The cover of this Fall 2008 issue of DELONE TODAY features the new look of Delone Catholic High School's stadium. When it became clear during the 2007-2008 school year that the bleachers in place for over 65 years were beyond on-going repair and needed to be rebuilt from the foundation up, Delone Catholic's Building and Grounds Committee of the Board of Directors began the demanding task of seeking assistance from architects and contractors and undertook the work of getting the job done. After approval from Delone's Board of Directors and appropriate Diocesan authorities, the project began in earnest last May. By the end of July, 2008, 98% of the project was finished. The project could not be delayed unless Delone wished to play all its football games in away stadiums or have everyone bring their own lawn chairs....both very impractical. So with borrowed funds the project moved forward. To pay for this much needed improvement Delone Catholic is seeking a major donor who might wish to see the name(s) of a parent, a grandparent, a teacher, a coach or a corporation on the Stadium itself, or someone who might wish to donate anonymously and leave it to future generations to speculate who really gave the new bleachers to the Delone Catholic community. Delone, Esq., gave the land and the money upon which the school named for him rose from the ashes of St. Mary's Central Catholic High School. Principal's Message

September, 2008

Dear Friends of Delone Catholic High School,

The J.T. Flaherty Field was buzzing with excitement, color and activity from the late spring and through the summer. Black and gold is now everywhere! Buildings sport our athletic colors as well as our new bleachers. Dedicated volunteers gathered on selected Saturdays in June and July to paint all the buildings. Cindy Staub donated her artistic talents to climb onto the JLG aerial lift operated by Jack Kale to touch up the mural that she had painted on the South Street press box years ago. Jack spent his time while on the lift painting all the other areas of the back of the press box. Tom Klunk supervised the entire bleacher project for the Board. His expertise minimized our stress knowing that the project would be well done and within the time frame dictated. Doubles can proceed on the field as scheduled for August 11th. What a relief during all football games that now no one can fall through the openings between the bleachers nor can they fall when the boards crack. We have a beautiful facility that will be functional for many years to come.

So now what we have accomplished on the outside we need to accomplish on the inside of our building. We have a 1940 building, a 1955 wing and a 1963 wing. That means that the construction finished at that time. Let's see, 1940, that means that the existing classrooms in that wing are now 68 years old, concomitantly, 53 years old and 45 years old. Since the 1963 wing houses the science labs, it has been 45 years since the labs have been upgraded. Now is the time. If Delone Catholic had been a public school with access to tax dollars, the school would have been built three times over. As we approach our Diamond Anniversary in 2014-2015, we need to overhaul our existing structure to reflect the pride and faith that has always been part of the legacy of Delone Catholic. What a celebration we could have in our 75th year with a renovation completed!

The rest of the building needs to become energy efficient in terms of heating, cooling and electricity. The technology of the day and near future will allow us to modify our structure and minimize operating costs, which will pay for itself as the years progress. The cracked floor tiles need to be removed and replaced with the poured floors already existing in the cafeteria and some hallways. Removal of the non-friable asbestos tiles on the floors adds to the cost and the time frame needed to complete each project.

At Delone Catholic we are surrounded by young people who search for knowledge in their faith and in their academic pursuits. The graduating class of 2008 exemplified this search as they earned over five million dollars in scholarships to continue their education beyond Delone Catholic. Our future depends on today and how we can enhance our existing programs and facilities to continue to challenge our students "spiritually, academically, physically, socially, and aesthetically within the traditions and teachings of the Roman Catholic Church."

Delone Catholic has predicated each decision with intelligent input from constituencies and from experts in the field. Choices have been made based on critical need at that point in time. We now have the opportunity to choose, to move from chance to choice, to create a facility that will serve the needs of the future, to serve the needs of our students for Catholic secondary education in this area. Our future is built on our past; our future depends on you.

CLASS OF 2008 BACCALAUREATE AND GRADUATION

One hundred fifty-six students in the Class of 2008 graduated on Friday, June 2, 2008. Of that number, 96% plan to continue their education through college, trade, technical or vocational training, or military service. The guest speaker for the evening was Reverend Edward Quinlan, Secretariat, Diocese of Harrisburg. The 2008 Class Valedictorian was Mark Hayden. The Salutatorian was Meghan Wiebe. The 156-member class received an unprecedented total of \$5,170,414.00 in scholarships and other monetary awards from colleges, university and/or various organizations. The awards were presented after the Baccalaureate Mass on Thursday evening, May 29th, 2008 at St. Joseph Church in Hanover.

The highest and most prestigious award, *The Catholic Faith Award*, which is presented to a college-bound senior who best exemplifies a commitment to the teachings of the Catholic Church and lives out that commitment as a young adult, was awarded to **Kelsey Bowker**.





Her great-grandmother Evelyn Staub was in Delone Catholic's first graduating class.



David underwent his 25th operation the week of August 4th. He is now able to walk with his prosthesis and currently resides in Molonge House on the grounds of the Walter Reed Hospital complex. His parents have been able to bring him home to Hanover for an occasional weekend visit. His father believes that David's continuing rehabilitation will take an additional nine months to a year before he will be released from Walter Reed. DELONE CATHOLIC COACH RECEIVES NATIONAL AWARD

Brother Rene Sterner, FSC, '55, Director of Development and Alumni Relations at Delone Catholic High School, has also directed Delone Catholic's speech and debate program for the past two years. At the 2008 National Forensic League National Finals held in Las Vegas, NV from June 15th-20th Brother Rene received the first ever awarded National Forensic League National Lifetime Service Award at the NFL Awards ceremony held on Friday, June 20th on the campus of University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

Brother Rene has been an active NFL coach since September of 1960 and has been a member of the NFL's nine member governing Executive Council since 1978. He is also a member of the NFL's National Hall of Fame and a charter inductee into the Pennsylvania High School Speech League's Hall of Fame. He was the Tournament Director of the National Catholic Forensic League's National Grand Tournament from 1973 through 1998. He also served as the NFL District Chair of the Pittsburgh NFL District and was the founding Chair of the Valley Forge NFL District. During his years of coaching he also served as Diocesan Director of the Catholic Forensic League in the Diocese of Pittsburgh, and the Archdioceses of Baltimore and Philadelphia as well as President of the National Catholic Forensic League.

Brother also served as Principal of Calvert Hall College in Towson, MD from 1980 to 1990 and as President of La Salle College High School in Wyndmoor, PA from 1991 through 2005. After a year sabbatical he returned to the Hanover area in July of 2006 to help in looking after his then 92 year old father and also became Director of Development and Alumni Relations at his Alma Mater.

Brother will be returning to the Christian Brothers community at La Salle College High School in mid-October.

DELONE CATHOLIC TO HOST ANNUAL MSGR. WILLIAM R. LYONS **FORENSIC TOURNAMENT ON DECEMBER 6, 2008**

The Delone Catholic High forensic team will host the Annual Msgr. William R. Lyons Forensic Tournament on December 6, 2008. Last year's tournament brought some twenty schools to Delone Catholic for the annual competition in Policy Debate, Lincoln-Douglas Debate, Public Forum Debate, ExTemporaneous Speaking, Commentary, Original Oratory, Oral Interpretation of Literature, Dramatic Interpretation, Humorous Interpretation, Duo Interpretation, and Oratorical Declamation. The day will begin with Registration at 8:00AM and Rounds of competition beginning at 9:00AM. Final Rounds will get underway by 3:00PM with Awards at 5:15PM. The day's events are open to the general public. Delone Catholic's forensic team will be competing and current parents and alumni parents of members of the team will be providing hospitality to all of the judges, coaches, and student participants.

DELONE CATHOLIC ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS STAND OUT

The most recent Delone Catholic High School Profile provides some impressive academic accomplishments of Delone Catholic's students.

Over the past five years Delone Catholic has had a total of nine (9) National Merit Finalists, four (4) Semi-Finalists, and thirty-four (34) National Merit Commended students. This is one of the best of any secondary school in South Central Pennsylvania.

In the Advanced Placement Examinations given in May of 2008, Delone Catholic students also did outstanding work. Delone Catholic provides the opportunity for its students to take Advanced Placement classes which are college level courses taught by Delone Catholic's faculty. At the end of each A.P. course, students take a four-hour Advanced Placement Exam in each of subject areas. Results are graded on a scale of 5,4,3,2, and 1. Students who receive scores of five and four (and in some cases a three) will usually receive six college credits for each course from the college or university they will attend in the future. This is a very demanding college level final exam in each of the particular subjects. In English Literature and Composition two (2) Delone Catholic students received a grade of five (5), two (2) received a grade of four (4) and ten (10) received a grade of three (3); the average score of all of the Delone Catholic students taking this particular exam was 3.33. In the United States History Exam ten (10) Delone students received a grade of four (4, and the average of all Delone Catholic students taking the U.S. History Exam was 3.553. In Calculus AB six (6) Delone Catholic students received a grade of five (5), four (4) received a grade of four (4), and two (2) received a grade of three (3) and the average grade of Delone students taking this particular exam was 3.8. In Physics one (1) student received a grade of five (5) and in A.P. Statistics two (2) students received a grade of five (5). Students taking multiple A.P. Courses and scoring well in multiple A.P. Exams can earn up to a semester or even an entire year's worth of college credits, allowing the student to finish college a semester or year early, or to take a lighter load in college. This year one Delone Catholic senior graduated earning a "5" in each of the six courses (two taken as a Junior and four taken as a Senior) in which he tested. Depending upon the college or university selected this could have earned him a total of 36 college credits – an entire year's worth of credits. This may be an Advanced Placement record for a Delone Catholic High School student. These achievements speak well of the dedication and hard work of Delone Catholic's faculty and students.


Girls' Track and Field

Since 1940 each of the pastors and later one lay representative from each parish, along with three at-large members, came to constitute the Board of Directors who oversee the operation of Delone Catholic High School. 

Prayer of Archbishop Oscar Romero, martyred Archbishop of El Salvador.

Let us remember that we are in the holy presence of God.

It helps, now and then, to step back and take the long view. The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts,

of El Salvador, on 15 August 1917. He was the second of seven children. When he was thirteen he declared a vocation to the priesthood. In February 1977, Oscar Romero became archbishop of San Salvador. As Archbishop of San Salvador, Father Romero was a source of strength and hope for the poor and for the oppressed of his country, working with and for them, taking their struggles as his own. Romero wrote and spoke passionately and publicly of the need for Christians to work for justice, frequently faced with threat and danger from those who opposed his ideas. On March 24, 1980, while celebrating the Eucharist, Archbishop Romero was shot and killed at the altar by a death squad assassin, paying the highest price for the commitment about which he spoke so often and so eloquently. Because of his courageous stand for justice, he became a martyr not only for poor Salvadorians but for all struggling to overcome oppression and poverty. Today, his sermons are read as powerful reminders of Christians' obligation to fight for a just society. Shortly before he was murdered, Romero said: "It is my hope that my blood will be the seed of freedom and the sign that hope will soon be reality" The example of Romero's courageous life and ultimately death continue to inspire those who struggle for human dignity and justice. -SalsaNet

FROM WHENCE COMETH THE SQUIRES AND SQUIRETTES

When free Catholic secondary education began in the Conewago Valley it was St. Mary's Central High School located at Annunciation Parish in McSherrystown that led the way. For a time there were some secondary classes conducted at St. Joseph's Parish in Hanover, but eventually it was St. Mary's Central Catholic that took in most of the area parishes and offered a complete four-year high school education. During those years in the late twenties and thirties the teams at St. Mary's Central were known as the Crusaders. However, when St. Mary's Central Catholic burned to the ground in March of 1938 the teams at the new Delone Catholic which opened its doors in September, 1940 were known as the Squires. What was the reason for this change in team mascot? Two stories have emerged and we welcome hearing from any Delone Catholic alumni who can shed any light on the matter. After the fire the students from St. Mary's Central Catholic were housed in the Knights of Columbus Building on Main Street in McSherrystown and in the nearby Pfaltzgraff Building. At that time the Knights of Columbus had a youth organization known as the Columban Squires. Here are the two versions of how Delone Catholic's team became the Squires (and Squirettes although Delone had no girl's sports teams at the time). Version One is that the name Squires came from the K of C youth group known as the Columban Squires and since the K of C had housed the school temporarily it was a way to honor the Knights. Version Two is that everyone knew Mr. Charles J. Delone, Esq. as "Squire" Delone because he was a very distinguished local lawyer (a graduate of Harvard University Law School no less) and that the name Squires was chosen to honor "Squire" Delone. We would like to hear from any of our graduates from the early 1940's to tell us what actually happened and which version is the correct one. Who made this decision? Was it the student's choice? Were there some concerns that Harrisburg Catholic (now Bishop McDevitt) and Lancaster Catholic were both also named the Crusaders and it was time for some originality? If anyone knows how this change from "Crusaders" to "Squires" came about please call the Alumni Office at Delone Catholic - 717-637-5969, Ext. 201. Delone Catholic honors its graduates who have made great contributions in the public square. Their living out of being 'DOERS OF THE WORD' comes in many forms and is expressed in many ways. This edition of DELONE TODAY salutes two Delone Catholic Alumni for their involvement and contributions to the human community and for being "DOERS OF THE WORD". We WELCOME your suggestions of other alumni who are 'DOERS OF THE WORD".

Julie Overbaugh, '75, enjoyed her four years at Delone Catholic. Delone influenced her future in some unique ways. She writes: "One of the best things about my Delone education was the fact that there was a balance of 'priorities'. The focus was not all about academics and having the best grades. There was also an appreciation among the students and the community on things like athletics and friendships and relationships. I think that growing up with that balance has helped me tremendously. People think of science as an intellectual and academic activity but the reality is that it is also a very social discipline. I spend a considerable amount of time mentoring and motivating my students and my trainees, and I think that my interest in my social life while at Delone helped me to develop important interpersonal skills. Likewise, my participation in team sports helped me to understand team dynamics which is an important aspect of science. I suspect these experiences and this type of balance helps in most things in later life. That is not to say that academics are not important, they are. But an absolute focus on academics, rather than this balance would have probably made me less effective as a mentor, teacher, and team leader. Being able to work well and interact with people is quite important. Interestingly sports was also a very important factor in my scientific career - in an unexpected way. It turns out that at most scientific meetings, there are breaks for

"free time" and many scientists are very active. As a junior person in the field I was able to break in on some of the more senior ranks because I played tennis. Almost all the senior people in science at the time were men, and since sports were an important social event at meetings, it tended to favor junior men in the field. By my having played a lot of competitive sports it gave me an extra in, something I would never have predicted." Incidentally, Julie had attended the University of Connecticut on a basketball scholarship.

When Julie was asked about teachers who were particularly influential on her as a student she mentioned two: David Nuen and Sister Loretta. Mr. Nuen was her religion teacher. He was someone who fostered critical thinking which was an

important skill throughout her career. Critical thinking is one of the most important things about being a scientist. "He fostered my ability to use my mind in this way." Sister Loretta was my art teacher. She encouraged creativity - "a gift which I bring to bear in my life and in my work".

After completing her Ph.D. in chemistry Julie realized that she wanted to find a way to impact public health and public policy. And the public health policy which Julie has dedicated her professional life to is AIDS and particularly what can be done to reduce the transmission of the AIDS virus from mother to infant. How does the virus work? How does it actually enter the human cell? After five years of post-doctoral studies at Harvard she started her own laboratory that focuses on



understanding HIV transmission. She has authored over 200 major articles on AIDS. She has opened a major AIDS clinic in Kenya where doctors, nurses, and health professionals are trained on how to reduce the transmission of the AIDS virus. She divides her time between the clinic in Kenya and the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center, Public Health Sciences Division in Seattle, WA. If you go on-line you can see the literally hundreds of research projects and papers she has directed, authored, and co-authored.

When asked about her experiences in Africa Julie offered the following response.

"Working in Kenya has been a fabulous experience. I started collaborating with physicians there about 15 years ago, and now some of those people are very good friends. I also have several Kenyan students who are getting their Ph.D. training with me, and I am absolutely stunned by how motivated they are and the sacrifices they make for education. They leave spouses, families, even children to come train in the lab. Their goal is to go back to help the devastation of AIDS in their country and this commitment is unwavering. I have to say that it was a personal challenge to go to Kenya the first time. I had never been to the developing world. It is still challenging at times to travel there. But it is also so eye opening and a great learning experience. As with most things the challenge is rewarded. I expect that I will continue to work closely with Kenyan researchers for the rest of my career. I will always have strong ties there because of the people I have trained who are from Kenya. This year we built a small lab at the University of Nairobi and set up an infrastructure to diagnose infant HIV infections and determine it they will be resistant to antiviral drugs. That lab is now led by a former student. My hope is to expand that lab over the next decade and transfer all of our technologies so that Kenyan scientists can lead research efforts there".

In an extraordinary and passionate way Julie Overbaugh, '75, lives out the Delone Catholic command to be a "DOER OF THE WORD!" Delone Catholic wishes Julie all the best in the challenges she meets to bring healing to a world so much in need.

ON THE SQUARE

Delone Catholic's second DOER OF THE WORD focuses on George V. Lingg,'70. Much of the inspiration of George's community involvement comes from experiences he learned at Delone Catholic. In 1989 George was a parishioner at Christ the Redeemer Church in Herndon, VA when he experienced a life-changing medical event that made him think of his school motto at Delone Catholic High School in McSherrystown, PA – "BE DOERS OF THE WORD." That verse from the first chapter of James – "Be doers of the word of God, not simply those who hear" –was meant to challenge a generation of Delone students to experience Jesus Christ personally.

It came back to Lingg as a call to fight the clinical depression affecting his life. Lingg wanted to be a doer and not someone who heard the word but ignored it. He wanted to follow Christ who said, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." What better way to express that love then through helping your neighbor overcome financial hardship or, at a more basic level, sharing food with them. Lingg is emphatic on this point, insisting that helping your neighbor was not a suggestion. "Jesus commanded us to help our neighbor," he said.

Lingg decided to obey Christ's command and channel his desire to help through an organization called LINK (Loudon Interdenominational Network for Karing). Founded in 1972, its mission is to provide people in need in Sterling and eastern Loudon County with emergency food and financial assistance. That mission soon expanded beyond Loudon County to include Fairfax County and the city of Herndon. With the expansion, the name now represents a linking of Christians together to fight hunger and poverty. LINK now assists more than 7,000 people annually providing them with necessary food and medical assistance. Lingg likes the ecumenical aspect of LINK and the fact that it's an organization run entirely by volunteers. "That's what attracted me," he said. "It's all volunteer." This heavy emphasis on volunteers keeps the administrative costs to about 7 percent of LINK'S operating budget. LINK is supported by 15 area Christian churches, including Christ the Redeemer Parish, and it is a key vehicle for supplying aid to thousands of needy citizens in Loudon and Fairfax counties. Member churches provide the donated food and the necessary volunteer labor to distribute it. "LINK is very important to Christ the Redeemer Church," said Father Donald Howard, Christ the Redeemer pastor, "It is our outreach program."

Father Howard said all parish outreach services go through LINK and that Lingg's participation on the LINK Board of Directors and the Christ, the Redeemer liaison since 1987 has been critical in providing the necessary services for those in need.

Lingg's health issues have been an impetus for LINK to find new ways to help its clients. Several years ago Lingg suffered three retinal detachments in one month. This unlikely series of medical mishaps gave Lingg another idea to help his neighbors. As a fiscal analyst for the Fairfax County Public School system, Lingg has health insurance that covered the majority of the costs associated with these retinal detachments. But as the bills came in and Lingg saw the costs associated with his medical crisis he thought, how can people without medical insurance afford this? Spurred on by this medical epiphany he worked with the office of Congressman Frank Wolf, R-Va., to get a \$100,000.00 grant for medical and prescription services. This grant helped fund the installation of a computer and special software at the Herndon Free Clinic to help find discount prescription services. Lingg was also instrumental in establishing a program that supplied mattresses and box springs to needy families. The program initially used donated mattresses, but a new Virginia state law requiring only sanitized mattresses to be donated forced LINK and Lingg to find an alternative to costly sanitizing procedures. Lingg prepared a Request for Proposal that went to eight or nine mattress vendors and resulted in a cost effective contract awarded to Mattress Discounters to supply new mattresses and box springs. The program is helping two qualified families each month receive new beds.

The association with LINK has been a continuing labor of Christian love for Lingg who says his commitment is a very personal act of Christian faith. Lingg is very proud of the work of LINK and its volunteers do for the community. This commitment to LINK prompted the town of Herndon to award Lingg the Distinguished Service Award for 2008 during the mayor's Volunteer Appreciation Night last month in Herndon. The award is very prestigious, but when asked how he felt when he received it Lingg said that he is a small part of LINK and the power of its volunteers is what makes the program a success and what shows us all to be "Doers of the Word."

CLASS OF 1963 ESTABLISHES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Class of 1963 has established an endowed Scholarship to honor the memory of their deceased classmates. The Scholarship Trust was officially established at Delone Catholic High School on Monday, July 7, 2008 and will be entrusted to the financial direction of FOCUS, the financial management department of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Harrisburg. It is the hope and intention of the Class of 1963 that this endowed Scholarship will reach \$100,000.00 by the time of the Class's 50th Reunion in 2013. Robert Hemler, '63 and other Class Officers met at Delone on July 7th to sign a formal request to the Diocesan Development Office to begin the management of this Endowment. Endowed Scholarships can be officially opened for diocesan high schools and for parishes when the initial gifts given reach \$5,000.00.

The Class of 1963 began their Scholarship Trust with an initial gift of \$5,000.00 from one of the members of the Class. Over half of the \$100,000.00 has already been pledged by members of the Class. It is Delone Catholic's hope that other classes will consider doing something similar. It is a bargain and yet there are those families who simply cannot afford the \$4,200.00 a year, particularly if there are several children in the family. That is why Delone needs a number of endowed financial aid grants to assist young men and women who wish to be students at Delone Catholic.
