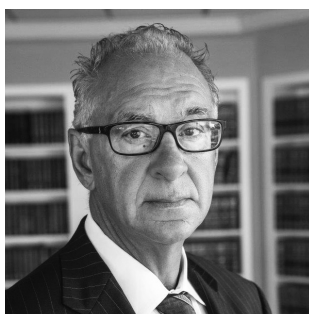

The past year has been full of “firsts” as we embarked on our efforts to re-engage our alumni and ask them to partner with us. We introduced many new alumni events to help alumni reconnect with each other and the school. Our first “Alumni Homecoming Celebration” was a tremendous success, bringing back 100 alumni to enjoy some food, memories and laughs. Our alumni networking events saw 30+ alumni at each event reminiscing about their days as Crusaders. We asked for help from our alumni for Career Day and it was an overwhelming response and success. And our Crusader Drive, which is the backbone of our Development efforts, has grown now from \$18,000 to almost \$75,000.

Alumni share their time with us each day by volunteering, sharing news and information and by helping current Crusaders as they start their career journeys. They share their talents when they make our community better and by assisting in days like Career Day or serving on our many committees and boards. They share their treasures when they donate or make gifts to our school to help fund projects, programs or scholarships.

There are opportunities to give back to Notre Dame in so many different capacities. Some are obvious such as the Crusader Drive and the Career Day event. Others are a bit more creative but help us differentiate ourselves as a school from our local public and private competitors. Here are some ways you can help:

INTERNSHIPS FOR CURRENT STUDENTS – We have now built two programs where our rising-senior students apply for summer internships with local companies. These internships can be paid or unpaid and often times have a scholarship attached to them upon completion. We are looking for alumni businesses to participate in this program for summer 2018.

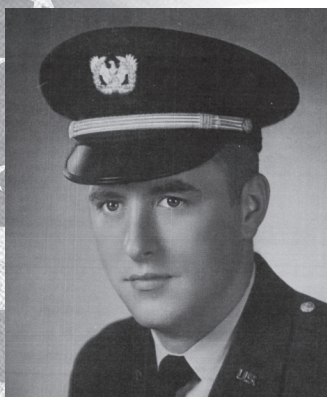

Notre Dame Salutes our Veterans

Our alumni community is filled with examples of individuals who sacrifice to allow all of us to enjoy the freedoms we have as Americans. We have had servicemen and women in each branch of the military that truly embody the Mission of Notre Dame. Over the past year, we have had alumni visit our campus that have served our country and protected our rights in various capacities. The Class of 2017 is no exception, with two young men leaving our Green Pond campus for military life when Tom Koons enters the US Air Force Academy and Austin Kaulius enters the US Naval Academy.



One of our distinguished alumni, Edward “Patrick” Mullins, Class of 1964, paid the ultimate price defending our freedoms and rights during the Vietnam War. Mullins was a pilot of a military aircraft on a medical evacuation mission when his craft was fired upon, crashed and burned. He was a member of the 92nd Aviation Co, 10th Aviation Bn., 17th Aviation Group. Patrick sacrificed his life in a gallant attempt to rescue his fellow soldiers and for this, he was awarded a Silver Star. The Class of 1964 and Pat’s brother Michael, in an effort to keep the memory of

Notre Dame Career Day a Huge Success!

On April 25, 2017, our Green Pond campus was flooded with speakers who answered the call to come share their time and talents with our students. Over 50 speakers shared with our students in 121 class periods in the hopes that they could shed some light on what they do, how they prepared for their professions and what the outlook for their professions were. Of these speakers, 40 were ND alumni or alumni parents! We had doctors, lawyers, accountants, insurance agents, financial investors, plant engineers, nurses, teachers and aviation mechanics. You name it, we had the career speaker.

We had alumni speakers from the 60's, 70's, 80's, 90's and 2000's. They spoke on what they do each day or what their passions are. Our students heard about Teach Rwanda, Disney Internships, how to be the CEO of a Non-Profit agency and what it's like to be a college athletic coach. They also learned a bit about fitness and health careers as well as journalism and engineering. We had alumni representing the FBI and the City of Easton's Fire Department. We had alumni travel locally and as far away as the west coast, as Arianna Powell had time off from

touring with Nick Jonas Band to speak with our students on life as a musician. We had alumni who really shared life experiences with our students and who could relate to what they are learning and experiencing here at Notre Dame. For many, it was their first trip back on campus in many years.

Our faculty was impressed with the expertise of our speakers and how engaged our students were. This made an impact on our current students, one asking to skip her lunch to listen to the speaker discussing law. One freshman sent a note in that before career day, she thought her career goal was to teach but after hearing so many other speakers, she is now considering a path in healthcare. The day was just not "day out of class or the office" but rather a day to explore and to share, for both our speakers and our students.

NOTRE DAME?

Often times, we hear students, visiting families or prospective students talk about the “wonderful science lab, performing arts studio, media center, or athletic facilities other schools have”. They ask us “why should we pick Notre Dame and pay tuition when we can go to XYZ School and get all the bells and whistles for free?” The fact is, we can’t (and won’t) compete with free. We don’t have a tax base that we can draw on when we need or want to improve what we have. We use what we have and build upon it. Our response is often: “we may not have the best of everything or the state of the art facilities but that isn’t what makes ND a great investment.” It’s something that doesn’t have a line item on the tuition bill. As alumni we all come to realize some day, maybe not while we are walking the halls as students, but one day, down the road, we know what a gift we have been given. It’s the people we encounter, the values that are instilled in us, the life lessons we are taught. It’s the strong Catholic foundation that we are given so that we believe in something bigger than all of us.

An example of the power of the Notre Dame community happened earlier this year. One of our alumni, Judy Williams Young, was stricken with an illness that threatened to take her life. She, along with her brothers and sisters, all graduated from ND in the 70’s and early 80’s. She relocated to Florida and was removed from most of her ND friends and former classmates. Yet, when word got out that she was ill, fellow Crusaders began to pray. Her classmates prayed and continue to pray daily at 3:00pm for her recovery and strength for her family. Classmates of her siblings began to pray. Our alumni trip to NYC included a stop at St. Monica’s Church (Monica is Judy’s sister) to say a few prayers and light a candle. Social media became the way we communicated and tried to help from afar. When the call came to send photos and cards to her hospital room, the mail began to travel to Florida. Although her road isn’t easy, she is a Crusader and she is fighting. With the power of prayer and the love from her friends in her ND family, she is

making strides and hopefully soon will have a full recovery. Generations of Crusaders came together and knew that if we rallied together in prayer, we could help. That is what Crusaders do! We continue to pray for Judy and we continue to pray for her family. The investment her family made 30+ years ago continues to blossom today.



Another example happened recently in the Lehigh Valley. A news story of a man who has repeatedly had to replace his shrubs and repair his yard due to careless drivers sparked a flurry of comments on Facebook. The Channel 69 news story ran and was shared on Facebook. The man was a beloved former ND teacher, Mr. Hlay. As soon as the news report ran, former students wanted to help. A Go Fund Me Page was created and requests came in on how former Crusaders could help. These were students who had not seen this teacher in over 25 years yet they wanted to help a family member in need.

Just a week ago, three 2017 graduates shared a breakfast out just days after graduating. As they sat in the restaurant sharing some eggs and laughs, a gentleman came up to them and asked, “did you just graduate from ND?” When they replied, YES, the gentleman told them breakfast was on him! The community knows our graduates give back and do great things.

This, my friends, is what makes ND special and this you will never find on a tuition bill!

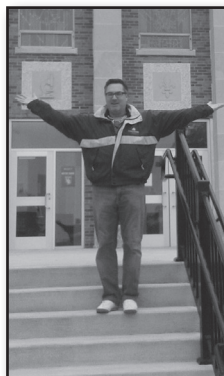

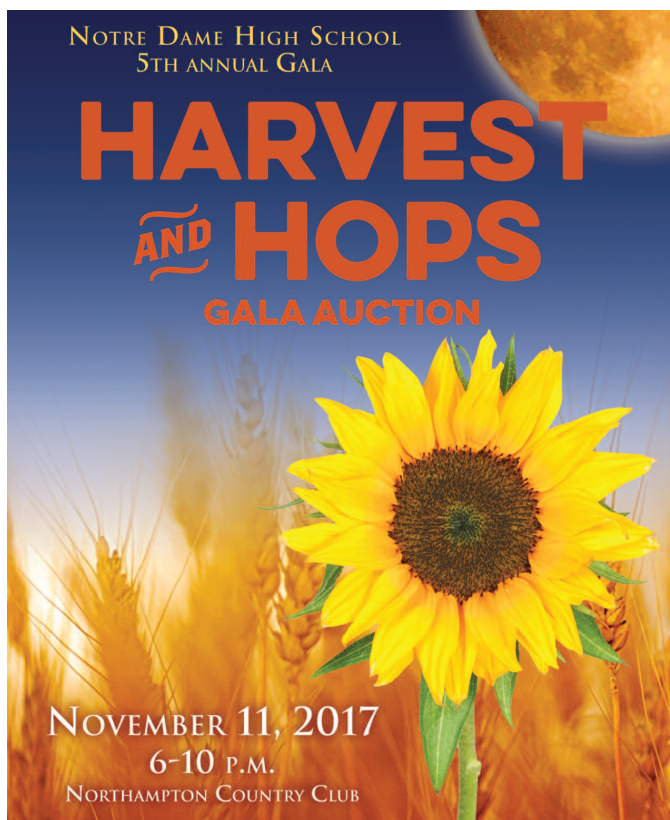
