REEDS 101 for parents of reed players

Students need to have many reeds at a time. Ideally they will rotate between four at a time. When a student does not have a reed, they cannot play. It is also unhealthy to play a reed beyond its lifetime. We recommend **Rico Royal** Reeds for their value and playability.

Ask your director what number (strength) reed to get. Generally it is as follows:

Clarinet

5th grade 2 ½ 6th grade 3

 $7^{\text{th}}/8^{\text{th}}$ grade 3 or 3 ½

Alto sax

 5^{th} grade 2 6^{th} grade 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ $7^{th}/8^{th}$ grade 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ or 3

Tenor Sax 2 or 2 ½

Bari Sax 2



Reeds can also be purchased at Melody Mart in Homewood.

It is OK to order them from Amazon, but please **do not** buy the really inexpensive reeds. They are knock-offs, and play very flat or not at all.

If you want to pay more for a nicer reed, we recommend VanDoren reeds. You might want to order one strength down, however, as they are harder than Rico Royal reeds.

Students should be keeping their reeds in a **reed guard**.
