
Frequently Asked Questions



Which is the best Teams app to use?

- The Teams Desktop Application is most robust.
 - The Teams Desktop App can be downloaded from the web version in Office 365.
- In each app version (web, desktop, mobile) the features will be different.

Is there a max number of students that can receive an assignment?

- Yes, 200 students max.
 - If you have a roster higher than 200 in one TEAM this will be a problem.

What are the key items when using the "Meet Now" feature?

- Make sure you change the student roles to an <u>attendee</u> as they enter the meeting.
 - Click the Participant Icon => More button (...) => Make an Attendee

Can we have multiple meetings being held at the same time in the same Team?

• Yes, multiple meetings can occur in different channels.

	the educator – coming in April
IT Administrator Settings	 Setting for the default role of meeting attendee - a policy setting to allow the default for meetings to be Educator is "organizer" and students are "attendees". This means the educator doesn't have to set this through "Meeting Options" every time - coming in early May
	 Meetings Chat policy- with this change, the new policy will allow students to chat ONLY in the meeting and not before or after – coming in early May
