Dear Daisy Families and Staff,

I am delighted to share some very positive news with you about our school. Daisy Ingraham School has been recognized by the Connecticut State Department of Education as a "School of Distinction" for 2015-16, based on the results of the recently released 2015-16 Next Generation Accountability System for schools and districts in Connecticut.

Daisy Ingraham School earned a Count of Distinction in the Highest Performing category, which means that our school performed in the top 10% with respect to the Accountability Index. In addition, our school also earned a Count of Distinction in the Highest Growth for All Students category, by placing in the top 10% in this category. In the State of Connecticut, there were 65 schools recognized in the Highest Performing category and 62 schools recognized in the Highest Growth for All Students category.

Connecticut's Next Generation Accountability System is a broad set of 12 indicators that help tell the story of how well a school is preparing its students for success in college, careers and life. Indicators factored into the Accountability Index score include: academic achievement measured by state assessments; academic growth; attendance in school; assessment participation rate; physical fitness and arts access.

We are most proud of how each of our students has demonstrated academic growth and success overall. I would personally like to thank each of our families who provide support at home, showing our children that you value education and that you support our work in school. I am also very grateful for an extremely dedicated staff of professionals at Daisy who work tirelessly and expertly to help each one of our students flourish in a multitude of ways: emotionally, socially, academically and physically. Home and school partnerships, combined with the greater community of Westbrook that supports our educational efforts, make a successful equation for each one of our student learners. Many thanks to all for your thoughtful collaboration on this continual effort.

Our Daisy Community has every right to be very proud of each of our students and this important distinction, which represents a combined sum of everyone's efforts and care for our students and school.


