




Dear Alumni, Parents and Friends of Delone Catholic High School,

In August of 2009, my message included the following from Matthew 17:20, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you."

This year we have moved mountains! Nothing was impossible! We began a capital campaign for the first time the history of Delone Catholic with a committee of very dedicated Division Chairpersons. These chairpersons, numbering 12 just like the Apostles of Jesus, zealously tackled their assigned tasks and reaped rewards immediately. In the short space of seven months we had met our original goal of \$1.75 million. The Board has since approved the extension of the goal. Today we have received gifts and pledges totaling \$1.99 million!

Conewago Enterprises, Inc., is under contract with the Diocese of Harrisburg to spearhead the renovation of the 1963 Math and Science Wing with the assistance of Jim Baumgardner, Architect. Materials are being ordered, color schemes chosen, fixtures designed – the dream of a decade is becoming a reality. The level of excitement and anticipation is reaching an all-time high!

Our goal is to move EVERYTHING out of the science and math classrooms. We will have a storage container on campus. We will recycle what materials we can, and we will sell metal parts that can be salvaged. We have targeted May 18-20 for our grand move. We need help! If any recent graduates have returned from college, please volunteer. If any of our parents have a day off or a schedule that will allow an hour or two, please volunteer. If any of our current seniors completed an exam by virtue of AP courses and are free to help, please volunteer. You can volunteer by contacting the school at 717-637-5969.

The next step is to have the non-friable asbestos tiles removed from all of the classrooms. The company believes that this project can be completed in 10-14 days. As one floor becomes available for renovation, the contractors will begin! The project will be finished before the start of school. I am positive that we will need abundant help in mid-August as we move everything back into the classrooms prior to the arrival of our students.

Just imagine! New labs! Air conditioning! Heat that works! Bathrooms that sparkle! Additional technology or access to it with the wires above the ceiling rather than hanging from it!

Delone Catholic continues to be indebted to all those who have donated to this project. As St. Francis of Assisi said, "It is in giving that we receive." So many have given so much, and to them we are indeed grateful. Psalm 30:12 reads, "O Lord my God, I will give thanks to thee forever." Delone Catholic will give thanks to God forever for touching the generous hearts of so many people!

# DELONE CATHOLIC MARKS 70TH ANNIVERSARY WITH MASS, REDEDICATION

"So it is that Delone High School is an instrument of Providence for hundreds of earnest young people who look forward to entering business industry or other fields of employment. What is of greatest importance, of course is that these young people will receive their training for the future in the inspiring atmosphere of religion. Here their faith, deepened and strengthened, will permeate as a leaven all other studies, and new horizons will open up before their youthful minds in the higher learning they will receive."

– Most Rev. Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Archbishop of Laodicea and Apostolic Delegate to the United States, Sept. 2, 1940

With these words on behalf of Venerable Pope Pius XII, Archbishop Cicognani opened Delone Catholic High School to its first students. Those students, the Classes of 1941-44, and the faculty and administrators who educated them began a proud tradition, which many came together to celebrate on Labor Day weekend 2010.

Delone Catholic began its 71st academic year in a unique position. The celebration of the milestone anniversary took place as the school took a major step in the physical renewal of its building. A capital campaign that puts the school on course to celebrate many more anniversaries in its current home was publicly announced just four months earlier. This time of growth also provided a special opportunity to thank God for his blessings over 70 years and remember all of those who made Delone Catholic's present and future possible through the hard work of the past.

"Building on the shoulders of the giants who have come before me has paved the way for a future filled with God's graces and special blessings on Delone Catholic High School," Dr. Maureen C. Thiec, Delone Catholic's seventh principal, said.

In the most fitting way for a Catholic school to celebrate such an occasion, the Delone Catholic family planned a Mass for Thursday, Sept. 2 in the Sheppard Gym. The current administrators, faculty, staff and students of the school were joined by alumni from all generations in welcoming Most Rev. Joseph P. McFadden as the principal celebrant. Bishop McFadden was making his first visit to a high school in the Diocese of Harrisburg since being installed as its 10th bishop in mid-August. Sixteen of his brother priests and three deacons representing the Adams Deanery and Maryland parishes served by Delone Catholic, as well as former chaplains and alumni priests concelebrated the Mass.

"We were delighted that Bishop McFadden was able to visit and celebrate Mass with all of us on this auspicious occasion," Dr. Thiec said. "Our anniversary followed so closely to Bishop's installation that his willingness to attend was much appreciated."

Bishop McFadden took the opportunity to ask God's continued blessing on Delone Catholic and all who teach and learn here as they began the new school year. In his homily, Bishop McFadden channeled the vision that his predecessor, Most Rev. George L. Leech, had for Delone Catholic to be an institution that prepares its students to use their gifts and talents to bring joy and happiness to their communities. At the groundbreaking in 1939, Bishop Leech had declared, "For our youth, we establish Delone Catholic High School; may it teach them how to live."

Bishop McFadden echoed these thoughts, saying, "We ask the Holy Spirit to help guide you this year to, first of all, be good students, to be open to learning about life. That's what this place is about. It's about learning our purpose. It's about opening your minds and hearts to all sorts of different things in the world that God has created. That's what we do in education, mold you and help you so you can be truly wise."

Knowing that Delone Catholic is taking all it learned in the past to grow and improve in the future, Bishop McFadden encouraged the students to do the same in their own lives.

"Right now, you are in school at Delone Catholic," Bishop McFadden said. "You are here because your parents sent you here to help you learn and grow so that you can have a full life. But as you are doing that, you have to discern 'What am I going to do with my life?'"

Delone Catholic has helped prepare thousands of students over the last 70 years to answer that question for themselves. Many families have seen their second, third and now fourth generations make the journey from childhood to adulthood within the walls of our school. Their preparation has allowed them to be parents and grandparents, priests and sisters, carpenters and engineers, valued members of the armed forces, scientists, poets, lawyers, doctors, office managers, administrative assistants, laborers and anything else that they have chosen to do.

Most importantly, no matter how Delone Catholic alumni have chosen to make a living, they have gained the necessary skills to do so in an environment that taught them to "Be Doers of the Word." Bishop McFadden's words reiterated that command from the letter of St. James, chosen so many years ago to be the school motto.

"Jesus tells us that if we want to be people that find happiness and joy, it's not so much what people can do for us. It's what we can do for others."

The anniversary celebration did not end when the Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree honor guard led all of the Mass participants out of the Sheppard Gym. The following night, after the Squires football team traveled up the road to open the season with a 14-0 blanking of local rival New Oxford, the





team and the students returned to J.T. Flaherty Field for Football Friday. Each week, WGAL-TV 8 broadcasts its highlight show from the site of several of the weekend's key games. Typically, they only broadcast from the home team's stadium, but they broke from tradition to help mark the 70th anniversary.

The following morning, the festivities concluded with a rededication ceremony in the Memorial Garden outside the Old Gym. Dr. Thiec was joined by three of her six predecessors and more than 100 students, faculty and alumni to call to mind the charge given to a Catholic school and to ask God's help and guidance in carrying it out.

Just around the corner of the building from the spot where, Archbishop Cicognani and Bishop Leech had been joined by 155 priests from around the Diocese in 1940, Rev. Msgr. Robert E. Lawrence, Delone Catholic's third principal, recalled the man whose name the school bears. Were it not for the generosity of Mr. Charles J. Delone, none of what has been accomplished since 1940 would have been possible. Msgr. Lawrence used Bishop Leech's words from the dedication to point out that Mr. Delone could have chosen to use his wealth for anything, but he used it to make a difference in the lives of his neighbors and many generations of their descendants.

"Mr. Charles J. Delone, through whose munificence this building has been erected, loved his church, his country and his fellow man," Bishop Leech said. "The means he chose to show that love is the wisest means as years ahead will prove when the graduates of Delone Catholic High School take their places in church, and nation and local communities. He did this deed for God and his fellow man."

Because of the great gift he has given to all of us, the name of the Delone family has lived on for more than 70 years without the benefit of a direct descendent. This was never his intent however, as Bishop Leech cited a "sincere and unfeigned desire on the part of Mr. Delone that his benefaction might remain anonymous." The Bishop said that Mr. Delone's wish was truly in keeping with the words of Jesus himself who said, "But when thou dost

alms, let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doth, that thy alms may be in secret and thy father who seeth in secret will repay thee." Bishop Leech continued, outlining the reason that he asked Mr. Delone to reconsider, and his words have proven to be prophetic.

"There are times, however, when the most high-minded personal wishes may properly and profitably yield in order that they may serve the cause of many. And because the donation of this high school building is a fine example to the laity of the Diocese of Harrisburg and a source of genuine edification, showing as it does what our people ought to do with their worldly possessions which they have received from God as the stewards of God, I have asked the donor of this building to allow the name of his fam-

ily and his forbears to be associated with this building in order that he and they may be perpetually remembered in the prayers of those who throughout the future years will come to profit by his priceless benefaction, and so I am very happy to announce to you now that this new institution will be known as the 'Delone Catholic High School.'"

Mr. Delone's example has truly been emulated over the last seven decades. Without the gifts of time, talent and treasure from students, parents, administration, faculty, staff, alumni and friends, Delone Catholic High School would have ceased to exist long ago. Mr. Delone's gift of the land and building allowed Delone Catholic to open, but the gifts of countless others – some known, some anonymous – have made 70 years possible. The continued support of many benefactors will allow this community to look back in another 70 years and remember them in the way we remember Charles J. Delone.

In the spirit of Bishop Leech we continue to remember God's abundant blessings through these benefactors, not simply to recall them, but to recall what they have provided for those whose lives are shaped by Delone Catholic. This school will always exist to prepare young people "in the inspired atmosphere of religion" to meet the challenges of tomorrow and to in turn make a difference for those who come after them.

As Archbishop Cicognani and Bishop Leech charted the course to be taken over the first 70 years, Msgr. Lawrence reminds all of us in the present that our role is to see Delone Catholic into the future.

"Then 70 years later we are here, different individuals, but the same purpose – to provide a Catholic high school education to the young people of this area. Delone Catholic High School continues to teach the three R's of reading, 'riting and 'rithmetic, but adds two more – religion and respect.

"We are here to remember all those who have been a part of Delone Catholic High School over the past 70 years, whether they have been students, teachers, administrators, support personnel or benefactors. Each and every one has had a part in making Delone what it is today, and of continuing the legacy that has been given to us.

"As most are aware, there are planned renovations to the building. Perhaps 30 years from now, as Delone Catholic High School celebrates its 100th anniversary, someone will recognize and show appreciation to those who are assisting in the renovations that are now being made.

"And may the blessings today continue God's special graces on this building, but most importantly, may they be on those who are and will be a part of Delone Catholic High School. It is now Dr. Maureen Thiec and the present faculty and staff who are called to continue the work that began 70 years ago. May the good Lord bless those whom He has chosen to lead Delone Catholic High School at this time.

"Squires, Estote Factores Verbi, Be Doers of the Word, so that this school may continue to be a great instrument of learning and formation for young people of this day, and the young people of future generations."






Groundbreaking July 17, 1939



### Charles J. Delone, Esq. 1864-1940

The following is adapted from The Evening Sun article announcing Mr. Delone's death. It was originally published on Jan. 18, 1940, and is reprinted with the paper's permission. Mr. Delone passed away the previous evening. As we celebrate 70 years as a pillar of the Adams Deanery Catholic community, it is appropriate that we take time to remember the man without whom none of it would have been possible.

Mr. Delone was an able lawyer and a shrewd business man. In club circles his genial personality, friendliness and charm of manner won for him deserved popularity. He was a suave and brilliant conversationalist. As a host, he was delightful. He was fond of travel, and made a trip to Europe in 1900, enjoyed camp life and was an enthusiastic motorist.

Mr. Delone was a son of the late Joseph and Maria J. Hilt Delone, and was born on Feb. 9, 1864. He attended Prof.

Baugher's private school in Hanover, later becoming a student at Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass., for four years.

Later he attended Harvard Law School for three years and after graduating in law practiced in New York City for a short time before returning to Hanover. He since followed his profession here as well as engaging in a number of business enterprises.

He twice served the municipality as borough solicitor, first being named to that office in 1893 when he served one year. Mr. Delone again became borough solicitor in 1903 and remained in that office during 1904 and 1905, records in the borough office show.

Attorney Delone was the donor of the new \$200,000 Catholic High School that is now under construction at Midway and South Streets, McSherrystown, which will be completed for the 1940-41 term, and also the site upon which it stands.

The cornerstone for the handsome brick structure which will serve 10 parishes, was laid and blessed at appropriate services Sunday, Nov. 5, by the Most Rev. George L. Leech, Bishop of the Harrisburg Diocese of the Roman Catholic church, who during his address announced that the new structure will be known as Delone Catholic High School, in honor of the donor.

Attorney Delone was always deeply interested in the Catholic church. He served as a trustee of the Paradise Protectory, near Abbottstown, home for orphan boys of the Catholic faith. He was a member of Hanover council, No. 871, Knights of Columbus, and St. Joseph's Roman Catholic Beneficial Society.

When the water shortage emergency developed here in 1930, Mr. Delone took a keen interest in the task of the Citizens Emergency Water committee, formed during the shortage, and later was of much assistance to that committee in the negotiations which led to the purchase of the Hanover & McSherrystown Water Company. All of the meetings of the Emergency Water committee were held in his office and, while not officially a member of the group, he worked with the committee thoroughly and well, giving unstintingly of his legal knowledge and advice. He went to New York with H.D. Sheppard when the deal for the purchase of the water company was finally consummated. His only compensation for his untiring and valuable efforts in aiding the community in solving its water problem was the satisfaction he received in performing a public service and this he often referred to as the greatest privilege of his life.

Mr. Delone was connected with various businesses in Hanover. He was president of the Hanover Engineering Company. He, too, was the owner and operator of the Park Theater, West Chestnut and Franklin streets, Hanover's only home-owned theater and, in addition, he was a director of the Revonah Spinning Mill. He also owned a number of farms in the vicinity of Hanover.

When steps were taken to form a lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks in Hanover, Mr. Delone took a leading part in the movement and became one of the charter members of Hanover lodge, No. 763. When the lodge was instituted he became the first exalted ruler and served in that capacity in 1902 and 1903. Mr. Delone continued active in the affairs of Elkdom here up to the time of his death. Members of the lodge always greatly enjoyed hearing of the early days of the organization here from the lips of their first exalted ruler, and last May 25 the lodge observed C.J. Delone night on which occasion he was presented with a life membership in the order.

Mr. Delone, too, was long an active member of the Arcadian Club, Hanover's oldest societal organization.

In the days of the Hanover fair, Mr. Delone was a member and a director of the Hanover Agricultural Society, which annually conducted the exhibition.

W.B. Gemmill, president of the York County Bar Association, announced that a meeting would be held on Friday, Jan. 19, 1940, in the court house at which time a tribute was paid to the memory of Attorney Delone.

Mr. Delone was survived by his wife, who before marriage was Helen S. Winebrenner, who died Nov. 27, 1962; a sister Miss Mary A. Delone and a niece Miss Elizabeth Delone, both of Hanover.

A funeral Mass for Mr. Delone was celebrated at 9 a.m. on Saturday, Jan. 20, 1940, at St. Joseph Church on Baltimore Street. He was laid to rest at Mt. Olivet cemetery.



## DCHS Alum Carves Out Niche on National TV

Every Saturday during the fall and winter, millions of people across the country tune in to ESPN to find out what is happening throughout the college football world. The producers and set designers go out of their way, it seems, to join in the festivities whenever their broadcasts coincide with a holiday season. For Kerry Weaver '92, this has been the key to getting his work showcased on national television.

In 2007, Weaver, who lives near State College, Pa., taught himself how to carve images into pumpkins. That football season, ESPN's popular preview show College GameDay originated from the Penn State campus on the weekend of their Oct. 27 showdown with top-ranked Ohio State. Weaver had carved the images of Penn State coach Joe Paterno, the Nittany Lion Shrine, the ESPN logo and the College GameDay hosts into pumpkins and took them to the outdoor set to show to the producers. The producers asked if they could use the pumpkins on the set. Though Weaver was not given name recognition, he had his opening.

While he has carved the images into real pumpkins, most of his work is done on foam craft pumpkins.

"I got tired of them withering in three days after I spent six hours on them," Weaver said.

Two years later, ESPN broadcast live from Penn State again, this time in late September. Weaver was in contact with the producers again, who were unsure of what their plans were for the Halloween game. Just a few days before USC's game at Oregon on Oct. 31, 2009, Weaver got a call requesting pumpkins for the GameDay set. He went to work carving the logos of the two schools into real pumpkins, and after three hours, he sent them overnight to the ESPN staff at the game site in Eugene, Ore.

"They showed them on GameDay, and that night, they showed them like three times during the game on ABC," Weaver said. "I didn't get recognition for it, but millions of people saw my work, which I thought was cool."

Weaver, who was a telecommunications major at Penn State, works part time with the university's telecommunications department. One of his major duties is operating a television camera during the broadcast of home basketball games. He also operates a pressure washing service. He is quick to point out that his hobby is one that others can pick up.

"I got my start with pattern books and tool sets from Wal-Mart," Weaver said. "I taught myself by going to a website that showed you how to make patterns. You take a photograph, put it into Photoshop and make a pattern. The website is not online anymore, which is a shame. I used to show it to people all the time because I don't want to take credit for it. I showed them, not like 'Hey, look what I can do,' but more 'Look what you can do.' I am not an artist. I am a tracer."

Mrs. Sneeringer is currently in her 10th year in the math department, but her affiliation with the school goes far beyond her tenure as a faculty member. Her grandmother was in the first graduating class from Delone Catholic and her parents, husband, Mike Sneeringer '88, and several other family members are alumni of the school.

It was always in Mrs. Sneeringer's plan to teach at Delone Catholic. After graduating high school, she earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Shippensburg University in Shippensburg, Pa., in 1992. At the time, no positions were available at Delone Catholic, and after applying to other school districts in the area, Mrs. Sneeringer decided to substitute teach for a year. After substitute teaching, she held a position with a local bank in training and human resources. Following the purchase of the bank by a holding company, she worked in human resources at a local factory. She then learned that a position had become available at Delone Catholic, for which she applied and was hired.

"After having Miss (Anne) Kerr in high school, I realized I wanted to teach high school math," Mrs. Sneeringer said. "It is an honor to teach with so many of the teachers who have taught me and for whom I have the utmost respect."

Mrs. Sneeringer teaches a range of classes in the Mathematics Department, including Pre-Calculus, Honors Statistics, Advanced Placement Statistics, Honors Calculus and AP Calculus.

"I thoroughly enjoy teaching at Delone Catholic," said Mrs. Sneeringer. "The material is challenging, and it is a pleasure to watch the students rise to the challenge."

Her commitment to Delone Catholic does not end in the classroom, however. Mrs. Sneeringer's involvement in activities and committees inside and outside the school community is extensive. She is currently a faculty representative to the School Board and to the Faculty Communications Committee. Mrs. Sneeringer is also a member of the Social Committee, the Technology Committee and the Validating the Vision/Accreditation for Growth Planning Committee, as well as the Quiz Bowl Moderator and a mentor for one of the new faculty members. She also serves as secretary for the parish council at Sacred Heart Basilica in Hanover, where she is a parishioner. Her sons attend school at Sacred Heart, where she also served on the Middle States Report Planning Committee. In 2009, Mrs. Sneeringer was also awarded the Hanover Chamber of Commerce Teacher of the Year Award.

The Golden Apple Award was originally presented by the Donahue Family Foundation in 1992 in the Diocese of Pittsburgh, and the Golden Apple continues to stand as a symbol for excellence in Catholic education. Each year the award winners are invited to a banquet at the Cardinal Keeler Center in Harrisburg, Pa.

When the awards banquet was held in May 2010, the Diocese of Harrisburg was still without a bishop. In his role as Diocesan Administrator, Very Rev. Chester P. Snyder, hosted the evening's events. A member of the Donahue family was a guest speaker, and each principal presented a speech about the award recipient from his or her school. Mrs. Sneeringer was happy to be surrounded by family and friends.

"It was a very enjoyable and memorable evening," Mrs. Sneeringer noted. "Best of all, I was able to share the evening with my husband, Mike, my sons Andrew and Sean, my mom Janet (Orendorff) Staub '69, Donna Tompkins, who nominated me for the award, and Dr. Thiec."

Receiving the Golden Apple Award is a particularly prestigious honor for any teacher in the Diocese of Harrisburg. The award has been in place for five years, and requires that the nominee be a practicing Catholic and a full-time teacher with at least three years at his or her current school, as well as having all required state and diocesan certifications. Also, a teacher must be nominated by a colleague, a parent or a student. Mrs. Donna Tompkins, chairperson of the Mathematics Department, nominated Mrs. Sneeringer for the award. Mrs. Sneeringer appreciates the respect from her colleagues to be considered for the honor.

"It was an honor to know that a colleague thought highly enough of me to nominate me for the Golden Apple Award. It was amazing to then go on and be selected from all those who were nominated. There are so many outstanding teachers in the Diocese," Mrs. Sneeringer said.

Mrs. Sneeringer continues to serve as a model of the school's motto "Be Doers of the Word." She has a resounding presence in the school community, and Dr. Thiec greatly appreciates her efforts.

"Mrs. Sneeringer is a valuable, trusted and dedicated member of our faculty whose deeds emit a true understanding of what it means to be a disciple of God," Dr. Thiec said. "She lives her faith in her day-to-day actions."

# DWIGHT SCHLALINE ORDAINED TO PRIESTHOOD OF JESUS CHRIST

Delone Catholic High School prepares each of its students for a life of service to God and to their brothers and sisters in His kingdom. This is stressed in the school motto "Estote Factores Verbi" - translated "Be Doers of the Word." Dozens of alumni have answered this call in a formal way, choosing to serve as members of the clergy and religious communities. Father Dwight Schlaline '00, ordained a priest for the Diocese of Harrisburg on June 26, 2010, is the latest to share fully in the work of Jesus Christ.

Like many priestly vocations, Father Schlaline became aware of his over time. His parents, John and Diane, raised him and his siblings in a Catholic household that included Mass attendance at Immaculate Heart of Mary parish in Abbottstown, participation in the sacraments, in youth groups and other church and community functions.

Father Schlaline began his formal education in a public school setting, but found it to be an uncomfortable fit for him. He said that he "wanted to learn, but couldn't in that environment." As he was preparing for the transition to high school, Sister Maria Jude, CSJ, vice principal at Delone Catholic, made a presentation at Immaculate Heart of Mary. Father Schlaline was excited by what he heard, but unsure of whether it was possible for his parents to send him to Delone Catholic.

Despite his doubts, Father Schlaline talked to his father about going to Delone Catholic, and his parents worked it out. Because of that decision, his high school years were a much more positive experience for him.

"Overall, Delone Catholic was much better for me," Father Schlaline said. "It was the simple things, like the uniforms. My class had a lot of very good people. We had class unity, and peer pressure wasn't an issue for us. There was prayer, and it was an overall happier environment. I really appreciated it. I sat on the bus for an hour-and-a-half each day, but it was worth it. I just prayed on the bus. It was an excellent school, and the teachers were impressive."

During his time at Delone Catholic, Father Schlaline was involved in a wide variety of activities. He was a four-year member of the Interact Club and the marching band. He also played in the concert band through his junior year, earning a place in the Diocesan Band as a sophomore and in the county band as a sophomore and junior. He was a member of the National Honor Society and the prom committee, and he was a retreat leader as a senior. In addition, Father Schlaline attained the rank of Eagle Scout in the Boys Scouts during his junior year.

Father Schlaline's academic work and involvement at Delone Catholic prepared him to enroll at Franciscan University of Steubenville in Steubenville, Ohio, in the fall of 2000. He earned bachelor's degrees in classical languages, focusing mainly on Latin and Greek, and philosophy. He learned from several sources that these majors would be helpful if he chose to enter seminary, but he had not made any concrete decisions about his future at that point.

"I didn't really discern much of my vocation in college," Father Schlaline said. "I was formed a lot at Franciscan University. It was a really Christian environment. People prayed together. They were very sincere. The students were very loving toward each other in a Christian way. Something like 50 percent of the students go to daily Mass every day there. It was really awesome. That was a huge formative influence."

By taking summer classes each year, Father Schlaline finished college a semester early and returned to live with his parents in East Berlin. He worked at a bank in the area from February 2004 to August 2005 as he sorted out the direction in which God was leading him.

"It was at that time that I really discerned my vocation more intensely. I had looked at all the other possibilities, so many other things I wanted to do, but that's not what is going to fulfill me," Father Schlaline said. "Ultimately, I felt more drawn to the priesthood. I remember one of the things with my discernment, and the way discernment needs to happen, I think, is that I basically said to God, 'I don't know exactly what you want me to do, but I am going to do this, and if this is wrong, you have to stop me.' I put the ball in His court, and He never stopped me, so I ended up here."

During the discernment process, the Office of Vocations at the Diocese of Harrisburg contacted Father Schlaline and other young men like him who had expressed interest in the priesthood but had yet to make a decision. They were invited by Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades, who was then the Bishop of Harrisburg, to his residence for Stations of the Cross and dinner. Father Schlaline had an opportunity to meet individually with the Bishop who asked him if he were to enter seminary, would he prefer to go to Mount St. Mary's in Emmitsburg, Md., or Saint Vincent in Latrobe, Pa.

"I didn't know the difference between the two," Father Schlaline said. "So as a joke, I said, 'Well, I'd rather go to Rome.' Then he took that seriously, apparently."

It did not seem that way at first, because in August 2005, Father Schlaline entered seminary at Saint Vincent. It did not take him long to find out that he would be headed to Rome after just one year. He spent that year taking classes that either prepared him for his time in Rome, or that he was not likely to take in Rome, among them, Italian language and pastoral counseling.

Those classes gave him at least the basics he would need while he spent the next four years studying at the Pontifical North American College in Rome. Father Schlaline said that it was a totally new experience for him because he had never left North America. He had been to Boy Scout camp in Canada each summer from seventh grade through high school, but going to a place where English was not the native language was completely different.

While he was working on his studies and formation, Father Schlaline also got to learn a whole new culture and way of living. The ancient sites in Rome that he had learned about in high school and college became real as he got to see the city's cathedrals and the secular structures, like the Coliseum. Those






lessons were not confined to Europe, however. He spent Holy Week and Easter Week in 2007 in Zambia on a trip arranged by former Delone Catholic social studies teacher Mary Furlong. That trip to Africa taught him an unexpected lesson.

"We could talk about the poverty in Zambia. I saw that, and I kind of expected to see that," Father Schlaline said. "What I was really struck by was that I felt more relaxed than I ever felt in my whole life. Not just me, but the people there. I have a friend in Zambia now, and I asked him 'In your native language, does the word "stress" exist?' It doesn't exist. The concept is not even there. Deadline? It's not even there.

"St. Francis and St. Dominic, they embraced the vow of poverty," Father Schlaline continued. "Most people try to get out of poverty. They went into poverty, choosing it. What they realized is that it is a lot less stressful. People don't realize that though. You would think that it would be the opposite, that you would be bored. I didn't feel bored there. I felt relaxed. And when I came back to Rome from Zambia, as we were flying over the city of Rome, my nerves, I could feel it. I was kind of more tense. You've got cars, hustle and bustle, and everything is moving. In Zambia, there is nothing to stress you out. I was really surprised by that, the total lack of stress."

As he neared the end of his formation in Rome, it came time for Father Schlaline and his classmates to receive their diaconate ordination. He was joined in Rome by his parents and sister, Kimberly Schlaline '02, as well as other friends from the Diocese of Harrisburg. Among them were Father Raymond Lavoie, the Vocations Director, Father Michael Messner, who at the time was the pastor at Immaculate Heart of Mary and chaplain at Delone Catholic, and former DCHS chaplain Father Charles Persing.

On Oct. 8, 2009, nearly 30 men received the sacrament of Holy Orders from Archbishop Robert J. Carlson of St. Louis at St. Peter's Basilica. During the Mass, Archbishop Carlson received from Father Schlaline, his vows of celibacy, obedience to the Ordinary of the Diocese of Harrisburg and to pray the Liturgy of the Hours daily for the rest of his life. After these vows were professed, Archbishop Carlson said, "May God who has begun the good work in you, bring it to fulfillment." Later in the ceremony, the Archbishop invoked the Holy Spirit through the laying of hands, and with his "Amen," Mr. Dwight Schlaline became Deacon Dwight Schlaline. A similar transition would take place the following summer back in his home diocese as he completed the journey from seminarian to priest.

Before returning home, however, Deacon Schlaline had a special experience that only a few of his classmates shared. At the Chrism Mass during Holy Week in 2010, he and several others were chosen by lottery to assist in the distribution of Holy Communion at the Mass celebrated by Pope Benedict XVI. Because of the large number of bishops and priests in attendance, they could not all process to the altar to receive Communion there. Only cardinals were able to do that. Instead, the deacons took the Body and Blood of Christ to the bishops and priests.

Father Schlaline completed his time in Rome and returned to his parents' home about two weeks before his ordination to the priesthood. He did so aware that he was in the somewhat unusual position of being ordained during a time in which the Diocese of Harrisburg did not have a bishop. Bishop Rhoades had been installed as the Bishop of Fort Wayne-South Bend in Indiana in January. Bishop Joseph P. McFadden was appointed by Pope Benedict XVI as the Tenth Bishop of Harrisburg four days before Father Schlaline's ordination, but was not installed until August. Because a bishop must preside over the sacrament of Holy Orders, the Diocese had arranged for Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio, Bishop of the Archdiocese of Military Services, USA, to celebrate the ordination. Father Schlaline was a little bit anxious that he was not going to be ordained by his own bishop, so he took the initiative to reach out to Archbishop Broglio and get to know him.

"I didn't even know who Archbishop Broglio was," Father Schlaline said. "So, the first thing I did was I contacted him, and I said, 'I'd like to meet the person who is going to ordain me,' and he agreed to that."

Father Schlaline was scheduled to be in Washington, D.C., where the Archdiocese of Military Services is based, for the ordination of three of his seminary classmates the week before his own. Archbishop Broglio invited him to stay at the residence for the weekend, and the two men shared several meals and their prayer life for the weekend, which was a comfort to Father Schlaline heading into his own ordination weekend.

"We got to know each other then, a little bit, thank God." Father Schlaline said. "He was able to make his homily (at my ordination) more personal then, which I liked."

The day of his ordination was a huge celebration for Father Schlaline and the whole church of the Diocese of Harrisburg. Many of his family members and friends joined him as he became the newest worker in the Lord's vineyard.

"It was nice to have all of my family there, and I really wanted people to be there," Father Schlaline said. "The biggest thing for me, I just wanted them to come and to be part of that experience and to be there with me. The fact that so many people came was huge."

The celebration continued the next day with his First Mass of Thanksgiving at Immaculate Heart of Mary. His pastor during his childhood, Father Thomas Langan, a former member of the Delone Catholic Board of Directors, gave the homily. He said that Father Schlaline's ordination was a particularly joyful one for the people of Immaculate Heart of Mary because he is the first man in the 201-year history of the parish ordained to the priesthood who received all of his sacraments as a member of the parish.

Now, nearly a year later, Father Schlaline continues to settle into his new life as a priest. He was assigned to St. Patrick Church in Carlisle, Pa., where former DCHS board member Father Andre Meluskey resides as the senior priest. Father Schlaline is also the Catholic campus minister at Dickinson College in Carlisle. Each day is a new experience for him as he celebrates the sacraments and completes all of the other tasks of a priest.

"I love being a priest," Father Schlaline said. "I am learning what life in a big parish is like. I get much joy in preaching the Gospel to the people and also in being with the sick and those who are struggling."

### INSTRUCTIONAL SUPPORT ASSISTS STUDENTS IN REACHING THEIR POTENTIAL

After the closing bell has rung at 2:45 p.m., most students are moving quickly toward their lockers to pack up for the day. However, some students can be seen making their way down to Room 3 for some extra academic help after school. Room 3 serves as the Instructional Support Services Center, yet another useful resource for the students at Delone Catholic High School, where academic success is a goal and a priority. Instructional Support is a unique process for students which instructs and helps develop academic skills, understanding and self-confidence.

In 2006, Most Rev. Kevin C. Rhoades, then Bishop of Harrisburg, stated that the mission of Catholic schools in the Diocese was to meet the needs of a wide range of students, including those with exceptionalities. In order to meet this need, it was directed that Instructional Support Services (ISS) should be implemented in schools throughout the diocese. With the approval of the Board of Directors of Delone Catholic, an Instructional Support position was added.

"The Bishop recognized that all students have a unique gift from God," said DCHS principal Dr. Maureen Thiec. "This includes students who may require some measure of instructional support."

The Instructional Support teacher, Robert Lester, has worked in high schools for special education for several years, so he is aware of the trials that face students with learning differences. Students with documented special educational needs may require some additional instructional support and assistance throughout the school day with a variety of tasks.

"All students will meet some degree of success, but for some, this success depends upon delivering the right amount of accommodations to students with documented special needs or learning differences," Mr. Lester said. "Instructional Support was created for just that purpose; to ensure success of students in the classroom."

Approximately 30 students utilize ISS in any given quarter. ISS aids students with a variety of learning differences and special needs including: autism, emotional disturbance, hearing impairments, specific learning disabilities, speech and language impairment, orthopedic impairment and traumatic brain

While many other schools nationwide charge as much as \$5,000 per year in addition to the standard tuition fees for this type of program, Instructional Support Services are provided by Delone Catholic with no additional cost to the students' families. The Lincoln Intermediate Unit assists by using Equitable Participation for students with exceptionalities, which is part of the federal special education funds for non-public schools, to purchase academic equipment and supplies used by ISS.

Students that are involved in Instructional Support receive assistance in subject areas where they may be struggling as well as work on strengthening their other academic skills. These students are still expected to meet the high academic standards that Delone Catholic requires. The program itself is a collaborative effort on the part of teachers and students to ensure success in the classroom.

"Instructional Support has added that necessary one-on-one instruction to produce success in students who have some form of learning difficulty," Dr. Thiec said. "Parents have written testimonies as to the achievement in college, a dream that did come to fruition with the help of the program."

Services help students with daily tasks from note-taking, organizational skills, test-taking techniques and completing overdue assignments. Students also have the opportunity to work one-on-one after school and during study halls with Mr. Lester, as well as take tests and complete work in the Instructional Support Center. The ISS center ensures students a quiet work environment as well as direct assistance when needed.

"Students work through individual obstacles that impede their educational process and ultimate success," Mr. Lester said. "Students with learning difficulties never outgrow them. It is hoped that we can help students develop learning processes and strategies that offset the devastating effects of an academic life cloaked by a learning difficulty."

ISS provides for the needs of all students as appropriate. The program is not limited to those students with documented learning differences. Students who are struggling academically for other reasons are often referred by parents, counselors and teachers and even seek extra help themselves through learning support. In this case, students are considered special interest.

"As any other teacher would, we want our students to reach their potential, at whatever level that might be and be successful," Mr. Lester said. "I often remind students success has many levels and to remember sometimes the journey is more important than the destination."




# McFarland Reaches Milestone in Association With **DCHS**

These activities are funded through fees paid by each participant, as well as fundraising done by many volunteers who contribute thousands of hours of their time each year.

# Faculty, Staff and Students Team to Begin Paper Recycling Program

Experience is typically a better method of instruction than lecture. With that in mind, Mrs. Patricia Marrocco, chair of the Delone Catholic science department, decided to show her students how they can make a difference by encouraging them to recycle classroom paper.

"Ecology is part of the science curriculum, and by recycling, the students can learn by doing," Mrs. Marrocco said. "This will enable them to understand the vital part each person can play in conserving resources."

All of Mrs. Marrocco's classes were informed that recycling was mandatory in her classroom, and the process of how paper is recycled was explained to them. Through a contact that Mr. Steve Hutton, a member of the DCHS guidance staff, has made, the paper is turned into shipping tubes or cubed for transport to a paper mill. All of the other members of the faculty and staff were encouraged to participate as well.

Every Monday after school, students earn service hours by collecting the paper from each classroom. They then consolidate it into bags and boxes and load it into Mrs. Marrocco's car, allowing her to transport it to Ox Paper Tube & Core, Inc., in New Oxford, Pa., for recycling.

This program is an add-on to a recycling program that was already in place at Delone Catholic. Several years ago, the Students Using Ethics (SUE) Committee began recycling glass, plastic and aluminum. This process has since been taken over by the DCHS maintenance staff.





# Delone Catholic Students Continue to Stand for Life

A group of Delone Catholic students made the annual pilgrimage to Washington, D.C., to join in the March for Life. They were among the thousands that gathered on Jan. 24 to mark the 38th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision effectively making abortion on demand legal.

# Delone Catholic Students Present Middle Passage Simulation

There wasn't a sound in Delone Catholic's Old Gym on Wednesday morning, Nov. 10, except for the a cappella rendering of the crescendo, "Amazing Grace," by Emily Sheahan '12. Some students and staff were teary-eyed, but all were reverent as half of the school population at a time encircled 125 juniors configured on the floor in the shape of a slave ship's hull.

Mrs. Dana Larkin Sauers '74, a member of the DCHS English department, considered the idea that was presented through her junior honors English class. The students had been reading the slave narrative of Olaudah Equiano.

"They were incredibly moved by its vivid language and emotionally evocative message," Mrs. Sauers said. "It occurred to me that the story was an opportunity to involve the entire school in the harsh lesson of man's inhumanity and to inspire and challenge all to consider the larger ideas of justice and equality as referenced by our school's foundational documents."

With three simultaneous media screens and three student visual displays on all forms of slavery, including perfectionism, alcoholism, drug, food and gambling addictions, the observers wound around the hull, viewing the brown bag-hooded juniors, chained together two by two with brown paper shackles.

"The hoods with only eye holes were to symbolize the loss of individuality and the loss of dignity," Mrs. Sauers said.

During the simulation, additional juniors read factual statements concerning the slave trade, named cultural contributions of African Americans and recited parts of Dr. Martin Luther King's famous speech. Selections of Dr. King's actual presentation blared through the silence periodically.

The entire student body was given fact sheets in advance of the assembly to introduce and extend knowledge as well as to guarantee that the students understood the gravity of the simulation.

Faculty members Katlyn Howes '05 and Matt Loban assisted in the interdepartmental educational venture.

In the final moments of the brief but powerful display with Sheahan's voice resonating, the juniors broke their shackles and all stood facing toward the center of the ship. On the back of each hood was written the name of a historical person who had transcended slavery or had contributed to reducing it

"It was an incredibly moving experience," said Kollin Ott '12.



# Forty Years Later, New Generation Carries on Work of First Lay Board Members

The Board of Pastors helped to guide the planning and decision making at Delone Catholic beginning in 1953-54. During the 1970-71 academic year, the pastors of the Adams Deanery parishes were joined on the renamed Board of Directors by four lay members of these parishes - Mr. Joseph P. McCullough, Mr. Charles A. McGough, Jr., Mr. Joseph P. "Pat" Smith '52 and Deacon James G. Sneeringer, Sr. - who have left a legacy of involvement at Delone Catholic.

Mr. McCullough is the longest-serving board member in DCHS history. He was a member until the conclusion of the 2010-11 term, a span of 41 years, and he still works with the Development Committee. His three children are all Delone Catholic alumni, including his daughter, Michele (McCullough) Noel '80, who works as the school's administrative secretary and bookkeeper. Three of her children are also alumni, and her two youngest daughters, Jamie '12 and Julie '14, are current students.

Mr. McGough, who owned CAM Industries (currently CAM Innovations) in Hanover, was a member of the board until 1973. Today, his son, Charles A. McGough III, serves as a member of the Middle States accreditation planning committee which is preparing for the site visit by the accreditation team in the Fall of 2012.

Mr. Smith, was the owner of Donald B. Smith Roofing, Inc., in Hanover. He served as a board member until 1986. Mr. Smith and his wife, Yvonne (Weaver) Smith '52 have four children who are all Delone Catholic alumni, and their grandson, Ethan Willing '11, is a member of this year's senior class. Upon Mr. McCullough's retirement from the board last summer, Mr. Smith's daughter, Judy (Smith) Willing '80, took his place as the St. Joseph, Hanover, parish representative, making her the first second-generation voting member of the board. Current board member Teresa (Willet) Altland '77 also has a second-generation tie to the board. Her mother, Mrs. Trudy Willet, a former faculty member, served a pair of two-year terms as a faculty representative.

Deacon Sneeringer spent the majority of his business career in sales, and he was a board member until 1994. In 1983, he was ordained a permanent deacon for the Diocese of Harrisburg, a ministry he faithfully fulfilled in spite of failing health in recent years. He passed away on Feb. 7, leaving behind six children who graduated from Delone Catholic and numerous grandchildren, several of whom also graduated from the school.

When these four men took their places on the Delone Catholic Board of Directors in the Fall of 1970, they joined a long line of alumni, parents and friends who saw the value of Catholic education and devoted their time and energy to ensuring that it continued at DCHS. Dozens of lay people from the Adams Deanery parishes and the surrounding areas in Pennsylvania and Maryland have worked with them and followed in their footsteps on the board. Their example has carried over to succeeding generations of their own families, who have assisted the school through their work on various committees and with generous financial contributions.

We thank not only the original lay board members and their families, but their successors and the priests with whom they have served for their wisdom, guidance and financial support throughout the years!





The season wrapped up with a closer-than-it-looked sweep at the hands of Schuylkill Valley in the district preliminary round. The Squirettes lost the three games by a total of eight points.

Faith Athey '12, Ali Bowker '11, Jen Jarrett '11, Allie Mondorff '13 and Nikki Snyder '12 were all honored for their individual accomplishments with spots on one or more of the various all-area first teams. In addition, the Gettysburg Times named Bowker and Coach Steph (Vial) Zortman '03, the All-Times Player and Coach of the Year, respectively.

#### 2010-11 Boys' Basketball

The big story of the 2010-11 boys' basketball season was the continued resurgence of Delone Catholic's cross-town rivalry with Hanover. The Squires (17-10, 12-3 YAIAA IV) and the Nighthawks finished in a tie for the YAIAA Division IV championship. They played four times during the season, three of which were decided by a total of eight points. Two of those were not decided until the final shot of the game, including the District 3 Class AA championship game at Giant Center in Hershey, in which a long 3-point attempt by Cody Kump '11 that would have tied the game hit the back of the rum at the buzzer.

In between the classics with Hanover, Delone Catholic found a great deal of success against the rest of the schedule. In midseason, the team was a onepoint overtime loss to South Western away from a 12-game winning streak, which was a nine-game run as it was. The Squires also won 10 league games in a row at one point. They picked up big wins against York Catholic and Wyomissing in the District 3 Class AA playoffs en route to their third district champi-

onship game in six years. The season came to an end with a 45-33 loss to District 12 power Vaux in the first round of the PIAA Class AA tournament. Full coverage of any postseason awards earned by the Squires will appear in the Fall 2011 issue of *Delone Today*.

#### 2010-11 Girls' Basketball

The Squirettes (22-8, 11-2 YAIAA IV) continued to experience the overwhelming success that has been the program's hallmark for decades. They reached the PIAA Class AA Quarterfinals for the eighth time in 10 years while compiling at least 20 wins for the third season in a row and the ninth time in the past 11 years. Delone Catholic's season ended in an overtime loss to Dunmore in the state quarterfinals. Coach Gerry Eckenrode's team has compiled an overall record of 72-20 in the past three seasons and has only lost back-to-back games once in that stretch, Dec. 27, 2008 and Jan. 5, 2009. The squad also made its first appearance in the District 3 Class AA Championship since 2005.

Individually, Sierra Moore '12 continued to put up eye-popping numbers. She averaged over 23 points per game this season and compiled six, 30+-point games. With nearly 1,900 career points, Moore has passed Becky Timmins '91 (1,673 points) and Janell (Smith) Fetter '95 (1,745) to move into second on the career scoring list behind Meredith Cox '06 (2,097). #### **2010-11 Swimming**

Sean Fiery '11 added to the recent tradition of Squire success in the pool in 2010-11. On March 5, he competed in the PIAA District 3 Class AA championships at Cumberland Valley High School. His time of 1:09.29 was good for 18th place in the 100-yard breaststroke.

#### 2010-11 Wrestling

The Delone Catholic wrestling team again overcame adversity to put together a respectable dual-meet record. In 2009-10, the team battled injuries and inexperience. This season, the team was forced to forfeit four weight classes on a typical night due to a smaller-than-usual team. The Squires (9-5, 4-4 YAIAA II) finished in a tie with archrival Hanover for fourth place in the division, despite starting most matches in a 24-0 hole. On Dec. 18, Delone Catholic finished 3-1 at the York Suburban Duals to tie for first place.

In tournament competition, Josh Ruppert '11 was crowned the 135-lb. champion at the season-opening Solanco Mule Classic and at the Bubblers Christmas Tournament at Boiling Springs, Ruppert competed at 130 pounds in the postseason. He was joined at the District 3 Class AA Section I championships by Anthony Lippy '14 (119 lbs.), Nathaniel Post '11 (140 lbs.), David Zinn '13 (160 lbs.), Aaron Rooney '11 (189 lbs.), Joe Post '14 (215 lbs.) and Dominic Fiorino '11 (285 lbs.). Ruppert took second place, while Rooney took third and Lippy placed fourth.

All three wrestlers advanced to the District 3 Class AA championships at HershevPark Arena on Feb. 25-26. Ruppert's third-place finish earned him a trip to the Class AA Southeast Regional championships, where he again placed third en route to a seventh-place performance in the state tournament. He became the latest in a long line of Squire wrestlers to pick up a state medal.

## Former Squires Inducted into Halls of Fame

The Adams County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame inducted eight individuals into its membership in the Class of 2010 on a night that was colored in black and gold. Six members of the class have ties to Delone Catholic High School.

At a dinner on Nov. 17 at the Dobbin House in Gettysburg, former Squire athletes Keith Bevenour '83 (baseball), Jack Greenholt '69 (baseball), Tony Koontz '84 (wrestling), Gardy Lawrence '69 (football) and Tim Kotula '81 (baseball) received the county's highest athletic honor. Former Delone Catholic head football coach Denny Frew was also inducted that night. Koontz received a double honor this year, also gaining admittance to the Pennsylvania Wrestling Coaches Association Hall of Fame in March.

## Former Squirette Mentor Reaches Career Milestone

Former Delone Catholic faculty member and girls' basketball coach Mary Fleig hit a major coaching plateau at the collegiate level this winter. In her 21st season as the head women's basketball coach at Millersville University in Millersville, Pa., Fleig notched her 500th win on Dec. 30 against Merrimack College. This year's squad finished 22-7, falling in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference semifinal, and qualified for the NCAA Division II tournament. Fleig posted a 122-60 mark in seven seasons at Franklin & Marshall College in Lancaster, Pa., and is now 393-195 at Millersville.




