Mr. Muccino's Corner

Principal Proud Of Student Protest

In this column, the school's principal, Mr. Muccino, shared his reaction about the March 14 Walkout at PS 83

I recently had a chance to sit down with our principal, Mr. Brandon Muccino. During this meeting, he told me his ideas about gun violence and the recent national school walkout/protest. The National School Walkout, planned by Women's March organizers, was on March 14 at 10 am in each time zone of the country. It called for students, faculty, parents, and others to walk out of school for seventeen minutes, one minute for each person who was killed in the Florida school shooting. This date was to mark the one month anniversary of the shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High school in Parkland, Florida.

Mr. Muccino is very proud of those seventh and eighth students who took part in this protest, especially since those who went out behaved very respectfully. He applauds them for standing up for what they believe in. This was a rare chance to hear Mr. Muccino's point of view on a topic like this. He clearly stated that if a protest like this was organized when he was a student. he, too, would have participated.

This protest was to call for enforcement of gun laws that already exist in this country and for new laws in view of the fact that there have been so many mass shootings in America. In Japan, a person who wants to own a gun has to attend an all-day class, take a written exam and pass a shooting-range test with a mark of at least 95%. There are also mental health and drugs tests. A person's criminal record is checked and police look for links to extremist groups. Then they check the applicant's relatives too - and even the work colleagues. As well as having the power to deny gun licenses, police also have sweeping powers to search and seize weapons.

In America, the laws are much more lenient. In the nearly nineteen years since the shooting at Columbine High School rocked America to its core, the country has seen so many more mass shootings. That school shooting, the first of its kind, isn't even among the ten deadliest mass shootings in modern United States history. Sadly, three of the five deadliest shootings have occurred in just the last year and a half.

The morning of the protest, Mr. Muccino came in during eighth grade advisory to inform students that they can go outside to protest peacefully for seventeen minutes. When he spoke, he told the eighth graders that he didn't want anybody who plays games like Fortnite to go out and protest. The reason he said this was that he felt that games like that one perpetuate the notion that gun violence is acceptable. He didn't want hypocrites who pretend to hate violence, but still play violent video games to

Autism Awareness Month Helps To Educate The Public

April is National Autism Awareness Month. National Autism Awareness Month has as its goal to educate and keep the public aware of autism spectrum disorders (ASD) that cause people all around the world to face difficulties and challenges every day. According to the Autism Society, it "represents an excellent opportunity to promote autism awareness and acceptance and to draw attention to the tens of thousands facing an autism diagnosis each year." The different puzzle piece colors shown in the ribbon for National Autism Awareness Month signify unity and diversity of the many people and families that face challenges from autism while the brightness of the ribbon signifies hope.

When checking to see if a child may have autism, there are specific signs to look for. Usually, autism starts to develop during the early stages of an individual's life so signs of ASD may show up at about two years old. Signs of autism could be found in ways of communication and how individuals act socially. At a young age, signs can be that the individual gives limited or no eye contact, according to an article from Autism Speaks. The article states that other signs may also be limited to no speech at all and no joyful expressions being presented. In general, signals of autism may also include staying away from people and preferring to be alone. Other indications can be different repetitive behaviors, such as flapping or rocking, and unusual reactions to specific things that are heard, smelled, tasted, or touched

There is still no cure for autism today as no one knows its exact cause. There are a number of treatments that are recommended to help people with the disorder. One form of treatment many recommend is therapy. Different forms of therapy helps to treat speech issues, social concerns, and other challenges that may affect people diagnosed with autism. According to an article from <u>Autism Science Foundation</u>, speech therapy, occupational therapy, and physical therapy are three treatment options that would help with the challenges that people with autism face every day. Speech therapy is an important option as it helps with social communication. Occupational therapy is also a good form of treatment as it helps people diagnosed with autism to complete tasks including fine-motor skills and movements such as dressing up or writing. Physical therapy, too, has a big impact on individuals with autism as it will help to increase an individual's participation in everyday activities. Physical therapy may help with walking, balance, sitting, and other physical activities. Applied Behavioral Analysis is another form of treatment as it addresses behavioral issues that may come with ASD. It teaches and reinforces behaviors that are more socially and academical-

Say No To Guns: Renaissance of Youth Movement

Columbine, Virginia Tech, Sandy Hook, Umpqua and Parkland, all major school shootings that have occurred starting from the turn of the twenty-first century. It is certain that guns have been an essential tool for defense and the Second Amendment in the Constitution of the United States gives the right to bear arms. Based on CNN, 42%, or approximately 136.79 million people own guns in the United States. Out of that population, many people use guns to hurt people. Injuries of the younger generation has been in the spotlight recently. Based on The New York Times, 31% of all mass shootings in the world take place in America. According to "Axios.com", 122 lives of students have been lost to guns and shootings in school since 1999. With many persistent gun owners in the United States, change was not likely to occur, but one shooting is what it took, for the bold Generation Z (millennials), to lead the country to the right direction.

According to Time Magazine, Nikolas Cruz, a nineteen year old, entered Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School on February 14, 2018, at exactly 2:21 PM, arriving with a case containing his AR-15 rifle and ammunition. It was six minutes of horror, as Mr. Cruz, wearing a vest to blend in, stormed through classrooms and hallways, constantly shooting. On this day, seventeen lives were lost, and seventeen others were wounded, and a whole community was left traumatized. Students, like Jack Macleod, a junior at the school, recalled the moments while speaking to The New York Times, "We waited. It was around five minutes but it felt like hours." Carly Novell, a senior at the school, told The New York Times, when she returned to school, "How am I back to this place where I hid? Where my classmates were killed? It's just crazy to think about that."

Yet, there was no time to grieve. The shooting, has given the rise to teen activists, questioning the ownership of guns, and gun laws. One of the popular and bold activists is eighteen-year old Emma Ms. Gonzalez. According to <u>People Magazine</u>, she spoke out in an eleven-minute speech at an anti-gun rally in Fort Lauderdale on February 16, 2018. She said, "The people involved right now, those who were there, those postings, those tweetings, those doing interviews talking to people, are being listened to for the very first time on this topic that has come up over 1,000 times in the past four years alone." She stated, "We are going to be the kids you read about in textbooks, not because we're going to be another statistic about mass shooting in America, but because we are going to be the last mass shooting." Since then, she has confronted many politicians with survivors from her high school and even the National Rifle Association (NRA). According to CNN, Ms. Gonzalez asked NRA spokesperson, Ms. Dana Loesch about her statement on whether or not it should be harder to obtain guns and bump stocks (pieces of plastic or metal molded to the lower end of a rifle to mimic the style of an assault rifle). Ms. Loesch's inability to give a definitive answer, and Ms. Gonzalez's rebuttal, began the controversy of the NRA.

Ms. Gonzalez is especially angry at the politicians



Officers Equal Safety?

Safety at schools has been a national concern for many years but the Florida shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School on Valentine's Day this year gained huge responses, from not only the government and parents but also many students, making the issue resurface once again. Many ideas about how to deal with the issue have been circulated such as arming teachers to protect their students. However, what about the solution we already have? New York Police Department School Agents who are already stationed at schools are meant to protect them.

In Fresh Meadows, Queens the NYPD has removed Sergeant Raul Espinet from Francis Lewis High School. Similar occurrences have happened at Bayside High School and Benjamin Cardozo High School. As of now officers aren't armed, however, in the past, it was a requirement to be armed. The practice was eliminated in the 1990s but some schools like Francis Lewis weren't accounted for. Instead of officers like the sergeant on duty, Mayor de Blasio's new policing units will visit schools while taking rounds. Some people aren't pleased with the replacement and their opinion is valid given that, in some cases, neighborhoods can contain hundreds of people and multiple schools. According to a sophomore attending the school, Ms. Josephine Li, "There are school shootings everywhere, and they took the one armed officer away from a school with 4,000 kids in it". Ms. Li then goes on to say "Who is there to protect us?" Many students have expressed similar ideas and their sincere concern including those at PS 83. Clearly people want action to be taken and have feelings that can't beignored.

There is more reasoning behind the voices upset over the loss of a valued member in their school environment. According to an English teacher and previous dean, at Francis Lewis High School, Phyllis Leibowitz, "Kids told him things . . . They would give him a heads up, and he would handle it before it happened". When someone gains the trust of someone else, it is a big deal. Being able to have an actual trusting relationship between student and staff is key to making a better and safer school environment.

Even if every school doesn't have a NYPD officer ready with a gun to protect the school population, they already have a solution. Every school in New York has a School Safety Agent and they are trained to provide security. According to the NYPD's website, the agents must go through a physical agility test which has two events. In one, the participant must go through a simulated emergency response and, in the other, they must go through a simulated stair climb and victim rescue. The events of concern these days are school shootings and the training the agents have gone through seem to prepare them for such situations.

Guns might be scary in schools. However, trained professionals do make schools feel safer. Even though School Safety Agents are at schools, not everyone is close to them or knows what they are capable of. The agents may have training but knowing they have more power with a gun, students would

Our Childhood Stores Shutting Down



Strikes Demand Pay Raises For Teachers!

Teachers have traditionally been underpaid for what they do to teach and enlighten the younger generation. It is a well-known fact that they don't get paid much compared to other professions. Lately, there has been a new effort to lower the salaries of teachers and cut funding for educational supplies because of the most recent tax cuts. Teachers across the country are now taking a stand to get raises and fight the poor conditions under which they work. This outrage began in West Virginia where thousands of teachers went on strike demanding relief from low pay and high health care costs. Although it is illegal for teachers to go on strike and protest in West Virginia, they went anyway. According to the New York Times, this movement has "spread like wildfire." Now, teachers from traditionally conservative states like Arizona, Kentucky, and Oklahoma have joined the movement. Closer to home, in Jersey City, teachers have been inspired by the teachers of West Virginia to take a stand. They went on strike outside the schools they taught at saying that they don't do well enough financially with the paycheck that they already receive and are often forced to take second iobs.

The teachers' unions have said that the teachers' salaries aren't enough for the everyday expenses of life and that is the main reason why teachers believe that they are in need of raises. But, there is also proposed cuts to pensions and rising health care costs that have pushed the teachers to protest.

Some believe that teachers going on strike is hurting kids because if no teachers show up to teach then that means there is no one in the classrooms to teach the students. When these strikes happen, sometimes schools close and students miss those days of school which they have to make up in the summer or students attend school but don't get taught anything. This is true but it is also true that teachers must be paid fairly and schools must have the resources needed to run efficiently.

Even when the teachers go back to class, it is clear that they still won't give up on their cause.

New York's Tax To Prevent Plastic Pollution

"Reduce, Reuse, Recycle" is a common slogan used to inform the public about trying to protect the environment. The impact of plastic on wildlife has been a big problem for years. It has reached every inch of the ocean into the stomachs of almost every creature it encounters and changed the way those creatures have evolved forever. New York State had decided to tackle these pollution problems because plastic had clogged sewers and waterways. But, when that plastic was gathered up, there was a lot less plastic found than expected. The sad truth is the rest of the missing plastic remains in the bodies of sea creatures.

New Yorkers use approximately twenty-three million plastic bags each year alone. In response, a plastic bag fee was planned. This meant that in specific areas in New York State, store customers must pay a five-cent fee for plastic bags. Although a vote was not scheduled, the plan was supposed to impact several New York communities. It was then opposed by a number of lawmakers, including Governor Andrew Cuomo. He claimed that the five-cent fee will affect many low income customers who are not always able to pay. This decline disappointed many environmentalists. So in place of the plastic bag fee, Governor Cuomo promised that he will assign a statewide task force to create a plan for this never-ending dilemma.

New York still needs a permanent way to prevent plastic pollution. Bronx Democrat Luis R. Sepúlveda plans on making a cheaper fee for plastic bags. Instead of the planned five-cent fee, he proposed establishing a threecent fee for plastic bags. He, too, believes that a five-cent fee is a big impact for low-income customers and so he tried to make the fee sensible and affordable for everyone to pay.

Plastic pollution has become a big problem worldwide.


According to Mr. Andrew Siewert, "The service is useful but won't solve the problem by itself." People believe that the sites won't always work, but it could help in some cases.



John McCain, the senator in Arizona, receives \$7.7 million in funds from the NRA, Richard Burr, senator of North Carolina, obtains almost \$7 million in funds and Roy Blunt, senator of Missouri, accepts \$4.5 million in funds. Based on CNN, Parkland survivor, Cameron Kasky, urged Senator Marco Rubio of Florida to refuse NRA donations.

The student protests do not stop. On March 14, 2018, an estimated one million students (according to The New York Times), participated in a nationwide walk out lasting seventeen minutes, commemorating the seventeen lives lost, one month before in the shooting. PS 83, was one of the proud schools, who participated in this walkout. Eighth grade students participated in the walk out after speaking to a teacher, who spoke to the principal, Brandon Muccino. At 10am sharp, seventh and eighth graders walked out to the yard and circled the track. They walked around the track for seventeen minutes, one minute for each death. Then, students gathered on the concrete platform and read a statement which expressed their hope for the future. In total, approximately one hundred eighth graders and a few seventh graders participated in the walk out.

The March for Our Lives, that took place in Washof student protest. Many of the survivors spoke out and delivered inspiring speeches. According to <u>The</u> New York Times, similar marches took place in New York City, Salt Lake City, Boston and Los Angeles. In total, hundreds of thousands of people marched that day to protest gun laws. Ms. Gonzalez, had an inspiring speech again. Based on Time Magazine, Ms. Gonzalez ended her six-minute speech with, "Fight for your lives before it's someone else's job."

These protests of Generation X have worked. Based on "Refinery29.com", major stores like Dick's Sporting Goods will end sales of assault-style rifles and is no longer selling high-capacity gun magazines. It will also no longer sell any guns to anyone under age twenty-one, regardless of local laws. Walmart announced that it has raised the age limit for purchasing guns and ammunition to twenty-one years of age. Kroger, and outdoor supply store, will no longer sell firearms to anyone under the age of twenty-one at its Fred Meyers locations. L.L. Bean will no longer sell guns or ammunition to anyone under twenty-one years old. REI announced they would halt its orders from Vista Outdoor, who owns firearm-manufacturing companies. Based on CNN, politically, state legislatures in Congress will outlaw bump stocks, enforce stronger background checks, support all markets to raise the age to buy guns, restrict gun magazine sizes to save lives and ban AR-15 style weapons.

Finally, the adults have responded to this renaissance of young movement. Based on Eudaimonia, Mr. Umair Haque, an adult journalist stated, "The Parkland kids are leading us somewhere that matters." According to "Business Insider", thirty-four year-old Mr. Alex Monroe stated, "[I am] hoping to elevate their voices to make change happen on this problem in our country."

To help ELL students develop vocabulary, an instructor moves on to higher and more challenging tasks by giving students more things to explore and give them more critical thinking tasks. According to the article "Understanding the Unique Instructional Needs of English Learners" by Elizabeth Brooke "Instructional activities often incorporate the development of skills such as imaging and sequencing in both oral and written language and moves to higher order thinking skills such as determining the main idea, drawing inferences, predicting outcomes and summarizing." This will help ELL students do better in tests with stories or articles, and bring them closer to the same level as other students in their class. This will help the student have a better understanding of stories which will help in the next step.

Students must be challenged by giving them harder material to read. They can only get better by being exposed to more complicated reading, as was also mentioned in the article. This is the hardest step for all ELL students because of unfamiliar vocabulary and sentence structure. Because of this, teachers should encourage students to highlight and look up words they do not understand.

Class participation is crucial. Encouraging new students to participate in the class allows having confidence in themselves and in what they have to say. Teachers need to start calling on the ELL students to answer questions, express their point of view and explain their opinion.

At this point, ELL students should be able to understand things on their own. They should be able to pick books that interest them and not have problems understanding them. In class, they should be able to handle the same level of class work and tests as their classmates. More importantly, ELL students that excel must help new ELL students by mentoring them. When newer students see what others have accomplished and learned from their experience, it will give them more courage and desire to do the same.

Hopefully, the steps that I have mentioned and my experience as an ELL student will help others in understanding how to deal with non-English





Unsolved: The Mysteries Behind The Murders Of Tupac & Notorious B.I.G.

Christopher Wallace, known by many as The Notorious B.I.G. and Tupac Shakur were two of the most iconic and influential hip hop artists of the 1990s and are still remembered well by many today for their famously popular music and for a more somber reason: their deaths. The Notorious B.I.G., also known as Biggie Smalls, and Tupac were both killed in drive-by shootings along the West Coast; California and Nevada, respectively, to be more specific.

<u>Unsolved</u>, a crime drama series that first aired on February 27, 2018, is a show that reenacts the investigations that took place covering both murders that happened only months apart and tries to solve one of the greatest mysteries in hip-hop history.

Grand Theft Art: The Truth Behind Stolen Artwork

The art of theft is something that is as brutal as it is demeaning. There are many levels of theft, something as simple as stealing a snack at the local deli or as devious as stealing a purse. Yet, the one of the most devious types of theft is undeniably, art theft. Art theft is usually for the purpose of resale or ransom (sometimes called artnapping). Stolen art is sometimes used by criminals as collateral to secure loans. Only a small percentage of stolen art is recovered, Estimates range from 5 to 10%. This means that little is known about the scope and characteristics of art theft.

There have been many famous cases of art theft, some heists where the most famous art pieces in the world have been stolen. One example of this is the 1911 theft of the most famous art piece in the world, the Mona Lisa, painted by Leonardo da Vinci. The police were as baffled as everyone else. It was thought that modernist enemies of traditional art must be involved and the avant-garde poet and playwright Guillaume Apollinaire was arrested in September and questioned for a week before being released. Pablo Picasso was the next prominent suspect, but there was no evidence against him either. Two years went by before the true culprit was discovered, an Italian petty criminal called Vincenzo Peruggia who had moved to Paris in 1908 and worked at the Louvre for a time. He went to the gallery in the white smock that all the employees there wore and hid until it closed for the night when he removed the Mona Lisa from its frame. When the gallery reopened he casually walked out with the painting under his smock, attracting no attention, and took it to his lodgings in Paris.

Perugia apparently believed that the Mona Lisa had been stolen from Florence by Napoleon and that he deserved a reward for doing his patriotic duty and returning it to its true home in Italy. Soon after, the Mona Lisa was safely returned to the original home in the Louvre and has resided there ever since. This is a perfect example of a more "famous" heist where there was global attention. Yet some heists go unnoticed. Billions of dollars' worth of art goes missing every year, according to the F.B.I., but thefts of high-profile paintings are both infrequent and widely reported. These paintings never get returned and end up becoming forever lost.

All in all, the theft of all this incredible artwork that artists have put their soul into something that must never be forgotten, overlooked or improperly addressed. Art is something precious, all forms of it, and the business of art theft goes against every principle that the artist based their work on. To be

The debate about cursive writing vs. printing is raging in education! Is cursive writing worth learning or is it a waste of time?

What's so significant about writing cursive? Experts say it's good for your brain. According to the "The great cursive debate" it states "cursive writing engages both the right and left hemispheres of the brain. It can actually aid in reading comprehension, idea generation, spelling, brain development and memory." Another pro of learning script is that it helps with dyslexia. Dyslexia is a general term for disorders that involve difficulty in learning to read or interpreting words, letters, and other symbols, but that do not affect general intelligence. Basically, learning cursive helps students who suffer from any forms of dyslexia. It is also important for people to learn cursive in order to sign any documents or papers. Furthermore, it allows students to express their creativity through arts. It's not that hard to learn cursive anywhere. It can be taught in about an hour. After that, it is all practice.

Even though there are benefits to learning cursive, I believe, it is ultimately a waste of time. In 2012, at a handwriting conference hosted by Zaner- Bloser, a publisher of cursive textbooks, surveyed teachers. Only thirty-seven percent wrote in cursive. It is still possible to get the benefits from handwriting without learning cursive. A person is still able to understand cursive even without learning how to write in it. Also, there are no studies that show that writing in cursive is more effective than printing.

Criminologists have recognized a link between serial killers and post animal abusers. It was concluded that people who think hurting living organisms is morally correct start out with abusing animals and move on to abusing humans. When abusing an animal, the abuser believes that its life is inferior to his/her own and decide that other people should feel the same way.

The NY Post also states, "Animal abusers are five times more likely to commit acts of human violence (for example, assault and rape), four times more likely to commit property offenses (such as burglary and vandalism) and three times more likely to commit drug offenses." The issue states statistics on how much more likely someone is to commit crimes after abusing animals. The article further lists many examples. One example states "Jeffrey Dahmer strangled and dismembered seventeen men and then kept their decomposing bodies in a barrel of acid. In childhood, he would reportedly kill animals to skin and soak their bones in acid before mounting their heads on stakes in the backyard." Dahmer used the same tactics when he abused animals and later moved on to abusing humans. He murdered seventeen men and kept their bodies in acid, which is similar to his experience in killing animals and keeping their bodies in acid as well.

This leads to the question of how can we stop people from committing these crimes. The FBI can keep track of animal abusers and their activity. This can allow them to keep track of their whereabouts and to make sure that they will not harm others. People can also play a role to report any activity that they witnessed to the authorities. Moreover, the government can regulate this issue more and not only help the people who are at stake, but the animals suffering as well.

All in all, animal abuse can gradually become something more serious. Abusers are more likely to commit crimes, especially killers since they have this mindset that they can kill other living things. There have been many instances that prove this theory as well. From this evidence, the FBI can stop more crimes from happening and the world can be a safer place.
