PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Dear Parents/Guardians:

I hope you all had a wonderful weekend! Last week we completed I-Ready ELA and Math Diagnostics. I understand that our students have been taking many assessments recently, but rest assured that we are closely analyzing the results to drive targeted instruction. Upon evaluating the data, we identified the following trends across grades and classes:

- Some students are rushing through exams, negatively impacting their scores.
- Test anxiety is causing some students to shut down and lose motivation.
- A focus is needed on number relationships with computation and problemsolving skills.
- Students struggle with vocabulary comprehension within texts. Daily reading for 20/30 minutes and completing a reading log is mandatory to build vocabulary.

Our year-end goal is for each student to read at least 50 books, with at least 25 books read by this midpoint in the school year. Every student is required to complete a book review and post their rating in their ELA class.

As the 2nd marking period ends on January 26th, remember that you can track your child's progress in Google Classroom. Report cards will be distributed on January 31st. We constantly remind students of the importance of completing assignments on time and heeding teacher feedback for grade improvement. Promotion in doubt letters will be distributed in the first two weeks of February. Please reach out to your child's teacher with any concerns regarding their grades.

8th Grade Computer-Based Simulation and Mock Test:

• This week, our 8th-grade students will participate in a computer-based simulation and a mock test. This is an excellent opportunity for them to apply their skills in a practical setting and get accustomed to the structure of formal testing environments.
