Historical background is also examined to enable students to understand how these regions developed from the past to the present. Scholars will become historians, capable of meaningful research, which leads to the development of unique opinions that are supported by strong evidence.

Social Studies fosters the critical thinking and the analytical and writing skills necessary for success. We will devote considerable time to the evaluation of primary documents, the successful writing of thematic and document-based questions (DBQ's), analysis, and the development of analytical and critical thinking skills.
