Math and Science

The five elementary science specialist teachers met to further develop teaching units so that the learning is consistent and standards-based across and within grade levels. In addition, they worked on curriculum maps to ensure alignment with the newly adopted Next Generation Science Standards.

Middle school science teachers worked to align the middle school science curriculum to the new state standards and to create math/science cross-curricular units for the coming year.

Language Arts

Other teachers spent time working on literacy instruction. According to Colleen Carroll, Director of Curriculum & Instruction, having focused in the past on reading, this summer they turned their attention to writing.

Literacy is the ability to read, write, speak, listen and view in a way that allows people to communicate effectively and gain knowledge. It is the foundation of education and is essential for learning all subjects. Educators agree that students should be exposed to a variety, or balance, of options – including reading novels and other forms of writing, writing papers, creating projects and making presentations.

Balanced literacy will be emphasized in the elementary grades. For middle and high school students, the focus is on authentic texts and a heavy stress on writing and collaborating with other students. Strong writing skills correlate with better reading and improved communication.

Over the next school year, parents should see their child become a more enthusiastic writer. Students will be given assignments that demonstrate different genres of writing, from writing stories to writing a narrative to preparing an informational paper based on the student's research

Dr. Carroll points out that there is a strong need for good writing in order to prepare graduates for college and career readiness. "Our state assessments reflect this need and we want students to have every tool to do well," she added, saying that there will be a clear progression of writing skills in each grade from Kindergarten through grade 12.

The groups also prepared high quality professional development for the entire teaching staff in both English and in Spanish in order to help teachers achieve literacy for all students within three years.

FROM STEM TO STEAM

A group of teachers will be participating this year in a year-long K-12 STEAM initiative under the auspices of BOCES. The purpose is to find ways for Port Chester to be on the cutting edge of teaching "science, technology, engineering, math – and art/design" to students as access points to guiding student inquiry, dialog and critical thinking.

Maestros de la escuela intermedia (Middle School) trabajaron para alinear el plan de estudios con cada una de las normas nuevas estatales, y para crear unidades transversales en matemática/ciencia para este nuevo año escolar.

Arte de Lenguaje

Otros maestros trabajaron en instrucción para el alfabetismo. De acuerdo a la Doctora Colleen Carroll, Directora de Currículo e Instrucción, en este verano el enfoque fué en temas importantes para la escritura.

El alfabetismo es la habilidad de leer, escribir, hablar, escuchar, y observar en una manera de comunicarse efectivamente y para obtener conocimiento. Es la fundación de la educación y es esencial para el aprendizaje de todas las materias. Los educadores coinciden en que los estudiantes deben ser expuestos a una variedad, o balance de opciones - que incluyen el leer obras literarias como novelas, y otras formas de escritura, entre ellas, escribir ensayos, crear proyectos, y hacer presentaciones.

El balancear el alfabetismo significa tener un énfasis en los grados de primaria. Para la escuela intermedia y la secundaria, el enfoque es puesto en textos auténticos que recalcan la escritura y la colaboración con otros estudiantes. Fuertes habilidades de escritura tienen una correlación con mejor lectura y mejoran la comunicación.

A travéz del próximo año escolar, los padres verán a sus hijos volverse más entusiasmados en la escritura. Los estudiantes recibirán asignaciones que demostrarán diferentes géneros de escritura, desde escribir historias en forma narrativa, a preparar ensayos de información basados en la búsqueda del estudiante.

La doctora Carroll explica que hay la necesidad de escribir bien para preparar a los graduados para la universidad y para estar listos para una carrera. "Las evaluaciones del estado reflejan esta necesidad y queremos que los estudiantes tengan todas las herramientas para hacerlo bien," añadió diciendo que habrá un progreso claro de habilidades de escritura en cada grado, desde Kindergarten hasta el grado 12.

EMERGENCY CLOSINGS

Use of Supt Conference Days as "Make-Up" Instructional Days as needed

- If the district uses an emergency closing day from September through November 6, November 7 will be a Make-Up instructional day for students.

- In the event that either the November 7 or March 20 Supt Conference Days are needed and used for Make-Up instructional days,

a Make-Up Supt Conference Day will be held on June 25 (Note that Supt Conference Days are for Staff only).

Emergency Closing Make-Up Instructional Days will be scheduled as follows:

- If 1, 2 or 3 Emergency Closing Days are used, there will be no changes in the calendar other than those described in 1 & 2 above.

- Beginning with the 4th Emergency Closing Day, Make-Up instructional days will occur in the following order:

March 20, April 3, April 4, April 5, April 6, April 2.

- If all Make-Up days are exhausted due to excessive emergency closings, 1 additional day will be absorbed and not affect the calendar.

However, if 1 this additional day is absorbed, as necessary the Board will revise the school calendar to ensure that the SED mandated number of instructional and Supt Conference Days are held.

- If fewer than 3 emergency closing days are used, schools will be closed on May 25.

No irrevocable vacation plans are to be made for potential "Make-Up" Emergency Closing days or May 25
