

The OCS Football team won the city championship with a decisive win over West Chatham Middle School finishing the season undefeated. The players and coaches fought through adversity from day one. The August heat and humidity made practices very difficult with this football season starting earlier than any other season in past years. There was a COVID quarantine of the entre football team that interrupted an entire week of practice. Coach Perry had to spend many hours with the players working on academics to keep them eligible after the first 9 week grading period. There was no break for the kids. They were at the school every day including Friday until 6:00 p.m. The Back Story: The Oglethorpe Charter School football program was started in 2007 when Tompkins Middle School was made into Woodville Tompkins High School. The big expense with starting a football program is the equipment. We were able to secure the football equipment from Tompkins Middle School, and this was the humble start of our rich football tradition at Oglethorpe. Our first coach was Derek Butler. Derek is the current Principal of Islands High School. We did not win a single game our first season. We scored one touch down in the final game and you would have thought we won the Super Bowl. Derek was big time motivator with the kids, and Mark Case (former athletic director) was very instrumental in getting our teams going in the right direction too. Coach Perry landed at

Oglethorpe Charter School in 2012 after Derek Butler accepted an Assistant Principal's job at Johnson High School. Since his arrival at Oglethorpe, Coach Perry has won the city championship in 2014, 2016, 2018, and now in 2021. It is not so much about the championship wins that makes all of us proud at Oglethorpe. It is more about getting the student athletes academically prepared to be successful at any high school and providing them with a character and moral base to meet the challenges that lay ahead. This is what coach Perry has accomplished through our football program. The top players at every high school in our metro area including all private schools typically are from Oglethorpe. Many of them go on to play collegiate football at the Division 1 and Division 2 level. Mike Cabalaro (Windsor Forest) just finished his season with quite a few scholarship offers. Barry Kleinpeter (QB at Country Day) was recruited out of Oglethorpe after the 2018 championship season. Barry is one the top college prospects in the nation now. Coach Perry's own son played on a championship team at Oglethorpe and is currently in his junior year as a Division 1 football player at Coastal Carolina. Javontee Middleton played for the Citadel and was the team captain. Coach Perry has provided year in and year out a program of excellence where the expectation is 5 days a week until 6:00 p.m. The focus is not always on football. Academics takes top priority. There are many life lessons taught on the football field that have absolutely nothing to do with football. The championships and winning seasons since 2012 are not by chance. Attention to detail with every aspect of student life has been the focus of Coach Perry. Great Season Players and Coaches!



OCS Volleyball: The OCS Volleyball team won the city championship in the spring of 2021. The sport was moved to that timeframe due to the pandemic. They had an outstanding winning season again this fall making it to the playoffs but coming up short against Godley Station. Volleyball is the winningest athletic program at Oglethorpe winning city championships in, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2021. **Great job players and coaches!**
