





 - -Potomac River








- III. Discovered by Christopher Newport




Fall Line

Regions

- I. Coastal Plains
 - I. Flat land
 - II. Near Atlantic Ocean & Chesapeake
 - III. East of Fall line
- II. Piedmont (land at foot of MTS.)
 - I. Rolling hills west of Fall Line
- III. Blue Ridge Mountains
 - I. Old & rounded
 - II. Part of Appalachian mtn. system
 - III. Between piedmont & Valley and Ridge regions
 - IV. Source of many rivers
- IV. Valley & Ridge
 - I. Includes the Great Valley of VA and other valleys separated by ridges
 - II. Located west of Blue Ridge Mtns.
- V. Appalachian Plateau
 - I. In Southwest VA
 - II. Only small part of plateau located in VA




Coastal Plain - Low, Flat Land




Piedmont & Blue Ridge Mts.

 - Blue Rock




Valley & Ridge
