Academic Updates—Tony Lang

MCA Data

- Math-last year at 25.58% proficiency overall
 - o Free and Reduced Lunch—on track to beat SPPS (27.25%) in this category
 - English Language Learners—more proficient than St. Paul
- Reading—last year at 30.67% profiency overall
 - o Free and Reduced-more proficient than SPPS
 - EL-on track to be more proficient than SPPS
- MCA Preparation
 - Overall: Students in grades 3-6 are practicing MCA questions every day in different modalities to prepare for MCA
 - o Testing will be done in the classrooms on the Chromebooks
 - Addressing problems for getting ready for MCAs and implementing action plans in grade levels
 - o Goal: All classes averaging 40% proficiency on both math and reading
 - MCA weekly data trackers—for MCA preparation
