## Agenda:

1. Youth Climate Summit, November 9 and 10, 2022

- a. The two days were a success. According to our Green Team members: "We should be more respectful to our environment. We need to be more involved and make people aware that the world's environment is hurting."
- b. Our idea for a Sustainable Impact Project was to get the school composting up and running. It has been done in the past, but the food was just being dumped after being separated. Is this a project we could make sustainable so that after our current members leave high school, the composting could still be happening?
