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Select Students Visit New-York Historical Society To Learn About Cultural Immigration

PS 83 is taking part in the Cultural Immigration Initiative with the partnership of the Center for Educational Innovation's Project BOOST. This program is located at the New-York Historical Society. The initiative is giving students the opportunity to learn about civics, immigration, and citizenship throughout American History as well as the use of digital tools to create their presentations. There will be a final exit project at the end using both of these resources.

Ms. Linda Collins, an ELA Staff Developer and Ms. Susan Barrett, a seventh-grade teacher, are taking select sixth and seventh grade to the museum located at 170 Central Park Ave, in New York City for eight visits. The students will be traveling from a bus at PS 83 to the New-York Historical Society, the oldest museum in New York City. Students will gather in the lobby at around 1:20 PM and wait for the bus. The duration of each trip is roughly 1:20 to 5:30 however the actual session will be about one hour and forty minutes long starting at around three o'clock.

The first date was January 2 with the session of studying objects, works of art, documents, and the use of 3D modeling. The second session is January 9 with the session of the American Story and building an adventure story on a software called "Twine". The third session is on January 16 when the students will be observing paintings of early America as well as designing a website. The fourth session will take place on February 6 and is about slavery in New York and learning about audio production. The fifth session is on February 13 and is about studying immigration from 1609 through the twentieth century, as well as development on the final project. The sixth session which is about women artists and activists and more development on the project will be on February 27. The seventh session is on March 4 and is about the many ways citizen activists affected change throughout American history. The eighth and final session is on March 11 and is a day to showcase the projects on the historical knowledge the students obtained and their digital literacy about using the tools stated above.

Twenty-eight students have begun the program. Nineteen students are coming from the sixth grade from Classes 6-410 and 6-308. The seventh grade has nine students from Classes 7-409, 7-415, and 7-417.

The participants are excited for what is to come with this new program. They hope this will be a step forward into more special opportunities!

Then, the school picked twelve girls in the eighth grade from Classes 8-509 and 8-508 to be group leaders and guide the fourth graders by sharing experiences and being open about the things that bothered them at the same age.

Ms. Whitfield started the meeting with a sixtyminute peer leader training, which demonstrated and went over what the eighth graders would do in groups with six to eight girls from the fourth grade. After meeting the fourth graders, the founder began with a short story of how the FearlesslyGirl began. She mentioned how it started in elementary school when she felt unworthy and useless as if everyone could climb a tree and move forward with improvements but she stayed in her spot not making any progress. It took her until high school to open her heart to her parents and classmates. When she found the key to open her heart she realized that she opened other girl's hearts during the lunch conversation. That's when the idea of FearlesslyGirl started. Most of the eighth graders related to her story and understood how she felt.

During the opening, Ms. Whitfield also mentioned the idea of a PERFECT GIRL that all the girls want to be but, in reality, this perfect girl doesn't exist. The program itself began with a full-group activity, which was standing in a large circle and as Kate read statements like "I feel pressure to be perfect", "I have been bullied", "I feel like I've been judged unfairly", "I feel pressure to act or dress a certain way in order to fit in" ... etc. teachers, eighth-graders and fourthgraders girls took a step forward if they related to the statement. Based on my observation many girls took a step boldly revealing that they related to the statement. Finally, Kate handed in the fourth-grade girls to the leaders and put them in small groups to start the other activities. Some of the activities included discussing questions, moments in life were they experienced things like (bullying or pressure to look different or try fit in) and sharing what they learned from their experiences... "Girl Talk!".

All girls in the group participated and talked even though some were shy or scared to speak, the leader's mission was to make the fourth-grade girls feel comfortable and relaxed and it seemed to work. One of the tips Kate shared with the leaders was to "be ready to jump in and answer the question if the girls get stuck when it's their turn to answer first".

The final activity involved using "Fearlessly Me Cards" Two cards were provided to all members in the groups and the leaders. One was pink which was supply to write to other girls something they wanted them to know. The other card was green on which the participants wrote something they fear. Last but not least Kate gathered all the girls together and told them to rip the green card into small pieces.

Devastating Earthquake Shakes Survivors' Lives In Central Albania

Two days before Albanian Independence Day, there was a horrible earthquake in Durres and Tirana destroying more than 11,000 buildings. The earthquake had a 6.4 magnitude, and multiple destructive after-shocks. Many schools were closed. The quake could be felt the most by the people in neighboring countries such as Kosovo and Montenegro. The earthquake was colossal. It was even felt in Bulgaria, Montenegro, Bosnia and Herzegovania, Greece, Macedonia, Serbia, and Italy. Military forces from Kosovo and fighter jets from Turkey came to help people in need.

As of late December, there were at least 2,000 injured and 4,000 homeless. The Prime Minister of Albania stated that 900 buildings in Durres, and 1,465 buildings in the capital, Tirana, were severely damaged. He has vowed that all homeless people will live in stronger homes by 2020. There were more than 2,000 rescuers going to help those in need. Families were in tents. Authorities were working on sending the homeless to spare hotel rooms.

Albania is a dangerous place now because of the aftershocks. It used to be a giant tourist destination, but now it looks like a war zone. This earthquake ruined the lives of most of the people in Durres. The Albanian earthquake was really horrible for the country, Albania being one of the poorest countries of Europe was not just hit physically on land but with the economy, they will need to clean up the ruins, then rebuild.

This was one of the worst disasters that has ever happened to Albania. This earthquake shook the lives of survivors. In early December, Ms. Ursula von der Leyen, the President of the European Commission donated fifteen million Euros to help Albanians in need. It is hoped that this is just the beginning of help that will be sent to help this devastating situation. Hopefully, the country will recover from this devastating natural phenomenon and come back stronger than ever.

On September 30, 1955, beloved actor and "rebel without a cause" James Dean, was driving his brandnew Porsche 550 Spyder to an auto rally in Salinas, California. Tragically, Dean was involved in a head-on collision with a 1950 Ford Tudor and never made it to the rally. Already on his way to stardom, the crash cemented Dean as a legend. At the time, the twenty-seven year- old had only released his first movie, East of Eden, his other two films, Rebel Without a Cause and Giant were released shortly after his death.

Ernst expressed his gratitude for the opportunity by saying, "We searched high and low for the perfect character to portray the role of Rogan, which has some extreme complex character arcs, and after months of research, we decided on James Dean...We feel very honored that his family supports us and will take every precaution to ensure that his legacy as one of the most epic film stars to date is kept firmly intact. The family views this as his fourth movie, a movie he never got to make. We do not intend to let his fans down". It is to be done using "full body" CGI, actual footage and pictures along with a voice actor to voice Dean. And so Ernst's dream was slowly becoming a reality, with full rights and a team by his side, he was sure the people were going to love it! Or so he thought...

Naturally, after going public on the topic, the idea received massive amounts of backlash from the community and some of Hollywood's biggest stars. Marvel actor Chris Evans tweeted, "I'm sure he'd be thrilled, This is awful, Maybe we can get a computer to paint us a new Picasso. Or write a couple of new John Lennon tunes. The complete lack of understanding here is shameful." Lord of the Rings actor, Elijah Woods tweeted, "NOPE. This shouldn't be a thing". Robin Williams' daughter, Zelda Williams, tweeted "I have talked to friends about this for YEARS and no one ever believed me that the industry would stoop this low once tech got better. Publicity stunt or not, this is puppeteering the dead for their 'clout' alone and it sets such an awful precedent for the future of performance." Thousands of others have voiced their opinions on the matter on twitter by tweeting "This is so dumb" or "This is actually very insulting".

Ernst was surprised at the backlash, and he told THR, "We don't really understand it. We never intended for this to be a marketing gimmick."

With <u>Finding Jack</u> set to hit theaters Veteran's Day 2020, it is unlikely that the Internet will forgive Mr. Ernst, and with the movie starring merely a robot, it is unlikely that the film will turn out well as he hopes.

A Day in the Neighborhood of Mister Rogers: The Values and Legacy Live On

On February 27, 2003, the beloved television personality, Fred Rogers, passed away from stomach cancer. He left behind a show that defined the childhood of various people and altered the way one looks at his/her own life.

Prior to the show, Mr. Rogers pursued a career in the then-nascent television industry, getting a job at NBC in 1951. Unhappy with the network's reliance on sponsorship and advertising, he moved to WQED in Pittsburgh, a public station where he'd eventually oversee the United States launch of his self-titled show in 1968. With this new show, Mr. Rogers intended to revolutionize how the viewers of the show thought, as well as television itself. As Mr. Rogers said in an interview with "I went into television because I hated it so... I thought there was some way of using this fabulous instrument to be of nurture to those who would watch and listen." In television, Mr. Rogers saw an instrument with amazing, or terrible, potential. It was a form of mass communication unlike any other, one that would have particular potency with young, impressionable viewers with a weaker grasp of the lines between fiction and reality. As someone who had considered working in the church, Mr. Rogers understood better than most the value of a pulpit; he was thus all the more horrified by the way television was mostly used to sell, rather than teach, things.

With this, the program's first week of episodes alluded to the Vietnam War, playing the conflict out through an allegory involving the show's puppet characters (including the bossy King Friday, who builds a barbed-wire barrier around his castle). The character Officer Clemmons (played by the actor and singer François Clemmons) was one of the first African-Americans to have a regular role on children's television, and Rogers would include pointed scenes, like one where the two washed their feet in a tub together as a way of challenging segregated swimming pools.

Mr. Rogers may have presented such weighty topics, but it's not the topics he presented it was the method in which he allowed for the audience to develop the feelings he intended to convey. Anyone who watched "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood" would know that the host considered all feelings natural — including the dark ones — and believed they don't need fixing. Mr. Rogers believed that variations of the "sticks-andstones" adages intended to get kids to "shake it off" are stifling. They abandon children to their pain instead of teaching them how to process it. In contrast, Mr. Rogers encouraged children to face their dark feelings. Not a trained philosopher, Mr. Rogers would likely attribute his education in the emotional landscape of children because you can jinx yourself or risk putting any of to the psychologist Margaret McFarland at the University of Pittsburgh, with whom he collaborated for 30 years. The belief that all children (and adults) get sad, mad, lonely, anxious and frustrated and he used television to model what to do with these difficult and often strong emotions. He wanted to counter the harmful message kids typically receive, some version of the ever-unhelpful you shouldn't feel that way.

In one episode, when he couldn't get a flashlight to work, Mister Rogers expressed frustration in front of the camera: He admitted feeling disappointed at the fact that the trick that he had wanted to show his viewers didn't work. In doing so, he validated his disappointment and showed his audience that talking about it Chinese New Year. (cont'd on pg. 4, col. 2) helps.



One of Mr. Rogers' core beliefs was "what's mentionable is manageable," and he considered an urgent lesson for kids to learn to name their pain. Mr. Rogers believed that if children were encouraged to talk about feelings instead of being shamed for them, they could get to work finding appropriate outlets. One of Mr. Rogers' recurrent lessons was on anger. Inspired by a child who asked him a question about anger, he wrote a song about it:

What do you do with the mad that you feel When you feel so mad you could bite? When the whole wide world seems oh, so wrong ... And nothing you do seems very right?

This song was Mr. Rogers' way of teaching kids how to be angry, instead of how not to be angry. The first step is for the child to recognize their anger as well as their temptation to bite, hit, kick. The second step the song suggests is to find appropriate outlets for that anger:

What do you do? Do you punch a bag? Do you pound some clay or some dough? Do you round up friends for a game of tag? Or see how fast you go?

"Mister Rogers' Neighborhood" was purportedly a show for children. Today, many of the children raised watching the program are now parents, and I think Mr. Rogers also meant it for adults. We'd be better off if we'd stop negating children's dark emotions with stifling commands like "Don't cry," "Calm down," "Be quiet." If we are convinced by Mr. Rogers' claim that feelings are not wrong and that "what's mentionable is manageable," we should begin mentioning our own sad, lonely and disappointed feelings. In doing so, we would show children — and our grown-up selves — how to appropriately manage them.

A new appreciation for Fred Rogers has blossomed thanks to the 2018 documentary Won't You Be My Neighbor? and the new feature film It's a Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood starring Tom Hanks as Fred Rogers. Today, the philosophy of Mr. Rogers about how to deal with difficult emotions stands a chance of being heard and heeded.
