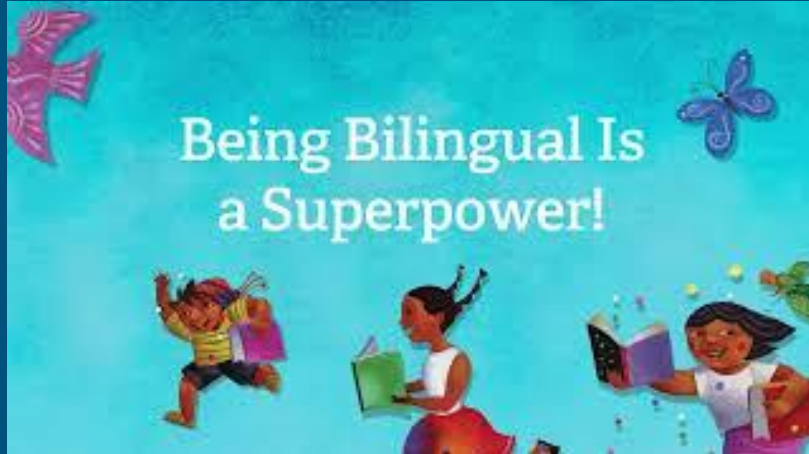

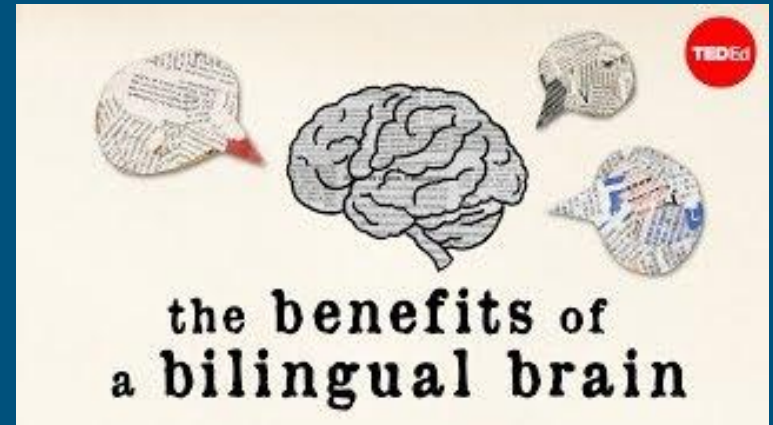

- Bilingual **Storytimes**

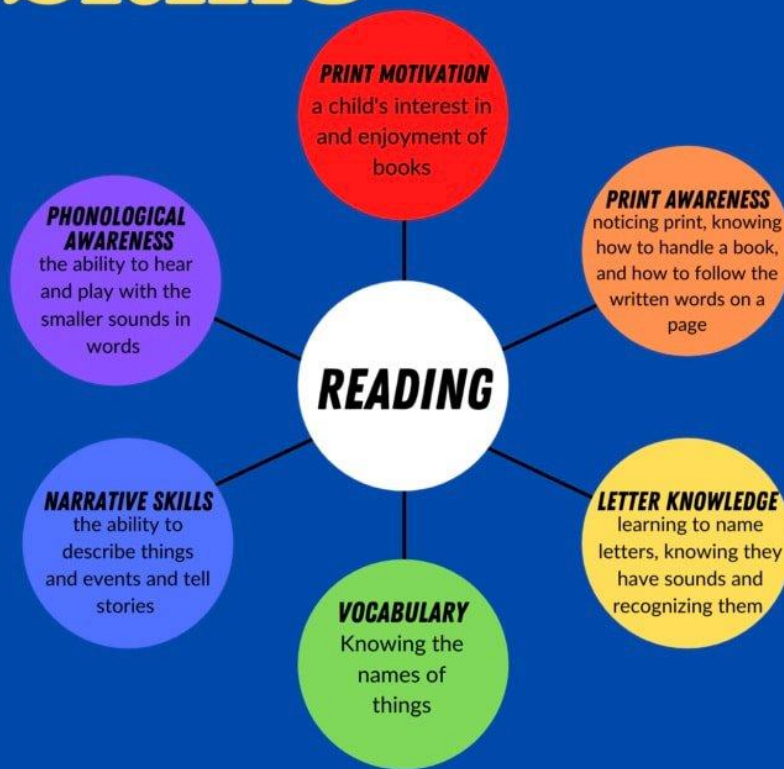

5 PILLARS OF EARLY LITERACY



The National Reading Panel identified five key concepts at the core of every effective reading instruction program. Since the panel's report was released in 2000, these concepts have become known as the "five pillars" of early literacy and reading instruction.

EARLY LITERACY PRACTICES

Let's get ready to read!

PLAY



- Play enables children to develop their language, social-emotional and cognitive skills. It also encourages imagination and creativity.
- Learning through play comes in many forms such as imaginary play, cooperative play and physical play.

WRITE

- Writing helps children develop motor skills and understand that written words represent ideas. It allows children to express themselves through language.
- Through writing, they also learn the conventions of written language and how to read. At the pre-writing stage, they do not need to write legibly – being able to scribble or trace is a good start.



SING



- Singing helps your child learn how to hear smaller sounds in words. Learning to hear and break down parts of words help your child develop phonological awareness, which will help him learn to read.
- Do not be afraid of being silly or singing off-key; your child will not mind at all. He is more likely to love the great bonding experience of singing with you!

TALK

- Talking helps a child develop early literacy skills. Nurture your babbling baby into a talkative toddler by talking and reading to him often. Talking is also an excellent way to build his narrative skills. These skills are help him with reading as he grows older.
- Read aloud and encourage your child to read along with you. You can initiate conversations about stories by asking, "What do you see on this page?" or "What do you think will happen next?"



READ



- Reading with children develops their language and literacy skills. Words can be found all around us, for example, on cereal boxes and advertisements.
- Recognizing such environmental print allows children to differentiate text from pictures at an early age by reading the words in their immediate surroundings.

Literacy Tips For Newcomers

Early Literacy TIPS FOR FAMILIES

1

Talk with Your Child

Use trips to the grocery store, dinnertime chats, and driving in the car as a time to introduce new words and talk about the world around us.

2

Exchange Stories

Tell a great story, and have your child tell you one back! It's a great way to build oral language and learn new words.

3

Have Fun with Rhymes

Sing rhyming songs, read rhyming books, and say tongue twisters with your child. This helps them learn new sounds in words.

4

Talk About Letters

Help your child learn the names of the letters and the sounds the letters make. Turn it into a game! For example, you could say, "I'm thinking of a letter and it makes the sound ssssss."

5

Keep Books Present

Your child will be more likely to pick up a book and read if they are out in the open and easy to find. Keep them readily available in the kitchen, car, and other locations where your child spends time.


