Prepare with Your Child: In the days leading up to the conference, take some time to discuss with your child what they wish to share during the session. This preparation is key to a successful and meaningful conference.

Your active involvement is crucial in this collaborative process. The extended duration of our Student-Led Conferences is designed to encourage deeper engagement and participation in your child's educational journey.

All students will receive their progress reports on March 11th, and Ms. Ovalles will ensure a copy is emailed to every parent. We urge you to review these grades with your children and to address any concerns directly with their teachers. Additionally, the progress report will detail each student's time spent on I-Ready lessons assigned through My Path, which should total a minimum of 75 hours by March 31st. My Path is tailored to each student's latest diagnostic results, helping to reinforce past ELA and Math content and challenge them beyond their current level. We assign My Path activities as homework and strongly encourage your collaboration to ensure your child's success at grade level.
Here are some strategies to enhance your child's I-Ready experience at home:

- PLAN a schedule with your child for home study and I-Ready activity completion. Writing down this plan and placing it in a visible area can be very effective.
- ENGAGE in the learning process with your child by exploring the student dashboard and lessons together.
- STRESS the importance of thoroughness and reflection in each lesson and quiz, advising them to think before clicking.
- MONITOR and discuss their progress regularly, aiming for 45 minutes of personalized instruction per subject each week, with a success rate of at least $70 \%$.
- CELEBRATE your child's milestones and successes to maintain motivation and enthusiasm.

Looking ahead, the New York State ELA exam is now 7 weeks away, scheduled for April 11 th and 12 th. The New York State Math exam follows, 9 weeks away, on May 7th and 8th. Please ensure your child is actively engaged in all preparatory assignments and activities we have provided.
