As the pastor I have to say that we are so very

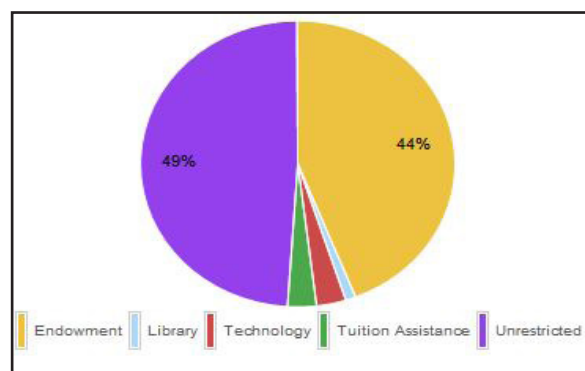

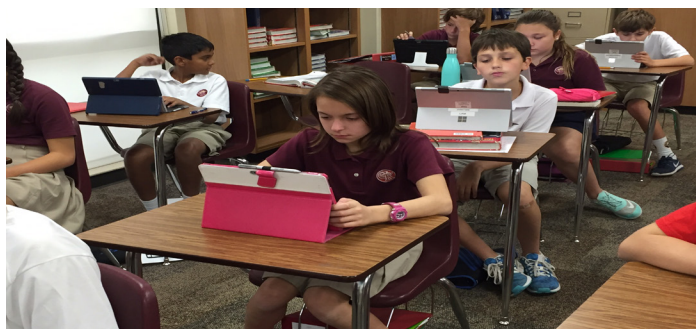


This year your generosity helped the Annual Fund raise a total of \$120,694.10. This allowed us to increase the School Endowment Fund by \$58,954.10, increase the Scholarship Endowment Fund by \$4,050.00 and offer additional tuition assistance to families for the 2015 -16 school year. We contributed \$28,341.00 towards the new gym floor and \$27,892.75 for the new One to One Technology Program. The library was able to purchase \$1,250.00 of new junior high level books for the Amy Smith memorial section.

ONE to ONE PROGRAM

The one to one program is an exciting voyage for all of us at Christ the King Catholic School. The program has been launched in its initial stages by placing tablets with all of the 6th grade students. The Surface Pro tablets have a detachable keyboard and an interactive touch screen. It has been exciting to see some of the ways that they have been utilized and how the students have responded to them. At this age they are all very comfortable with technology and have taken to the devices with relative ease. The ability to use this technology to enhance different learning styles that are beneficial to specific students is wonderful. It offers visual, auditory, and kinesthetic learners possibilities that would not be as readily available to them without this infusion of technology. Some of the textbooks are available online and others will be added in the future making the possibility of eliminating the thirty pound back pack a realistic benefit. There are always setbacks in the implementation of a new program and we are learning as we move forward, but the net benefits have made this a worthy endeavor. The utilization and growth of the one to one program is an exciting addition to the Christ the King landscape.

NEW GYM FLOOR

I am constantly reminded how lucky I am to be able to raise our children in Christ the King Parish. I am excited and inspired to be part of such a caring community, which emphasizes the importance of family, social interaction, and volunteerism. Our large parish provides seemingly endless opportunities to participate and make a difference, and our parishioners heed the call at every turn.

I am a Christ the King lifer. I was baptized at CK, attended school at CK with my brother and sister, got married at CK, and now send my kids to CK (with their cousins). My parents even got married at Christ the King back in 1952 in what is now the cafeteria.

I started at Christ the King in 1st grade in the fall of 1975 and graduated from 8th grade in 1983. At that time, CK didn't offer classes in kindergarten or pre-K. The school looked very different back then. The cafeteria and adjacent classroom hallway represented the northern boundary of the school. Each grade had only one class. If you were in 4th grade, you were in 4th grade, not "Mrs. Oldenburg's 4th grade." The west parking lot was our only parking lot. The east parking lot was our playground. There was no Mayfield Foyer, or an atrium, or any of the rooms that came with it. The junior high school/playground area was known as Greystone Presbyterian Church and we didn't own it.

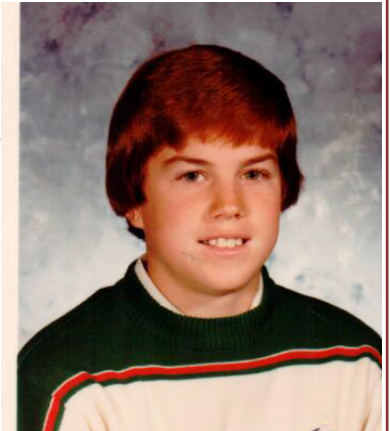
The first major facelift CK experienced in my lifetime was the construction of the original gym, which opened in 1982. We got to practice on the beautiful, state-of-the-art (at the time), poured rubber floor for one year before we graduated, and we loved it. That floor remained until a replacement floor was poured around the year 2000.

When I am not doing my day job, I am the CK athletics director and coach of several basketball teams. Over the past few years, I compared volleyball and basketball players using our gym to little kids playing on kitchen tile in socks. We constantly worked to keep the floor swept and mopped, but the adhesive effect would only last for about 20 minutes. It had finally reached a point where we were concerned about injuries. Fr. Rick and Mrs. Carter agreed that it was time to do get something done. We were in need of a change, and the parish came through as usual.

This past June, the new gym floor was installed. If you have not had a chance to see it, I encourage you to do so. We modified the colors and the design in the hopes of making basketball and volleyball lines more discernible. We also used a new sheet rubber, which is a very high-quality product. None of this would have been possible without the generosity of the school PTO (large monetary gift), the Christ the King Annual Fund (of which part was allocated toward the floor), the CK Parish (donation) and the CK Athletic Committee (donation).

As I said, I am a CK lifer. Because of the people of this parish, I hope my kids and grandkids will be too.

2016 Distinguished Alumnus

Most recently she led the Girls on the Run program both after school and as an elective for the Junior High students. This program inspires girls to be joyful, healthy and confident using a fun, experience-based curriculum which creatively integrates running. Dana also served on the board of the Good Shepherd Catholic School, which services children on the autism spectrum, Bishop McGuinness Alumni Board, the Bishop McGuinness PTSO Board and as a CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) where she was honored as an Outstanding Volunteer.

GIRLS ON THE RUN

If you happen to see groups of girls running around the Christ the King campus after school in the Spring or perhaps some mornings in the Fall, there's a good chance they are part of the Girls on the Run afterschool program or its junior high program, called Heart and Sole. Girls on the Run is an international program that uses running and physical activity to promote a healthy and confident lifestyle for girls in the third through eighth grades. This will be the fourth year Girls on the Run has been offered at Christ the King as an after school activity in the Spring for third, fourth and fifth grade girls. This is the second year that the junior high program for Girls on the Run, called Heart & Sole, has been offered as an elective to seventh grade girls during the school day during the Fall semester.

But Girls on the Run is so much more than a running program. The lessons encourage positive social, emotional, mental and physical development. The curriculum allows every girl to recognize her strengths and develop healthy strategies to navigate life experiences. Throughout the season, the girls build their confidence and celebrate all that makes them unique. And each season concludes with a celebratory 5K.

Dana Brou Hill '83 is the current Girls on the Run coach at Christ the King. With the help of the other current and former coaches, Amanda Putnam Koltavy '84, Amy McIntyre, Machel Clayton, Lisa Powel and Lisa Mullins, Christ the King School has had over 75 girls participate in the program so far. In a recent interview for an article in the Daily Oklahoman on the program, CK Girls on the Run had this to say, "I really enjoyed the running because during the running we would be learning things – like about ourselves. It helped us set goals and stuff," said Kelly Willis. Ava Thielke added, "I learned how to stop bullying and stop a rumor someone started that wasn't true."

Leslie Littlejohn, the Oklahoma County Girls on the Run director, says that "Truly watching a girl who will look at you and say, 'There is no way I can run a 5K', finish one that day – you just know she believes she can conquer the world." Girls on the Run is available at many sites in central Oklahoma, including public school in OKC, Norman, Mustang, Moore, and Tecumseh. For more information, visit girlsontherunokcounty.org.

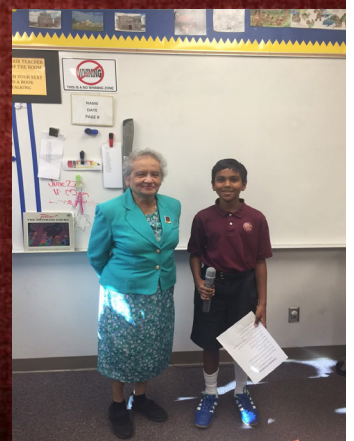
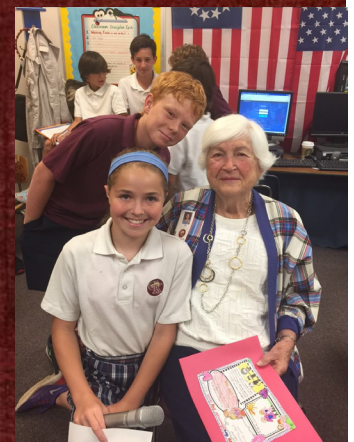


GRANDPARENTS DAY

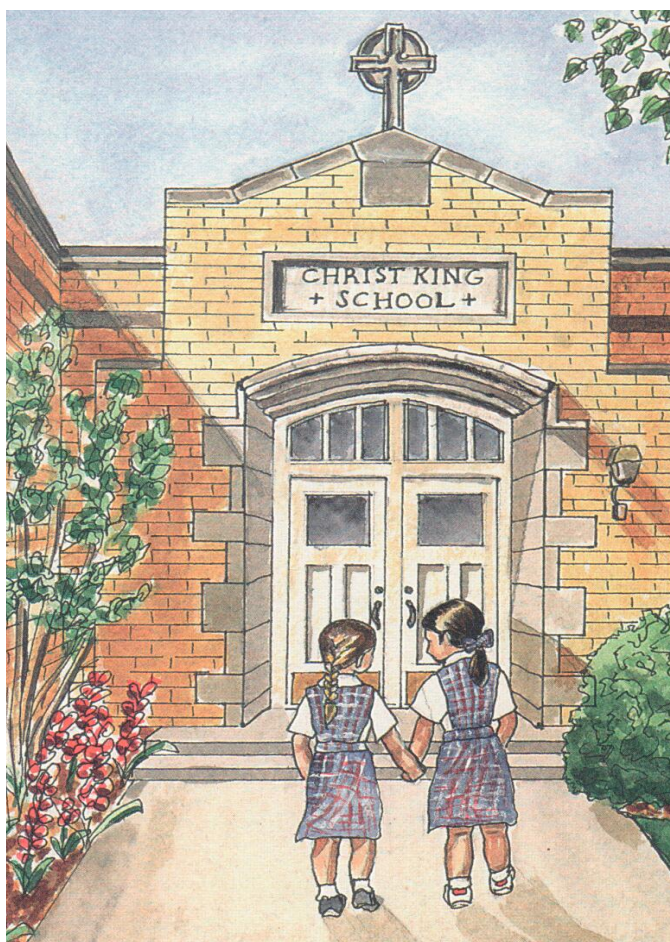
