
Wyoming Continues to Outscore the NAEP National Average in 4th and 8th Grade

The WDE recently released the WY NAEP reading and mathematics results. Overall, Wyoming's 4th and 8th grade students continue to outperform national average test scores in reading and mathematics on the 2017 National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), known as the Nation's Report Card.

Unlike the state's WY-TOPP assessments, which test all students, NAEP is administered to a statistical sample of students and does not render individual test results for students or their schools. As such, NAEP data represent a sampling of Wyoming students.

NAEP testing is administered every two years in reading and mathematics to 4th and 8th grade students. All fifty states participate in the assessment, as well as the District of Columbia and Department of Defense (DoD) schools. NAEP provides an external reference or point-of-comparison to audit, review, and compare each state's educational program. Additionally, NAEP provides a stable trend line for tracking achievement during the current flux nationally in state testing programs.

No state performed above Wyoming's average NAEP score in grade four mathematics in 2017 (in 2015, two states had higher grade four math scores). Additionally, Wyoming was one of only six states with over 50 percent of students in the sample scoring proficient or advanced.

Another bright spot in the new results was an increase in grade eight mathematics scores for the state's Native American students; their increased performance in mathematics during 2017 significantly reduced the achievement gap between Native American and White students in Wyoming as previously reported in 2015.

Overall, average reading and mathematics scores in Wyoming for both grades four and eight were statistically unchanged from NAEP results reported in 2015. Similarly over the four-year reporting period from 2013 to 2017, Wyoming results in reading and mathematics at both grades were statistically flat or unchanged.

WY-TOPP Benchmarks/Proficiency Scales Set This Summer

In July, a panel of Wyoming educators will review Wyoming student's work to make recommendations on where to place benchmarks and proficiency levels with the WDE for the new WY-TOPP assessments.

Once benchmarks are in place, AIR will be able to score the summative and K-2 interim assessments. Results will be released by WDE in the fall of the 2018-19 school year.

ACCESS Testing Results

In January and February, SCSD#1 English Learner students took the ACCESS assessment. ACCESS results will be released on May 14 to school districts. Once released, EL teachers will review, analyze, and be asked to share results with all that support our English Learners.
