PRESIDENTS OPENING REMARKS

Ms. Capeci thanked everyone for attending the meeting. Ms. Capeci also thanked the Building and Grounds department for working tirelessly during all the snow storms and the JFK emergency evacuation.

Mr. Swift gave a brief description on the upcoming College and Career day at PCMS.

Mr. Fanelli asked the Assistant Principals, Rob Barrett and Byron Womack to join Mr. Swift at the podium and thanked all three for their efforts.

Mr. Swift ended by saying "Port Chester is a fantastic community".

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Dan Tellup – Renshaw Place. Mr. Tellup questioned the job the Board is doing on student verification. He doesn't think the Board is doing enough. He would like to see a volunteer group to assist in the verification process. Mr. Tellup predicts the building of a new school will not happen.

Mr. Tellup said the 3:00 dismissal at the Edison School in particular is a "wild west" show. The kids are not safely being dismissed. He sent pictures to the Mayor of Port Chester.

Liz Rotfeld – 105 Betsy Brown Road. Mrs. Rotfeld echoed Mr. Tellup's comment regarding school dismissal. Edison School is not an isolated issue. King Street School is also dangerous at dismissal. She would like to see more funding to address busing.
