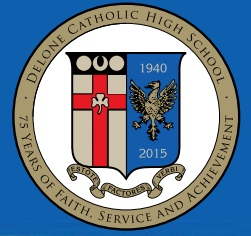




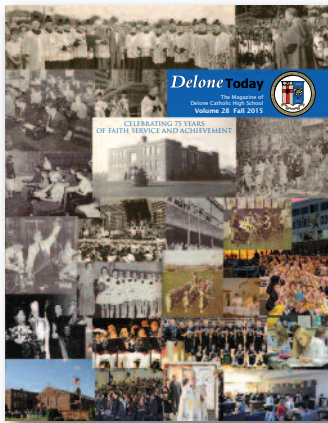

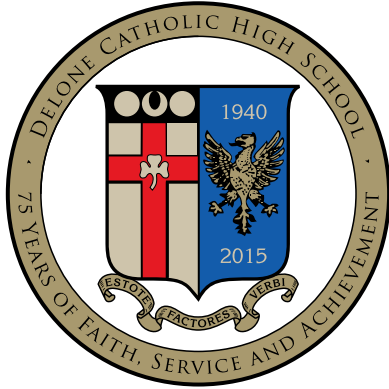

Dear Alumni, Parents and Friends of Delone Catholic High School,

The door to the future has sprung open as we celebrate the 75 years of our existence. In 1940, God had truly blessed Delone Catholic as a fledgling school as the world sat on the precipice of war. We continued our journey through many wars, civil rights, man's ascent in space and eventual landing and walking on the moon, September 11, Pope John Paul's tremendous leadership, Pope Benedict's official resignation as Pope and now Pope Francis inviting us to share our wealth, reminding us of our commitment to the environment and celebrating with us, our lives as children of God. SEVENTH HEAVEN: DONNA TOMPKINS WINS GOLDEN APPLE AWARD

For Donna Tompkins, life is good. On a warm June morning, having just returned from a walk with daughter Kati (Tompkins) Hockstad '06 and six-month-old grandson, Kennedy, this 2015 Golden Apple winner is welcoming and ready to talk teaching. "Let's get to it," she says. "What do you want to know?"

It is this matter-of-fact manner that appeals to her students. "I think the kids like that I am [very] honest," she says unapologetically. "If you don't want that [honesty], then don't ask."

Kendall Kohler '17 agrees. "One thing I took away from the class," he explains, "is never be afraid to ask questions." Kohler feels Mrs. Tompkins is a great teacher because not only does she "explain difficult material very thoroughly, but she takes time to connect with the students on a personal level."

Colleague Julia Fuhrman, a 2011 Golden Apple recipient, concurs. "Mrs. Tompkins was the first teacher who welcomed me at my first in-service day," and she recalls, offered "greetings and advice."

It is that ability to connect with people – students, colleagues, community members – that inspired Mrs. Fuhrman to nominate one of her "closest friends and truest role models" for this year's award. Mrs. Tompkins exemplifies the meaning of the Golden Apple Award which, according to the Diocese of Harrisburg's website, symbolizes "a teacher's professional excellence, leadership, commitment to Catholic values, and devotion to teaching in Catholic schools." The Golden Apple Awards Program was first established through the generosity of the Donahue Family Foundation in the Diocese of Pittsburgh in 1992. The Diocese of Harrisburg was invited to participate in May 2005. Since then, seven teachers have been chosen each year from schools throughout the Diocese to receive Golden Apple Awards, which includes a \$5,000 award check, a certificate of achievement, a gold apple and photos with the Bishop and the Secretary for Education.

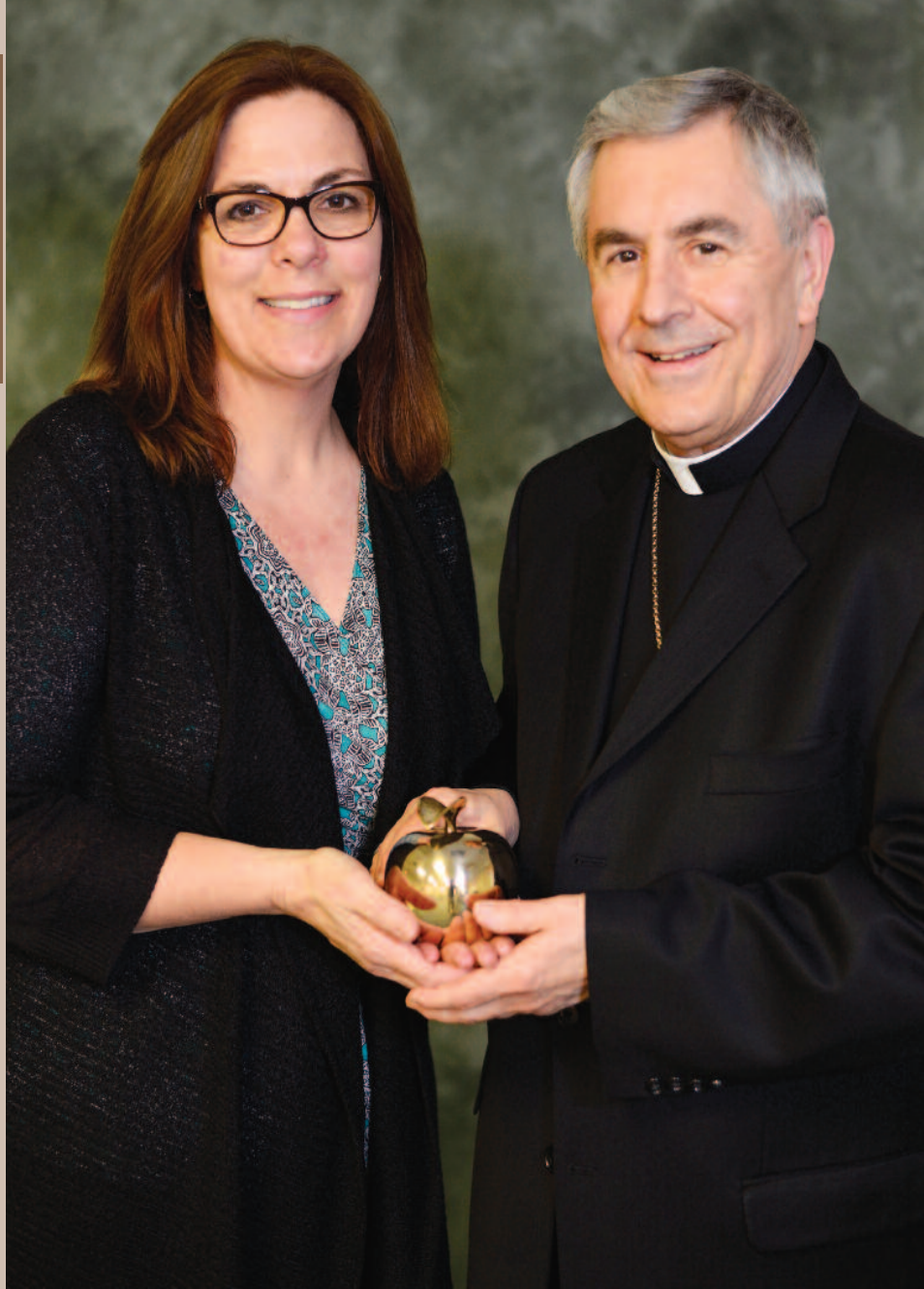
While devoted to the Catholic school system, this North Jersey transplant had a high school experience of a different kind.

"Growing up," explains Mrs. Tompkins, "I didn't have the opportunity to attend Catholic school. I missed having the openness of prayer with my teachers, classmates and coaches." She, however, did have the impact of great teachers and coaches at Wallkill Valley Regional High School in Hardyston, N.J., a Sussex County academic and athletic powerhouse. Similar in size to Delone Catholic, the school provided her opportunities to excel in basketball, field hockey and softball at the varsity level. And she did.

Mrs. Tompkins was the first student from Wallkill Valley Regional High School to make the all-state team for basketball. Her talents also earned her induction into the school's Hall of Fame. Post-graduation, she continued her academics and athletics at Pfeiffer University in Misenheimer, N.C.

Along the way, coaches and teachers inspired her to be – and do – her best. Her high school coach, she recalls, reminded the players that there was "no star on our team." With teamwork, they made it all the way to the state championship. Losing by "just two points," Mrs. Tompkins recalls crying "all the way home." Even though that was 30 years ago, she "still remembers what that felt like." More importantly, they won or lost as a team – an important value she passes on to her students and colleagues.

In the classroom, Mrs. Fuhrman believes Mrs. Tompkins is "firm, but fair," and she does whatever is possible to provide "justice for each student" which

includes, but is not limited to, providing after-school help sessions as well as accommodations for students with various challenges.

Mrs. Tompkins is an advocate for students and teaches them how to advocate for themselves. Kohler concurs stating that questions “will enhance your understanding and will educate you on new ways to use a topic.”

Simply, Mrs. Tompkins is a team player and works for the greater good in the classroom and in the community.

For 25 years, she has been connecting students to the world of mathematics. Having taught algebra on all levels, as well as trigonometry, it is geometry that has remained the constant. “It is not abstract,” she explains. “It is neat to see kids get it, to see connections from one thing to another.”

Her approach is not ‘why things work’ but ‘how it works’ and that, Mrs. Tompkins believes, makes a difference.

So does Kohler. “My favorite part about the class,” he shares, “was that through humor and different teaching methods, Mrs. Tompkins never failed to make the period interesting.” He continues, “It was nice to have a lively class during the days that seemed to [slow down].”

In the community, Mrs. Tompkins continues to exemplify the school’s motto – “Be Doers of the Word” – through her involvement in the Relay for Life Team and the Provide-A-Lunch (PAL) Program. She connects Delone Catholic to the community and inspires teamwork.

Delone Catholic’s Principal, Dr. Maureen Thiec, is not surprised. “The Relay for Life Team endeavor,” she explains, “was well suited for Mrs. Tompkins’ dedication and energy.”

Like any community, Delone Catholic has been touched by loss from cancer: Joe Byrne, a beloved English teacher, and Brother René Sterner, FSC ‘55, a dedicated Development Director, as well as parents and grandparents of staff, administration and students, have been taken by the disease.

Mrs. Tompkins formed the “Delone Catholic Faculty, Family and Friends” team to honor, remember and support those affected by this disease and has been successful in connecting Delone Catholic to this effort through teamwork.

“It is a matter of asking,” recalls Mrs. Tompkins. With any of these programs, it is important to get a sense of interest or simply encourage people to participate.

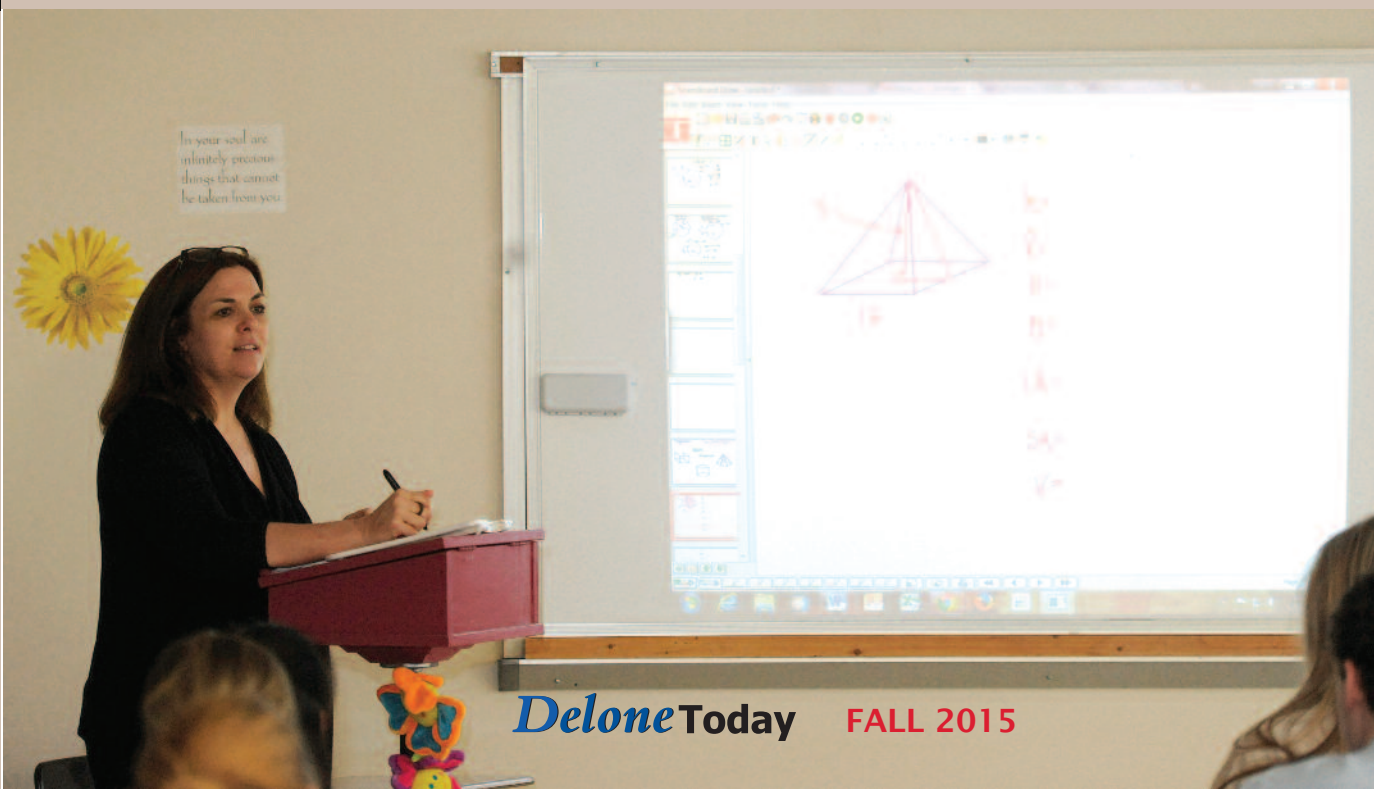
Mrs. Tompkins reflects on getting Delone Catholic involved in the PAL program to feed the homeless through the Hanover Area Council of Churches. “At first,” she recalls, “I would send emails out to faculty or get feelers out to students [about helping once a month.]” A few months went by, but she did not give up. One night at the Christmas party, Mrs. Tompkins remembers just asking faculty members, “Would you be willing to help?” The response from colleagues and students has been steady ever since.

Dr. Thiec points out that Delone Catholic is the “only school that commits to the first Saturday of the month to plan, cook and serve lunch” to those who would otherwise go without.

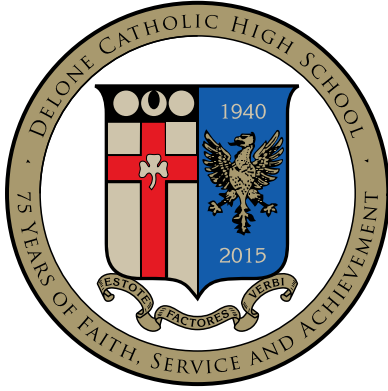
It is Mrs. Tompkins’ faith-filled dedication and leadership to this program, her belief in teamwork, and the importance of connections that make her such a worthy recipient of the Golden Apple Award, marking the seventh year in a row Delone Catholic has had a recipient.

Mrs. Tompkins watches her daughter tenderly carry a sleepy Kennedy into another room. “She loves being a mom,” Mrs. Tompkins beams. The conversation turns to her son, Ryan Tompkins ‘10, and to her husband, Kyle, and about her gratitude for family. Her dog Maggie, a rescue, comes over for a pat on the head and then returns to the warmth of the noon sun through the patio doors. The house is quiet for a moment broken only by a final thought.

“A series of events occurred in my life which brought me to Delone Catholic High School,” reflects Mrs. Tompkins, “and what a blessing it has been.” Yes, for all of us.

DELONE CATHOLIC TO CONCLUDE 75TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

The Delone Catholic community will conclude an 18-month celebration of the 75th Anniversary of the school's founding with two school-wide Masses. The first on Thursday, Oct. 8 will celebrate the school community's commitment to service on the local, national and international levels. The concluding Mass will take place on Wednesday, Nov. 4, the Feast of St. Charles Borromeo. Both Masses will take place in the Old Gym at 9:30 a.m. The entire extended family is invited to attend. CHROMEBOOK CRAZY

With the arrival of the new school year came the arrival of approximately 230 Chromebooks. These portable computers were distributed to all freshmen and sophomores at the beginning of the school year. The initiative will continue to be phased in over the next two years so that every Delone Catholic student will have a Chromebook for the 2017-18 school year. In the interim, juniors and seniors will have access to Chromebooks and other devices to ensure that they too are properly prepared for using technology.

While most 14-16 year olds are technologically savvy, and the first generation to always know the digital world, training was still provided for these students, more to acclimate them to the nuances of the Chromebook than teaching them how to use the computer. Students had the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the features: creating, saving, sharing and uploading Google documents, expectations of use and care of the machine and accessing eChalk, which is the students' way to access assignments, resources and all things related to their classroom.

Before the end of the 2014-15 school year, teachers had Chromebooks in their hands. Training provided by the Lincoln Intermediate Unit 12 assisted teachers with understanding the potential and ease of bringing and continuing technology in the classroom. Various websites for subject areas were shared and explored during the two-day in-service. Departments were given valuable time to discuss how to incorporate this exciting technology into their day-to-day lesson plans.

Delone Catholic is built on tradition and commitment. The Chromebooks, which the students will take with them upon graduation, speaks to the tradition of providing a quality education and a commitment to equipping students with the knowledge and tools to succeed in today's exciting and changing world.

In addition to several college road trips, Robbie Foster '16 made time for a trip to Washington, D.C., in early August to attend the National Student Leadership Conference at American University.

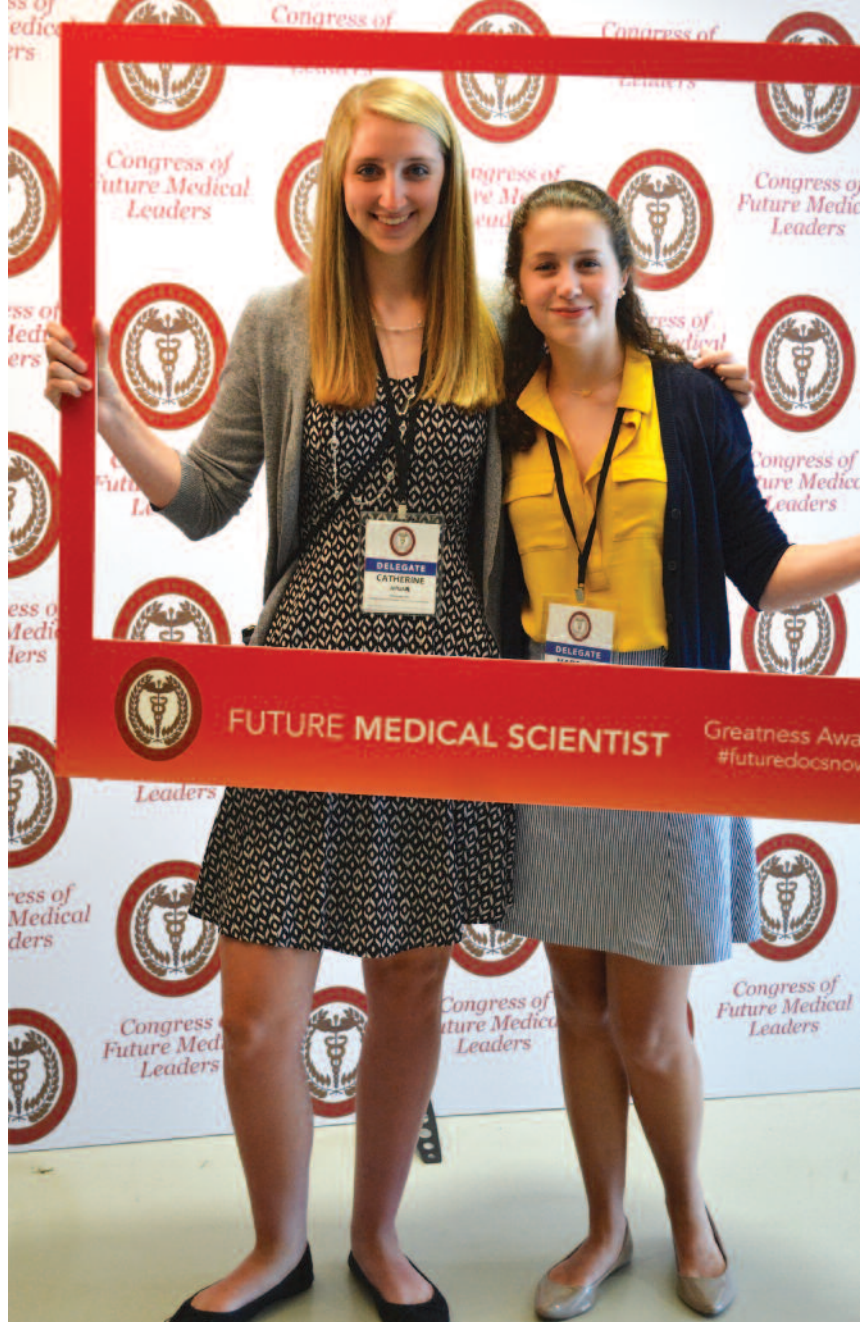
He knows he wants to be a part of the medical field, and the Medicine and Health Care program allowed him explore the different aspects of medicine and hone his people skills.

Beyond the lectures, students had real experiences in the sciences such as looking at eyes and a heart, and “we touched a brain.” Additionally, Foster recalled, we “saw and felt the difference between diseased lungs and normal lungs.”

Foster is not sure exactly what area of science he would like to pursue; however, he has thought about becoming a physician's assistant or a nurse. “We discussed who we are as people,” Foster said, which was an invaluable experience. “I met people from all over the country,” and, there were a few participants from other parts of the world. “It was great.”

OPERATION: MEDICINE (PART 2)

Catherine Apgar '18 and Madeline Hovercamp '18 were invited to attend the National Academy of Future Physicians and Medical Scientists' Congress of Future Medical Leaders in Lowell, Mass., in June. They were selected based on their interest in becoming physicians as well as their academic performance, specifically in math and science. During the conference, they were able to hear many prestigious speakers which included prize-winning medical researchers, physicians and innovative award-winning teen researchers. They also heard from the woman who had the first successful face transplant in the United States and one of the doctors who survived the recent Ebola outbreak. Other highlights included watching a live surgery on a big screen and talking to the surgeon as he was working.



Catherine Apgar and Madeline Hovercamp declare their intentions to be Future Medical Scientists

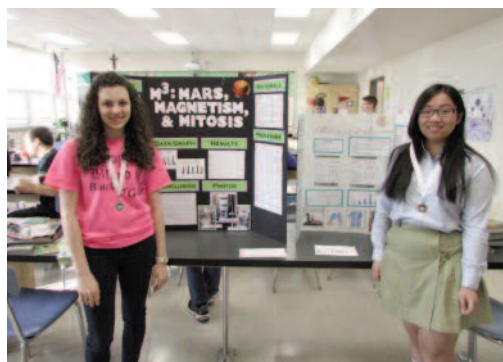
PROBLEMS AND SOLUTIONS: WARNER AND LUC RECOGNIZED AT SCIENCE FAIR

Victoria Warner '16 and San Luc '16 placed second and third, respectively, with their projects at the Capital Area Science and Engineering Fair (CASEF), held in Harrisburg, Pa., from March 18-20.

Warner explored space with her project titled “Mars, Magnetism and Mitosis” and earned second place for her efforts in the plant sciences category. Warner's project tackled and explored the problem of growing food on Mars.

Luc focused on the medical sciences with her presentation “Protection Against Viruses” which tested the Centers for Disease Control's (CDC) various techniques for removing personal protective gear.

Because of their outstanding research and presentations, both students were offered scholarships to Harrisburg University of Science and Technology, along with an invitation to participate in the BioGeneius competition later in the spring.

Once again, Brian Yealy '79 has designed a marching band extravaganza. This year's *Masterworks* field show is filled with three concert band classics and one piano classic. The performance includes "Emperata Overture" by Claude Smith/Jay Dawson which, Mr. Yealy notes, is a "great concert band work"; "Variations on a Korean Folk Song," a John Barnes Chance/Jay Dawson piece to "add some variety to the show"; a "fun Latin version" of Beethoven's piano classic "Für Elise" titled "Elise Gone Bad" with an arrangement by Jay Dawson and lastly, "Chorale and Shaker Dance" by John Zdechlik/Jay Dawson (featuring "Simple Gifts").

Students had the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the music by listening to the recordings to get a feel for the arrangements. Rehearsals began in June, and for two-a-half hours on Mondays and Wednesdays, the Marching Band rehearsed to perfect formations and songs.

In addition to performing at home football games and some away contests, the Marching Band will have an opportunity to display its talents in competition against other Cavalcade of Bands Independence Division bands. Competitions are scheduled for Big Spring on Sept. 26, Cumberland Valley on Oct. 10, Carlisle on Oct. 24 and Governor Mifflin on Nov. 7. The band will also march in the Hanover Area Jaycees Halloween Parade on Oct. 29 and the Cavalcade of Bands Grand Championships on Nov. 14 at Kottmeyer Stadium in Downingtown, Pa.

FROM THE OLD GYM STAGE

Each year, Delone Catholic High School presents two drama productions in the Old Gym. The spring production is a musical in odd-numbered years. The Spring 2015 musical was "Little Women."

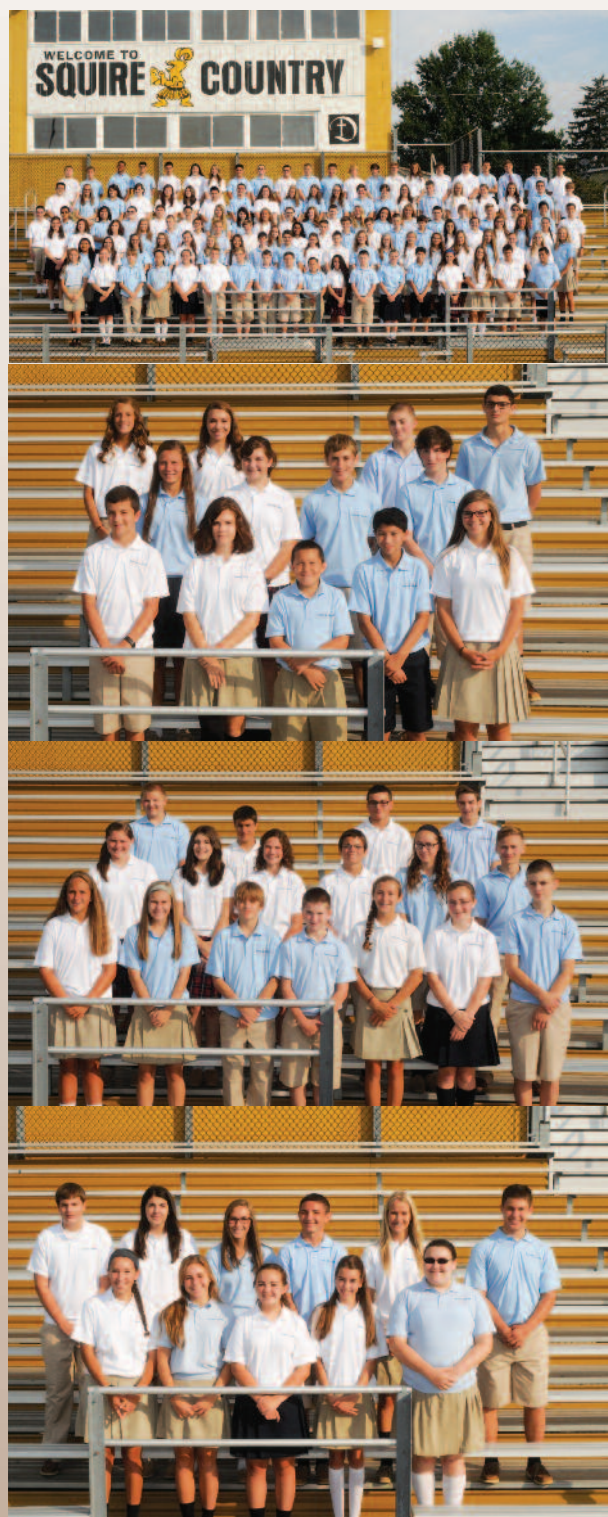

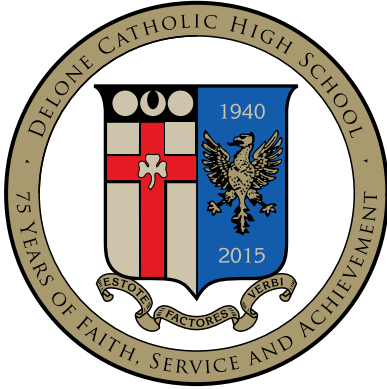

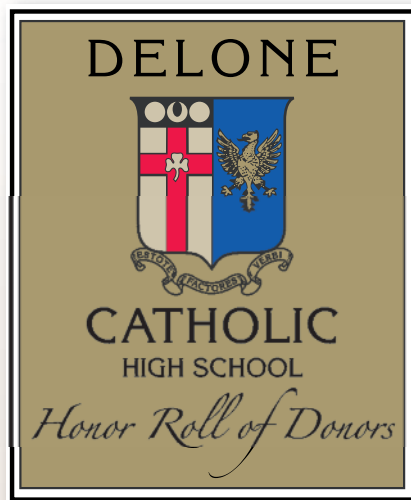

Donors who were inadvertently omitted will be published in future issues of *Delone Today*. Any gifts received after June 30, 2015 will be considered part of the 2015-16 Honor Roll of Donors.

All giving, regardless of purpose, is reported each year in *Delone Today*. It should be noted that in the case of pledges, only payments actually received during the 2014-15 fiscal year are counted in this report. Future payments will be reported in the year in which they are made.

Again in the 2014-15 Honor Roll of Donors, income for extracurricular activities is not counted in the total giving figure on the last page of this section. Prior to 2009-10, these figures were included in the bottom line with gifts from all benefactors. Because a large percentage of the Athletic Association income is from ticket sales to games, and much of the Music Association income is from the annual carnival, these figures will not be added to the bottom line. They are still listed for informational purposes, however.

PLEASE NOTE: Income from tuition is NOT used to fund any of Delone Catholic's extracurricular activities. These activities are funded through fees paid by each participant, as well as fundraising done by many volunteers who contribute thousands of hours of their time each year.

At the direction of the Diocese of Harrisburg, the structure of the Boards of Directors in the Diocesan high schools was changed during the 2014-15 school year. Previously, each of the nine parishes of the Adams Deanery was represented by its pastor and a lay member of the parish on the Delone Catholic High School Board of Directors. There were also four members at large. With the restructuring, the Bishop of Harrisburg is the episcopal member of the board, while the pastor of each parish serves as a pastoral member. Three of the pastors serve as active members of the Board, with the pastors of the other six parishes maintaining voting rights. There are also nine lay members of the board. All nine lay members on the newly-structured board were members of the previous board, and all of the pastors remain as members of the board. For that reason, this listing of Board of Directors Donors includes all those donors who were members of the original board at the beginning of the year.

2014-15 BOYS' BASKETBALL

The 2014-15 season was one of firsts and ups and downs for Delone Catholic boys' basketball. First-year head coach Lawrence Williams, who played for former coach Jim Dooley at Gettysburg High School, served as a link between the past and the future. An assistant coach for some very successful teams at Dover High School, Williams took over his own program for the first time. The Squires (12-12, 10-4 YAIAA III) dropped the first three games of the season against some stiff competition, before securing Williams' first win as a head coach on Dec. 12 at Biglerville. The team also won the next two and never was more than two games above or below .500 the rest of the season.

It appeared that Williams would have some experience returning, but offseason injuries to Devon Moore '15 and Jake Wiles '15 robbed the team of its top two scorers. What was to be a mostly young and inexperienced supporting cast stepped into the spotlight and gained valuable playing time. All the while, they played well enough to be competitive within the division and to qualify for the PIAA District 3 Class AA playoffs, extending a long streak of district appearances for the program. The Squires avenged a pair of regular-season losses to division rival York Catholic in the first round of the playoffs before falling to Camp Hill in the quarterfinals.

2014-15 GIRLS' BASKETBALL

The 2014-15 season had a little bit of everything in store for the Delone Catholic girls' basketball program, from blowout wins to nail-biting losses, and a senior climbing the program's career scoring list. The Squirettes (21-7, 11-1 YAIAA III) earned the 13th season of at least 20 wins in the 16 seasons under head coach Gerry Eckenrode. They claimed a share of the YAIAA Division III title, their first since splitting the Division IV championship in 2010. The team also reached the PIAA District 3 Class AA semifinals for the seventh season in a row.

The Squirettes ripped off eight straight wins to start the season before falling to Bishop Guilfoyle by two points in overtime in the championship game of Bishop Guilfoyle's holiday tournament. The team also had winning streaks of three, four and five games during the season. Among their victories were wins against York Suburban and Dallastown in the first two rounds of the YAIAA tournament. Delone Catholic would fall to West York in the championship game. Their final victory of the season came in the PIAA District 3 Class AA quarterfinal. A 67-64 double-overtime loss in the semifinal and a four-point loss to Trinity ended the year.

Throughout the season, Maddie Comly '15 built on an outstanding career to become one of the program's all-time leading scorers. Her 638 points were good for an average of 22.8 points per game. She eclipsed the 30-point mark five times, including what is believed to be a program-record 46 points in the overtime loss at Bishop Guilfoyle. She entered the season in 10th place on the career scoring list and climbed to fifth with 1,644 points, passing Ann Welty '90 (1,009), Kristin Schneider '89 (1,037), Kelly Strausbaugh '92 (1,084), Michelle Sneeringer '89 (1,142) and Ashley Eline '02 (1,178).

For her efforts, Comly was named GameTimePA.com YAIAA Girls' Basketball Player of the Year and to the AP PIAA Class AA All-State first team. Ally Shipley also received honorable mention from GameTimePA.com.



2014-15 SWIMMING

Delone Catholic continued a recent tradition of sponsoring individual swimmers as a PIAA non-swimming school. At the 2014-15 PIAA District 3 Class AA championships, Caroline Dudenhoeffer '17 finished eighth in the 200-yard individual medley and ninth in the 100-yard breaststroke, and Gwyn Dolecki '18 placed 21st in the 100 backstroke. Kyle Miller '15 earned 17th place in the 100-yard backstroke.

2014-15 WRESTLING

The improvement of the Delone Catholic wrestling team was not as dramatic in 2014-15 as it has been recently, but it was, perhaps even more profound. The Squires (13-4, 5-1 YAIAA III) only lost two regular season dual meets and qualified for the PIAA District 3 Class AA Team Championships this season, three years after an 11-loss season. Most of their wins were by large margins. The exception was a senior-night clash with perennial power Biglerville that needed a pin from Bryce Perkins '17 in the night's last contested bout for the Squires to win. Perkins did just that with a first-period fall that gave Delone Catholic its first win over the Cannons in eight years.

For the second straight year, Delone Catholic qualified 11 wrestlers for the sectional tournament and came close to doubling its point production again. Antonio Ugarte '15 (second place - 126 lbs.), Mark Evich '15 (sixth place - 138 lbs.), Brian Shermeyer '17 (third place - 145 lbs.), Lucas Shull '15 (third place - 152 lbs.), Brady Repasky '17 (third place - 160 lbs.), Josh Sneeringer '15 (third place - 170 lbs.), Mike Rider '15 (second place - 220 lbs.) and Bryce Perkins (second place - 285 lbs.) all placed in the top six and advanced to the PIAA District 3 Class AA tournament. The Squires, who jumped from 7.0 points to 39.5 a year ago, increased their performance to 56.5 pts., good for ninth place and advanced Ugarte and Shermeyer to the regional tournament. Both regional qualifiers received honorable mention on the GameTimePA.com YAIAA Wrestling All-Star team.

2015 BASEBALL

Weather played serious havoc on the 2015 baseball season, condensing the entire regular season into just 40 days. A team with only four seniors often found itself playing three or four games per week and twice had games suspended and completed up to two weeks later. In spite of it all, the Squires (13-9, 12-3, YAIAA IV) put together a solid performance and gained valuable experience for the future. They earned their seventh-straight YAIAA Division IV championship and their 15th-consecutive appearance in the PIAA District 3 playoffs. The team found a familiar foe in York Catholic in the district quarterfinal. The teams split the regular season contests, each winning on its home field. The Fighting Irish took the postseason rubber match, 2-1, to end the Squires' season.

Austin Roth '15 capped an outstanding career by leading the team in batting average, hitting .361 with 15 RBI and nine runs scored. Austin Kuntz '16 and Evan Haymaker '18 both hit .311. Kuntz posted seven extra-base hits and drew 22 walks for a .494 on-base percentage. He also stole 19 bases. On the mound, Hunter Keith '15 worked 44.2 innings and posted a 2.98 earned run average to go with a 5-4 record. Chase Kint '16 and Ethan Slusser '17 both contributed at least 20 innings with ERAs under 4.00.

Kuntz was named a GameTimePA.com Baseball All-Star first-teamer, while Keith and Roth received honorable mention.

2015 SOFTBALL

The Delone Catholic softball resurgence continued in 2015. The Squirettes (20-6, 13-2 YAIAA IV) followed the program's first District 3 championship appearance since 1999 with a return trip in 2015. They avenged the 2014 championship loss to Susquenita in the semifinal and jumped on Kutztown early with five runs in the first inning and three more in the third to capture the program's first district championship in 16 years. After not having won a district game in 12 years, Delone Catholic is now 5-1 in the past two seasons. The season continued with a 6-0 blanking of Philadelphia Academy Charter in the first round of the PIAA Class AA First Round. That game took more than 48 hours from beginning to end due to a weather-related suspension. The Squirettes then came oh-so-close to advancing to the semifinals for the first time in program history. They scored single runs in the first and fourth innings of the quarterfinal against Holy Redeemer to take a 2-0 lead. The opponents got both back in the bottom of the fourth and added the decisive tally in the bottom of the seventh, ending another outstanding Delone Catholic softball season.

A team as successful as this one usually does not come without a few standout performances. Shelbee Holcomb '16 compiled one of the greatest single seasons the program has ever experienced. She hit .740 with 50 runs scored and 53 RBI to earn GameTimePA.com YAIAA All-Star first team and PIAA Class AA All-State Softball Player of the Year honors. She has verbally committed to playing Division I softball at Mount St. Mary's University in Emmitsburg, Md. Katie Laughman '16 was also brilliant, earning first-team honors from both organizations after hitting .500 with five home runs, 27 RBI and 35 runs scored. Cassie Rickrode '16 also had another outstanding two-way season, going 17-6 on the mound and delivering at the plate as well. With all three returning, 2016 promises more good times on the softball diamond.

A GIANT OPPORTUNITY

On May 16, Squire Country had a New York state of mind as New York Giants Offensive Line Coach Pat Flaherty '74 returned to his alma mater. Flaherty headlined the Mason-Dixon Linemen Clinic which is a new fundraising event for The John Gastley Scholarship Foundation (TJGSF). TJGSF awards a four-year, full-tuition scholarship at the supporting parish rate for one incoming Delone Catholic High School freshman each year.

Handing Off Tradition

It is Flaherty's love for his father, the game of football and Delone Catholic that drew him to hold this event for up and coming players in grades 6-12. While the scholarship holds the name of the head coach from 1966-1978, it is Flaherty's father, J.T. Flaherty, an assistant under Gastley, for whom the football field is named. During Pat's sophomore year, his father worked with him to be a center for the Squires.

And now Pat pays it forward.

According to parent and member of the clinic committee Jennifer Hart, "Coach Flaherty personally presented each drill to the players." Additionally, she adds, "He gave them some great advice on football and school," sharing his football experiences and bits of advice his coaches gave him. What was most impressive, however, was seeing "his love of the sport shining through" and being "truly engaged with the players on the field."

It Takes Teamwork

Months of preparation went into this one-day event. Jennifer Hart, whose sons Zach '17 and Ryan '18, play for the Squires, got involved in the clinic to give back. She wanted to "contribute to the Foundation that awarded Ryan his scholarship."

This huge event was a "cooperative effort," Hart said. Working with George '73 and Sally (Miller) '75 Neiderer, Foundation chairman Andy Angel '73, Athletic Director Dave Lawrence '69, Director of Development and Alumni Relations Eric Lawrence '98 and many other TJGSF committee members and supporters, the event was marketed through flyers, press releases and media alerts to secure full coverage of the clinic. Within the clinic, Hart worked with this team to write the bios of the coaches for distribution to not only the media but the attendees and their families.

Many Delone Catholic alumni were involved in the event, both on the planning side and the coaching side. Hart felt it was "inspiring to see so much support for the school and the sport."

The clinic drew players from a wide area. More than 70 football players from approximately 25 middle schools and high schools in South Central Pennsylvania and Northern Maryland attended the clinic. One participant came all the way from Connecticut.

Pat Flaherty brought a 23-member squad of his own to have a 10-to-1 player-to-coach ratio and to maximize the repetition of drills for each participant. Dick Anderson, Flaherty's mentor at Penn State, and East Stroudsburg offensive line coach Mike Santella, volunteered their time to help the players hone linemen skills.

Special guest John Urschel, a two-time first-team All-Big Ten lineman at Penn State and a current member of the Baltimore Ravens, spent a few hours instructing the linemen. Wade Neiderer '17 was one of those linemen who felt that clinic was very beneficial. "Even though we were a young line coming in to the [clinic]," shares Neiderer, "we were more skilled at the end of it." Neiderer explained that even though there were a few individual drills, a lot of the instruction was group focused.

Postgame

Later that evening, a dinner raffle was held to celebrate the successful day and continue to raise funds for the next scholarship.

Ryan Hart had the opportunity to meet Coach Flaherty that evening.

"He was really nice," Hart said. "Not only did I get to see his Super Bowl ring up close, [but] he handed it to me to try on. It was heavy!"

Flaherty addressed the crowd at the dinner with stories about playing football for Delone Catholic and for his dad.

"I was incredibly impressed with the entire event," concludes Jennifer Hart. "For these kids to be able to receive instruction from [Coach Flaherty], college coaches, and a professional football player is something they are sure to remember."
