


# SOCIAL STUDIES Summer Reading Assignment US History 1 – ALL FRESHMEN - DMHS & A@E



## ***WHAT ARE THE PROS AND CONS?***

Do you love debating? Do you know how to structure and deliver a convincing argument?

Your first assignment in US History 1 will be a 3-4 page paper convincing your reader to feel the way YOU do about a topic of your choice. Go to [www.procon.org](http://www.procon.org). Scroll to the bottom and choose from among The 50 listed topics.

Click on the topic of your choice, one with which you have -- or someone close to you has -- a personal connection. **INJECTING PERSONAL ANECDOTES INTO YOUR ARGUMENT IS A REQUIREMENT FOR THIS ASSIGNMENT** (in other words, talk about yourself!). Spend **NO LESS THAN 6 HOURS** researching the topic, using at least 6 sources on this and other websites (click on each topic and you will see Pro & Con Arguments, Quotes, Historical Timelines, Videos, Related Articles, etc.). Take your time to **READ** and become an expert! Take notes on everything, and be sure to record your sources. Then write a 3-4 page essay (plus cover page & MLA works cited page) convincing your reader of your position on this topic, supported by facts and examples.

## ***REQUIREMENTS***

1. Cover page should feature an interesting, creative title for your essay and include hand-drawn or computer-generated graphics. Have fun with this, perhaps including a personal photo illustrating your position on the issue!
2. Opening paragraph must have a clear thesis. Be sure it states your topic and your position on it; then give clear arguments **PLUS** a counter-argument to show that you have considered both sides of the issue.
3. Using MLA format, include PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS and a WORKS CITED page. Learn how by going to <http://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/resource/747/2/>.
4. Include some kind of personal reference or connection to the topic to make your argument more convincing.
5. **Formatting Criteria:** MLA format (one-inch margins on all sides of the page; 12 point Times New Roman; double-spaced text; indent paragraphs and do not insert extra spaces between paragraphs; put your full name in the top left corner of the first page of the essay and your last name and the page number in the top right corner of every page after that, one-half inch from the corner in the header of your document).
6. Consult and attach rubric to your essay.
