From the Principal: Online Classroom Etiquette Requirements for Students

- Come prepared to learn and participate. You should login early, be dressed appropriately, and have your materials necessary to participate. You should select a location in advance of the meeting that will be free from distractions. Whenever possible, you should sit at a table or desk space, not your bed. The area you select should be properly lit and free of distractions. Plan to fully participate in instruction.
- Make sure your camera is on. During instruction, students are required to show their faces (on screen) unless otherwise permitted by the teacher (students or their parents should speak with the teacher/principal if a student has a unique/unusual situation that will prevent him/her from showing his/her face). The camera should show your entire face (not just the top of your head) and should not be pointed up at the ceiling.
- **No recording or screen-shots.** In accordance with the <u>School District Code of Conduct, P. 29</u>, students (or parents) are not permitted to audio or video record any lessons, nor alter any previously recorded lessons given or posted by teachers. No pictures, recordings or videos may be taken during live or prerecorded lessons. All synchronous and asynchronous posts are intended solely for the students and teachers in the class and should not be shared with others without permission from the teacher.
- Use school appropriate profile pictures. Any profile picture used on a Google account should be an accurate representation of the student. Students should not be using pictures of other people or pictures that are distracting or interfere with the learning process.

Important: We begin our remote plan on Tuesday, October 13th, 2020, a B-DAY, and continue through Wednesday, October 21st. During this time, all students must sign into Google Classrooms during the time of each class period where they will find their teachers ready to deliver instruction synchronously. Wednesdays will continue to be asynchronous and lessons will be posted by all teachers by 7:30am for students to complete, as has been the practice thus far. On Tuesday, October 13, we continue with the alternating pattern of A-days and B-days with Tuesday being a "B" day schedule.

It is important to remember that students must note their attendance on the asynchronous Wednesdays as noted in their teachers' Google Classroom. At this time students are scheduled to return to in person hybrid learning on Thursday, October 22, 2020.

CANCELLED SAT School Day - October 14, 2020: Due to the need for PRHS to switch to remote learning, the SAT scheduled for Wednesday, October 14, 2020 during the school day has been cancelled. Our communication with the DOH regarding the decision to switch the high school to remote learning led to the need for this action. As a result, contact with the College Board regarding recent events impacting PRHS has resulted in our ability to add/open additional seats for the SAT being offered on our campus Saturday, November 7, 2020. Unfortunately, due to the College Board's scheduling of SAT's, no additional weekday exam is presently being offered. Additionally, if your choice is to take the Saturday, November 7, 2020 exam, you are asked to go into the College Board's website to register as soon as possible as the College Board only affords a first come, first serve registration policy. You will need to pay for the new date's exam (November 7, 2020) directly to the College Board upon registration; however, all parents will be issued a refund from the district for the cancelled October 14th exam. Unfortunately, due to the College Board's rules, payments and refunds need to work this way.

CANCELLED PSAT/NMSQT - October 17, 2020: Due to the need for PRHS to switch to remote learning, the PSAT scheduled for Saturday, October 17, 2020 has been cancelled. Our communication with the Department of Health regarding the decision to switch the high school to remote learning led to the need for this action. We continue to discuss this matter with the College Board to work on a solution regarding a new test date. At this time, we anticipate establishing a new test date and will send communication once plans are in place. Any parent wishing not to reschedule, will be refunded their payment for the October 17, 2020 test payment. Additional directions regarding the logistics for refunds will be forthcoming. Understanding the importance of the test, we have been working on the best solutions within the options available. Please look for additional communication as this will be sent when concrete plans are confirmed.
