


Congratulations Mrs. Carter

Dear Friends and Alumni of Christ the King Catholic School,

Welcome to our first newsletter. One of the goals of this newsletter is to help our Alumni and Friends keep up with what is going on at Christ the King School. I know that for some it may seem odd to have alumni from elementary school keep up with the school or each other, but lets face it, some of the most formative years occur at this age and not in college and high school. I know that for myself 2 of my closest friends to this day are guys that I went to grade school with and that was obviously decades ago!

First of all I would like to remind all of you what a treasure that we have at Christ the King Catholic School. For well over 50 years Christ the King has been sending graduates on to high school with a strong academic foundation but a strong spiritual one as well. I was visiting with a graduate who is now in high school and they told me that much of what they were learning in religion they had learned here before. Our students consistently gain honors and scholarships as they move on to Bishop McGuinness, Mount St. Mary, or several other schools that our students have attended over the years. We have an awesome principal and staff, and that was recognized this year by the National Catholic Education Association as Mrs.Carter was named one of the most outstanding principals in the nation.

This year we had our first Annual Appeal, which was an awesome success. Some may ask, "Why the need?" "Doesn't the parish subsidize the school?" And it should.



The reality is that each year the parish supports the school almost \$1,000 per student, but obviously there are limits to what the parish can do as the numbers keep going up. We also want to add to our school endowment, which is very small compared to other schools our size. While the parish has total endowment funds of just over 2.5 million, only about 1.5 million is actually dedicated to the school. Why do we need an endowment? The reason is that we want to keep tuition reasonable so that as a Catholic school, our tuition is never out of reach of the people that we serve. The endowment helps with scholarships and operating expenses, so that tuition money can go into salaries and academic development.

This year, for example, thanks to your generosity we were able to add significantly to our school endowment. We were able to put artificial turf on the school playground, which is much nicer and safer than the old mulch and was a large expense that we could not have done otherwise. Also we were able to offer more financial aid than ever before, so that our school remains affordable to the people that we serve. I thank all of you who are so generous to this fund, to the school Auction and to other fundraisers as well as the parish. It was also great to get to meet some of our Alumni, who are no longer around Oklahoma City at our first annual alumni reunion. May God bless you all and together may we continue to build upon this great school that was given to us by the foresight and generosity of many generations before us.

2013 - 2014 ANNUAL FUND

Thanks to the generosity of our Annual Fund donors Christ the King was able to set up an Advancement Office with a part-time Advancement Director and purchase donor management software. This allows us to work on long-term financial goals which will help with projects that are not covered in the budget, help keep the subsidy from the church from having to increase, and help to keep tuition at a reasonable rate. We were able to increase the School Endowment Fund by \$100,960.00, increase the Scholarship Endowment Fund by \$3,575.00 and offer \$21,170.00 in tuition assistance to families for the 2014 - 2015 school year. The new school playground surface was completely funded by the Annual Fund for \$61,755.00. We received \$2,000.00 for technology needs. The library was able to purchase \$750.00 of new junior high level books for the Amy Smith memorial section.

In 1949 Christ the King Catholic School opened its doors to 72 students to offer a quality Catholic education in 1st-4th grades taught by 2 Benedictine Sisters. Today we have built on that foundation and provide 513 students from Pre-K to 8th grade with a quality Catholic education taught by 40 teachers. Times have certainly changed and we have certainly grown but our mission has stayed the same to be committed to uphold Catholic faith and tradition and, in partnership with families, help students develop academically for a life of faith, integrity and service. 2014 Distinguished Alumnus

Christ the King Catholic School is in its seventh year of honoring a distinguished alumnus, one who has been a good and faithful steward in both his professional and parish life. The 2014 recipient of this award was renowned artist, Greg Burns, Class of 1961.

Mr. Burns spent his early years doodling in the textbooks at Christ the King Catholic School and graduated from Bishop McGuinness High School in 1965 where he studied the work of famous artists under the tutelage of Sister Stephen. Born with Arthrogryposis, a muscle and joint disease that affects the use of his arms and legs, he spent his early years carried around by loving people and rolled around by family and good friends. He discovered his love of art at an early age and entered numerous art shows throughout his childhood. Mr. Burns draws cradling the pen in his hand, and watercolors by holding the brush in his teeth. He has spent all his energy attacking life, inspiring by example the rights and opportunities of disabled persons. He received his BFA in Fine Art from the University of Oklahoma and has won numerous art competitions throughout his life. He received the Governor's Art Award for Oklahoma in 1978 and was a member of the OK States Arts Council and the Oklahoma City Arts Commission. He is featured in an exhibit at the Oklahoma Heritage Association. Mr. Burns said the secret to his success is "not quitting." "In my experience if you think you can do something you can and when you don't think you can do something you can't. My parents provided me with the materials and the encouragement and off I went. I got so much support, too, from church and school." "It is important for handicapped people to get out there and try what they want to do. If something stops you, sit back and think. Then try it another way."

His adventures continue as Mr. Burns draws and paints on his many travels throughout the country and world with his wife, Patricia, whom he married in 1978. He is also busy with his website, gregburns-fineart.com.

Greg was presented with the Distinguished Alumnus Award on Sunday, May 11, 2014, at the 10:00 a.m. mass at Christ the King Catholic Church. A reception followed in the Parish Center Atrium.


