Parents: A Few Reminders from the Principal

- 1) Student Drop Off students should not be dropped off before 7:20 am. We understand the traffic may be heavier around that time, but students have no way to socially distance inside the building until that time.
- **2) Health Assessment** the health attestation MUST be completed by 7am EVERY <u>MORNING</u> before students arrive at the high school. Students who have not completed the form, will be called from class in order for the nurse to check the student's temperature and have the form completed. Only students who report to the high school building that day need to complete the screening. Thank you for your attention to this very important matter.
- 3) Lockers please remember that lockers will not be used and, therefore, they are inaccessible until further notice.

Please note the importance and requirement to wear masks at all times with the exception of while eating and during prescribed mask breaks as determined by teachers. Also, in order to maintain a high level of precaution, no more than two students should be in the schools' larger bathrooms at any given time. These bathrooms will be cleaned on a rotating basis.

Reminders:

Board Policy 5163 High School Lunch Periods: To maintain student focus during the school day on educational program activities, high school students shall be required to eat lunch at school and remain on the school campus during their lunch period with the exception of seniors, who shall enjoy the privilege of walking off school grounds for lunch. Students who drive cars to school, regardless of where they park, are prohibited from using their cars during the hours of the school day, unless they are in possession of a school approved dismissal pass issued by the Building Principal, based upon a written application by the student's parent, legal guardian or the student's own note where the student is an emancipated minor or has reached the age of 21.

Lateness to School: Students must bring in a parent note to the attendance office within 48 hours if they are late to school. Students who are late without a note serve an afterschool detention after the 48 hours.

Safety: Students are not to climb the fence between the high school and ShopRite at any time. Anyone wishing to exit the campus on the ShopRite side of the building must go out the exit on Central Avenue. Climbing the fence may cause personal injury and damage to the Shop Rite property. Students may not travel the school road between ShopRite and the Auditorium as construction & vehicle traffic does not allow safe passages.
