There were 60 community members present including students, faculty, and staff. Assistant Superintendent Susan Shirken was unable to attend.

#### I. CALL TO ORDER

Board president David M. C. Stern called the meeting to order at 7:05 P.M.

At 7:07 P.M. Jennifer Darger made a motion to adjourn the public meeting and to begin Executive Session to discuss special education students, personnel, negotiations, and legal matters. Jonathan Faust seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

At 8:20 P.M. Jonathan Faust made a motion to readjourn to public session. Jennifer Darger seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

David M. C. Stern began the tribute to Ed Kennedy by saying that Ed has been with Edgemont for 36 years beginning his career as a science teacher, then as an assistant principal, and then as principal of Seely Place School. David described Ed as one of the "Crown Jewels" of our district. He said people chose to come to Edgemont because of Dr. Kennedy's reputation of caring for the community, the children, and the parents. Dr. Kennedy is known for his "personal contact" with students and with parents; "thousands have benefitted from his time here at Edgemont." David described his leadership and love of the outdoors (Sixth Grade Camp) as being just a few of Dr. Kennedy's outstanding traits. David addressed Ed and asked that he accept this tribute as a thank you from the Edgemont community to a man whose dedication to Edgemont and its students have made him the embodiment of what is special about Edgemont.

Ed Kennedy received a round of applause and a standing ovation from all present.

David M. C. Stern announced that there will be a special day when Ed Kennedy will be celebrated.

Victoria Kniewel began her comments by saying that Edgemont is a very special place. We work together as partners with students, teachers, and parents and with special principals, creating a stable environment to the school. Victoria thanked Ed for his warm welcoming and support when she became Superintendent of Edgemont Schools. Victoria congratulated Ed and said, "You will be missed."

#### **Board Comments:**

Jennifer Darger thanked Ed Kennedy for all he has contributed to Edgemont and shared some personal stories with the community.

David Chao said he is happy and thankful that he and his family have been touched by Ed's class and his royalty in Seely Place.

Michael Bianchi thanked Ed for "creating this amazing school; I'm really going to miss you."

Jonathan Faust said, "Thank you for what you've done for our kids, parents, and the school district; and thank you on a personal level."

Anish Nanavaty said, "I'm sorry to see you go; you've put in many hours and many years looking after the community; you personify Edgemont."

Brian Yarrington said, "thank you very much; you've been a wonderful help to me; Seely Place School is a true reflection of your personality and your expertise; it is a wonderful school; with tremendous gratitude, we thank you very much."

David M. C. Stern sent regrets from Sue Shirken who was unable to attend tonight's meeting and share in Ed's tribute.

Kathleen Fox, Edgemont Teachers Association President, addressed the Board and the community as she paid tribute to Dr. Edward Kennedy. Kathleen described Ed as follows: a superb mentor, smart, clever, master at humor, extremely modest, loves sports, admired and well-liked by his colleagues, always in a good mood, his door always open where people felt welcomed and safe; teachers trust him. Kathleen said, "We wish you the best in your retirement; we will miss you...thank you for everything; we love you."

Ed Kennedy was asked to say a few words. He began by saying, "This is a difficult night for me." He thanked the members of the board and Kathleen Fox for all of their sentiments. Ed said, "This is my second home; I enjoy Edgemont and will always do whatever I can for Edgemont; this was the hardest decision I've ever made; I will always carry the many fond memories of Edgemont with me; thank you all very much."

At 8:56 P.M. David M. C. Stern called for a short recess.

At 8:58 P. M. David M. C. Stern called the meeting back to order.

#### VI. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Adoption of the Administrative Budget Proposal for 2016-2017 Victoria Kniewel, Susan Shirken

David M. C. Stern called upon Victoria Kniewel to give an update on the latest developments regarding the administrative budget proposal for 2016-2017. Victoria said that since the last board meeting of March 22<sup>nd</sup>, the proposed budget has been adjusted due to an increase in State aid and because of the State's gap elimination adjustment, resulting in a percentage tax-rate increase of 2.74%. She continued to say that the budget is well under the tax cap. Victoria thanked the Board and the community for their support.

## **Board Comments:**

David Chao said, "It is a good budget for this year; it sets us up for stronger budgets in the future; I am 100% in favor of this budget."

Brian Yarrington commented, "In the past, we were being bombarded and not able to get ahead of the game; this budget is a good incremental step forward; it has positive steps in the right direction as in hiring the technology coach without burdening the taxpayer." Brian concluded by saying, "I echo David Chao's comments, and I am very much in favor of this budget."

Jonathan Faust said, "I strongly support this budget; it amplifies what it is we are trying to accomplish to improve technology, to improve our educational goals while maintaining educational excellence; we continue to provide a premier education in a fiscally responsible manner."

Jennifer Darger commented, "With gratitude and appreciation, I say this is a responsible budget; I appreciate the efforts that were made by everyone."

Michael Bianchi said, "I appreciate what the Board has done for this budget."

Anish Nanavaty commented on the expenses and revenues and said that from the expense side, he is pleased that all of the requirements are met; on the revenue side, it is great that the State has given us back money, providing us with a stable budget; this allows us to keep an appropriate level of reserves to deal with the various contingencies the district has to contend with. Anish said, "This is a great budget, and I would urge everyone to pass it."

David M. C. Stern thanked Victoria and Sue for coming through with a fiscally responsible budget and a budget that meets the spirit of educational excellence. David said he looked at the drivers for every decision that was made and was impressed with the management of the reserves and the way the strategic goals helped with those decisions.

Victoria thanked Sue for her careful stewardship with every dollar, working closely with teachers and administrators and for her attention to detail.

David M. C. Stern asked that Agenda Item C.1. be taken out of order. Victoria read the resolution and a motion was made.

Brian Yarrington made a motion to approve the 2016-2017 budget in the amount of \$55,912,470. Michael Bianchi seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.
