Congrats New Peer Listeners



Congratulations to 12 new Peer Listeners who have just completed their 2-day certification training on August 10, 2017!!

Peer Listening is a ministry - and a serious responsibility. A Peer Listener's daily ministry is to help other students who may be struggling with life issues or to simply brighten someone's day. A Peer Listener responds to those in need with compassionate listening and encouragement. He/she has answered God's call with a willing heart, and the desire to allow His love and compassion to work through them to serve their peers.

In April 2017, the candidates in the training group went through an interviewing process, and were required to write an essay about why they feel "called" to be a Peer Listener. In addition, each candidate is required to participate in a 2-day Diocesan certification training.


Mrs. Kelly Weber and Mrs. Sharon Hillhouse (moderators) facilitated the training, with several veteran Peer Listeners contributing. The training is a crucial final step in the process to ensure that each new Peer Listener is equipped with important listening/communication skills, understands the importance of confidentiality, and knows how to discern if a peer is dealing with a critical issue that should be referred to an adult.

Each of the candidates will receive a certificate stating that he/she is a certified Peer Listener an Induction Mass in December.


Calling All Veteran's...

Coming in November 2017 Financial Aid & PHEAA Presenter in the PM for seniors and parents

Michael Burke, our regional PA Higher Education Assistance Agency (PHEAA), will be coming to Notre Dame on Tuesday evening, November 14, 2017 to speak with parents and students about the state and federal financial aid process. Parents are strongly encouraged to attend this event for useful information on the financial aid process.

PACCAO Tour comes to Notre Dame Monday, October 2, 2017 at 11:30 a.m.

The Pennsylvania Association of Catholic College Admissions Officers (PACCAO) will be visiting Notre Dame High School. Approximately 20 colleges will set up in our gym in a college fair like fashion, while students are encouraged to walk around and speak with the admission reps. Students should be prepared to ask questions and find out more about the Catholic colleges in Pennsylvania, including the tuition incentives available to Catholic high school graduates.

Northampton County College Fair Northampton County College Tuesday, October 10, 2017 from 6:00 - 7:30 p.m.

More than 150 representatives from colleges, universities and technical schools will be present to answer your questions and provide valuable information about their institution, and other relevant post-secondary materials.

PSAT/NMSQT- Grades: 9, 10, 11 Wednesday, October 11, 2017

Freshman, Sophomores and Juniors will take the PSAT/NMSQT at Notre Dame on Wednesday morning, October 11th. The PSAT is a preliminary SAT cosponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation. This test is administered to promote college readiness and Juniors may be eligible for the National Merit Scholarship program. Freshman will take a special version of the PSAT, referred to as the 8/9 PSAT. The PSAT provides the best practice for the SAT as it is in the same format and evaluates the same skills as the SAT: reading, math, and writing. After the test, students will have direct access to free, customizable, online, SAT test prep through Khan Academy

The test will take approximately 3 hours and we will resume an abbreviated schedule for the rest of the day.

No School for Seniors: College Visit Day Wednesday, October 11, 2017

Seniors will be off that day, but will be expected to use their time wisely. This should be time spent exploring colleges, or other post-secondary options through campus tours, visits, interviews, etc...

Class of 2018: Sending Transcripts

The Guidance Office sends official transcripts to colleges and universities through E-docs (electronic documents), in our Naviance/Family Connection account

Family Connection is a customizable website that allows Notre Dame Seniors to utilize the tools available in Naviance.

Family Connection

Just some of the features students will be using in Family Connection include: a thorough college search, links to college admissions pages and college/university online applications, and the ability to request transcripts and letters of recommendation that will be sent by the Guidance Office electronically to the colleges that students have applied.

If you don't quite understand the process, please do not worry. Senior meetings with the Guidance Office have begun, and will continue through September and October.

Most students should know their individual Family Connection login information. http://connection.naviance.com/notredhs

Students were asked to use their Notre Dame Email account (firstinitiallastname@student.ndcrusaders.org), and the password initially was six digit date of birth, (ex., 050299).

After you successfully log in you'll be taken to Notre Dame's Senior Family Connection homepage, where you will see links to relevant senior year information on the left, and four tabs: College, Career, About me, My Planner.

Some of the features you'll notice in each tab include:

College Tab: College Search, Common App Account Matching, College Profiles, College Statistics, College Match, College Maps, and the National Scholarship Search by Sallie Mae.

Career: Career Search, Career KeyTM, Career Interest Profiler, Roadtrip Nation Interview Archive

About Me: Game Plan Survey, Do What You Are, StrengthsExplorer®, Resume Builder, Cluster Finder, and Career Interest Profiler.

My Planner: Include an overview of the student's success plan schedule, goals and to-do list creation, and a task list.

Guidance will use this feature as much as we can with students in school, however part of Family Connection's strength is the ability for parents and students to complete a number of college/career related items at home.

Should a student use a Common Application?

That depends on whether or not you see the little "CA" logo next to a college in the *Colleges I'm Thinking About page*.

To use the Common App, the first step is to create a **Common App** account.

Remember- Students will still apply to colleges using the Common App (www.common app.org), or an online application directly from that college. Supporting documents will be sent electronically upon request by you through edocs



Student Assistance Program (SAP)

If you know a student who is struggling with something, and could use some extra help, please remember the SAP Team. SAP is a team of ND faculty/staff trained to remove barriers to learning a student might be facing.

CIU 20 Driver Ed Program

On-the-Road Instruction

This training consists of six (6) 1-hour sessions one-on-one with an instructor. Driver training cars are provided by CIU20. A student must have his/her driving permit in order to take part in this instruction, as required by the state.


The On The Road program will take several months to complete. We will attempt to start your child's On-the -Road instruction as soon as possible but please be aware that there may be significant wait period of up to 2 months.

The student will drive with our instructors adapting new aptitudes. Parents are then expected to supplement this instruction with a minimum of 65 hours of instruction, as required by PennDOT, A Classroom Theory course is only required for on-the-road instruction if the student wishes to obtain his/her license through CIU20. They may take the classroom theory course at the same time they are learning with our instructors and practicing with their parents. Upon successful completion of a classroom theory course/classroom course and our on-the-road instruction and the 65 hours. The student may take the final PennDOT licensing exam with one of our instructors. No student will be eligible for testing with a CIU 20 instructor unless the on the road CIU 20 instructor approves the testing. Students in their senior year of high school, must complete the final end-of-course skills test to obtain one's license by August 20th of the calendar year in which they graduate.

Cost: \$275 for six (6) 1-hour lessons
