Principal's Report: This school year is beginning with a remote learning model for all students and teachers. All teachers are teaching from the itsLearning platform, which is also integrated with Power School. The district is currently working out a few bugs, but it seems to be working fairly well. itsLearning is compiled using multiple platforms to reach all students. There are a few students still in need of hard paper packets versus working remotely from a device. So far to-date, we have issued 366 chromebook devices to students to accommodate remote learning.

Mandatory finance training for all new board members will be announced in the near future. Georgia Charter School Association webinar trainings will be available soon for all board members.

Learning Platform: I would like to say a big thank you to our parents and students for being patient with us while we implemented online learning this year. There is no substitute for in person face to face instruction. The school system did purchase a high quality learning management system (itslearning). The technology glitches are slowly getting worked out as we are entering this week of on-line learning. The main glitch has been trying to get the itslearning platform to communicate with the Power School platform. These are behind the scene issues that our teachers have no control of. Due to our teachers not having any control over making the platforms communicate with each other, they had to resort to other online platforms such as google classroom, google meets, zoom etc. The use of the various platforms did cause confusion and we knew it would. Thank you for being patient with us as we navigate something that is also very new to us.

Map Testing: Oglethorpe Charter School is working out the details to provide MAP testing to be able to monitor student growth this year. We want to make sure that we get students caught up academically from lost academic instruction from last year and help them make academic growth moving forward. MAP testing is a good diagnostic tool to help all stakeholders access academic growth. We will update everyone when our plans are finalized.

In Person Learning Update: Oglethorpe Charter School anxiously awaits the day for in-person learning to return. This will be a phased in approach with many moving pieces

to take into consideration. We have to follow the lead of the Savannah Chatham County School System with this phased in approach to in person learning. The school zone for Oglethorpe Charter School is the entire Chatham County region. We get students from Bloomingdale, Pooler, the islands, and almost every single neighborhood that is found in Chatham County. With our students coming from so many different areas in the city and county, we rely heavily on school bus transportation. As soon as all of the specifics and details are worked out by the Savannah Chatham County School System for the phased in approach to starting in-person learning, we will make sure all of our OCS stakeholders get the information. There are many possible scenario's that could take place. I encourage all OCS parents to try and follow the BOE meeting this week that should be taking place on Wednesday, September 16th. That meeting should be streamed live for your viewing if you are available during that time frame to watch.

Itslearning Platform Update: We are slowly but surely getting all of the glitches worked out on our online learning platform. We did have an issue this past week where we had to change some course codes in Power School that resulted in students losing the ability to see some of their classes for one day. The 2 platforms (itslearning and Power School) communicate with each other to make the online system work and be more streamlined. Any time a major change is made in the Power School platform (changing course code numbers), it usually takes 24 hours for the 2 platforms to get back in sink.

Progress Reports: The Quarter 1 Progress report date has been changed to **September 18**th due to the two week delayed start of school.

Who should I contact if the device isn't working properly?
