SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

We had one HIB incident for the month of September. That was at Dwight Morrow High School. Back to School Night went very well with a tremendous turnout. Parent/Teacher Conferences are scheduled for October and early November. Students are included as part of the meetings. Latin Heritage Fair took place at Grieco. We had an excellent turnout. Dwight Morrow hosted the Academies at the open house. Student ambassors guided our visitors to each of the five programs.

OPENED THE PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR - Items that are on the agenda.

Ms. Mosley: I'm here to speak about the Mission One contract. If you accept Title 1 funds, there are conditions that come with it. You cannot have outsourced paraprofessionals. I really want you to reconsider and hire directly talented paraprofessionals that want to work with our children.

Mr. Caviness: How are we filling a \$4 million gap with \$4.8 million - the numbers don't add up. We're putting the district in a worse financial hole. Volunteer students from Dwight-Englewood – not a good look. We have alumni that are willing to come back and tutor our kids.

Ms. Walker. I'm glad to see all the trips that the little ones are going on. I hope we continue to see that – they need that type of experience.

Ms. Shemesh: The members of the Englewood Teachers Association are here tonight to demonstrate our sense of frustration at the way the negotiations process has been conducted by the Board's negoatiating team. We deserve support from the Board of Education. We are the element of continuity in this district. We are your staff and as such we deserve your support, your respect and a contract – sooner rather than later.

Mr. Matthews: I see nothing wrong with Dwight Englewood kids tutoring our kids. I applaud them. We should look at Title 1 money – something has got to change. Whatever we've been doing with that money has not been effective. I'd like to know the background of the math teacher.

Mr. Popkin: Why did we have nine suspensions in September? Last year we had none in September.

APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

Mr. Haughton: We are going to separate from the consent agenda five resolutions: 16-A-23, 16-A-26, 16-F-41, 16-F-47 and 16-F-52. There is a desire of the Board to have discussion on these items. As you can see, we only have five members that are here tonight. We were aware that at least two of the members have notified us in advance that they were not going to be here. We learned of a third earlier today that would not be here. While we have a quorum, there are a couple of members that are unable to vote on personnel. Personnel actions require an affirmative vote of five members of the Board. Therefore, by the time we take action on the consent agenda if no other members show up we are going to table the personnel items on the agenda.

Motion by Mr. Pruitt, seconded by Mr. Carter to approve the consent agenda, excluding 16-A-23, 16-A-26, 16-F-41, 16-F-47, 16-F-52 and all of Personnel.

BOARD DISCUSSION

16-A-23

Mr. Carter. Liberty Science Center – Our kids deserve what every other child gets in the State of New Jersey. I'm appalled that anyone says that our children shouldn't get that.

Mr. Haughton: I'm very supportive of the trips that have been identified. The kids are getting a hands-on experience and doing it in creative ways.

16-A-26

Mr. Pruitt: I've seen several QSAC submissions. I think this is the highest scoring submission. I'm pleased to see the district improving.

Mr. Haughton: I want to thank Ms. Feinstein for working with our staff and administration in going through the review with QSAC.

16-F-41

Mr. Carter: My concern is the same as I say every year. When I got on this Board, we were talking about the cost of our paraprofessionals. I think it was around \$2 million. Now we are up to \$4.8 million. We need to look at the cost and the quality of what we're getting.

Mr. Pruitt: A lot of the concerns have been identified. Now we're seeing the full year's budget. We need to make sure we have quality people. In terms of the contract, we need to approve it. We need to work on the controls to make sure our kids are getting the services they need.

Ms. Feinstein: The company we're using now is better than the company we were using before. We asked what it would cost to have your own employees versus outsourced employees. We never got that. We still don't know whether we would save money. I'm asking for it again. I don't know if it's cost effective.

Mr. Haughton: The Mission One contract had been awarded in June. This is ratification of a complete contract. This contract has an expansion to include the After School Program. That's why we're seeing it on the agenda. However, to Ms. Feinstein's point, we have routinely and consistently asked for an analysis. Our current Business Adminsitrator had not been the person that we had asked. We are going to make a request now that the analysis be brought before the Finance & Operations Committee to be reported on at the next Board meeting. It is important that we evaluate what the differential would have been for in-district staff versus out-of-district staff. Make the FTE's the same. When we had our staff in house doing it, they served in multiple functions. The way the contract is written, we have people that are classroom aides, but then we're paying separately for lunch aides and bus aides. We need to get a full understanding and evaluate the economics fo this because the intention behind this was to save the district money. It needs to be brought to the next Finance and Operations Meeting and then reported on at the next Board meeting without fail. Otherwise, I am certain that we will look at another direction the next time around.

16-F-47

Mr. Pruitt. Our district does get Title 1 funding. This will allow the district to have more flexibility and could be a larger benefit for our children.

Ms. Balletto: As you know, every school is receiving Title 1 funding. Due to the fact that our free and reduced lunch count at every school is over 40%, the Englewood School District has an opportunity for each of those schools to become a schoolwide Title 1 Program. Right now we are a Targeted Assistance Program. That means the funding that you would receive for Quarles can only be spent on Title 1 children. By becoming a school-wide program, all students can be part of these programs which would better utilize our resources. All students would have a chance to have the additional services that Title 1 would provide. This resolution allows each school to decide if they would like to submit an application. A school could opt to do this or not. The applications are then sent to the state. Then a year-long planning process goes on where a comprehensive needs assessment takes place. That will get sent to the state for final approval. If the state approves the plan then it would come back to the Board for adoption. The funding will stay the same; however, what we do with the funding will be flexible for our district.

16-F-52

Mr. Pruitt: We should do what we can to foster effective partnerships.

Mr. Haughton: They are more than just a partner. They are absolutely our family. They continue to support our students.

Motion by Mr. Pruitt, seconded by Mr. Carter to table all of Personnel. Motion carries.

Mr. Haughton: To Ms. Shemesh and to the ETA, know that we fully recognize that our teachers are the constant for us. We rely on you – you are our partner. We have frequent conversations that need to continue. We must work together and do it with respect, with care and compassion. I look forward with continued dialogue.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Pastor Javon Davis from the Ebenezer Baptist Church donated 51 baskets and 51 book bags for the 51 homeless students that attend the Englewood Public School system.

Dr. James: On behalf of the Englewood Public School District we thank you so very much.

Mr. Haughton: I had the opportunity to attend the fabulous event that you held at your church. You, as have other churches, done so much for the community. We hope you will partner with our school district and bring together other houses of worship so that we can continue and grow these initiatives for all the kids. Tonight we have the privilege of naming and taking action of voting on our new Superintendent. Before we do that, I want to thank the administrators for being here in support of the new Superintendent and support of change. To have all of you here means so much. This is a rflection of our community. What Ebenezer has done for us this evening is so heartfeld and so moving. Mr. Kravitz, the folks that are here tonight are the most passionate, most caring and most opinionated. Thank you all for being here. I want to thank Mayor Huttle for being here tonight. I also want toacknowledge Mr. Brown, who is being acknowledged by the NAACP at their Freedom Fund Event. I also want to acknowledge our wonderful police department. For those who drop off their children at various schools, you may have observed a strong police presence--a presence that was very helpful that caused us to have smooth operations so that when parents dropped off their children they moved on and moved off. I want to introduce to you Mr. Robert Kravitz, who after tonight will be the next Superintendent of the Englewood Public School District.

Mr. Kravitz: Thank you to the Board of Education, Mr. Huttle and to my parents. I am so proud to be here tonight. I walked into this building and I saw two things – a poster that said "Change We Can Believe In" – that has been my mantra. The second was a floor mat that said Englewood Public Schools from 1872 – change you can believe in and knowing where you came from. I believe in great things. I know we can be better. You have my commitment. Thank you all for coming out.

OPENED THE PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Mr. Huttle: This is a very special evening. The single most important thing is leadership in the Superintendent. You can't go forward unless you know where you came from. This man has addressed it in his opening remarks. Councilman Skurnick: I am committed to the public schools. They gave a tremendous opportunity to my own children and to my friends' children.

Anita Newkirk: Were any parents involved in the Superintendent search?

Liliana Saumet: I have seen improvement over the last five years. I have seen action and accountability. I want to thank Mr. Armental - he really showed me that he really cares about our kids.

Curtis Caviness: We are still a focus high school. You are coming into a district that is a Title 1 district. It is a district with 70% free/reduced lunch. We don't have secretaries or paraprofessionals. This is the landscape that you coming to. The only thing that I will ask you to do is to follow the law.

Dave Matthews: I would like to see this district be brought up to Bergen County standards. That includes every measure of academic success.

Anita Shemesh: I am co-president of Englewood Teachers Association. On behalf on our members I would like to welcome you. I look forward to meeting with you as soon as you are settled in. We'd like to share our perspectives and our concerns. Most of all, we'd like to figure out ways where we can collaborate to make our schools successful and a wonderful place for learning and teaching.

Daniela Small-Bailey. On behalf of the Adminstrators Association, we would like to welcome you.

Board Discussion

Mr. Pazant: We engaged the firm Sousa & Stern. They held two meetings; one was a community meeting and they also had a meeting with teachers and administrators. We had a total of 33 candidates. We narrowed it down to 8 and then the final 2...Mr. Kravitz was the winner.

Mr. Haughton: There was an opportunity for parents, teachers and administrators to share your thoughts and what it was that you were seeking in a superintendent. We were guided by that information. That input was critical.

Mr. Pruitt: The parental input was part of the rubric.

Mr. Brown: Mr. Kravitz' experience is remarkable. I wanted to see someone who had success. Many of his skills in business were transferable. He understands management and that is extremely important in this district.

Ms. Feinstein: You will find it hard to believe that we were able to come to a consensus – but we could. This town and this school system is very important to me. When I had this role to find a Superintendent I took it very seriously. I want us to be successful. We came to a decision that we think is right for Englewood. We have to be able to work together. We can agree to disagree – we need to get behind the Superintendent. I am very happy to support Mr. Kravitz.

Ms. Craig-Berry: I welcome you, Mr. Kravitz. We look forward to your leading this district.

Mr. Garrison: I think the Board was at it's best during this procedure. This is one of the finest moments this Board has had. Devry, thank you for your leadership. I look forward to working with Mr. Kravitz.

Mr. Haughton: My thanks to the committee – I really appreciate all the work that everyone has done.

OPENED THE PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Curtis Caviness: How do you strap Mr. Kravitz with the items on the agenda that are recommended by the Interim Superintendent? On the website, it says you can call the attendance line in some of the schools. Who mans the attendance line? It also mentions a truant officer. We don't have a truant officer. Maybe that's why our attendance is 15% not 10%. I hope there is a little more to the Corrective Action Plan.

Dave Matthews: I do want us to start the process for the Intel Science Contest. I'd be happy to meet with Academic Affairs Committee and share information. It takes approximately a year to prepare. It will challenge our staff and students.

Esther Santiago-Babb: As a taxpayer, I would like to get a tour of the shed. Is there a dog living in the shed? Can we make different arrangement for the Pritchard employees. They need to leave either at 2:00 p.m. or 4:00 p.m. Leaving at 3:00 p.m. does not work for our kids' safety. If NCLB is back, does that mean the children that are Title 1 can now start doing the Huntington classes for free?

Anita Newkirk: I have a problem with my daughter's schedule. I believe that we are now teaching to the test. She receives 2 ½ hours of English Literature, 1 ½ hours of Math, 40 minutes of Related Arts, Social Studies and Science are grouped together – which means you only get half of it. Why don't we have Science and Social Studies separate. We should have gym every day – especially for our little people. They need to get out. Another thing – why can't parents sit on the committees? We want parents involved.

Mr. Haughton: With regard to the shed, I'm sure Dr. James will arrange that for you. I took a tour of the shed last week – there was no dog there. Buses were parked behind the shed; however, the Facilities Director said that in the Winter they will be parked inside. Regarding parent involvement, know that we do have parent involvement in a variety of ways. On the Technology Committee we have two parents that are involved. We have parents that are involved on the QSAC Committee. We seek parental involvement. If there are parents that wish to bring things to different committees – please come. Your engagement is desired.

Motion by Mr. Brown, seconded by Mr. Pruitt to approve the consent agenda as amended.

Board Discussion

Mr. Garrison: Some members of the public raised some issues about busing, curriculum and scheduling. The Board has expressed our concerns as well. If the Superintendent is going to do an investigation, could she please send that in a bullet-pointed summary to the Board members to see what issues are being raised and see if they are founded. *Dr. James*: You will receive a memorandum regarding scheduling from me and busing will come from the Business Administrator.

Mr. Brown: The Corrective Action Plan – the audit found there were problems with verifying the free & reduced lunches. People that are eligible are not getting it and those that are not eligible are getting it. We've had a staff member earning over six figures receiving it which was obviously not right. What are we going to do about it?

Ms. Balletto: The required 10% of total applications that are approved for free or reduced lunch – letters will go home. Parents or guardians must submit back information. If it is not submitted in the time that is prescribed by federal law, you then receive a second letter. If you do not respond to that second letter, your child will go back to a paid status. Staff members are going for training to be up to date on all current laws and rules.

Mr. Haughton: I want to clarify to the remark that was made that there was a staff member earning six figures that knowingly used that benefit. If that took place and the Board was aware of it, I'm sure that criminal charges were pressed and the appropriate authorities were made aware and action would have been taken. I hope that it was not misconstrued. Mr. Garrison: 16A-16 – Hohokus School of Trade - \$170,000 for seventeen students. These are all Eagle Academy Students. This is the most expensive program that we run in the district. Where are we going with this? What is the enrollment at the Eagle Academy? What are we spending per child at Eagle? If you have 20 kids at the Eagle Academy and 17 are going for half-day – why do we have the Eagle Academy? This is a major expenditure per capita. If you have a full-time staff at the Academy and most of the students are leaving for the half-day programs, why isn't the Eagle Program closing half day? The staff is being completely underutilized. I would really like more information on this. Mr. Haughton: Dr. James is keenly aware of your concerns and other Board members. We've observed the number of students that were enrolled last year versus the declining number this year and not seeing the decline in the staffing levels. I know that it was Dr. James' intention to bring this to the Academic Affairs Committee and to the Financial & Operations Committee to discuss it from an academic perspective and a financial perspective.

The Commissioner of Education shall implement a system and related schedule of Statewide assessments to evaluate student achievement of the Core Curriculum Content Standards in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:8-4.1 et seq. The Board of Education is required to administer the applicable Statewide assessments according to the schedule prescribed by the Commissioner.

State assessments provide parents with important information about their child's progress; detailed diagnostic information about each individual student's performance that educators, parents, and students can utilize to enhance foundational knowledge and student achievement; and include item analysis which will clarify a student's level of knowledge and understanding of a particular subject or area of a subject. The data derived from State assessments will be utilized by teachers and administrators to pinpoint areas of difficulty and customize instruction accordingly. Such data can be accessed and utilized as a student progresses to successive school levels.

The New Jersey Department of Education, pursuant to State law and regulations, requires all students to take State assessments as scheduled. There is no provision for a student to opt-out of Statewide assessments. If a student is absent on a testing date, the student will be expected to take the missed test on another school day. Parents and students will be informed of all scheduled testing dates, including make-up testing dates for students who missed the initial testing date.

Statewide Assessment System

The Superintendent of Schools shall develop and annually present to the Board for its approval an assessment program that complies with the rules of the State Board of Education.

Test Administration Procedures and Security Measures

All Statewide assessments shall be administered in accordance with the Department of Education's required test administration procedures and security measures. Any breach of such procedures or measures shall be immediately reported to the Superintendent or designee.

The Department of Education shall provide the Superintendent with documentation of student achievement after administration of each test in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:8-4.2. The Board shall maintain an accurate record of each student's performance on Statewide assessments in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:8-4.2. Information regarding individual student test scores shall only be released in accordance with Federal and State law.

Accountability

The Board will provide parents, students, and citizens with results of annual assessments according to N.J.A.C. 6A:8-4.2. The Board shall provide appropriate instruction to improve skills and knowledge for students performing below established levels of student proficiency in any content area either on Statewide or local assessments. All students are expected to demonstrate the knowledge and skills of the Core Curriculum Content Standards as measured by the Statewide assessment system.

Public Reporting

In accordance with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 6A:8-4.5, the Department of Education shall report annually to the State Board of Education and the public on the progress of all students and student subgroups in meeting the Core Curriculum Content Standards as measured by the Statewide assessment system. In public reporting of school and district performance data, the Department of Education shall not compromise the confidentiality of individual students.

Parental Notification

Parents shall be informed of the district assessment system and of any special tests that are to be administered to their children.

Student Accommodations/Modifications

The Board shall provide appropriate accommodations or modifications to the Statewide assessment system as specified by the Department of Education for English Language Learners (ELLs) and students with disabilities as defined in N.J.A.C. 6A:14-1.3 or eligible under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act as determined by the Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) or 504 Team in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:8-4.1(d)1.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:38-25, every parent, guardian, or other person having control and custody of a child between the ages of six and sixteen shall cause the child to regularly attend school. The Board of Education requires students enrolled in the school district attend school regularly in accordance with the laws of the State.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6 and for the purposes of this Policy and Regulation 5200, a student's absence from school will may be excused, or unexcused that counts toward truancy, or unexcused that does not count toward truancy.

Students that are absent from school for any reason are responsible for the completion of assignments missed because of their absence. A student who is absent from school for observing a religious holiday shall not be deprived of any award, eligibility, or opportunity to compete for any award, or deprived of the right to take an alternate test or examination that was missed because of the absence provided there is a written excuse of such absence signed by the parent.

Prolonged or repeated absences, excused or unexcused, from school or from class, deprive students of the educational and classroom experiences deemed essential to learning and may result in retention at grade level

For districts with secondary school(s)

or loss of credit or removal from a course that would count toward the high school diploma in accordance with policies of this Board.

Students shall be subjected to the school district's response for unexcused absences that **count** account toward truancy during the school year as outlined in N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6(a)4 and Regulation 5200.

Unexcused absences from school or from classes within the school day may subject a student to consequences that may include the denial of a student's participation in co-curricular activities and/or athletic competition. Repeated

5330 ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION

The Board of Education disclaims any and all responsibility for the diagnosis and treatment of **an** the illness of any student. However, in order for many students with chronic health conditions and disabilities to remain in school, medication may have to be administered during school hours. Parents and legal guardians are encouraged to administer medications to children at home whenever possible as medication should be administered in school only when necessary for the health and safety of students. The Board will permit the administration of medication in school in accordance with applicable law.

Medication will only be administered to students in school by the school physician, a certified or noncertified school nurse, a substitute school nurse employed by the district, the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s), a student who is approved to self-administer in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:40-12.3 and 12.4, and school employees who have been trained and designated by the certified school nurse to administer epinephrine in an emergency pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:40-12.5 and 12.6.

Self-administration of medication by a student for asthma or other potentially life-threatening illness or a life threatening allergic reaction is permitted in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-12.3.

Medication no longer required must be promptly removed by the parent(s) or legal guardian(s).

The school nurse shall have the primary responsibility for the administration of epinephrine. However, the certified school nurse may designate, in consultation with the Board or the Superintendent, additional employees of the district who volunteer to be trained in the administration of epinephrine via a pre-filled auto-injector mechanism using standardized training protocols established by the Department of Education in consultation with the Department of Health and Senior Services when the school nurse is not physically present at the scene.

STUDENTS 5330/page 2 of 3 Administration of Medication

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-12.6.d, no school employee, including a school nurse or any other officer or agent of a Board of Education or a physician providing a prescription under a standing protocol for school epinephrine pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:40-12.5, shall be held liable for any good faith act or omission consistent with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-12.5, nor shall any action before the New Jersey State Board of Nursing lie against a school nurse for any such action taken by a person designated in good faith by the school nurse pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:40-12.6. Good faith shall not include willful misconduct, gross negligence, or recklessness.

The school nurse or designee shall be promptly available on site at the school and at school-sponsored functions in the event of an allergic reaction. In addition, the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) must be informed that the school district, its employees and agents shall have no liability as a result of any injury arising from the administration of epinephrine to the student.

The parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of the student must sign a statement acknowledging their understanding the district shall have no liability as a result of any injury arising from the administration of the epinephrine via a pre-filled auto-injector mechanism to the student and the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) shall indemnify and hold harmless the district and its employees or agents against any claims arising out of the administration of the epinephrine via a pre-filled auto-injector mechanism to the student.

The permission for the emergency administration of epinephrine via a pre-filled auto-injector mechanism containing epinephrine to students for anaphylaxis is effective for the school year it is granted and must be renewed for each subsequent school year.

Each school in the district shall have and maintain for the use of students at least one nebulizer in the office of the school nurse or a similar accessible location. Each certified school nurse or other persons authorized to administer asthma medication will receive training in airway management and in the use of nebulizers and inhalers consistent with State Department of Education regulations. Every student that is authorized to use self-administered asthma medication pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:40-12.3 or a nebulizer must have an asthma treatment plan prepared by the student's physician which shall identify, at a minimum, asthma triggers, the treatment plan, and other such elements as required by the State Board of Education.

All student medications shall be appropriately maintained and secured by the school nurse, except those medications to be self-administered by students. In those instances the medication may be retained by the student with the prior knowledge of the school nurse. The school nurse may provide the Principal and other teaching staff members concerned with the student's educational progress with such information about the medication and its administration as may be in the student's best educational interests. The school nurse may report to the school physician any student who appears to be affected adversely by the administration of medication and may recommend to the Principal the student's exclusion pursuant to law.

The school nurse shall document each instance of the administration of medication to a student. Students self-administering medication shall report each incident to a teacher, coach, or other individual designated by the school nurse who is supervising the student during the school activity when the student self-administers. These designated individuals shall report such incidents to the school nurse within twenty-four hours of the self-administration of medication. The school nurse shall preserve records and documentation regarding the self-administration of medication in the student's health file.

5339 SCREENING FOR DYSLEXIA (M)

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-5.1 et seq., the Board of Education shall ensure each student enrolled in the school district who has exhibited one or more potential indicators of dyslexia or other reading disabilities is screened for dyslexia and other reading disabilities using a screening instrument selected pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-5.2. This screening shall be administered no later than the student's completion of the first semester of the second grade.

In the event a student enrolls in the district in Kindergarten through grade six and has no record of being previously screened for dyslexia or other reading disabilities, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:40-5.2, the Board shall ensure the newly-enrolled student is screened for dyslexia and other reading disabilities using a screening instrument selected pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:40-5.2. This screening shall be administered at the same time other students enrolled in the student's grade are screened for dyslexia and other reading disabilities or, if other students enrolled in the student's grade have previously been screened, within ninety calendar days of the date the student is enrolled in the district. The screenings shall be administered by a teacher or other teaching staff member properly trained in the screening process for dyslexia and other reading disabilities.

For the purposes of this Policy, "dyslexia" is a specific learning disability that is neurological in origin. It is characterized by difficulties with accurate and/or fluent word recognition and by poor spelling and decoding abilities. These difficulties typically result from a deficit in the phonological component of language that is often unexpected in relation to other cognitive abilities and the provision of effective classroom instruction. Secondary consequences may include problems in reading comprehension and reduced reading experience that can impede growth of vocabulary and background knowledge.

For the purposes of this Policy, "potential indicators of dyslexia or other reading disabilities" means indicators that include, but shall not be limited to, difficulty in acquiring language skills; inability to comprehend oral or written language; difficulty in rhyming words; difficulty in naming letters, recognizing letters, matching letters to sounds, and blending sounds when speaking and reading words; difficulty recognizing and remembering sight words; consistent transposition of number sequences, letter reversals, inversions, and substitutions; and trouble in replication of content.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-5.2(a), the Commissioner of Education shall distribute to each Board of Education information on screening instruments available to identify students who possess one or more potential indicators of dyslexia or other reading disabilities. The Commissioner shall provide information on the screening instruments appropriate for Kindergarten through grade two students and on screening instruments that may be suitably used for older students. The Board shall select and implement age-appropriate screening instruments for the early diagnosis of dyslexia and other reading disabilities.

STUDENTS 5339 SCREENING FOR DYSLEXIA (M)

In accordance with provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-5.2(b), the Commissioner shall also develop and distribute to each Board of Education guidance on appropriate intervention strategies for students diagnosed with dyslexia or other reading disabilities.

In the event a student is determined, through the screening conducted in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:40-5.3, to possess one or more potential indicators of dyslexia or other reading disabilities pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A 18A:40-5.1 et seq., the Board shall ensure the student receives a comprehensive assessment for the learning disorder. In the event a diagnosis of dyslexia or other reading disability is confirmed by the comprehensive assessment, the Board shall provide appropriate evidence-based intervention strategies to the student, including intense instruction on phonemic awareness, phonics and fluency, vocabulary, and reading comprehension.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:6-131, general education teachers in grades Kindergarten through three, special education teachers, basic skills teachers, English as a second language teachers, reading specialists, learning disabilities teacher consultants, and speech-language specialists are required to complete at least two hours of professional development each year on the screening, intervention, accommodation, and use of technology for students with reading disabilities, including dyslexia. The Board may make these professional development opportunities available to other instructional or support staff members as the Board deems appropriate. This requirement for professional development in reading disabilities may be part of the twenty hours of annual professional development required by N.J.A.C. 6A:9 et seq. Documentation of teachers' fulfillment of this professional development requirement shall be maintained in the district.

The Board of Education recognizes that as telecommunications and other new technologies shift, the manner in which information is accessed, communicated and transferred that those changes will alter the nature of teaching and learning. Access to telecommunications will allow students to explore databases, libraries, Internet sites, bulletin boards and the like while exchanging information with individuals throughout the world. The Board supports access by students to information sources but reserves the right to limit in-school use to materials appropriate to educational purposes. The Board directs the Superintendent to effect training of teaching staff members in skills appropriate to analyzing and evaluating such resources as to appropriateness for educational purposes.

Powers of the Board and Standards of Conduct

The Board recognizes that telecommunications may allow students access to information sources that may not have been pre-screened by educators using Board approved standards. The Board therefore adopts the following standards of conduct for the use of computer networks and declares unethical, unacceptable or illegal behavior as just cause for taking disciplinary action, limiting or revoking network access privileges and/or instituting legal action.

The Board provides access to computer network/computers to students and teachers for educational purposes only.

The Board retains the right to restrict or terminate student access to the computer network/computers at any time. The Board retains the right to have district personnel monitor network activity, in any form necessary, to maintain the integrity of the network and ensure its proper use.

Standards for Use of Computer Networks

Any individual engaging in the following actions when using computer networks/computers shall be subject to discipline or legal action:

Using the computer network(s)/computers for illegal, inappropriate or obscene purposes, or in support of such activities. Illegal activities are defined as activities that violate federal, state, local laws and regulations. Inappropriate activities are defined as those that

violate the intended use of the network. Obscene activities shall be defined as a violation of generally accepted social standards for use of publicly owned and operated communication vehicles.

Using the computer network(s)/computers to violate copyrights, institutional or third party copyrights, license agreements or other contracts.

Using the computer network(s) in a manner that:

Intentionally disrupts network traffic or crashes the network;

Degrades or disrupts equipment or system performance;

Uses the computing resources of the school district for commercial purposes, financial gain or fraud;

Steals data or other intellectual property;

Gains or seeks unauthorized access to the files of others or vandalizes the data of another user:

Gains or seeks unauthorized access to resources or entities;

Forges electronic mail messages or uses an account owned by others;

Invades privacy of others;

Posts anonymous messages;

Possesses any data which is a violation of this policy; and/or

Engages in other activities that do not advance the educational purposes for which computer network/computers are provided.

Internet Safety/Protection

The Englewood school district is in compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act and has installed technology protection filtering measures for all computers in the school district used by students, patrons and staff, including computers in media centers/libraries, that block and/or filter visual depictions that are obscene as defined in section 1460 of Title 18, United States Code; child pornography, as defined in section 2256 of Title 18, United States Code; are harmful to minors including any pictures, images, graphic image file or other visual depiction that taken as a whole and with respect to minors, appeals to a prurient interest in nudity, sex, or excretion; or depicts, describes, or represents in a patently offensive way, with respect to what is suitable for minors, sexual acts or conduct; or taken as a whole, lacks serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific value as to minors. Filtering will be disabled only for bona fide research or other lawful purposes. Minors will be educated, supervised, and monitored with regard to safe and appropriate online activities.

This policy addresses access by minors to inappropriate matter on the Internet and World Wide Web; the safety and security of minors when using electronic mail, chat rooms, instant messaging and other forms of direct electronic communications; unauthorized access, including hacking and other unlawful activities by minors online; unauthorized disclosures, use, and dissemination of personal identification information regarding minors; and measures designed to restrict minors' access to materials harmful to minors.

Notwithstanding blocking and/or filtering the visual depictions prohibited in the Children's Internet Protection Act, the Board shall determine other Internet material that is inappropriate for minors. The Board will provide have available copies of this policy for the public.

Inappropriate Network Usage

To the extent practical, steps shall be taken to promote the safety and security of users of the Englewood online computer network when using electronic mail, chat room, instant messaging, and other forms of direct electronic communications.

Education, Supervision and Monitoring

It shall be the responsibility of all members of the Englewood School Staff to educate, supervise and monitor appropriate usage of the online computers network and access to the Internet in accordance with this policy, the Children's Internet Protection Act, the Neighborhood Children's Internet Protection Act, and the Protecting Children in the 21st Century Act.

Procedures for the disabling or otherwise modifying any technology protection measures shall be the responsibility of Technology Director or designated representatives.

The Technology Director or designated representatives will provide age-appropriate training for students who use the Englewood Internet facilities. The training provided will be designed to promote the Englewood commitment to:

- a. The standards and acceptable use of Internet services as set forth in the Englewood Internet Safety Policy;
- b. Students safety with regards to:

- i. safety on the Internet
- ii. appropriate behavior while online, on social networking Web sites, and in chat rooms; and

- c. Compliance with the E-rate requirements of the Children's Internet Protection Act ("CIPA").

Following receipt of this training, the students will acknowledge that he/she received the training, understood it, and will follow the provisions of the District's acceptable use policies.

Consent Requirement

No student shall be allowed to use the computer network and the Internet unless they shall have filed a consent form signed by the student and/or his/her parent(s) or legal guardian(s).

Violations

Individuals violating this policy shall be subject to the consequences and other appropriate discipline, which includes but are not limited to:

- 1. Use of the network only under direct supervision;
- 2. Suspension of network privileges;
- 3. Revocation of network privileges;
- 4. Suspension of computer privileges;
- 5. Revocation of computer privileges;
- 6. Suspension from school;
- 7. Expulsion from school; and/or
- 8. Legal action and prosecution by the authorities.

5120 ASSIGNMENT OF PUPILS

The Board of Education directs the assignment of pupils to the schools, programs, and classes of this district consistent with the best interests of pupils and the best uses of the resources of this district.

Pupils shall generally attend the school located in the attendance area of their residence. The Superintendent may assign a pupil to a school other than that designated by the attendance area when such an exception is justified by circumstances and/or is in the best interests of the pupil. Every effort will be made to continue a pupil in the same elementary school once the pupil has been enrolled in that elementary school.

The Superintendent shall assign an incoming transfer pupils to the school in their attendance area of their residence provided the district's school or class size requirements can accommodate the pupil's enrollment that will afford the pupil the most appropriate educational opportunity. The Building Principal may assign pupils in his/her school to grades, classes, and groups on the basis of the needs of the pupil as well as the sound administration of the school.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:36-38.a.(1), a parent of twins or higher order multiples enrolled in the same Kindergarten through eighth grade level at the same public school may request, in writing, the children be placed in the same classroom or in separate classrooms. The Principal shall make the classroom placement requested in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:36-38.a.(1).

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:36-38a.(2), a parent of twins or higher order multiples enrolled in the same ninth through twelfth grade level at the same public school may request, in writing, the children be placed in the same classroom or in separate classrooms. The placement of such children shall be made at the discretion of the Principal in the best interest of the school and its pupils. The parent may appeal the Principal's classroom placement decision to the Board of Education, which shall make a final determination on the placement.

The written request must be submitted to the Principal no later than fourteen days after the first day of each school year. Parents of twins or higher order multiples enrolling after the school year commences shall request the classroom placement in writing no later than fourteen days after the first day of attendance.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:36-38.(2)(b), a Principal may, after consultation with the pupils' parent and teachers at the end of the initial grading period, request the Board make a different classroom placement determination for the twins or higher order multiples if the initial classroom placement is determined to be disruptive to any of the pupils in the class or classes, or if the Principal concludes the initial placement does not sufficiently support the pupils' academic or social development. Upon receiving such request, the Board shall make a final classroom placement determination.

"Higher order multiples" means triplets, quadruplets, quintuplets, or larger group siblings born at one birth. Provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:36-38 do not apply to a school district which maintains only a single classroom for the grade level in which twins or higher order multiples are enrolled. The parent shall be responsible for any additional pupil transportation costs that are incurred by the district as a result of providing the requested classroom placement, unless the district is in agreement with the placement. In the event one of the twins or higher order multiples receives special education services, the requested placement shall not be accommodated if the placement is inconsistent with a pupil's Individualized Education Plan.

Title: Reporting Pupil Progress

Report cards and Progress Reports are standard communications from the school. Parent conferences are regularly scheduled to allow parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and teachers to meet in order to discuss pupil progress. If the school experience is to be a vital, productive one for the children, then home-school contact must be constantly maintained, even beyond the district-mandated opportunities.

Parent(s) or legal guardian(s) appreciate hearing from the school as soon as possible when a problem arises. This allows the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) to get involved when their intervention can make a difference. Parent(s) or legal guardian(s) should be contacted when:

- 1. Children fail to do assignments, especially major work;
- 2. When they fail tests;
- 3. When they are having difficulty either academically or behaviorally in class.

Teachers should not allow more than two or three missed assignments to accumulate before contacting parent(s) or legal guardian(s), and certainly failed tests and quizzes, when occurring regularly, should be noted with written communication (electronic or otherwise).

Contact may take the form of phone calls or note sent home. In some cases, teacher may believe a phone call is necessary. In either case, parent(s) or legal guardian(s) can help if they are involved in the process.

Safe Harbor

In order to encourage early intervention and shared responsibility by all parties involved, with respect to grades 9-12, a safe harbor shall be available. Within the first three (3) quarters of an academic year, if a student receives a failure grade below fifty (50), then the student may request that such grade be lifted to a 50 ("Safe Harbor"). Such request shall only be granted by the teacher if the student or parent or legal guardian agrees to a performance improvement plan provided by the teacher designed to assist the student.

This Safe Harbor may only be used once per class subject, per academic year and is not to be available for the fourth quarter grade. If Safe Harbor is granted, the Safe Harbor grade of 50 as well as the original grade shall be recorded with the Safe Harbor grade used in the calculation of the final end-of-year grade.

Report Cards

Report cards are issued four times a year on the dates specified. Teachers hand out the Report of Pupil Progress to the pupils and collect the signed envelope. The original copy is placed in the child's folder annually.

Between the Issuing of Report Cards

It is assumed that between the issuing of report cards, teachers are at work with pupils on whatever plan the teacher has set up for individual help to the children to assist them toward achieving their grade level. With such pupils, particularly frequent informal reporting to parent(s) or legal guardian(s) is essential.

It is recommended that teachers keep in contact with parent(s) or legal guardian(s) through:

- 1. Informal notes: positive in tone, some congratulatory, some warnings of a dropping of interest, brief, friendly, etc.
- 2. Telephone calls: encouraging, warning, inquiring, investigating, cheery, informing, etc.

- 3. Informal contacts: through the sending home of a piece of work showing progress, etc.
- 4. Electronic Communication

Electronic Grade Books

Also referred to as a class register, marking book, or roll book, grade books are official records of pupil attendance and academic progress.

All electronic grade books are the property of the school and are kept as part of the permanent record of a pupil. They must be clear and neatly kept. Electronic grade books must reflect a variety of evaluative criteria.

Every pupil should be recorded accurately in the electronic grade book. A key or legend must be noted prominently in the electronic book to indicate what any symbol used, what it stands for, and how grades are determined. All work, whether it be homework, tests, projects, or other assignments, must be clearly labeled in the electronic book. Tests, quizzes, homework, and other instruments used to assess pupil progress are recorded in the electronic grade book. It is critical that teachers provide to pupils adequate numbers and variety of assignments in order to fairly and properly grade them.

Progress Reports

The purpose of the Progress Report is to communicate information about the status of pupil achievement and conduct accessible through the parent portal.

In deciding which pupils should receive Progress Reports, teachers should keep in mind the following:

- 1. A standard form progress report be sent home mid-way through the marking period to inform the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of the possible failure of the child... As well, it is advisable for pupils whose grade has dropped more than a whole letter grade (e.g. C to D) to receive a Progress Report.
- 2. No child is to receive a failure on his/her report card unless he/she has been issued a Progress Report.
- 3. Teachers should exercise professional judgment in determining which pupils receive Progress Reports. A useful guideline is to alert parent(s) or legal guardian(s) to any deviation or negative change in performance or conduct. Sending the form gives the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and pupil the opportunity to improve performance.

4. In addition to sending Progress Reports to stress the need for improvement, teachers are strongly encouraged to send Progress Reports to acknowledge outstanding achievement.

A progress report form is available to teachers to use in communicating with parent(s) or legal guardian(s). Although suggested dates are usually midway through the marking period, these reports may be sent home at any time during the school year and for any reason the teacher deems necessary (encouragement, warning of possible failure, disciplinary reasons, request for parent conference, and others). Teachers are obliged to contact parent(s) or legal guardian(s) regarding some deviation of the pupil's normal pattern of learning.

5530 SUBSTANCE ABUSE (M)

The Board of Education recognizes that a **student's** pupil's abuse of harmful substances seriously impedes that **student's** pupil's education and threatens the welfare of the entire school community. The Board is committed to the prevention of substance abuse and the rehabilitation of substance abusers by educational means, but will take the necessary and appropriate steps to protect the school community from harm and from exposure to harmful substances. Accordingly, the Board will establish **policies and procedures in operating programs to support the social, emotional, and physical development of students in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.1 et seq. The Board of Education will and maintain a comprehensive substance abuse intervention, prevention, and treatment referral program in the schools of this district.**

A. Definitions

N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-9 N.J.A.C. 6A:16-1.3; 6A:16-4.1 **et seq.**

The definitions as outlined in N.J.S.A. 18A:40A et seq., N.J.A.C. 6A:16 et seq., and those terms defined in Regulation 5530 shall be used for the purposes of this Policy and Regulation.

For the purposes of this policy:

"Substance" means alcoholic beverages, controlled dangerous substances, including anabolic steroids, as defined at N.J.S.A. 24:21-2 and N.J.S.A. 2C:35-2, any chemical or chemical compound which releases vapors or fumes causing a condition of intoxication, inebriation, excitement, stupefaction, or dulling of the brain or nervous system, including, but not limited to, glue containing a solvent having the property of releasing toxic vapors or fumes as defined at N.J.S.A. 2C:35-10.4 and over the counter and prescription medications which are improperly used to cause intoxication, inebriation, excitement, stupefaction, or dulling of the brain or nervous system.

"Substance abuse" means the consumption or use of any substance for purposes other than for the treatment of sickness or injury as prescribed or

administered by a person duly authorized by law to treat sick and injured human beings.

"Evaluation" means those procedures used by a certified or licensed professional to make a positive determination of a pupil's need for programs and services which extend beyond the general school program by virtue of learning, behavior, or health difficulties of the pupil or the pupil's family.

"Intervention" means those programs, services, and actions taken to identify and offer help to a pupil at risk for learning, behavior, or health difficulties.

"Referral for treatment" means those programs and services offered to a pupil or his or her family to help implement the recommendations of an evaluation or in response to the family's request for assistance with a learning, behavior, or health difficulty.

"School grounds" means and includes land, portions of land, structures, buildings, and vehicles, when used for the provision of academic or extracurricular programs sponsored by the school district or community provider and structures that support these buildings, such as school district wastewater treatment facilities, generating facilities, and other central services facilities including, but not limited to, kitchens and maintenance shops. School grounds also includes other facilities as defined in N.J.A.C. 6A:26-1.2, playgrounds, and recreational places owned by local municipalities, private entities or other individuals during those times when the school district has exclusive use of a portion of such land.

B. Discipline

N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-10; 18A:40A-11 N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.1(c)2.; 6A:16-6.3(a)

The Board prohibits the use, possession, and/or distribution of alcohol or other drugs on school grounds, including on school buses or at school-sponsored functions according to N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-9, 10, and 11.

A student pupil who uses, possesses, or distributes a alcohol or other drugs will be subject to discipline in accordance with the district's Code of Student Conduct. School authorities also have the authority

to impose a consequence on a student for conduct away from school grounds in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.5 substance, on or off school premises, will be subject to discipline. Discipline will be graded to the severity of the offenses, the nature of the problems and the pupil's needs. Discipline may include suspension or expulsion. The Board will may establish consequences for a student pupil not following through on the recommendations of an evaluation for alcohol or other drug abuse and related behaviors. The Superintendent and/or designee will notify the appropriate law enforcement agency pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-6.3(a).

C. Instruction

N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-1 et seq. N.J.A.C. 6A:16-3.1

The Board shall provide an instructional program on the nature of drugs, alcohol, anabolic steroids, tobacco, and controlled dangerous substances in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-3.1 comprehensive program of prevention, intervention, referral for evaluation, referral for treatment, and continuity of care for pupil alcohol, tobacco, and other drug abuse.

D. Identification, Evaluation, and Intervention Reporting, Notification, and Examination

N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-11 through 18A:40A-17 N.J.A.C. 6A:16-3.1; 6A:16-4.1; 6A:16-4.2; 6A:16-4.3

1. Alcohol or Other Drugs

- a. Any educational staff member or other professional to whom it appears that a student pupil may be currently under the influence of alcohol or other drugs as identified in N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-9 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.1(a), on school grounds, including on a school bus or at a school-sponsored function shall report the matter in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3(a)1.
- **b.** An immediate medical examination shall be conducted and a written report of the medical evaluation shall be furnished to the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of the **student** pupil,

the Building Principal, and the Superintendent in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3(a)2 **through** 4.3(a)8.

- c. If the written report of the medical examination is not provided within twenty-four hours of the referral of the student pupil, the student pupil shall be allowed to return to school until such time as a positive determination of alcohol or other drug use is received from the examining physician, unless the student was also removed for violating the Code of Student Conduct.
- d. If the written report of the medical evaluation verifies that alcohol or other drugs do not interfere with the student's pupil's physical or mental ability to perform in school, the student pupil shall be immediately returned to school. If there is a positive determination from the medical examination indicating the student's pupil's alcohol or other drug use interferes with his or her physical or mental ability to perform in school, the student pupil shall be returned to the care of the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) as soon as possible, and Aattendance at school shall not resume until a written report has been submitted to the parent, Principal, and Superintendent from a physician licensed to practice medicine or osteopathy who has examined the student that verifies the student's pupil's alcohol or other drug use no longer interferes with his or her physical and mental ability to perform in school.
- **e.** Removal of a **student** pupil with a disability shall be in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:14.
- f. While a **student** pupil is at home because of the medical evaluation or after the **student** pupil returns to school, an appropriately certified school staff member(s) will conduct an alcohol and other drug assessment of the **student** pupil and a reasonable investigation of the situation and may initiate referral alcohol or other drug abuse treatment in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3(a)12, 4.3(a)13, and 4.3(a)14.
- g. Disclosure to law enforcement authorities of the identity of a student in instances of alcohol and other drugs shall

2. Anabolic Steroids

- a. Whenever any teaching staff member, certified or non-certified school nurse, or other educational personnel has shall have reason to believe a **student** pupil has used or may be using anabolic steroids, that the person shall report the matter in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3(b)1.
- b. The Building Principal or designee upon receiving such report shall immediately notify the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and Superintendent and shall arrange for an examination of the **student** pupil as soon as possible to determine whether the **student** pupil has been using anabolic steroids in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3(b)2.
- c. Disclosure to law enforcement authorities of the identity of students in instances of anabolic steroids shall be in accordance with The Superintendent will disclose to law enforcement authorities the identity of the pupil pursuant to the requirements of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3(b)3.
- d. A written report of the examination shall be provided by the examining physician to the parent(s) or legal guardian(s), Building Principal, and Superintendent.
- **e.** If it is determined the **student** pupil has used anabolic steroids, an appropriately certified school staff member(s)

shall interview the **student** pupil and others to determine the extent of the **student's** pupil's involvement with and use of anabolic steroids and the possible need for referral for treatment in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3(b)5.

If the results of a referral for evaluation have positively determined the **student's** pupil's involvement with and use of anabolic steroids represents a danger to the **student's** pupil's health and well-being, an appropriately certified school staff member(s) shall initiate a referral for treatment to agencies and/or private practitioners as outlined in N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3(b)6.
- 3. A school employee who seizes or discovers alcohol or other drugs, or an item believed to be a controlled dangerous substance, including anabolic steroids, or drug paraphernalia, shall comply with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-6.4.
- 4. The Board will provide intervention, referral for evaluation, and referral for treatment services to those students that are affected by alcohol or other drug use in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.1(c)7.
- 5. Refusal or failure by a parent to comply with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-12 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3 shall be treated as a policy violation of the Compulsory Education Act, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-25 and 31, and child neglect laws, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 9:6-1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-11.

In-service training shall prepare teachers to instruct pupils on substance abuse and inform teachers about the nature of substances, the symptomatic behavior associated with substance abuse, the availability of rehabilitation and treatment programs, the legal aspects of substance abuse, and Board policy and regulations on substance abuse.

F. Parent Training Program/Outreach Program Outreach to Parents

N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-16; 18A:40A-17 N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.1(c)87.

The Board will provide an a parent training program/outreach program in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-16 and 17. to parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of pupils that includes information on the district's substance abuse curriculum, the identification of substance abusers, and rehabilitation organizations and agencies. The Superintendent is directed to develop the program in consultation with local agencies recommended by the Commissioner and to offer the program at times and in places convenient to parent(s) or legal guardian(s) on school premises or in other suitable facilities.

G. Records and Confidentiality of Records

§408 of the Drug Abuse Prevention, Treatment, and Rehabilitation Act, 42 USC, and Implementing Regulations,

Information concerning regarding a student's pupil's involvement in a school intervention or treatment program for alcohol or other drug abuse shall be kept strictly confidential according to 42 CFR Part 2, N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-7.1 and 7.2, N.J.A.C. 6A:16-3.2, and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-6.5 in accordance with §408 of the Drug Abuse Prevention, Treatment, and Rehabilitation Act, 42 U.S.C. 290 ce 3, and implementing regulations, 42 CFR Part 2.

If an elementary or secondary student pupil who is participating involved in a school-based drug or alcohol abuse counseling program provides information during the course of a counseling session in that program which indicates that the student's pupil's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) or other person residing in the student's pupil's household is dependent upon or illegally using a substance as that term is defined in N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-9, that information shall be kept confidential and may be disclosed only in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-7.1 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-3.2 the pupil's written consent, to another person or entity whom the pupil specifies in writing in the case of a secondary pupil, or to a member of the pupil's immediate family or the appropriate school personnel in the case of an elementary pupil; pursuant to a court order; to a person engaged in a bona fide research purpose, except that no names or other information identifying the pupil or the person with respect to whose substance abuse the information was provided, shall be made available to the researcher; or to the Division of Youth and Family Services or to a law enforcement agency, if the information would cause a person to reasonably suspect that the elementary or secondary pupil or another child may be an abused or neglected child.

Any educational or non-educational **Board employee** school staff member who in good faith reports a **student** pupil to the Building Principal or designee in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3 shall not be liable in civil damages as a result of making such a report, as specified in N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-13 and 14.

J. Reporting Students Pupils to Law Enforcement Authorities

The Superintendent, or designee, shall disclose to law enforcement authorities the identity report of a student pupils to law enforcement authorities if the staff member has reason to believe a pupil reasonably believed to be in possession of a controlled dangerous substance, including anabolic steroids, or related paraphernalia is unlawfully possessing or in any way involved or implicated in the distribution activities regarding of controlled dangerous substances, including anabolic steroids, or drug paraphernalia, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.1(c)9 6.3(a). The Superintendent or designee shall will not disclose the identity of the student report pupils who has have voluntarily sought and participated in an appropriate treatment or counseling program for an alcohol or other drug substance abuse problem provided the student pupil is not reasonably believed to be involved or implicated in a current drug-distribution activitiesy.

The Superintendent or designee may, but need not disclose to law enforcement authorities the identity of a **student** pupil suspected to be under the influence of alcohol and/or **other drugs** controlled dangerous substances, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.1(c)9.i. 4.3(a), or a pupil suspected to have used or who may be using anabolic steroids, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3(b), and who is referred for a medical evaluation,

5533 PUPIL SMOKING (M)

The Board of Education recognizes the use of tobacco presents a health hazard that can have serious implications both for the smoker and the nonsmoker and that smoking habits developed by the young may have lifelong deleterious harmful consequences.

For the purposes of this Ppolicy, "smoking" means the burning of, inhaling the smoke from, exhaling the smoke from, or the possession of a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, or any other matter or substance which contains tobacco or any other matter that can be smoked, including and the use of smokeless tobacco and snuff, or the inhaling or exhaling of smoke or vapor from an electronic smoking device.

For the purpose of this Policy, "electronic smoking device" means an electronic device that can be used to deliver nicotine or other substances to the person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to, an electronic cigarette, cigar, cigarillo, or pipe.

For the purposes of this Ppolicy, "school buildings" and "school grounds" means and includes land, portions of land, structures, buildings, and vehicles, owned, operated, or used for the provision of academic or extracurricular programs sponsored by the district or community provider and structures that support these buildings, such as school wastewater treatment facilities, generating facilities, and any other central facilities including, but not limited to, administrative buildings, kitchens, and maintenance shops, and garages. "School buildings" and "school grounds" also include athletic stadiums; swimming pools; any associated structures or related equipment tied to such facilities including, but not limited to, grandstands; greenhouses; garages; facilities used for non-instructional or non-educational purposes; and any structure, building, or facility used solely for school administration. "School buildings" and "sSchool grounds" also includes other facilities as defined in N.J.A.C. 6A:26-1.2; playgrounds; and other recreational places owned by the local municipalities, private entities, or other individuals during those times when the school district has exclusive use of a portion of such land.

The Board prohibits smoking by pupils at any time **in school buildings and** on any school grounds as defined above, at events sponsored by the Board away from school, and on any transportation vehicle supplied by the Board.

A sign indicating smoking is prohibited **in school buildings and** on school grounds as defined above will be posted at each public entrance **of a school building** in accordance with law. The sign shall also indicate violators are subject to a fine. Pupils who violate the provisions of this **P**policy shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary measures **in accordance with the district's Pupil Discipline/Code of Conduct** and may be subject to fines in accordance with law.

In the event the **a** pupil is found to have violated this **P**policy and the law, the Principal or designee may file a complaint with the appropriate Municipal Court or other agency with jurisdiction as defined in N.J.A.C. 8:6-9.1(c).

[Optional

A pupil found to have violated this pPolicy and the law may be required to participate in additional educational programs to help the pupil understand the **harmful** deleterious effects **of** upon smokersing and to discourage the use of tobacco products. These programs may include, but are not limited to, counseling, smoking information programs, and/or smoking cessation programs sponsored by this school district or available through approved outside agencies.]

The Board directs that the health curriculum include instruction in the potential hazards of the use of tobacco. All school staff members shall, by example and persuasion, make every reasonable effort to discourage pupils from developing the habit of smoking.

The Board of Education will comply with any provisions of a municipal ordinance which provides restrictions on or prohibitions against smoking equivalent to, or greater than, those provided in N.J.S.A. 26:3D-55 through N.J.S.A. 26:3D-63.

5600 STUDENT DISCIPLINE/CODE OF CONDUCT (M)

The Board of Education adopts this Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy to establish standards, policies, and procedures for positive student development and student behavioral expectations on school grounds and, as appropriate, for conduct away from school grounds. Every student enrolled in this district shall observe promulgated rules and regulations and the discipline imposed for infraction of those rules.

The Superintendent of Schools will establish a process for the annual review and update of the district's Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation that may involve a committee of parents, students, and community members that represent, where possible, the composition of the district's schools and community. The Superintendent will report to the Board the process used for the annual review of this Policy and Regulation and will recommend to the Board updates, if any, to the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation.

The Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation shall be disseminated annually to all school staff, students, and parents. The Board of Education shall provide to all employees annual training on the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation, which shall include training on the prevention, intervention, and remediation of student conduct that violates the district's Policy and Regulation. Information on the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation shall be incorporated into the orientation for new employees.

The Board provides for the district's Student Discipline/Code of Conduct's equitable application. Student discipline and the Code of Student Conduct will be applied without regard to race; color; religion; ancestry; national origin; nationality; sex; gender; sexual orientation; gender identity or expression; martial, domestic-partnership, or civil union; mental, physical or sensory disability; or by any other distinguishing characteristic, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5.-1 et seq.

For students with disabilities, subject to Individualized Education Programs in accordance with 20 U.S.C. §1400 et seq., the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act and accommodation plans under 29 U.S.C. §§ 794 and 705(20), the Code of Student Conduct shall be implemented in accordance with the components of the applicable plans.

The Student Discipline/Code of Conduct is established for the purposes outlined in N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(b).

Policy and Regulation 5600 include a description of student responsibilities that include expectations for academic achievement, behavior, and attendance, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8 and 13.1; a description of behaviors that will result in suspension or expulsion, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2; and a description of student rights pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(c)3.i through vii.

The Board of Education approves the use of comprehensive behavioral supports that promote positive student development and the students' abilities to fulfill the behavioral expectations established by the Board. These behavioral supports include, but are not limited to, positive reinforcement for good conduct and academic success including the programs that honor and reward student conduct and academic achievement; supportive intervention and referral services including those services outlined in Policy 2417; remediation of problem behaviors that take into account the behavior's nature, the students' developmental ages and the students' histories of problem behaviors and performance; and for students with disabilities, the behavior interventions and supports shall be determined and provided pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:14.

Policy and Regulation 5600 include a description of school responses to violations of behavioral expectations established by the Board that, at a minimum, are graded according to the severity of the offenses, and consider the developmental ages of the student offenders and their histories of inappropriate behaviors pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(c)5.

Students are required to be in compliance with Policy and Regulation 5200 – Attendance pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6 and Policy and Regulation 5512 – Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.7.

The Building Principal shall maintain a current list of community-based health and social service provider agencies available to support a student and the student's family, as appropriate, and a list of legal resources available to serve the community.

The Building Principal or designee shall have the authority to assign discipline to students. School authorities also have the right to impose a consequence on a student for conduct away from school grounds that is consistent with the district's

Code of Student Conduct pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.5. This authority shall be exercised only when it is reasonably necessary for the student's physical or emotional safety, security, and well-being or for reasons relating to the safety, security, and well-being of other students, staff, or school grounds, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:25-2 and 18A:37-2. This authority shall be exercised only when the conduct that is the subject of the proposed consequence materially and substantially interferes with the requirements of appropriate discipline in the operation of the school. Consequences pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.5 shall be handled in accordance with Policy and Regulation 5600, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1, and as appropriate, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7-2, 6A:16-7.3, or 6A:16-7.4. School authorities shall respond to harassment, intimidation, or bullying that occurs off school grounds, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-14 and 15.3 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-1.3, 7.1, and 7.7.

Consequences and appropriate remedial action for a student who commits one or more acts of harassment, intimidation, or bullying may range from positive behavioral interventions up to and including suspension or expulsion. The factors for determining consequences and remedial measures and examples of consequences and remedial measures are listed in Policy 5512 – Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying. Consequences for a student who commits an act of harassment, intimidation, or bullying shall be varied and graded according to the nature of the behavior, the developmental age of the student and the student's history of problem behaviors and performance, and shall be consistent with this Policy and the school district's Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1. Remedial measures for one or more acts of harassment, intimidation, or bullying shall be designed to correct the problem behavior; prevent another occurrence of the problem; protect and provide support for the victim of the act; and take corrective action for documented systemic problems related to harassment, intimidation, or bullying.

Consequences and remedial measures to address acts or incidents of dating violence at school shall be consistent with the school district's Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy. The factors for determining consequences and remedial measures and examples of consequences and remedial measures are included in Policy and Regulation 5519 – Dating Violence at School and shall be used to address the act or incident as well as serve as remediation, intervention, education, and prevention for all individuals involved. The responses shall be tiered with consideration given to the seriousness and the number of previous occurrences of acts or incidents in which both the victim and aggressor have been

involved. Consequences for acts or incidents of dating violence at school may range from admonishment to suspension or expulsion. Retaliation towards the victim of any act or incident of dating violence shall be considered when administering consequences to the aggressor based on the severity of the act or incident. Remedial measures/interventions for acts or incidents of dating violence at school may include, but are not limited to: parent conferences, student counseling (all students involved in the act or incident), peer support groups, corrective instruction or other relevant learning or service experiences, supportive student interventions (Intervention and Referral Services - I&RS), behavioral management plans, and/or alternative placements.

Any student to be disciplined shall be provided the due process procedures for students and their families as set forth in Policy and Regulation 5600 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.2 through 7.4.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.8, when a student transfers to a public school district from another public school district, all information in the student's record related to disciplinary actions taken against the student by the school district and any information the school district has obtained pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2A:4A-60, Disclosure of Juvenile Information, Penalties for Disclosure, shall be provided to the receiving public school district, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:36-19(a) and N.J.A.C. 6A:32-7.5.

The Superintendent may be required to submit a report annually to the New Jersey Department of Education on student conduct, including all student suspensions and expulsions, and the implementation of the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy in accordance with the format prescribed by the Commissioner of Education. The Superintendent shall report to the Commissioner of Education each incident of violence, including harassment, intimidation, and bullying, vandalism, and alcohol and other drug offenses, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3, in the school district utilizing the Electronic Violence and Vandalism Reporting System, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-5.3.

6113 E-RATE

The Telecommunications Act of 1996 provides for a Federal funded program called the Universal Service Fund (USF) or E-Rate that is designed to provide affordable access to telecommunications services for all eligible schools and libraries in the United States. The program provides discounts on telecommunications services, Internet access and internal connections, and provides discounts of up to ninety percent to assist most schools and libraries in the United States to obtain affordable telecommunications and Internet access. The purpose of this Policy is to provide guidance and direction so the Englewood School District can participate in the E-Rate program and this Policy assigns E-Rate responsibilities to school staff members to ensure the school district is in compliance with Federal Communications Commission and E-Rate participation requirements.

Full access to telecommunications and information resources makes possible the rich teaching and learning that take place in schools and libraries. For these institutions to provide the high level of service necessary for their pupils and patrons to participate fully in American society, the costs can be great. Telecommunications and Internet access, the hardware needed for assembling local networks, and maintenance of systems and machines can stretch budgets that are already under stress.

Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) is responsible for processing applications for support, confirming eligibility, and reimbursing telecommunications companies and Internet access providers for discounted services delivered to eligible schools and libraries. USAC reviews applications, invoices, and other program information to ensure that applicants and service providers follow rules for the program set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). USAC also conducts Schools and Libraries Program beneficiary audits to ensure program compliance.

Eligible participants include public and most non-profit Kindergarten through grade twelve schools as well as all public and many private libraries. All program participants must carry out a competitive bidding process to select the most cost-effective companies to provide the goods and/or services requested.

Once eligible school districts complete the competitive bidding process, applicants submit to USAC all information required to demonstrate compliance with the rules required for receiving support. After approving applications, USAC notifies applicants of a commitment to fund the acquisition of services. When applicants start receiving services, USAC makes payments to the companies selected to provide those services.

Funding may be requested under five categories of service: Telecommunications, Telecommunications Services, Internet Access, Internal Connections, and Basic Maintenance of Internal Connections. Discounts for support depend on the level of poverty and the urban/rural status of the population served and range from twenty percent to ninety percent of the costs of eligible services.

Eligible participants include public and most non-profit Kindergarten through grade twelve schools as well as all public and many private libraries. Guidance on the eligibility requirements to participate in the E-Rate Program is available on the USAC website at www.usac.org.

This Policy provides the steps to be used by this school district to receive E-Rate discounts.

Technology Plan

A Technology Plan is a plan prepared by the school district that explains how telecommunications and information technology will be used to achieve educational goals, curriculum reforms, or library service improvements. School districts applying for Priority 2 services (Internal Connections and Basic Maintenance) must prepare a technology plan.

In general, Technology Plans should not cover more than three years. Technology Plans should be written (at least in draft form) before an FCC Form 470 is posted to the USAC website in order to support the requests for services featured on that form, cover all twelve months of the funding year, and be approved by a USAC-certified Technology Plan Approver (TPA) before an FCC Form 486 is filed and before services start.

Technology Plans must, at a minimum, contain: clear goals and a realistic strategy for using telecommunications and information technology to improve education or library services; a professional development strategy to ensure that members of the staff know how to use these new technologies to improve education or library services; a needs assessment of the telecommunication services, hardware, software, and other services that will be needed to improve education or library services; and an evaluation process that enables the school district to monitor progress toward the specified goals and make mid-course corrections in response to new developments and opportunities as they arise.

In order to be eligible for E-Rate funding, the school district must have its Technology Plan approved for E-Rate use by the New Jersey Department of Education.

The Director of Technology shall be responsible for developing the school district's technology plans and submitting the plans for approval to the New Jersey Department of Education.

Competitive Bidding Process

A competitive bidding process is a formal process to identify and request the products and services a school district needs so potential service providers can review these requests and submit bids. To open the process, the school district must post an FCC Form 470 to the USAC website and, if the school district chooses to or if required by the New Jersey Public School Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1 et seq., issue a Request for Proposals or prepare bid specifications.

The school district will determine eligible E-Rate funding products and services based on the needs as outlined in the school district's approved New Jersey Department of Education Technology Plan or as identified by the Superintendent, in consultation with school district administrative and technology staff members.

The entity that will run the competitive bidding process (which may be the school district, a State procurement agency, or another entity that the district has authorized to negotiate on its behalf with a Letter of Agency (LOA) or similar document) must file the FCC Form 470 (Description of Services Requested and Certification) and must be prepared to receive and evaluate bids and negotiate with service providers.

The FCC Form 470 for the upcoming funding year is generally available online on the USAC website a year before the start of the funding year. FCC Form 470 can be filed for a particular funding year as soon as it becomes available online. The entity filing the FCC Form 470 must wait at least twenty-eight days after the date that the FCC Form 470 is posted and the date the RFP is issued, whichever is later, before closing the competitive bidding process. Services provided under tariff or on a month-to-month basis require an FCC Form 470 to be posted each year. If, however, a multi-year contract results from the competitive bidding process, it is not necessary to post a new FCC Form 470 until a new contract is required.

After the FCC Form 470 is posted to the USAC website, USAC will issue an FCC Form 470 Receipt Notification Letter (RNL). This letter includes much of the information featured on the form, provides a means to correct certain errors, and discusses the next steps in the application process. The Business Administrators and E-Rate consultant will review the RNL to ensure the products and services included in the RNL are accurate and will notify USAC within fifteen days of the postmark date of the RNL if there are any required revisions. If an unallowable correction on the Form 470 is identified, the district must post and certify a new Form 470 within the filing window. A new Form 470 must be posted at least twenty-eight days prior to signing a contract or selecting a service provider.

The entity filing an FCC Form 470 can issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) in addition to the FCC Form 470. For the purposes of this Policy, an RFP is a formal bidding document that describes the project and requested services in sufficient detail so that potential bidders understand the scope, location, and any other requirements. The district's formal bidding documents must indicate the district will accept bids on equal and/or equivalent goods or services. The district is not required to issue an RFP unless the State or local procurement rules or regulations require the district to do so. If the district issued or intends to issue an RFP, that information must be included on the FCC Form 470 along with information on how to obtain a copy of the RFP.

The entity filing the FCC Form 470 must ensure the competitive bidding process is open and fair. All bidders must be treated the same and no bidder can have advance knowledge of the project information. There shall be no secrets in the bidding process, such as information shared with one bidder but not with others. All bidders shall know what is required of them.

Service providers and potential service providers cannot offer or provide gifts to applicants and no school district employee or official shall solicit or accept a gift of any value from a service provider or potential service provider. These prohibitions are in effect during the entire funding year. In addition, the value of free services (e.g., price reductions, promotional offers, "free" products) must generally be deducted from the pre-discount cost of funding requests.

The competitive bidding process and the FCC 470 RNL process shall be coordinated and supervised by the Business Administrator and E-Rates Consultant. (Insert the school district's procedures for coordinating the competitive bidding process and the FCC 470 RNL process.)

Selecting Service Providers

After the close of the competitive bidding process, the school district shall evaluate the bids received and choose the bid that is the most cost-effective with the price of the E-Rate eligible products and services as the primary factor. The district may consider as many factors in this evaluation as it wants, but the price of the E-Rate eligible products and services must be included as a factor and must be weighted more heavily than any other single factor. The FCC Form 470 and the Request for Proposals (RFP), if issued, must both have been publicly available for a twenty-eight day period, whichever is later, before the district can close its competitive bidding process. Any evaluation of bids shall be in accordance with the New Jersey Public School Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1 et seq. and FCC Competitive Bidding Rules.

Preparing a Bid Evaluation Matrix helps evaluate bids and also provides documentation of the process followed to select a service provider. The Bid Evaluation Matrix shall be completed by E-Rates Consultant. All copies of bids (successful and unsuccessful), evaluation criteria, vendor contact information, and the signed contract shall be retained in accordance with the document retention guidance outlined in this Policy. The district can receive services:

- 1. Under tariff or on a month-to-month basis Services such as basic telephone service or Internet access may not require a contract. The district must post an FCC Form 470 and open a competitive bidding process for these services each year.
- 2. Under a contract Tariffed or month-to-month services provided under a contract are considered to be contracted services. Also, internal connections and basic maintenance products and services are generally provided under a contract. If the district posts an FCC Form 470 and signs a multi-year contract resulting from that posting, the district does not have to post an FCC Form 470 or open a competitive bidding process again for the life of that contract.

If the district intends to receive services under contract, the contract must have been preceded by the filing of an FCC Form 470 (NOTE: If the district has an existing contract that was not signed as a result of posting an FCC Form 470, the district can post an FCC Form 470 for the next funding year and consider its existing contract as a bid response. The district must evaluate any other bids received as well, as the district's existing contract may not be the most cost-effective solution.). The entity that filed the FCC Form 470 must also have followed the Schools and Libraries Program's competitive bidding rules and all applicable State and local contract and procurement rules and regulations.

The Board shall approve all contracts for products or services if the products or services were bid in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1 et seq., where an RFP was used to obtain proposals, or any contract to be awarded in excess of \$6,000.00.

The district may sign a contract, which may be for one or more years and may include the option of voluntary extensions. If the district is eligible, it can purchase services from a State master contract; however, the district must file their own FCC Form 470 and use the State master contract pricing as a bid to consider in evaluating all potential bids. If the district is eligible to purchase from a State master contract, but that contract will expire before or during the upcoming funding year, the district and the State of New Jersey should follow the guidance for State replacement contracts (See State Master Contracts section on USAC website at www.usac.org).

The evaluation of bids and the selection of service providers or recommending service providers to the Board of Education, if required, shall be the responsibility of the Business Administrators. (Insert the school district's procedures for the evaluation of bids, selecting service providers and signing contracts as applicable.)

Applying for Discounts

To apply for Schools and Libraries Program discounts, the district must file an FCC Form 471 to provide USAC with information about the services being requested and the eligible discount(s). USAC will review the request, may ask for additional information, and will then issue a funding decision.

All contracts, if contracts are required, must be signed and dated before the FCC Form 471 is submitted to USAC.

The FCC Form 471 must be filed during a specific application window each year. In general, the application filing window opens about six months before the start of the funding year and is open for about two and a half months. All applications received or postmarked before the close of the filing window are considered as having arrived on the same day, and have priority over those submitted after the filing window has closed. The specific opening and closing dates of the filing window are published in advance on the USAC website.

After the FCC Form 471 is certified online or on paper, USAC will issue an FCC Form 471 Receipt Acknowledgment Letter (RAL). The RAL shall be reviewed by the Technology Director within twenty calendar days of the school district's receipt of the RAL. This letter includes much of the information featured on the form, provides a means to correct certain errors, and discusses the next steps in the application process. The information the district must provide on the FCC Form 471 includes the following:

- 1. Entity numbers (also called Billed Entity Numbers (BENs)) for all entities receiving service (recipients of service), together with specific information for each entity (Block 4 of the form).
- 2. NCES and/or FSCS codes for entities receiving service (Block 4).
- 3. Information on telephone and Internet access connections and speeds (Block 2).

The FCC also sanctions other mechanisms to determine a school's or district's level of need, as long as those mechanisms are based on - or do not exceed - the same measure of poverty used by NSLP.

The Business Administrator will verify the student data used to calculate discounts in accordance with the eligibility requirements of the National School Lunch Program and the New Jersey Department of Agriculture.

- 2. Specific information on each service or set of services the district is requesting, including:
 - a. Name and Service Provider Identification Number (SPIN) of the service provider;
 - b. Cost of the service;
 - c. Contract number and other contract details (if there is a contract);
 - d. Start and end dates of service;
 - e. Worksheet(s) identifying the entity or set of entities receiving each service; and
 - f. A detailed description of products and services, referred to as an Item 21 attachment. These products and services shall be reviewed by the E-Rate Consultant to ensure they are eligible for E-Rate funding according to the current Eligible Service List as published on the USAC website.

The district's certified FCC Form 471 and Item 21 attachment(s) are due on or before the close of the application filing window.

The school district is only able to receive support for internal connections in two of every five funding years. This applies to individual recipients (individual schools, libraries, or non-instructional facilities). For each eligible entity, the five-year period begins in any year in which that entity receives support for internal connections. Entities can use two years within any five-year period, looking back and looking forward from that year. FY 2007 was the first year that entities were ineligible for internal connections funding based on this rule (for

entities that received funding for both FY 2005 and FY 2006 internal connections requests). USAC provides a Two-in-Five Tool that provides information on the school district's eligibility for funding of internal connections requests for multiple funding years. This rule does not apply to telecommunications and Internet access services or to basic maintenance of internal connections services categorized as Priority 2. Basic maintenance services are eligible for support each year if they are necessary to the operation of the internal connections network. The school district will be considered to have used a year if it has been specified in the FCC Form 471 Block 4 worksheet cited on one or more approved internal connections funding requests in that year.

The Business Administrator shall be responsible for applying for discounts from the School and Libraries Program.

Application Review

After the district files an FCC Form 471 and the associated Item 21 attachment(s) within the filing window, Program Integrity Assurance (PIA) reviewers at USAC will check the information on the form for completeness and accuracy and may have additional questions for the district to answer. All applications go through an initial review and a final review, which may involve questions from PIA reviewers on one or more of the following topics:

- 1. Eligibility of the entities receiving service (this review step generally occurs for entities that have not appeared on a previous application);
- 2. Eligibility of the services requested;
- 3. Discount calculations;
- 4. Contracts;
- 5. The competitive bidding process; and/or
- 6. Any discrepancies between the information on the funding request and the associated Item 21 attachment.

The district must indicate the preferred mode of contact on FCC Form 471 Item 6c (telephone), 6d (fax), or 6e (email). Because PIA reviewers send written questions by fax or email, they will call the district and ask for a fax number or email address if the district indicated telephone as the preferred mode of contact. The district will have fifteen days to respond to PIA questions. The district can ask for more time, if needed, but a request for additional time will add more time to the review process.

Some applications undergo additional review - Selective Review is one example - where PIA reviewers may request more detailed responses that can include:

- 1. Documentation of the competitive bidding and service provider (vendor) selection processes;
- 2. Documentation of the district's ability to pay the non-discount share (the portion of the cost of eligible products and services not reimbursed by USAC); and/or
- 3. Proof the district has obtained necessary resources (i.e., hardware, software, staff training, electrical capacity, retrofitting) that are not eligible for Schools and Libraries Program discounts, but that must be in place to make effective use of the discounted services.

As part of the review process, PIA reviewers may be required to change the category of service on a Funding Request Number (FRN). If PIA reviewers discover there are ineligible services in a funding request, the district will be able to remove them or move them to a separate request to avoid denial under the thirty percent rule. After the PIA review process has been completed, USAC issues a Funding Commitment Decision Letter (FCDL) containing USAC's decisions on the district's funding requests. The district should review this letter carefully, as it contains important information both for planning the start of the receipt of services and for completing the additional steps in the application process. If the district disagrees with one or more of the decisions in the FCDL, the district can appeal to USAC or to the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

The Technology Director shall be responsible for preparing and providing the requested documentation for the application review(s). (Insert the school district's procedures for preparing and providing the documentation for application review.)

Starting Services

After the district receives the Funding Commitment Decision Letter (FCDL) and the delivery of services has started, the E-Rates Consultant shall be responsible for: filing a FCC Form 486 to inform USAC that services for which the district has been approved for discounts have started and invoicing can begin; assuring the district's Technology Plan, if required, has been approved by a USAC-certified Technology Plan Approver and the district is in compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA), 47 CFR 54.520, or CIPA does not apply because the district's application is only for Telecommunications Services and/or Interconnected Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) services. CIPA requirements include an internet safety policy, a technology protection measure, a public notice hearing or meeting, the monitoring of online activities of minors, and providing education to minors on appropriate online behavior.

The Business Administrator shall be responsible for reviewing the originating purchase order and/or contract to ensure the products and services on the purchase order or contract have been received in the district, and the invoice from the provider is consistent with the purchase order/contract and products and services received.

In advance of the start of services, the district and its service provider(s) should have a conversation about the details of the services the district will be receiving. The district should also review the contract, if there is a contract. In addition, the district should determine whether the district or its service provider will invoice USAC for the discounted amount of the cost of the services. Under certain circumstances, advanced installation of some Priority 1 components can occur before July 1 of the funding year.

The district can file an FCC Form 486 early (before services have started) if the district:

- 1. Received its FCDL; and
- 2. Services will start in the month of July; and
- 3. The district can truthfully make all of the certifications in Block 4, which include compliance with the technology plan and CIPA requirements; and
- 4. The district is filing the form on or before July 31.

NOTE: Early filing using Item 6a on the FCC Form 486 is an option if and only if services will start within the month of July of the relevant funding year, all relevant certifications in Block 4 can be accurately made, and the FCC Form 486 is postmarked on or before July 31 of the Funding Year.

The district must be in compliance with the Schools and Libraries Program's technology plan requirements and the requirements of CIPA before services start. USAC cannot pay discounts on services received during a period of time when the district was not in compliance. USAC may review the district's compliance with these requirements either before or after the district's FCC Form 486 is processed.

The FCC Form 486 must be certified no later than one hundred twenty days after the service start date or one hundred twenty days after the date of the FCDL, whichever is later. Filing late can result in a reduction in funding; the later the filing date, the greater the reduction.

After USAC completes the processing of the district's FCC Form 486, USAC will issue an FCC Form 486 Notification Letter. This letter features the information the district provided on the form and outlines the next steps in the application process. If USAC was required to adjust the service start date for a funding request due to a compliance issue, the service start date in the letter will be marked with an asterisk and followed by an explanation of the reason for the adjustment.

To be eligible for program support, eligible services must be received during a specific period of time related to the particular funding year for which discounts are requested. Recurring services must be delivered during the relevant funding year (July 1 through June 30). In general, non-recurring services must be delivered and installed between July 1 of the relevant funding year and September 30, following the June 30 close of that funding year (i.e., fifteen months after the beginning of the funding year). However, certain recipients have received or may receive extensions of the deadline for delivery and installation of non-recurring services. Such extensions can occur for various reasons, including:

1. A Funding Commitment Decision Letter (FCDL) was issued by USAC on or after March 1 of the funding year for which support was authorized.

- 2. Operational SPIN changes or service substitutions were approved by USAC on or after March 1 of the funding year.
- 3. The school district or service provider requested an extension because the service provider was unable to complete delivery and installation for reasons beyond the service provider's control.
- 4. The school district or service provider requested an extension because the service provider has been unwilling to complete delivery and installation after USAC withheld payment for those services on a properly-submitted invoice for more than sixty days after submission of the invoice.

USAC will automatically extend the service delivery deadline in situations where criteria (1) or (2) listed above are met. Recipients of non-recurring services that wish to satisfy criterion (3) must submit documentation to USAC on or before September 30 following the close of the funding year. A recipient of service that meets criterion (4) must certify to USAC on or before September 30 following the close of the funding year that its service provider was unwilling to deliver or install non-recurring services before the expiration of the deadline after USAC had withheld payment for those services on a properly submitted invoice for more than sixty days after the submission of the invoice.

The Business Administrator shall be responsible to coordinate the filing of the FCC Form 486. (Insert the school district's procedures for coordinating the filing of FCC Form 486.)

Invoicing

After USAC has processed the district's FCC Form 486, the district or its service provider can begin the process of invoicing USAC for the discount share of the approved eligible services. The Technology Director, in consultation with the school business office staff member responsible for authorizing the payment of invoices, shall be responsible for reviewing the originating purchase order and/or contract, the products or services on the purchase order or contract have been received by district, and the invoice from the service provider is consistent with the purchase order or contract. The Business Administrator shall only submit reimbursement requests to USAC for eligible products and services once the district's non-discounted portion is paid.

There are two methods that can be used to invoice USAC. Once USAC has processed an invoice for a funding request, that method of invoicing must be used for that particular funding request for the remainder of the invoicing process.

1. Invoice Method #1

Applicants file FCC Form 472, Billed Entity Applicant Reimbursement (BEAR) Form if the district paid the service provider in full for the services and want to be reimbursed for the discount amount. The service provider must approve the form before it is submitted to USAC. USAC will review the invoice and process a payment to the service provider if payment is approved. The service provider then passes the reimbursement on to the applicant.

2. Invoice Method #2

Service providers file FCC Form 474, Service Provider Invoice (SPI) Form if they have provided discounted bills to their customer and want to be reimbursed for the discount amount.

Under both invoice methods, USAC will review the invoice and process a payment to the service provider if payment is approved. Applicants are required to pay the non-discount portion of the cost of the services.

The district can file a BEAR Form after all of the following have occurred:

- 1. The district received a Funding Commitment Decision Letter (FCDL); and
- 2. The district has filed, and USAC has processed, an FCC Form 486; and
- 3. The district's service provider has filed an FCC Form 473, Service Provider Annual Certification (SPAC) Form (disbursements cannot be made until the SPAC has been filed with USAC); and
- 4. The district paid for the service in full; and
- 5. In general, the services must have been delivered (an exception can be made for progress payments specified in a contract).

The district must file, and the service provider must approve, BEAR Forms no later than one hundred twenty days after the last day to receive service or one hundred twenty days after the FCC Form 486 Notification Letter date, whichever is later. If the deadline is missed the district can request an invoice deadline extension.

After processing the district's BEAR Form, USAC will issue a BEAR Notification Letter with information about the processing of the district's form. If the district needs more information about a reduction or denial of payment, the district should refer to the invoice error code(s) featured on the letter.

After the end of each calendar quarter, USAC issues a Quarterly Disbursement Report that details all invoicing activity, BEAR Forms, and SPI Forms processed during that quarter for all funding years. This report allows the district to track all of the invoicing activity related to the district's Billed Entity Number (BEN). The district can initiate an invoice check if it would like to be notified each time the district's service provider submits a SPI Form.

The Technology Director shall be responsible to ensure that all eligible E-Rate goods and services have been received, the service provider invoices are correct and the district's non-discounted portion of the invoice has been paid before submitting invoices to USAC. The E-Rate Consultant shall review the eligible reimbursements that are made to any service provider to ensure the amounts being billed to USAC and the school district equal 100% of the invoiced amount. The E-Rate Consultant will notify USAC and the provider in the event there are any problems with this reconciliation. (Insert the school district's procedures for invoicing, making payments to service providers, and requesting reimbursements from USAC.)

Annual Policy Review

The Board of Education shall be responsible to ensure this Policy is reviewed annually and make recommendation for any revisions to this Policy as needed.

Document Retention

All documents related to the E-rate Program, including but not limited to, the application process, the competitive bidding/vender selection process, and the invoicing process shall be retained for at least five years after the last date of service delivered for a particular funding year or in accordance with the New Jersey Division of Archives and Records Management Schedules of Record Retention, whichever is longer.

R 2412 HOME INSTRUCTION DUE TO HEALTH CONDITION (M)

The Board of Education **shall** will provide instructional services to an enrolled **student** pupil whether a general education **student** pupil in Kindergarten through grade twelve or special education **student** pupil age three to twenty-one, at the pupil's home or another suitable out of school setting such as a hospital or rehabilitation program when the **student** pupil is confined to the home or another out-of-school setting due to a temporary or chronic health condition or has a need for treatment **that** which precludes participation in their usual education setting, whether general education or special education.

Request For Home Instruction Due To A Temporary or Chronic Health Condition 1. The parent(s) or legal guardian(s) shall submit a request to the _____(building level or central office administrator school staff member responsible for receiving home instruction requests) that includes a written determination from the student's pupil's physician documenting the projected need for confinement at the **student's** pupil's residence or other treatment setting for more than ten consecutive school days or twenty fifteen cumulative school days or more during the school year. 2. The _____ (same staff member identified above) shall forward the written determination to the school physician, who shall review the written determination and verify the need for home instruction. The school physician may contact the student's pupil's physician to secure additional information concerning the student's pupil's diagnosis or need for treatment, and shall either verify the need for home instruction or shall provide reasons for denial to the _____ (same staff member identified above). ____ (same staff member identified 3. above) shall notify the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) concerning the school physician's verification or reasons for denial within five school days after receipt of the written determination by the

student's pupil's physician.

B. Providing Services

- 1. The school district shall provide instructional services within five school days after receipt of the school physician's verification or, if verification is made prior to the **student's** pupil's confinement, during the first week of the **student's** pupil's confinement to the home or out-of-school setting.
- 2. The school district shall be responsible for the costs of providing instruction in the home or out-of-school setting either directly, **through online services, including any needed equipment,** or through contract with another district Board of Education, Educational Services Commission, Jointure Commission, or approved clinic or agency pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:14 for the following categories of **students** pupils:
 - a. A **student** pupil who resides within the area served by this Board of Education and is enrolled in a public school program; or
 - b. A **student** pupil who is enrolled in a nonpublic school that is located within the area served by this Board of Education pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:46A-1 et seq.

C. **Minimum Standards** Requirements For Home or Out-of-School Instruction

- 1. The district shall establish a written plan for the delivery of instruction to continue the student's academic progress and to maintain a record of delivery of instructional services and student pupil progress for each pupil receiving home or out-of-school instruction.
- 2. The teacher providing instruction shall be a certified teacher.
- 3. The teacher shall provide instruction for the number of days and length of time sufficient to continue the student's academic progress and dependent upon the student's ability to participate.

The hours of instruction shall be provided on no fewer than three separate days during the week.
- 4. For a **student** pupil with disabilities, the home instruction shall be consistent with the **student's** pupil's Individualized Education Plan (IEP) to the extent appropriate, and shall meet the Core Curriculum Content Standards pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:8, Standards and Assessment. When the provision of home instruction will exceed thirty consecutive school days in a school year, the IEP team shall convene a meeting to review and, if appropriate, revise the **student's** pupil's IEP.

5. A. Purpose

The Student Code of Conduct and this Regulation are established to achieve the following purposes:

- 1. Foster the health, safety, social, and emotional well-being of students;
- 2. Support the establishment and maintenance of civil, safe, secure, supportive, and disciplined school environments conducive to learning;
- 3. Promote achievement of high academic standards;
- 4. Prevent the occurrence of problem behaviors;
- 5. Establish parameters for the intervention and remediation of problem student behaviors at all stages of identification; and
- 6. Establish parameters for school responses to violations of the code of student conduct that take into account, at a minimum, the severity of the offenses, the developmental ages of student offenders and students' histories of inappropriate behaviors in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.2 through 7.8, as appropriate.
- B. Expectations for Academic Achievement, Behavior, and Attendance

All students have a responsibility to comply with State statutes and administrative codes for academic achievement, behavior, and attendance, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8 and 13.1.

C. Behaviors That May Result in Suspension or Expulsion

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2, any student who is guilty of continued and willful disobedience, open defiance of the authority of any teacher or person having authority over the student, the habitual use of profanity or of obscene language, or who shall cut, deface or otherwise injure any school property, shall be liable to punishment and to suspension or expulsion from school. Conduct which shall constitute good cause for suspension or expulsion of a student guilty of such conduct shall include, but not be limited to, any of the following:

- 1. Continued and willful disobedience;
- 2. Open defiance of the authority of any teacher or person, having authority over the student;
- 3. Conduct of such character as to constitute a continuing danger to the physical well-being of other students;
- 4. Physical assault upon another student;
- 5. Taking, or attempting to take, personal property or money from another student, or from the student's presence, by means of force or fear;
- 6. Willfully causing, or attempting to cause, substantial damage to school property;
- 7. Participation in an unauthorized occupancy by any group of students or others of any part of any school or other building owned by any school district, and failure to leave such school or other facility promptly after having been directed to do so by the Principal or other person then in charge of such building or facility;
- 8. Incitement which is intended to and does result in unauthorized occupation by any group of students or others of any part of a school or other facility owned by any school district;

- 9. Incitement which is intended to and does result in truancy by other students;
- 10. Knowing possession or knowing consumption without legal authority of alcoholic beverages or controlled dangerous substances on school premises, or being under the influence of intoxicating liquor or controlled dangerous substances while on school premises; and
- 11. Harassment, intimidation, or bullying.

Students shall also be suspended from school for assault upon a school staff member in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2.1 and 2.2.

D. Students' Rights

Students subject to the consequences of the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation shall be informed of their rights, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(c)3.i. through vii., that include:

- 1. Advance notice of behaviors that will result in suspensions and expulsions that have been identified under authority of N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2;
- 2. Education that supports students' development into productive citizens;
- 3. Attendance in safe and secure school environments;
- 4. Attendance at school irrespective of students' marriage, pregnancy, or parenthood;
- 5. Due process and appeal procedures, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:3-1.3 through 1.17, N.J.A.C. 6A:4 and, where applicable, N.J.A.C. 6A:14-2.7 and 2.8, and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.2 through 7.5;

- 6. Parent notification consistent with the policies and procedures established pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-6.2(b)3 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1 through 7.8; and
- 7. Protections pursuant to 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act; 34 CFR Part 99, Family Educational Rights and Privacy; 20 U.S.C. § 1232h, Protection of Pupil Rights; 34 CFR Part 98, Student Rights in Research, Experimental Programs and Testing; P.L. 104-191, Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act; 45 CFR Part 160, General Administrative Requirements; 20 U.S.C. § 7165, Transfer of school disciplinary records; 42 CFR Part 2, Confidentiality of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Patient Records; N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-7.1, Confidentiality of certain information provided by pupils, exceptions; N.J.A.C. 6A:16-3.2, Confidentiality of student alcohol and other drug information; N.J.S.A. 18A:36-19, Pupil records, creation, maintenance and retention, security and access, regulations, nonliability; N.J.S.A. 2A:4A-60, Disclosure of juvenile information, penalties for disclosure; N.J.A.C. 6A:32-7, Student Records; N.J.A.C. 6A:14-2.9, Student records, as well as other existing Federal and State laws and rules pertaining to student protections.

2. Supportive Interventions and Referral Services

A student may be referred to the school's Intervention and Referral Services Team in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-8.1 and 8.2 and Policy and Regulation 2417.

3. Remediation of Problem Behavior

The following actions may be taken to remediate problem behavior. These actions will take into account the behavior's nature, the students' developmental ages, and the students' histories of problem behaviors and performance.

- a. Restitution and Restoration
 - (1) A student may be required to make restitution for any loss resulting from the student's conduct; or
 - (2) A student may be required, at the discretion of the school district and when appropriate, to restore to its former condition any damaged or defaced property resulting from the student's conduct.
- b. Counseling
 - (1) A student may be required to consult with school guidance counselors or Child Study Team members.
 - (2) The counselor will explain why the student's conduct is unacceptable to the school and damaging to the student, what the consequences of continued misconduct are likely to be, and appropriate alternative behaviors.

For students with disabilities, the remedial measures and behavioral interventions and supports shall be determined and provided pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:14.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(c)5, the Student Code of Conduct shall include a description of school responses to violations of behavioral expectations established by the Board of Education that, at a minimum are graded according to the severity of the offenses, and consider the developmental ages of the student offenders and their histories of inappropriate behavior that shall:
 - a. Include a continuum of actions designed to remediate and, where necessary or required by law, to impose sanctions;
 - b. Be consistent with other responses, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-5.5;
 - c. Provide for equitable application of the Code of Student Conduct without regard to race; color; religion; ancestry; national origin; nationality; sex; gender; sexual orientation; gender identity or expression; marital, domestic-partnership, or civil union; mental, physical, or sensory disability; or any other distinguishing characteristic, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-1 et seq. and
 - d. Be consistent with provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:6-1, Corporal Punishment of Students.
- G. Description of School Responses

School responses to violations of behavioral expectations are listed below:

- 1. Admonishment/Reprimand
 - a. A school staff member in authority may admonish or reprimand a student's unacceptable conduct and warn the student that additional misconduct may warrant a more severe penalty.
- 2. Temporary Removal from Classroom

- a. The classroom teacher may direct the student report to the office of the administrator in charge of student discipline.
- b. The teacher will complete a form that indicates the student's name and the conduct that has caused the student's removal from the teacher's room.
- c. The administrator in charge of discipline will interview the student and determine which, if any, additional consequences shall be imposed.
- 3. Meeting with School Administration and Parent
 - a. The student's parent may be required to attend a meeting with the Principal or designee and the student to discuss the student's conduct and to ensure the parent and the student understand school rules and expectations.
- 4. Deprivation of Privileges
 - a. Students may be deprived privileges as disciplinary sanctions when designed to maintain the order and integrity of the school environment. These privileges may include, but are not limited to:
 - (1) Moving freely about the school building;
 - (2) Participation in co-curricular or inter/intrascholastic activities:
 - (3) Attendance at a school-related social or sports activity;
 - (4) Participation in a graduation ceremony;
 - (5) Transportation to and from school on a school bus; or
 - (6) Any other privilege the Building Principal or designee determines may be appropriate and consistent with Policy and Regulation 5600 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1 et seq.

5. Detention

- a. A student may be required to report before or after the school day to detention. This detention may be assigned by the teacher or the Principal or designee.
- b. Transportation to detention before school or from detention after school will be the responsibility of the parent.
- c. A student may be excused from detention only for an unavoidable commitment previously made; any such excused detention must be made up on another day.

6. Grade Adjustment

a. A student who has cheated on a test or assignment, plagiarized material, falsified sources, refused to submit assignments, or otherwise indulged in academic dishonesty or negligence may suffer a reduced grade by virtue of the disqualified work. In no other instance may a student's grade be lowered as a direct penalty for misconduct.

7. In-school Suspension

- a. If the school operates an in-school suspension program, a student may be removed from his/her regular classes and required to report to the in-school suspension program.
- b. In-school suspension will not be imposed without the due process procedures set forth in Policy and Regulation 5610.

8. Suspension from School

- a. A student may be denied the right to attend school for a period of time pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2, N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.2 and 6A:16-7.3, and Policy 5610.
- b. Suspension from school will not be imposed without the due process procedures set forth in Policy and Regulation 5610.

9. Expulsion

- a. The Board may expel a general education student from school, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2, N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.4, and Policy 5620.
- b. Expulsion is an extremely serious disciplinary measure and will not be imposed without the due process set forth in Policy and Regulation 5610 and Policy 5620.

- 2. The school responses to violations of behavioral expectations that are subject to student discipline including suspension or expulsion pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2 outlined in a Chart of Student Discipline shall be consistent with the Board's policies and regulations/procedures on attendance, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6 and harassment, intimidation, and bullying, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.7.
- 3. The Principal or designee will maintain a list of community-based health and social service provider agencies available to support a student and a student's family, as appropriate, and a list of legal resources available to serve the community.
- 4. The Board of Education may deny participation in extra-curricular activities, school functions, sports, graduation exercises, or other privileges as disciplinary sanctions when designed to maintain the order and integrity of the school environment.
- 5. Nothing in Policy and Regulation 5600 shall prevent the school administration from imposing a consequence for unacceptable student conduct not listed or included in a Chart of Student Discipline.
- I. Student Conduct Away from School Grounds
 - 1. The Building Principal or designee has the right to impose a consequence on a student for conduct away from school grounds that is consistent with the Board's Code of Student Conduct, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1.
 - a. This authority shall be exercised only when it is reasonably necessary for the student's physical or emotional safety, security, and well-being or for reasons relating to the safety, security, and well-being of other students, staff, or school grounds, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:25-2 and 18A:37-2.

- b. This authority shall be exercised only when the conduct that is the subject of the proposed consequence materially and substantially interferes with the requirements of appropriate discipline in the operation of the school.
- c. Consequences for conduct away from school grounds shall be handled in accordance with the Board approved Code of Student Conduct, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1, Policy and Regulation 5600, and as appropriate, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7-2, 7.3, or 7.4.
- 2. School authorities shall respond to harassment, intimidation, or bullying that occurs off school grounds, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-14 and 15.3 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-1.3, 7.1, and 7.7.

J. School Bus Conduct

Violations of the rules regarding student conduct on school buses will be handled as follows:

- 1. The bus driver will report unacceptable conduct to the Principal of the school in which the student is enrolled by submission of a completed written report that includes the name of the student, the school, and the student's conduct.
- 2. The Principal or designee will investigate the matter, which may include meeting with the bus driver, bus aide, other students on the school bus, and the student who was reported by the bus driver.
- 3. The parent will be notified of the student's reported conduct.
- 4. The Principal or designee will make a determination if the student violated behavioral expectations and the discipline to be administered in accordance with the Code of Student Conduct.
- 5. If it is determined the misconduct is severe, the student may be suspended from the bus pending a conference with the parent.

K. Students with Disabilities

For students with disabilities, subject to Individualized Education Programs in accordance with 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq., the Individuals with Disabilities Educational Improvement Act, N.J.A.C 6A:14, and accommodation plans under 29 U.S.C. §§ 794 and 705(20), student discipline and the Code of Student Conduct shall be implemented in accordance with the components of the applicable plans.

L. Records

- 1. Instances of student discipline will be recorded in the student's file in strict compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:32-7.1 et seq. and Policy and Regulation 8330.
- 2. When a student transfers to a public school district from another public school district, all information in the student's record related to disciplinary actions taken against the student by the school district and any information the school district has obtained pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2A:4A-60, Disclosure of Juvenile Information; Penalties for Disclosure, shall be provided to the receiving public school district, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:36-19(a), and N.J.A.C. 6A:32-7.5.
 - a. The record shall be provided within two weeks of the date that the student enrolls in the receiving district.
 - b. Written consent of the parent or adult student shall not be required as a condition of the record transfer; however, written notice of the transfer shall be provided to the parent or the adult student.
- 3. When a student transfers to a private school, which includes all sectarian or nonsectarian, nonprofit, institutional day, or residential schools that provide education for students placed by their parents and that are controlled by other than public authority, all student disciplinary records with respect to suspensions or expulsions, shall be provided by the public school district of residence to the private school upon written request from the private school, in the same manner the records would be provided to a public school, pursuant to 20 U.S.C. § 6301, Title IV § 4155 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act.

- 4. The Board shall not use a student's past offenses on record to discriminate against the student.
- 5. All student disciplinary records pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7 shall conform with the requirements set forth in N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.8(d).

M. Annual Review

The Superintendent will designate a school staff member to coordinate an annual review and update of Policy and Regulation 5600. The Superintendent's designee will:

- 1. Compile an annual summary report of violations of the student behavioral expectations and the associated school responses to the violations in the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation.
- 2. Convene a Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Committee comprised of parents, students, and community members that represent the composition of the district's schools and community to review the annual summary report and to develop recommendations, if any, to improve and update the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation.
- 3. The Superintendent's designee shall submit the Committee's recommendations, if any, to improve or update the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation.
- 4. The Superintendent will review the Committee's report with school administrators and will determine if the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation should be updated.
- 5. The Superintendent will recommend to the Board revisions to the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy, if needed.

R 9270 HOME SCHOOLING AND EQUIVALENT EDUCATION (M)

OUTSIDE THE SCHOOLS

Home schooling is an educational program provided at home, usually by the parent(s), or legal guardian(s), or other person having custody and control of the child. Children are taught using their own curriculum or published home school curriculum. The Board of Education recognizes that home schooling is an option for parent(s) or legal guardian(s) under the compulsory education law.

For the purpose of this Regulation, "parent" shall mean parent, legal guardian, and other person having custody and control of a child between the ages of six and sixteen.

- A. Legal Requirement for Compulsory Attendance
 - 1. N.J.S.A. 18A:38-25 requires all children **between the ages of** six to **sixteen** 16 years to attend the public schools or a day school in which there is given instruction equivalent to that provided in the public school for children of similar grades and attainments or to receive equivalent instruction elsewhere other than school.
 - 2. The parent(s), or legal guardian(s), of a child that is home schooled is responsible to ensure their child receives instruction equivalent to that provided in the public school for children of similar grades and attainments or to receive equivalent instruction elsewhere other than school.
 - 3. In the event the Superintendent determines there is credible evidence the parent, legal guardian, or other person having custody and control of a school-aged child is not causing the child to receive equivalent instruction elsewhere than at school, the Superintendent may request a letter of intent from the parent, legal guardian, or other person confirming the child is receiving equivalent instruction elsewhere than at school. The Superintendent may report to the appropriate municipal authorities those children whom he/she has reason to believe are not offered instruction outside the schools equivalent to that offered in the public schools for children of similar ages or attainments.

- 4. If the Superintendent makes a report, the parent(s), or legal guardian(s), of a pupil receiving instruction elsewhere other than school may, but is not required to, notify the Superintendent of their child's educational program status and provide sufficient information to satisfy the district that equivalent instruction is being offered.
- 5. A **pP**arent(s) or legal guardian(s) of a home schooled **child** pupil **is** are not required to seek approval from the district or to submit materials to the Superintendent in order to permit it to make a determination as to the equivalency of the instruction.
- 6. The New Jersey Department of Education encourages a parent to notify the Superintendent of the intent to educate the child elsewhere than at school to avoid questions with respect to compliance with the compulsory education laws.
- B. Truancy/Violations of Compelling Attendance
 - 1. When a Superintendent and Board believe a person is not complying with the compulsory education law (N.J.S.A. 18A:38-25 et seq.) they must initiate truancy proceedings in municipal court where a parent may be found guilty of a disorderly persons offense and fined in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:38-27 and N.J.S.A. 18A:38-31.
 - 2. If the parent(s), or legal guardian(s), are is challenged in court by the Superintendent or Board, the district must demonstrate, beyond a reasonable doubt, that the parents are not providing a curriculum that is academically equivalent to that provided in the public school for a child of similar grade and attainment the child is not receiving an education in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:38-25.
- C. District Requirements for Home Schooled Pupils
 - 1. The Board is not required by law to allow a child educated elsewhere than at school to participate in the regular school curriculum or in extra-curricular or sports activities unless specifically provided in Board Policy, or required by Federal law, or State statute or administrative code. Unless requested by the parents, and agreed to by the school district, the school district is not required or permitted to:

- a. Test a child educated at home;
- b. Review the quality of instruction received at home; or
- c. To monitor the results of home instruction.
- 2. When children are educated at home and are not enrolled in a school, the school district will not (or will) provide entitlements or privileges of pupils enrolled in the school district unless specifically provided in the Federal special education laws.
- 23. A child educated at home shall not receive a State endorsed high school diploma from the Board of Education.

D. Pupils With Disabilities

- 1. Any written request from a parent of a home schooled child for a special education evaluation of their child will be reviewed in a meeting of the Child Study Team (CST), the parent, and the regular education teacher in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:14-2.3. At this meeting, the current information about the child shall be reviewed to determine whether an evaluation is warranted. The Superintendent will consider requests for evaluation of all potentially disabled home schooled children and make determinations whether or not to conduct evaluations.
 - a. If an evaluation is warranted, another determination shall be made regarding the assessment procedures. Written notice of the determinations shall be provided to the parent. Once the assessments are completed, a meeting in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:14-2.3 shall be held to determine whether the child is eligible for special education and related services. If the school district's Child Study Team (CST) determines that an evaluation is required, the procedures as outlined in N.J.A.C. 6:28-3.4 are followed.

- b. If the child is eligible for special education and related services, the CST will determine a classification category and develop an Individualized Education Program (IEP) in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:14-3.7 6:28-3.6. If the child is eligible for special education and related services, the district shall make a free, appropriate public education available only if the child enrolls in the district.
- c. Home schooled children with disabilities may be provided a special education program including related services.
- d. If a home schooled child with disabilities re-enrolls in the public school, the school district must implement the special education program described in the IEP. The school district will also review the IEP annually and be ready to conduct re-evaluation every three years.
- ce. The school district will notify the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of a classified child who is being educated at home to offer services as required by law. The documentation of this notice will be maintained in the child's record file
- df. Any determination by the school district CST regarding the provision of a special education program to a classified child who is being educated at home may be challenged by the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:14 et seq.

E. Curricular and Co-Curricular Activities

When children are educated at home and are not enrolled in a school, the school district is not required to provide any of the entitlements or privileges of pupils enrolled in the school district unless specifically provided in the Federal special education laws.

5410 PROMOTION AND RETENTION (M)

The Board of Education recognizes that the way each child develops and grows is unique and that a student should be placed in the educational setting most appropriate to his or her social, physical and educational needs. Therefore, each student enrolled in this district shall progress to graduation through a continuous program of learning in harmony with his or her own development.

Parent/Legal Guardian Notification

Standards for student promotion shall be related to the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards, district goals and objectives, and the accomplishments of students. Promotion policies and procedures will be provided to parent(s) or legal guardian(s) as appropriate. During the school year, parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and students shall be regularly informed of the student(s) progress toward meeting promotion standards.

Remediation/Notification of Retention

A teacher who determines that a student(s) progress may not be sufficient to meet promotion standards shall notify the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and the student. The teacher will offer immediate consultation to the students parent(s) or legal guardian(s). Every effort shall be made to provide a remedial plan for an educationally deficient student before retention is recommended. The parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and, where appropriate, the student, shall be notified in advance of the possibility of the students retention at grade level. Whenever feasible, notification will be provided no later than January 30 (full-year) courses or October 30 (half-year) courses.

Attendance Requirements for Promotion

School attendance shall be a factor in the determination of a student(s) promotion or retention. Only extenuating circumstances will permit the promotion of a student who has been in attendance fewer than one hundred sixty-two (162) days out of one hundred eighty (180) days for a student enrolled at the elementary, middle, and high school levels, including the granting of high school course credit. A request to consider extenuating circumstances must be articulated by parents/guardians to the School Principal, who will approve or deny the request.
