(cont'd from page 1) "The ejection itself appears to have occurred earlier than expected, but analysis is not complete", the agency has stated. They also experienced problems with the thrusters built to soften the landing. According to CNN, "the agency believes they switched off sooner than expected". The bigger picture for the ESA is to send the Exo-Mars Rover to the Red Planet in 2020.

Schiaparelli's sibling ship appropriately named the Trace Gas Orbiter is safe in Mar's orbit. Its mission, as CNN describes it, "will investigate the source of life on Mars, which could be a sign of life or geological processes". The presence of methane is an important discovery on Mars because the source of the methane could hint to a sign of life from the past or the present. Adam Stevens, a researcher in astrobliology has stated that the mission will help "rule out some possibilities". The Trace Gas Orbiter has an expected lifespan of four more years.

On the other hand, the United States has the aim to send humans to Mars. As depicted in the 2015 movie, "The Martian" astronauts will be sent to the surface of the chaotic planet in the near future. The goal, according to President Obama, is to put humans on Mars in the 2030's with the eventual aim of staying for an extended period of time". The two current rovers on Mars, Curiosity and Opportunity, are still in operation. Private companies such as SpaceX plan to send humans to the planet in the next ten years. SpaceX has tested its new engine named Raptor which will be used for interplanetary transportation. Elon Musk, CEO and creator of SpaceX, has announced his plans to use the Interplanetary Transport System (ITS), the rocket planned for Mars. The ultimate goal for the future is to colonize Mars which could be the next home for humankind.






Nature Is So Beautiful When Predators Protect Their Helpless Prey
