VIII. PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

- I want to address Tab 4 It's about Dual Enrollment DMHS has been a creative, innovative pioneer in the advancement of Dual Enrollment. It has been a model of inclusiveness. We need to celebrate the fact that our high school is a leader in forward thinking academic engagement.
- HH For those of you that are speaking from written statements, if you would be so kind as to leave the written statements with us, that would be greatly appreciated.
- I have procedural questions several of the resolutions say Acting Superintendent who is that? Job Descriptions who wrote those job descriptions. Supervisor of Athletics are we moving away from Athletic Director? There are several positions that have not seen posted or in the newspaper. Who is guiding this ship since June 30? Englewood Cliffs is not paying us any tuition and how long has this been going on? I spoke to other Business Administrators that came through this district they told me that there is a tuition schedule. I also see that the cheerleaders are having a car wash to raise funds. We have a \$70 million budget why are our kids begging for money? Do we have a breakdown for each athletic team? How much are they allocated?
- HH There are a number of questions where I am going to direct you to the Business Administrator. She is available during the daytime. The Acting Superintendent is the Passaic County Superintendent. That person is making certain recommendations that are based on recommendations that are provided by our administrators and staff. In district staff wrote the job descriptions. Supervisor of Athletics there is no one currently in that role. Postings you will have to talk with our Business Administrator and Human Resources about the specific jobs that you are asking about. As to your questions about who is guiding the ship We have an Acting Superintedent. We are actively conducting an Interim search and it is the intention of this Board to have a contract approved by the County by July 31st.
- Doesn't the Superintendnet have to be at this meeting in order for it to be a legal meeting? I want to complain about the legal services. This is a form of soft corruption. We are paying Mr.Tabakin a lot of money, but he's not doing Special Education. Can we see his contract? Why is Weiner Lesniak getting this contract? Was a bid put out? Let's look at the legal fees from surrounding districts. We don't need an attorney at meetings. We need a debate club at the high school. The kids deserve a debate club. There is a demand for it. Bring back the Academy Prep. Mr. Elbert told us at the last meeting that we are being taken off the Focus School list.
- In termsof being taken off the focus school list the Board has not received any correspondence indicating as such. The bids that were done for Special Education services they were competivily bid. All the records are available in the Business Administrator's office. You can OPRA them.
- I would like to have a schedule of our buses this summer. Why did we need to have First Student buses and have our own buses sit at Liberty. I want to know why our buses are not serving our summer school? I would like us to work better with the Englewood City committees. Do you meet every month or every quarter? I have not seen your input with making the two miles within the school safer. The Eagle Program and PreK-4 needs permanent housing before you build a shed. I would like you to also work much harder on having intelligent, rich, academic after-school programs. That is why I campaigned with Chavez to take over the after-school program. I would like to see a number of clubs.
- HH Let me suggest that you OPRA the bus schedule information. We have different Board members that are sitting on different committees jointly with the city. We are strengthening our dialogue with the counsel and the Mayor's office. Safe Routes Grant we are excited that the city is applying for and looking to put up a light at what is a very high traffic area. We know how much traffic is out there. Whatever we can do for the safety and well-being for our kids is absolutely appreciated. We're celebrating the fact that it is being done.
- I would like to put forward the proposal for a DMHS Debate Team. I firmly believe that the creation of a debate team will greatly benefit the school. I humbly request that the Board consider my proposal and continue to offer their support.
- HH It's really refreshing to have students come to our Board meetings. We want to encourage that. I am going to hand this to our Academic Affairs Committee Chair.
- Did the Board get any legal advice on how to prepare the RFP for the legal services? 15-P-07 is a blank check.
- HH Our RFP process is defined by code and regulation and the Business Administrator follows those standards consistently. 15-P-07; we will take that under advisement.

AN ACT concerning dual enrollment programs, supplementing chapter 61C of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes, and repealing P.L.1986, c.193 and P.L.1986, c.194.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. Within one year of the effective date of this act, a school district with a high school shall enter into a dual enrollment agreement with one or more public institutions of higher education.
- b. Within one year of the effective date of this act, a public institution of higher education shall enter into a dual enrollment agreement with one or more school districts with a high school.
- c. A dual enrollment agreement between a public institution of higher education and a school district shall delineate the dual enrollment program pursuant to which instruction is provided to high school students through courses offered by the institution of higher education on its campus or on the campus of the public high school for college credit or credit toward a career certificate.
 - d. The dual enrollment agreement shall include:
- (1) a description of the courses available to students eligible to participate in the dual enrollment program;
- (2) a description of the student eligibility requirements for initial and continuing participation in the dual enrollment program, which shall include a provision that ensures that an eligible student is not excluded from participation because of an inability to pay;
- (3) a description of the process by which a student and his parent or guardian exercise the option to participate in the dual enrollment program;
- (4) a provision ensuring that any dual enrollment course taught on the high school campus is equivalent in rigor to courses taught on the campus of the institution of higher education;
- (5) a description of the process by which a student and his parent or guardian are informed about opportunities for student participation in the dual enrollment program; and
- (6) such other items as deemed appropriate by the Commissioner of Education and the Secretary of Higher Education.

2. A public institution of higher education shall accept the course credit of a student who successfully completes a course under the dual enrollment program.

 3. The Commissioner of Education and the Secretary of Higher Education shall submit annually a joint report to the Governor and to the Legislature pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), on dual enrollment programs in the State. The report shall include, but need not be limited to: information related to the utilization of dual enrollment programs throughout the State,

including information specific to the income-level and location within the State of participating students; the effect dual enrollment programs have on reducing the average time-to-degree completion and increasing the likelihood of college graduation for participating students; an analysis of the rigor of the courses taken pursuant to the dual enrollment program; and recommendations for any suggested changes to the dual enrollment program.

 4. The State Board of Education and the Secretary of Higher Education each shall adopt, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), rules and regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this act.

5. The following sections are repealed:

15 Sections 1 and 3 of P.L.1986, c.194 (C.18A:61C-1 and 16 C.18A:61C-3); and

17 Sections 1 through 7 of P.L.1986, c.193 (C.18A:61C-4 through 18 C.18A:61C-9).

6. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill provides that within one year of its effective date, all school districts with high schools must enter into a dual enrollment agreement with at least one public institution of higher education. Similarly, within the one-year time frame, all public institutions of higher education must enter into dual enrollment agreements with one or more school districts with a high school. A dual enrollment agreement will delineate information concerning a dual enrollment program pursuant to which instruction is provided to public high school students through courses offered by the institution of higher education, either on its campus or on the high school campus. The credit may be used toward a career certificate or an associate or baccalaureate degree.

The bill requires the dual enrollment agreement to include:

- a description of the courses available to students eligible to participate in the dual enrollment program;
- a description of the student eligibility requirements for initial and continuing participation in the program, including a provision that ensures that an eligible student is not excluded from participation because of an inability to pay;
- a description of the process by which students and their parents or guardians exercise the option to participate in the program;

- a provision ensuring that any dual enrollment courses taught on the high school campus are equivalent in rigor to courses taught on the campus of the institution of higher education;
- a description of the process by which students and their parents or guardians are informed about opportunities for student participation in the program; and
- any other items deemed appropriate by the Commissioner of Education and the Secretary of Higher Education.

The bill specifies that a public institution of higher education is required to accept the course credit of a student who successfully completes a course under the dual enrollment program.

Under the provisions of the bill a joint report will be submitted annually by the Commissioner of Education and the Secretary of Higher Education to the Governor and to the Legislature on dual enrollment programs in the State. The report will include: information related to the utilization of dual enrollment programs throughout the State, including information specific to the incomelevel and location within the State of participating students; the effect dual enrollment programs have on reducing the average time-to-degree completion and increasing the likelihood of college graduation for participating students; an analysis of the rigor of the courses taken pursuant to the dual enrollment program; and recommendations for and suggested changes to the dual enrollment program.

The bill repeals two dual enrollment programs which did not require the participation of institutions of higher education. This bill seeks to increase the availability of dual enrollment courses for public high school students by requiring the participation of all school districts and all public institutions of higher education, both four-year and two-year, in dual enrollment programs.

- 14) Chair the District Technology Committee and serve on other district committees, as assigned.
- 15) Maintain records and reports as required.
- 16) Assist with publicizing district technology efforts and accomplishments.
- 17) Perform duties as assigned by the Superintendent of Schools.

#### **Appointment:**

Appointment shall be made by the Board of Education upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools and/or his/her designee.

#### **Terms of Employment:**

Twelve (12) month employee. Salary to be established by the Board of Education upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools and/or his/her designee.

#### **Evaluation:**

Performance of this position will be evaluated annually in accordance with the Board's policy on evaluation of certificated personnel and the administrative procedures on certificated staff evaluation.
