Connor Buchanan presented a revised budget to reflect the addition of Cares Act grant funds. This addition of funds enabled OCS to reduce expenses for software and hardware, and to add funds for summer school, some additional funding for possible substitute teachers, and possible Spring sports, etc. The standard financial report through the month of December, 2020 was not presented as the payroll figures for the month of December were not available from the district at the time of the meeting due to the district integrating to a new financial system.

Principal's Report: All board members were sent a course invitation containing all links to required annual governing board member training. Returning board members require 9 hours of training. New board members require 15 hours of training during the school year. Three hours have been given previously to all board members, who attended whole group training.

We are still in a virtual teaching/learning mode. The Savannah Chatham school board will meeting Wednesday, February 3rd to decide if the virtual model will remain, or if they will reintroduce the hybrid model. OCS will keep the same schedule that is currently being followed by teachers and students. Each student will see (virtually) each of their teachers each day Monday through Friday. 
