## REPORT CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT

### Who must Report

- 1. Everyone who suspects abuse and/or neglect
- 2. Licensed physicians, residents or interns, registered nurses and visiting nurses.
- 3. Social Workers
- 4. Law Enforcement Officers
- 5. A judge presiding during any proceeding

### **Immunity**

 If you report a child abuse and/or neglect in good faith you will be immune from civil or criminal liability.

## **Failure to Report**

1. If you suspect abuse and/or neglect and do not report your suspicion, you can be charged with a misdemeanor in a court of law.

# **HOW TO REPORT CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT**

### Where

- 1. New Mexico Statewide Central intake 1 (855)333-SAFE (7233) or from a cell phone #SAFE (7233)
- 2. Local County Child Protective Services Office
- 3. Local Law Enforcement; including State Police, County Sheriff's Office or local City Police Department
- 4. Tribal Law Enforcement or Tribal Social Services

#### What

- 1. All known demographic information on the child and family
- 2. Allegation of suspected abuse and neglect
- 3. Location of the child and the family
- 4. Safety factors involving the child
- 5. Potential Risks for the child and the family
- 6. Assessment of the family needs and strengths
- 7. Potential risks to the Investigator

### Who investigates

- Child Protective Services Division only investigates abuse and neglect in which the perpetrator is a caretaker of the child.
- 2. Law Enforcement investigates all abuse and neglect reports including abuse and/or neglect by the day care providers, foster parents and institutions.
- 3. Child Protective Services and Law Enforcement jointly investigate child abuse and/or neglect when appropriate.

REMEMBER: A report of suspected child abuse and/or neglect is a responsible attempt to protect a child
