Message from the Superintendent Marco Pochintesta

This year, the community will have two propositions to consider. Both have long reaching impacts to the future of the District. The two propositions that are subject to voter approval are the annual school budget, and a bond proposition that has been under development for nearly a year.

The school budget continues to support and advance the academic program of the schools in a manner that is consistent with the District's values of fiscal responsibility and sustainable growth. The proposed

budget remains below the tax cap and maintains all current services and programs without any reductions.

Within the proposed budget, community members will see the following new or expanded items: 2 special education teachers, 3 teaching assistants (FA Maker Space, HS computer lab, elementary special education class), a .4FTE increase to the elementary library media specialist position making that position full time, a .2FTE teacher position to allow for an accelerated 6th grade math program. Additional expenditures will allow for additional clubs at the high school including robotics and debate club, two new athletic teams, girls golf and JV cheerleading, and \$30,000 for additional technology at the middle school.

The second proposition on the ballot is the approval of a Capital Improvements Bond. We have seen the changes in learning standards over the years and the art and science of teaching has had to change to keep pace. Our educators have innovated and adapted, doing their best to prepare students for a rapidly changing world. The bond proposition brings innovation and adaption consistent with 21st Century skills, the 4C's, to key learning environments such as the PRHS library media center, science and technology wing, fine and performing arts wing, and the PRMS music wing and expanded gymnasium. Safety and security are the priority focus of the infrastructure projects. Upgrades to front entrances of elementary schools and the middle school to make them more secure, at all schools replacement of outdated HVAC equipment, roof repairs, and additional emergency lighting at the high school are part of the infrastructure portion of the bond proposition. The bond proposal also includes a new multipurpose synthetic turf field with lights, repaved track and tennis courts, handicapped accessibility to the main field, and restrooms.

Proposition 2: Capital Improvements Bond

On Tuesday, May 16th, there will be a second proposition put before the voters of the Pearl River School District for capital improvement projects. The district is seeking voter approval to spend \$32,182,000 million on numerous projects throughout the Pearl River School District. The scope of work spans all school buildings and our athletic fields. These plans not only address the infrastructure needs of maintaining buildings that are over 50 years old in a safe and energy-efficient manner, but also meets the teaching and learning needs of our students and staff through improvements and upgrades to learning environments.

The total cost for what is being proposed is \$32,182,000. The district currently has \$3,182,000 in a capital improvements reserve line which would reduce the bond to \$29,000,000. The district would receive 39% of the total cost of approved projects via State Building Aid funds. We have estimated that over the next 23 years district taxpayers will see an increase of \$49.05 annually for a home assessed at \$200,000 for this comprehensive capital projects bond.

Under New York State law, voter approval is required for capital improvement expenditures and will appear as Proposition 2 on the ballot on May 16th.

Who May Vote:

To vote in a PRSD Budget Vote and Board Election, you must be:

- 18 years of age or older on the day of the vote,
- · A citizen of the United States,
- A resident of the Pearl River School District for at least 30 days prior to the day of the vote,
- Registered to vote.
- Anyone who has voted in a general or school election since 2013 and who meets the above criteria is automatically eligible.

Where To Vote:

All voters now vote in ONE POLLING PLACE: Pearl River High School - Pirate Cove 275 East Central Avenue

Take first entrance onto campus and follow drive all the way around building to gym/cafeteria entrance. See sign for Pirate Cove on right side of building.

Absentee Ballots:

Absentee ballots may be obtained at the office of the district clerk, located in the PRSD Administrative Offices, 135 West Crooked Hill Road, Pearl River. Requests for ballots to be mailed to the voter must be received at least seven days prior to the election. Ballots being picked up personally must be picked up by the day before the election. Absentee ballots must be returned to the district clerk no later than 5PM on May 16, 2017 in order to be included in the vote count.

Budget Highlights Total Proposed Budget: \$65,880,252 Projected Tax Rate Increase for Homeowners of 1.75%

Final tax rates could change based upon total assessments in August

Expands/Maintains Academic Programs:

- Adds 2 special education teachers at the elementary level
- Increases part-time elementary library media specialist to full time
- Adds .2 FTE support for a 6th grade accelerated math class
- Adds 3 teaching assistants to support FA Maker Space, HS computer lab, and elementary special education class
- Continues to protect class sizes at the elementary level and protects core courses at PRMS and PRHS
- Adds new electives to HS- Women in History and the Philosophy of Ethics
- Maintains continuum of special education services

Revenue Highlights:

Includes a small increase in state aid based on prescribed Foundation Aid calculations. District will also allocate \$245,000 of reserves to cover the spending plan.

Expands/Maintains Other Student and Community Programs:

- Adds JV Cheerleading and Girls golf
- Maintains 69 athletic teams (varsity, JV, modified, and intramurals)
- Additional funding for clubs at the HS such as robotics and debate
- Additional funding for technology at the middle school
- Maintains 30 extra-curricular clubs at PRHS and 16 at PRMS
- Adult education program including programs for senior citizens

Expense Management:

Overall spending increase of 2.01%, a total of \$1,295,491. Included in this total is an increase of \$200,000 in planned capital work related to the Building Conditions Survey.

What Will it All Cost?

For a home assessed at \$200,000 (Orangetown is on partial assessment), the projected tax increase is 1.75% per year. *Final tax rates could change based upon total assessments in August.*

RESOLVED, That the Board of Education (the "Board) of the
Pearl River Union Free School District, in the County of Rockland,
New York (the "District"), is hereby authorized to construct improvements and alterations to all school buildings and/or sites, (the "Project"), and to expend therefor an amount not to exceed \$32,182,000; (b) that the amount of not to exceed \$3,182,000 from the District's "District-Wide Renovations, Reconstruction and Construction Reserve Fund" established by the voters on May 19, 2009, is hereby authorized to be expended to pay for a portion of the Project, and such expenditure is hereby approved; and (c) that a tax in the amount of not to exceed \$29,000,000 is hereby authorized to pay the balance of the cost of the Project, such tax to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as shall be determined by said Board of Education, and that in anticipation of such tax, bonds of the District may be issued, and a tax is also hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.
