





What is an AP Course? What is a College Accredited Course?



Advanced Placement (AP)

- Advanced Placement (AP) is a series of subject courses created by the College Board which offers college-level content and examinations to high school students.
- American colleges and universities often grant placement either credit or advanced standing to students who obtain high scores on the examinations.
- Course syllabi follows College Board requirements and must be approved by the College Board Audit Board.

College Accredited Course (SUNY)

- SUNY Courses are designed to provide students with an entry level college experience. Students enrolled in these courses are eligible to receive State University of New York credit through the University of Albany (UHS) or Westchester Community College (ACE).
- Most private colleges and universities will accept SUNY courses for credit or advanced standing.
- BHS (SUNY) teachers must be approved as teaching adjuncts by SUNY Albany or WCC.





Percentage of Pocantico Students on Free or Reduced Lunch 2006-2016



POCANTICO STUDENT ENGAGEMENT CLASS OF 2015

- 100% of students exceeded the State Requirement in Mathematics.
- 92% of students exceeded the State Requirement in Science.
- 92% of students took at least four years of World Language.
- 79% of students took five or more years of World Language.



100% of Pocantico students were placed in a college program. 22 students were accepted into a four year college or university, and 2 students were accepted into two year college programs.







ACT Composite Score 2011-2015




SAT Scores – Math 2011-2015









