## ARC of Rockland offers many services that will assist you in planning for your child's transition from school to adult life:

Planning for the Future - We can answer questions about SSI, Medicaid and help you to obtain services for your child. Call us if you need help getting Medicaid. We offer Free Guardianship training

Service Coordination - Is a service for people with Medicaid. The Service Coordinator has the information and expertise to help the individual with a disability and his/her family to locate and receive services and supports in the community. They can help you through the transition process: finding the appropriate program, getting benefits and advocating for your child.

Discovering Possibilities - We offer the opportunity to become involved in the community, continue with basic life skills and learn new skills such as cooking, art, dance, and computers. Franklin Square, located in Pearl River is our new center for young adults and will also offer job training and placement. We also offer Hemlock Hub located in Congers that will meet the more intensive clinical and or medical needs of individuals who are leaving the school program.

Recreation – Individuals age 13 and up can participate in our weekly Recreation program with weekend activities including trips. The Friday night TGIF for teens to 21 is a fun dance and also offers the opportunity for parents to meet and join in with other parents on various subjects of their interest.

Our summer day camp provides a fun filled six-week program for those aged 9–12 and 13-21.

**Residential** — Our Residential Services provides comfortable professionally supervised homes in the community. We can help you plan for your child's needs.

Respite – We have two respite houses (Children's 4-15 and Young Adult 15-Adult) offering care from an afternoon to a week - up to 42 days a year FREE

**Sibling Support** – This group meets twice a month and provides fun activities for brothers & sisters of children with disabilities – the chance to focus on themselves.

**Family Reimbursement** – Is a program that offers reimbursement for goods or services not covered by insurance or other programs.
