# 2020-2021 BACK-TO-SCHOOL TASK FORCE RE-ENTRY PLAN OVERVIEW

#### **TASK FORCE MISSION:**

When 2020 began, our daily routines did not include remote teaching and virtual meetings, and social distancing was not part of our vocabulary. The novel coronavirus changed our lives, as individuals and as an institution in unimaginable ways. Envisioning how we return safely to a "new normal" of what school should look like is the mission of the 2020-21 Back-to-School Task Force.

#### **TASK FORCE FRAMEWORK:**

To gain stakeholder and constituent input in our planning as a district, we want to actively solicit the contributions and ideas of as many of our partners as possible. To that end, this "Back-to-School Task Force" will be charged with identifying and solving the challenges ahead.

- •The entire Task Force will meet initially on **Monday, June 8, 2020 at 4:00 p.m.** to clarify expectations, review structures, and kickoff the process.
- Each of the five working groups below will focus on a particular element of re-entry, and each group will generally be divided into elementary school, middle school, and high school subgroups.
- Each subgroup will be asked to
  - (1) identify the areas that need to be addressed (Issues),
  - (2) brainstorm options for addressing each issue (Options),
  - (3) identify the constraints, problems, and complications of potential options (*Challenges*), and
  - (4) propose the soundest potential solutions (*Recommendations*).
- •The five groups will meet as subgroups and as a large group several times over the course of the next three weeks so that we end the 2019-20 school year with a clear understanding of community standards and expectations that will further be informed by guidance from the New York State Departments of Education and Health and the federal Center for Disease Control moving forward.
- •The leadership of the groups and subgroups will then coordinate and, in conjunction with senior district leadership, collective bargaining units, and Board of Education governance, facilitate the implementation of the recommendations in the Back-to-School Re-Entry Plan.
