Based on our needs assessments, we know that the majority of our students are behind in math, ELA, and College Readiness. Further, from the results of our SEL survey and surveying our students, we know that our students are further hampered by lack of mental health supports. We have several strategies to combat this learning loss going forward.

First, we are requesting funds for an Aspiring Teacher at .75 FTE for 21-22 and .55 FTE for 22-23 to push into ELA and math classes to provide tutoring support for students and additional support for teachers. We have students coming in at a range of level of proficiency and having an extra teacher in the class allows for the lead teacher to focus on moving lessons along according to the NYSED learning standards while providing support for students who are behind.

We are requesting a .75 Guidance Counselor and .75 College & Career Readiness Coordinator in the 21-22 SY and .65 Guidance Counselor and .65 Career Readiness Coordinator in 22-23 SY to assist students in regaining their college

	preparedness. Research has shown that working with counselors will improve a students academic proficiency ¹ and improve performance in college. ² College & Career Readiness services at New Dawn will involved the use of SEL practices which have been show to be key in success in schools. ³		
	Finally, we understand the learning loss does not occur in a vacuum. Learning loss involves as much social emotional trauma as it does actually missing class and falling behind on concepts. Therefore, to ensure that we are working with the whole student, addressing those things that impact learning that appear to have nothing to do with learning (depression, anxiety, isolation, etc.), we are requesting monies for a .5 FTE Director of Student Services & Operations to work with staff and students addressing the needs of the whole student as they move towards graduation and college/career.		
	The New Dawn Charter High School leaders and staff members functioning as a team are providing academic and social-emotional supports for NDCHS students in an effort to reduce the learning gap resulting from the pandemic. These initiatives have been and will continue to make up for lost learning time. These initiatives are consistent with ESSER II Use of Funds #11.
