
The delivery of urgent supplies to quake-hit areas of northern Syria has been complicated by a long-running civil war between opposition forces and the Syrian government, led by President Bashar al-Assad, who is accused of killing his own people. Also, Russia, which backs Assad's regime, has previously blocked approval for another aid route to Syria at the United Nations. According to Reuters, approximately 51,907 people have died. At least 118,626 people have had non-fatal injuries. At least 2.4 million people have been displaced. As many as 24 million people have been affected. Over 200,089 buildings have been destroyed. And there has been between 50-90 billion dollars in property damage.



The disaster toppled down buildings, schools, and hospitals, leaving communities and infrastructure in ruins. The people in Turkey are furious because they think that there was poor construction since the government wanted to save money. Because they believe this contributed to the widespread death and destruction, Turkish people have protested against the government.



People have created charities to support Turkey and Syria for the cause of the damage. More than 150 aid trucks carrying desperately-needed relief supplies including food, water, shelter, and cleaning essentials have crossed into northwest Syria from Turkey, according to the United Nations. More shipments are also on the way to the area. Global Giving, a United States-based humanitarian nonprofit, is accepting donations for its Turkey and Syria Earthquake Relief Fund.



Billions of Years In One Telescope

What would happen if scientists could see 200 million years after the universe was formed, a phenomenon that is known as the Big Bang? The James Webb Space Telescope is one of NASA's Great Observatories, a series of huge space instruments that will peer deep into the Milky Way. According to spaceplace.nasa.gov, the James Webb Space Telescope will be able to capture images of the first galaxies ever formed, look inside dust clouds, and observe new stars and planets when they form.

The James Webb Space
Telescope sees the universe in light that is invisible to the human eye which is known as infrared radiation. This telescope uses its infrared cameras to see through dust in the universe. Stars and planets form inside those dust clouds, so looking inside these dust clouds could lead to some interesting discoveries. This instrument will also be able to see objects—the first galaxies—that are so far away that the expansion of the universe has made their light shift from visible to infrared.

Space telescopes use mirrors to collect and focus light from distant stars. The bigger the mirror, the more details it can see. Naturally, it would be difficult to launch a giant, heavy mirror into space. So engineers solved this problem by giving the telescope eighteen smaller mirrors covered in gold to help reflect infrared light. The mirrors fold up inside the rocket, then unfold to form one large mirror in orbit.

Just like how people wear sunglasses to block out the sun from their eyes. This telescope has a sunshield to protect its mirrors and other important features of the Webb telescope. The size of the sunshield is roughly about the size of a tennis court!



Pictures taken from the Webb telescope were very sharp, pristine, and full of information. The James Webb telescope is better than anyone had predicted! Some people even say it was too good. With the discovery of 850 early galaxies, there is a great deal for scientists to study and understand.

Data Is Evolving

Over the years, data has evolved from a megabyte equal to one million bytes if one were to compare it to a zettabyte which is a hundred thousand times the amount of a megabyte. A yottabyte is a unit of digital information that is an enormous number of bytes or its 1000 zettabytes. Many places have data centers that use these big machines that carry a great deal of data which comprises the hardware equipment used in the data centers that includes routers, switches, firewalls, cables, and modems. These machines need cooling systems that are used to draw away the heat produced in the data machines. Estimates are that these data machines hold about 1 petabyte for each one of them. These machines are called servers, and the role of a server is to share data resources and distribute work.

In the future, big data analytics will increasingly focus on data freshness with the goal of real-time analysis, enabling better-informed decisions and increased competitiveness. Also, as AI evolves, data analytics solutions are also changing and becoming more sophisticated.



It's amazing to think the first way to store data was the IBM 23FD which was created in 1971. It was called the floppy disk drive which was used with the System 370 among other computers. But these days, up to 1000 zettabytes or one yottabyte which is an incredible number of one sextillion can be stored. It is important that the method of storage of data is evolving because there are significant new developments and the world will need more data and the means to store it

Data is important because good data allows organizations to establish baselines, benchmarks, and goals to keep. Because data allows one to measure if a person can establish baselines, find benchmarks and set performance goals. Data can also be important because health is important to track. For example, if a person is trying to lose weight, he/she can track the progress with photos which get stored as data on devices. Tracking obesity is important because obesity increases the risk of several debilitating and deadly diseases, including diabetes, heart disease, and some cancers.

The Issue of Obesity in Youth

Childhood obesity is a common problem in the United States. People say about seventeen percent of children in the United States are obese according to stateofchildhoodobesity.org . This is troubling because the extra pounds often lead children on the path of health problems that were once considered adult problems. If children are obese, they are at risk of health problems in the future such as high blood pressure and type 2 diabetes.

Obesity as defined by google is the state or condition of being very fat or overweight. A child could be obese for many different reasons such as poor lifestyle choices which can include too little activity, too many calories from food and drinks, and poor sleep routines according to cdc.gov. Another reason why a child could become overweight is because of genetics. If the family has a history of obesity, the child will have a higher chance of becoming overweight. A third reason why a child may have weight problems is because of certain medications a child may take like corticosteroids, antidepressants, diabetes medications such as insulin or those containing sulfonylureas, some heartburn drugs, hormone therapy, or anti-seizure drugs such as Depakote.



With regard to medications, doctors are allowing weight loss surgery and weight loss drugs for kids twelve and above. Some of the drugs that are being used now are Orlistat, Saxenda, Qsymia and Wegovy. One surgery doctors are allowing is bariatric surgery. Bariatric surgery makes the stomach smaller and makes other changes in the digestive system. Medical professionals are now allowing this because they say that watchful waiting (closely watching a patient's health but not prescribing any treatment or medication unless the symptoms change) does not solve the problem, it only worsens it.

Childhood obesity is a very dangerous thing both physically and mentally. It can affect the child's mood and people with obesity often experience depression, anxiety, and low self-esteem. This can also affect whether or not the child will be obese in the future. There are ways to prevent this such as exercising daily, eating healthy and not spending so much time on electronics.

Weight Does Not Define What You Are

An eating disorder is a serious condition related to persistent eating behaviors that negatively impact people's health. People with eating disorders can be having distressing thoughts and emotions. One type of eating disorder is anorexia nervosa, a condition that occurs when people have a fear of looking or being overweight. Bulimia nervosa, another type of eating disorder happens when people overeat way too much and then afterwards they make themselves vomit due to feeling disgusted about how much they ate. 

One of the small, but noticeable rules MLB has implemented into the game is making the bases bigger. The methodology behind this rule is that many injuries occur when the fielder has his foot on the base and the runner accidentally runs into his foot while trying to make an effort to be safe at first. Also with these bigger bases, although it is only by a couple inches, stolen bases have been becoming more alive than ever in recent years in the MLB. This can really encourage players to steal bases more often and is rewarding to the fast players on the team.


