


In order to view the pre-recorded instructional videos (K-4th Grades) or the post-recorded Distance Learning Live Streams (5th – 8th Grades) you may need to download a video player on your MacBook. We highly recommended the free media player VLC. You may download the program at <https://www.videolan.org/> choose the MAC OSX Option

VLC for Mac OS X

VLC is a free and open source cross-platform multimedia player and framework that plays most multimedia files as well as DVDs, Audio CDs, VCDs, and various streaming protocols.

Devices and Mac OS X version

VLC media player requires Mac OS X 10.7.5 or later. It runs on any 64bit Intel-based Mac. Previous devices are supported by older releases.

Note that the first generation of Intel-based Macs equipped with Core Solo or Core Duo processors is no longer supported. Please use version 2.0.10 linked below.

Web browser plugin for Mac OS X

Support for NPAPI plugins was removed from all modern web browsers, so VLC's plugin is no longer maintained. The last version is 3.0.4 and can be found [here](#). It will not receive any further updates.

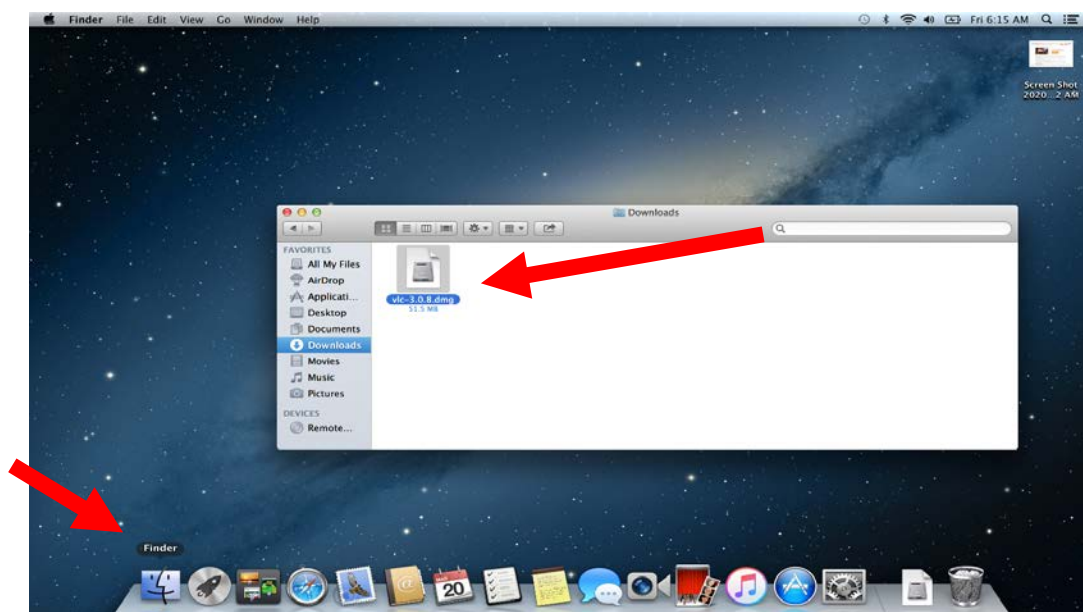
Older versions of Mac OS X and VLC media player

We provide older releases for users who wish to deploy our software on legacy releases of Mac OS X. You can find recommendations for the respective operating system version below. Note that **support ended** for all releases listed below and hence they won't receive any further updates.

Mac OS X 10.6 Snow Leopard

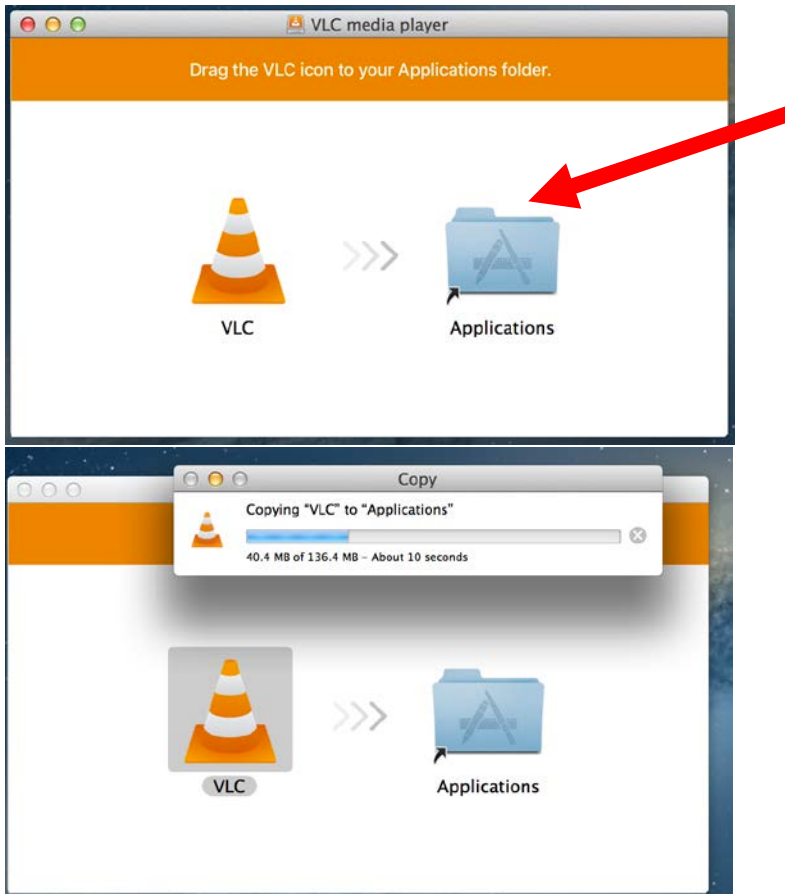

1. Once the file is downloaded, double click it to start the installation

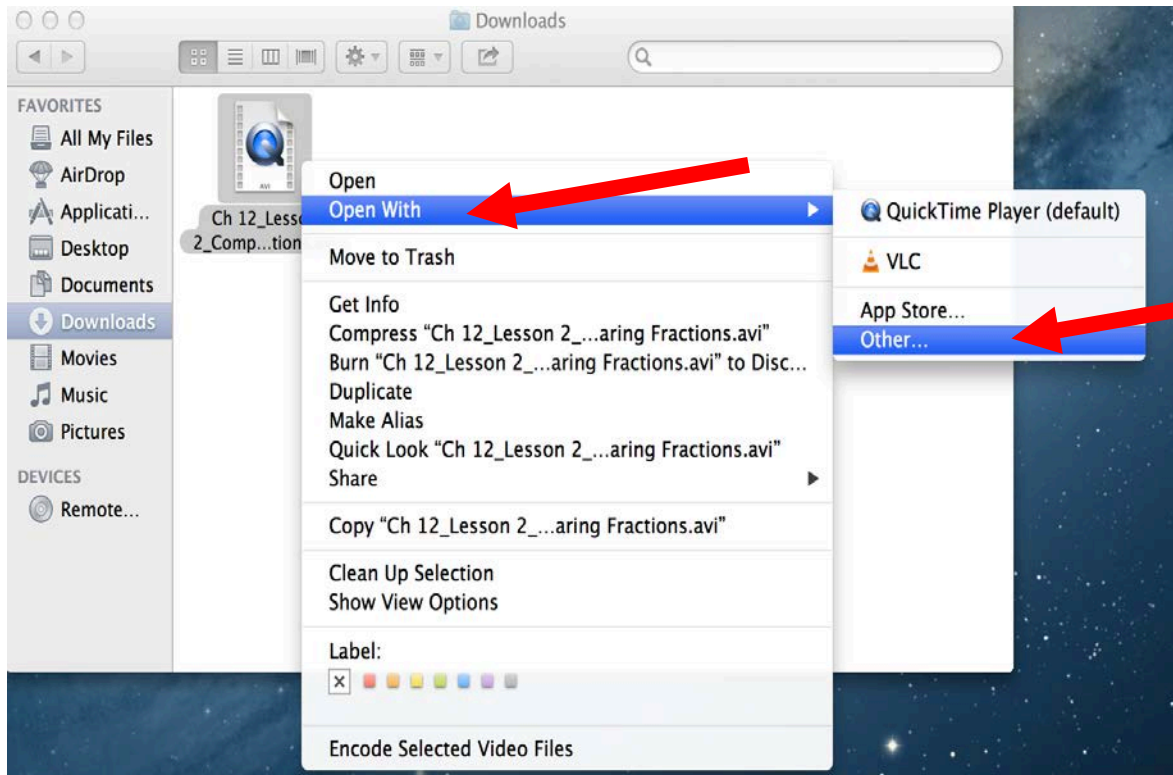




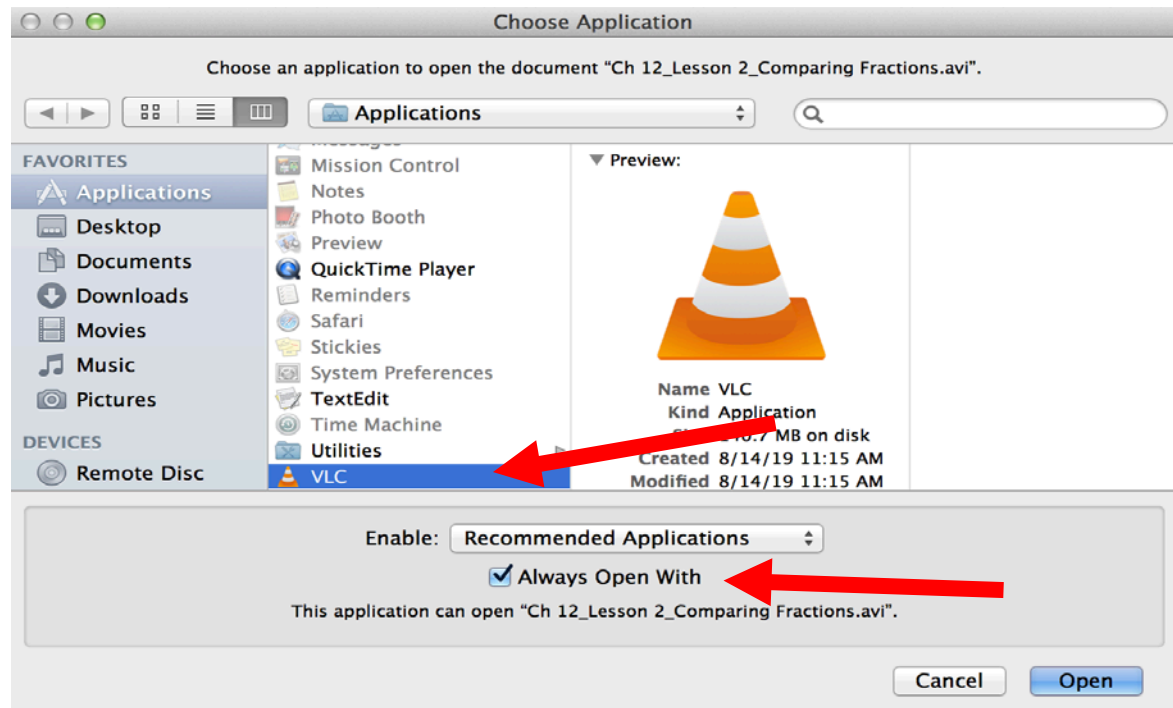
2. Drag the VLC icon into the Applications Folder



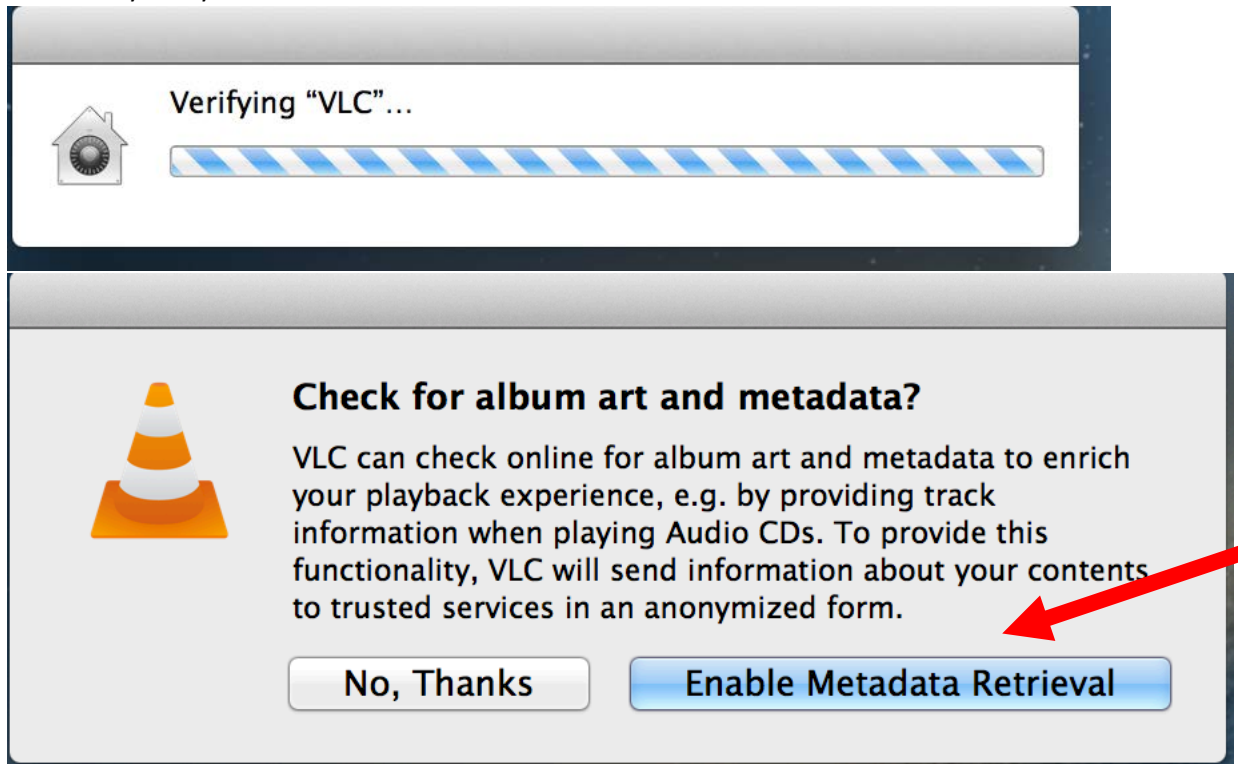
3. To set the VLC as the default media player you can RIGHT click on the movie file and choose the option that says open with, the choose "Other"



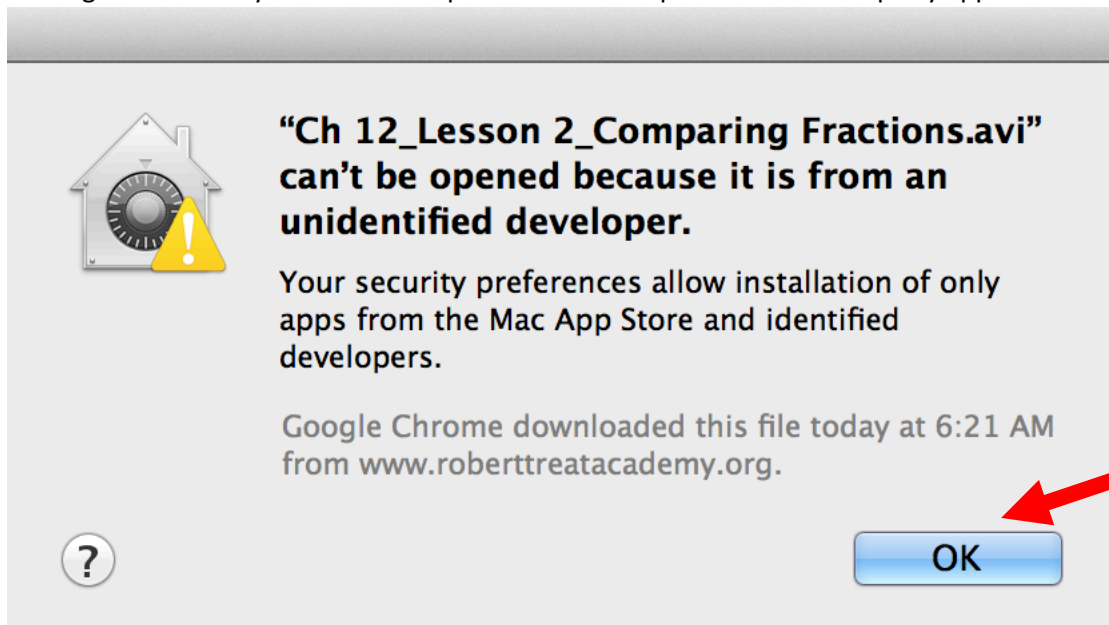
4. Then scroll down to VLC and click on the box to put check next to "Always Open With", then press open to save your settings and open the file



5. At this point, you will see a screen to Verify VLC and Check for album art and metadata. Let it verify and you can choose Enable Metadata Retrieval



6. If your video plays, you may start watching your videos. Otherwise, you might get the next message. To fix this you will have to perform a few steps to enable third party apps.



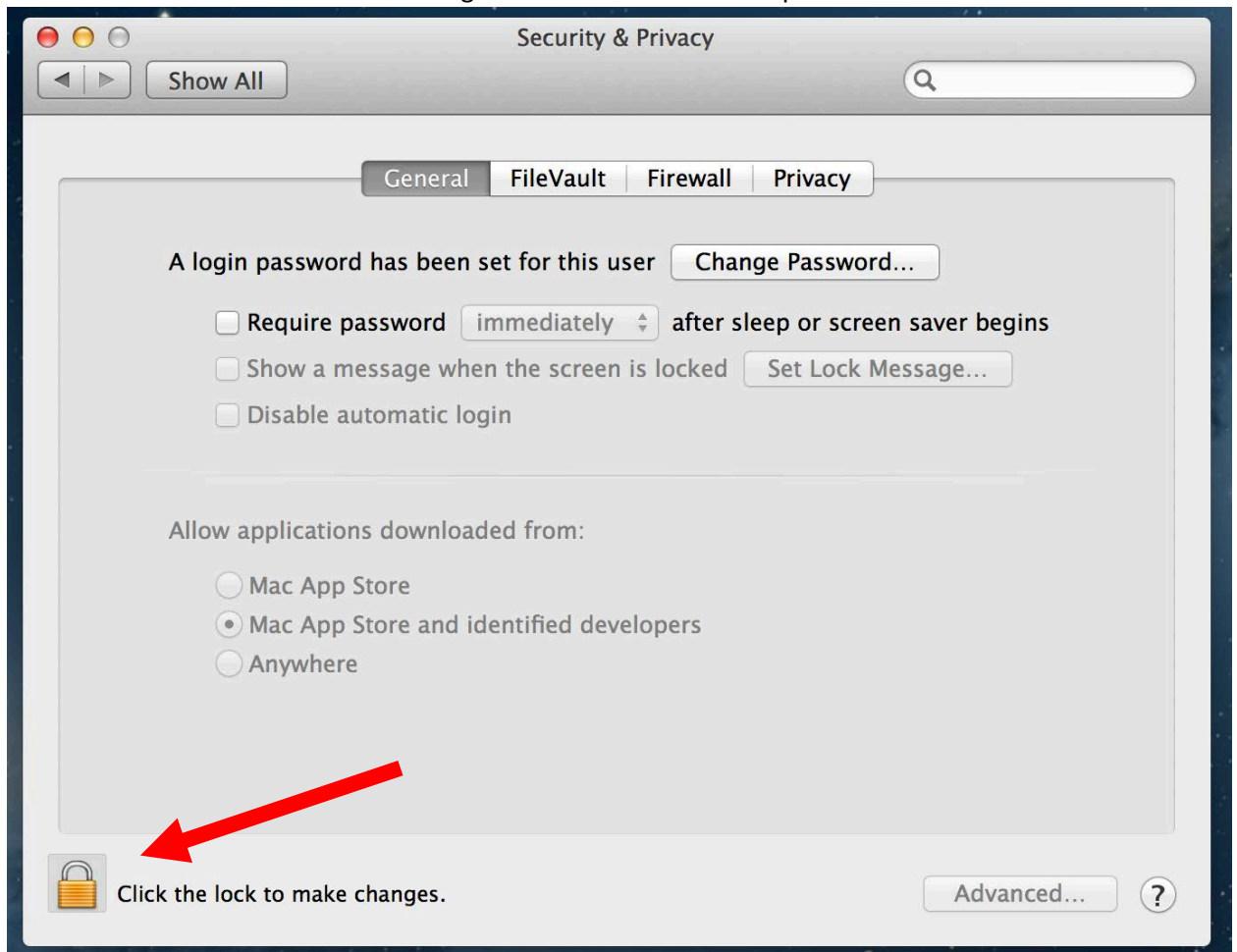
7. Click on System Preferences



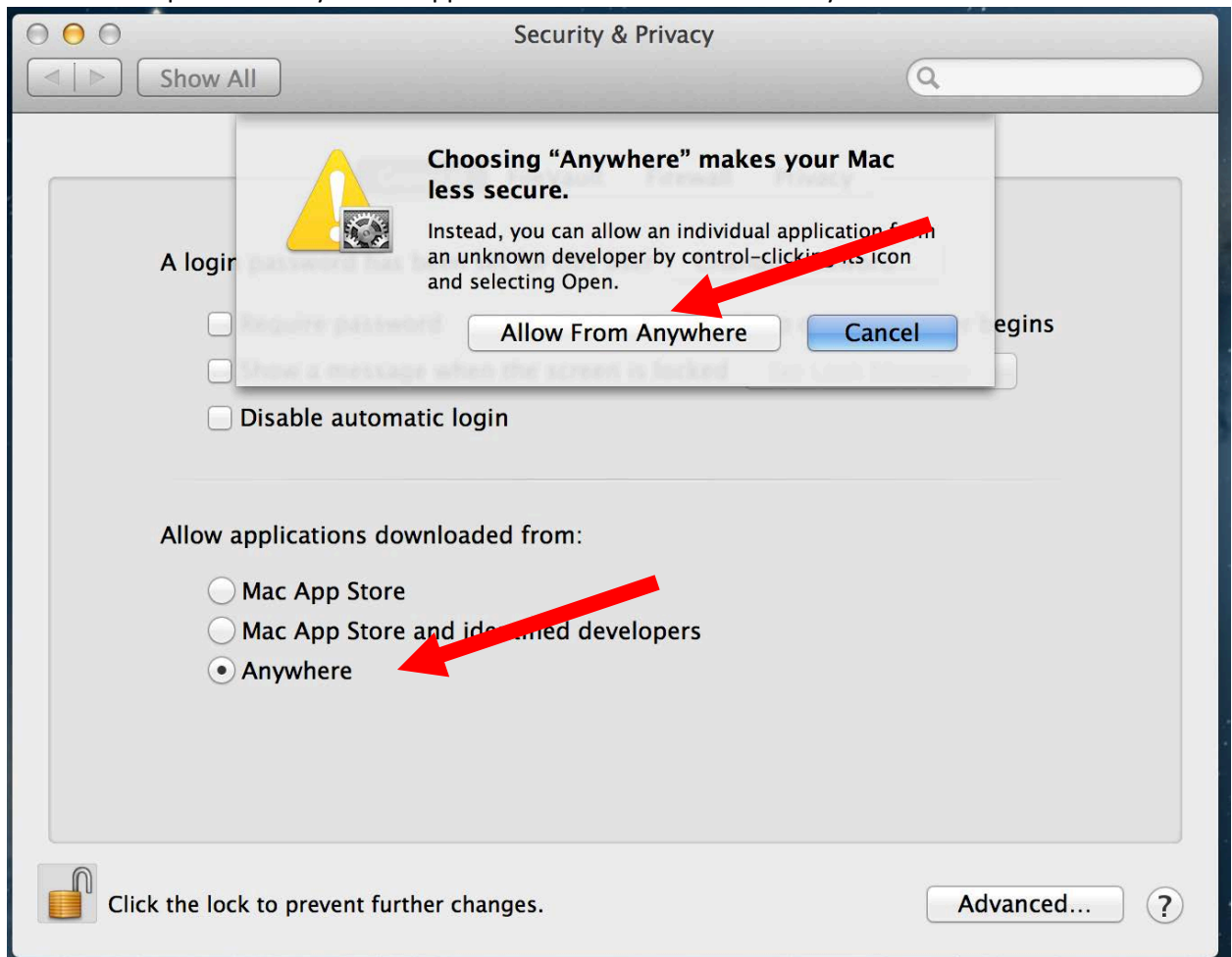
8. Click on Security and Privacy



9. If locked click on “unlock to make changes” otherwise see next step



10. Choose the option that says Allow applications downloaded from “Anywhere”



11. Try opening the video again and you should see this message, press open and your video should start playing
