Financial Report through November, 2020 was presented by Lisa Reavis

Cathy Vogel reported on various grants awarded to OCS.

The State of Georgia awarded OCS a facilities grant in the amount of \$39,034.00, which is to be used to renovate the current fluorescent lighting to LED lights. A Federal Cares Act Proportionate Calculation grant in the amount of \$13,435.55 was awarded to OCS to purchase document cameras and Apple pencils for teachers. A Federal Cares Act Stimulus grant in the amount of \$161,867.63 was awarded to OCS for the purchase of software and hardware such as laptops, Chromebook carts, Chromebooks, and iPads.

Credit Recovery Plan: Mr. Brown (Director of Instruction) scheduled meetings with all teaching teams and put the following Steps in place as our credit recovery plan:

- Step 1: Review Failure Reports/Familiarize yourself and your students with Edgenuity/Identify Eliqible Students (10/27)
- Step 2: Using Edgenuity as the preferred Credit Recovery Platform
- Step 3: # of Assignments/Determine highest grade achievable/Differentiation of Assignments
- Step 4: Monitor Student Progress
- Step 5: Grade Change Forms submitted to Mr. Wall before December 4th.
 Mr. Wall will then submit the forms to Ms. Grant.

Step 2 references using a platform called Edgenuity as one of the main platforms that teachers could use for the credit recovery process. Edgenuity's credit recovery courses help students who have fallen behind learn the material they need to know to move forward. The flexibility and design of the courses empower students to focus on exactly the content they need to in order to catch up to their peers. This is a modules based platform that many school systems are using as their sole virtual learning platform.

Note — The school system purchased 2 platforms for all schools to use at the beginning of the school year. In order to try and get a handle on the multi platforms being used, the school system purchased the itslearning platform. The idea was that parents and students would only have to use one platform for all virtual learning needs. The roll out of the itslearning platform had glitches and all teachers in the school district had to revert back to mainly the google classroom platform but other platforms as well. The school system **did not** purchase the Edgenuity platform for any of the charter schools. Oglethorpe had to purchase that program (\$12,000).

Many Oglethorpe teachers used the Edgenuity platform for the first nine-week credit recovery process. We also allowed them to use all platforms such as google classroom, USA Test Prep and teacher made assignments with the overarching goal of getting students that had failed passing for the first nine-week grading period.

Critical Decision Forms: At the conclusion of the first nine-week grading period we required OCS teachers to send out critical decision forms. Teachers were also required

to have parent meetings on any critical decision form that was sent home. Critical Decision forms are typically mailed home at the end of the first semester, but we wanted to get a handle on the failures much quicker this year. This has turned out to be a very effective way of getting parents and students involved to ensure academic success. Multiple Critical Decision meetings have been held every afternoon. A typical critical decision meeting involves the entire teaching team and one administrator meeting with the parent and student. This has proven to be the best credit recovery procedure that we have employed. The combination of the early mailout of the critical decision form, required team meeting with parent and student, and the use of Edgenuity as the main credit recovery platform has resulted in large numbers of students receiving passing grades for the first nine-week grading period.

Note – We had total teacher buy in with our credit recovery process and procedure. In past years, we did not get as big of a bang for our buck with our credit recovery Sat Schools. We will start another credit recovery process for the second nine-week grading period after the Christmas break to address failures for that grading period. We will do the same thing during the third nine-week grading period as well. This should keep our Summer School numbers to a minimal. We do anticipate a very small number of students that will need credit recovery in the summer. Using the Edgenuity platform will allow us to only have to use a few teachers to monitor the credit recovery process. We will not know the final percentage of students moved off the failure list until grades are finalized for the first semester. On Friday, December 4th (deadline for submitting grade change forms), over 80 grade change forms were signed meaning that 80 students had passed classes the first nine-week grading period that were previously failing. Many more grade change forms were signed prior to this December 4th deadline, and we do anticipate some more being signed prior to Christmas break.

Second Semester In-person Cohort: All teachers are expected to return to work in January. This will allow us to offer more in-person learning opportunities for all students. We should be able to operate with no students on the waiting list. We will continue with our Monday and Tuesday cohort of students and add an entirely new cohort of students on Thursday and Friday. Wednesday will continue to remain a deep cleaning day. The numbers for the second Cohort as of Monday, December 7th based upon the parent survey are as follows:

New Schedule: We will be making a schedule change beginning in January adding more time on to the school day but also allowing every student to see every teacher 5 days a week. Please see the attached double hybrid schedule:
