
PTO Cookie Dough Fundraiser Ends Friday, Sept 23rd: All cookie dough order forms and money are due this Friday (September 23rd). It is highly recommended for parents to bring the money and order forms to the front office if large quantities of cookie dough products have been ordered. The cookie dough will arrive for distribution towards the end of October. This is a win-win fundraiser for all students and families. Parents will receive all required family contract volunteer hours by selling just one tub of cookie dough. Students will receive 5 free dress-down days for selling 1-4 tubs of cookie dough. Students that sell 5-9 tubs of cookie dough will receive 10 free dress-down days. Students that sell 10 or more tubs of cookie dough will receive 10 free dress-down days and a lunch trip to the Oglethorpe food court during the school day.

Deep Writing: The creative Deep Writing program is being offered in person this year at Oglethorpe Charter School. We have a rich tradition with this after-school program dating back many years. Students that participate in this program can get their writing pieces published. The first Deep Writing after-school workshop will be on Tuesday, September 20th in Ms. Roland's classroom.

For other students that did not complete a lot of assignments, we use the Edgenuity platform and assign standards-based modules for

them to complete. Please make it a top priority for your child to complete all required tasks if they are a part of the credit recovery process.
