Women all over the world get paid less than men for many different types of jobs. It doesn't matter what type of occupation a specific woman has, the fact still remains that women are being paid less than men. In 1963, the Equal Pay Act made it clear that women and men must be given equal pay for equal work done at a specific workplace. This act has been around for more than fifty years, yet there is still a gender pay gap. Despite the Equal Pay Act, women are still being paid about 20% less than what men are being paid.

Changes are being made, but there is still little progress. Almost half of the workforce is made up of women. In half of families in the United States with children, they are the sole or co-breadwinner. Women today earn more college and graduate degrees than men. Yet they continue to earn considerably less.

A recent example was widely reported in the media when female actress, Michelle Williams, starred in the movie, All the Money in the World, and didn't get paid the same amount as male actor, Mark Wahlberg, when both of them had to reshoot some scenes. Mr. Wahlberg got paid a total of \$1.5 million for only ten days of shooting while Ms. Williams earned only eighty dollars per day, resulting in a total of \$1,000 dollars. This was less than 1% of what the male co-star, Mark Wahlberg, received. When this became public, Mr. Wahlberg donated the money he earned as a result of

Ms. Carmen Farina, New York City's current school chancellor is retiring, sending Mayor De Blasio on a search for a new school chancellor to guide all New York City public schools. Ms. Farina was a retired public school teacher, a principal, a superintendent, and the Deputy Chancellor of Teaching and Learning, when she was chosen by Mayor De Blasio to be the Schools Chancellor on Janu-

During her tenure as Schools Chancellor, Ms. Farina has implemented actions that have improved New York schools. She worked to decrease the amount of school crime and suspensions in New York schools. Of course, the goal is always to maintain a safe learning environment for all students. In mid January, 2018, Farina's campaign to encourage more students to take the SHSAT was a success with the number of students applying to specialized high schools dramatically increasing. Ms. Farina has made many great actions for the schools of New York, but as she retires, the next Schools Chancellor must be able to continue to improve current public school problems.

As Ms. Farina retires, Mayor De Blasio as well as the City of New York have several expectations for the next person taking place as New York City's Schools Chancellor. This person must take action to close down schools that are not fit for a student's education. New York has a number of families who are struggling to send their children to school, and often times the schools those children are being sent to are not good enough to support a child's education. It is the next Schools Chancellor's job to close those schools and open better ones for those students.

It is also expected that the next leader will continue to focus on teacher quality. He/she must work to pay the teachers more in order to attract and keep the best teachers the profession has to offer.

Like Ms. Farina and all the past school leaders, the new Schools Chancellor must act as a protector for the students. This is particularly true in view of the recent school violence and the controversies about how to best keep the New York City schools as places of learning and not as battlefields.

The donation of blood is very important to a community. Blood banks and hospitals need to have access to large supplies of blood in case of an emergency or disaster where the lives of people are at risk. Blood donations are especially critical in the winter months. In these times, many people may not be able to go outdoors due to the cold. In addition, many blood drives might be cancelled because of weather conditions. So when there is a blood drive happening it is really important for people to donate.

The statistics tell the story. 4.5 million Americans would die each year without life-saving blood transfusions. Approximately 32,000 pints of blood are used each day in the United States. It is vital that there is a continued supply of donated blood because just like milk, blood spoils. It can only be used for forty-two hours and the fresher the blood the better it can be utilized. Just one pint of donated blood can help save as many as three people's lives.

Most of us take for granted the rights and privileges of being an American citizen. Many may not stop and think about what it means to pledge allegiance to this country every morning. Recently. Robert Qeta of Class 8-508 received his American citizenship. This was necessary because he was not born in this country and, thus, was not a citizen. When a young child begins the process of becoming a citizen, he/she has to have paperwork filled out by an adult which indicates that he/she wants to be a citizen of the United States. If a person is older than fourteen years old and wants to come to America, he/she has to take a loyalty oath.

In Robert's case, his parents decided to leave Albania and come to the United States for opportunities for them and education for their children. Luckily, his parents won a green card in a lottery and were able to immigrate. Sometimes an individual decides to give his/her homeland citizenship up to become a citizen of the country he/she is currently living in. Robert did this because he wanted to feel that he truly belonged here.

The cost of citizenship for one person is \$740. In order to become a citizen of America, a parent or guardian has to fill in a great deal of paperwork and then mail it to the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services which is located at 26 Federal Plaza in Manhattan. If there is a mistake made while filling out the paperwork, a parent or guardian has to submit it again. There is also an interview and a citizenship test. This entire process can take up to two years to be completed. After waiting all this time, Robert and his family signed the official documents ensuring that the process was successfully completed a few weeks ago.

Throughout this long journey, Robert had to take a chance that he would be granted citizenship but he felt that it is worth it in the

Futbol vs Football

The Super Bowl LII has ended and as the 2018 FIFA World Cup approaches, there will be much controversy between fans regarding which event is more worth a person's time. Futbol which is known in America as soccer, has been around ever since the mid-nineteenth century when people in England began to kick around a ball. Some historians even say that is was created by the Chinese who played a version of it centuries earlier. Despite this, the history of modern soccer began on December 8, 1863 when the Association of Football (Soccer) and Association of Rugby finally split into two different organizations. Later that year, on December 19, 1863, Barnes Football Club and Richmond Football Club went on to play the first ever recorded and organized Soccer match at Barnes Common in Mortlake, London.

On the other hand, the history of American football is much different from that of soccer. American football first started on November 6, 1869 when Rutgers and Princeton played what was billed as the first college football game. However, it wasn't until the 1880's that a remarkable rugby player from Yale, Walter Camp pioneered the rules changes that changed rugby into the sport of American football.

When it comes to statistics, there are many differences between soccer and football. For example, soccer has an estimated 3.5 billion fans! That's roughly one in every two people on Earth. On the other hand, football only has about 400,000,000 fans mostly in the United States. The average stadium attendance of a football game is about 68,000, whereas the average for Soccer clubs such as Borrusia Dortmund have an average stadium attendance of 80,354 fans. The football stadium that can hold the most people is MetLife stadium with a capacity of 82,566 people but that's still not enough to beat the Camp Nou, the stadium for the Soccer Club Barcelona with a capacity of 99,354 people. The top speed of a kicked soccer ball is about 131 miles per hour which was executed by Ronny Heberson in 2006. The top speed of a football is only sixty miles per hour as thrown by Logan Thomas in 2014. Speed is another category in which coccer prevails. The top running speed in soccer, held by Arjen Robben, is about twenty two miles per hour. The top running speed for a football player is only about nineteen miles per hour which is held by Chris Johnson.

In the United States, soccer is often neglected and usually doesn't get as much recognition as American football. Americans often believe that they have the best of everything in the world.

The fact is that soccer is an international sport played across all of the four corners of the Earth should earn it more respect. Quite frankly, one category that America isn't one of the top contenders is in the sport of soccer. This plays a key role to why soccer isn't very popular in the United States, the reason being that if Americans aren't the best at soccer, then they don't want to associate with it. The bad part is that, that desire to be the best, can lead to arrogance and sometimes even ignorance.

This alone isn't enough to keep Americans away from the sport though. It's becoming an known fact in the United States that Americans have an obsession with being bigger and quicker. For example, we have supersized meals, huge cars, and the biggest houses that we can afford. A prime example of this would be the scores in sports. In American football, the average score is twenty to seventeen, in comparison that would be about seven goals. Additionally, in the National Basketball Association the average score per game is 97.2 points which is about seventy five to eighty five goals. To contrast, in soccer the average score per game is 2.2 goals and that's just not enough scoring for most Americans. To further support that point, I turn to the players themselves. Football players aren't very tall but they do compensate for their height with their weight since the average football player in the National Football Association is about six feet, three inches and two hundred fifty pounds. Additionally, As expected, soccer players aren't anywhere close to that. The average soccer player is five feet, nine inches and one hundred seventy five pounds.

Another reason that makes it hard for soccer to compete with football has to do with money. This is because the main broadcasters of Soccer, which are ESPN, CBS, NBC, and ABC, make most of their money through advertisement and commercials. This is important because soccer just isn't conducive for advertisements. American football has the end of the first or third quarter, the two minute warning of the second or fourth quarter, time-outs which include injury time-outs, instant replays, game stoppage after punt return, game stoppage after score, and game stoppage after turnovers which all lead to commercial breaks and a chance for advertisements to be shown. In comparison, soccer has halftime. That's just not enough for the networks. But even if it was and networks did air soccer matches, Americans still wouldn't watch. This is because as Americans, we value the time that we spend watching sports. For example, most American people think spending an hour and a half to watch one goal isn't technically the best use of one's time.

In conclusion, until Americans don't care as much about being the best at everything in the world and can get over the fact that everything needs to be huge, soccer will be just one of those things that a person occasionally sees while looking through television channels. Meanwhile, football will be praised by Americans. Soccer still has a chance in the United States, since there are many people from other countries who come here and bring their passion for soccer with them. Another

The Opioid Crisis A Growing Epidemic Sweeping the Nation

For the past couple of years, the opioid crisis has swept the country. Huntington in West Virginia is the new opioid capital of the United States. Teens and young adults are the main users of these drugs. Many have overdosed on the latest opioid drug called fentanyl. The crisis is so severe that the life expectancy of the average American has dropped from 78.9 years to 78.6 years in the last twenty-four months due to the rise in opioid deaths. So far, the United States has spent over \$500 billion into dealing with this epidemic.

Opioids are drugs that are supposed to imitate the effects of the pain-reducing properties of opium. Legal painkillers like morphine, oxycodone, and hydrocodone are prescribed by doctors to deal with extreme pain. These drugs can become addictive and cause users to turn to a drug like Fentanyl. Fentanyl was created as an over-the-counter drug to people suffering from long term intense pain. Heroin is a natural drug that is derived from a poppy plant and has been used as a medicine for centuries. Fentanyl is 100 times more potent than heroin. Both are highly addictive and can cause long term damage. They are fast acting. Carfentanil is a cheaper variation of fentanyl. It's made to be even more powerful.

Prescriptions drugs are a colossal problem in this outbreak. Prescription opioid painkillers are highly addictive and will cause addicts to turn to fentanyl or heroin for something stronger. They were originally labeled safer than other painkillers and less addictive but they ended up being even worse than what was already out. Doctors started to sign away on high doses of the drug. Then overdose victims spiked to a record-setting high. After people became addicted to the painkillers, they craved more which lead to heroin. People with tolerances to heroin moved to fentanyl and carfentanil.

In 2016, roughly 64,000 died from drug overdoses. This number is greater than deaths from guns and cars. The United States government has sunk \$500 billion into the epidemic. According to <u>usa today</u>, the epidemic could claim one million lives by 2020.

There are some ways to end the opioid epidemic. The doctors need to stop over prescribing. A bottle can be given for something as small as ankle pain or a simple medical procedure. A bottle can contain thirty very powerful pills. So, after an over prescription, a patient can become hooked as an addict. There needs to be more access to treatment for those who have a drug problem. Drugs such as methadone, buprenorphine can help with addiction. But, it is better if they are combined with mental treatment.

The opioid epidemic is a major crisis that doesn't show any sign of slowing down, \$500 billion later. With the exploding growth of this problem, it isn't easy to keep this under control. With incorrect labelling of the safety of the drug and high doses being prescribed, this crisis looks to be getting worse every year.



Questions Grow About Recreational & Medical Uses of Marijuana

Marijuana, a psychoactive drug from the Cannabis plant, has been a controversial topic in the United States for many years. The drug has been used by 55 million Americans countrywide. almost 22% of the entire population. With its many users, the legality of marijuana is still in question. The drug today has been used for both medical and recreational purposes. This raises questions as to what extent will the legality be adjusted and whether laws should be enforced to limit the use of the drug.

Currently, only nine states claim the recreational use of cannabis as legal. These include Alaska, California, Colorado, Maine, Massachusetts, Nevada, Oregon, Vermont, Washington and the District of Columbia. Whereas there are twenty-nine other states that pronounce only the medical use of marijuana legal, and the twelve other states have completely decriminalized the drug. Americans have argued on its legality for years and the topic still remains undecided.

On the side supporting marijuana being declared illegal, many people think marijuana is a gateway drug. A gateway drug typically means it'll lead to other dangerous drugs. Furthermore, people think it's corrupting health and overall society. As of now, there's no adequate parameters to control and supervise marijuana use. As an example, the U.S has a well-defined line when it comes to driving under the influence of alcohol. If a person is under a bloodalcohol content of 0.08%, they may or may not be arrested for driving impaired. If their BAC is 0.08% or over, they will be fined or arrested. The same restrictions and supervision doesn't exist with marijuana.

Then on the other hand, the side supporting marijuana for both medical and recreational uses also has valid points. The majority of the American public favors legalization. So why fight it? Gallup's October 2016 poll and CBS News' April 2017 poll found 60% and 61%, respectively support legal marijuana throughout the United States. The facts speak for themselves. Childhood Obesity A Click to Weight Loss?



For many years, the rate of childhood obesity has risen to 18.5% from 2-20 year old children. Because of this, doctors needed to find a solution to drop the numbers from getting even higher. Fortunately, in the 1960's, Doctors Mason and Ito created a procedure to lessen the amount of food transfer into the stomach. The name of this procedure was the Gastric Procedure or the Restricted Surgery.

During the Gastric Procedure, surgeons use a stapler to separate the stomach into two sections. One section is a small pouch that can only hold an ounce. It will expand though into at least three to five ounces over the years. At first, a person can eat a certain amount (three-quarters to one cup of food) but this will change throughout the course of time. The downside of this operation is that if the patient doesn't chew the food correctly, vomiting and nausea will occur and upset the stomach quickly.

Throughout the United States, childhood obesity rates have risen and risen higher and higher than they have in other countries in the world. Parents and other citizens have stressed over the amount of deaths that have tripled due to obese children in the last thirty years. The excess fat in their bodies is caused by the fattening foods they eat. The more a child eats, the higher the risk is of him/ her suffering from a chronic health issue.

If a parent is going through a difficult situation where his/her child is overweight, doctors concluded that a solution can be to exercise every day or to get the gastric surgery done. More than a thousand children have gotten the surgery and complained about the difficulties they faced. For example, the amount of food that they have to eat or the way the substance has to be chewed or swallowed. This can cause digestive issues to occur and interfere with the purpose of the surgery.

Pay Up At the Met: Metropolitan Museum's New Admissions Policy



Fashion is a way for people to express themselves and their style with their outfits. People who create fashion are innovative, creative, and have a vision of what they want the world to look like. Some of the most well-known fashion companies are Chanel, Prada, Louis Vuitton, and Gucci. Another iconic one is Versace, an Italian luxury fashion company which produces upmarket Italian-made ready-to-wear and leather accessories. It is currently owned by Donatella Versace, but many forget its original owner, her late brother, Gianni Versace. A new mini-series on FX, The Assassination of Gianni Versace: American Crime Story, retells history by reenacting the events that led up to and followed his murder.

The series began on January 17th, and will conclude on March 21st. It tells the story of Gianni Versace, portrayed by Edgar Ramirez, and his assassin, Andrew Cunanan, portrayed by Darren Criss. Mr. Cunanan was an American serial killer who later was put on the FBI's Top 10 Most Wanted List. Whereas Episode 1 of the show depicts the actual assassination of Versace, Episodes 2 through 8 reveal the events that led up to Cunanan holding Versace at gunpoint. The show goes into depth about Cunanan's murder spree, why the Miami Beach Police Department and FBI failed to catch him, and how other victims were affected by his actions.

The show was based on the book <u>Vulgar Favors</u>: <u>Andrew Cunanan</u>, <u>Gianni Versace</u>, and the <u>Largest Failed Manhunt in U.S. History</u> by Maureen Orth, an award-winning journalist and <u>Vanity Fair</u> special correspondent. According to <u>GoodReads</u>, while Ms. Orth was writing the book, she interviewed over 400 people and looked at thousands of police reports. Thus, it's safe to say that the book is an accurate depiction of what occurred to Versace and his relationship to Cunanan. Also, since the show bought the rights to the book and used it as a basis for the script-writing, it also accurately portrays Versace's assassination and the events revolving around it.

The mini-series has gathered positive reviews from critics. According to <u>Rotten Tomatoes</u>, "The Assassination of Versace starts with a bang and unfurls slowly, moving backward through an intricate (and occasionally convoluted) murder mystery anchored by a career-defining performance from Darren Criss." By starting the show with Versace's assassination, it made viewers immediately intrigued and eager to continue watching the miniseries. Furthermore, <u>MetaCritic</u> ranked the show as the seventh best new television season of 2018, and the fourth most discussed television season of 2018. The show is raising awareness on the Versace case and why Versace is so memorable.

Overall, "The Assassination of Gianni Versace: American Crime Story" is a show I would recommend to anyone who has ever worn Versace. They should be learn about Gianni, the man whose vision created the entire Versace company. By learnThe Metropolitan Museum of Art has established itself as a symbol of New York City, a place filled with opportunities for the public, both young and old. The Metropolitan Museum of Art was founded in 1870 by a group of American citizens, businessmen and financiers as well as leading artists and thinkers of the day who wanted to create a museum to bring art and art education to the American people. For more than 100 years now, the Metropolitan Museum, or Met as it is commonly referred to, has provided tourists, school children and New Yorkers, the opportunity to be inspired and enlightened on art from around the world. The most famous pieces being "Self Portrait With a Straw Hat" by Vincent Van Gogh, "Washington Crossing the Delaware" by Emanuel Leutze and "Relief Panel" (c 883-859 B.C) for example.

The admission prices for The Met have been since the 1970's, the amount to pay is up to the individual. However online, the suggested price, is \$25 for adults; \$17 for seniors; \$12 for students; and free for members, patrons, and children under 12. Effective on March 1, 2018, there will be a new policy. The museum said it will begin charging out-of-state visitors. The new rule will affect about one-third of the Met's roughly seven million annual patrons, the museum said. However, only 17% of the people who visited the museum last year paid the full \$25. And that percentage has been in a steep decline.

Back in 2004, for example, 63% of visitors were willing to fork over the full suggested donation. Now, the new admissions price will reflect the suggested price for tourists and foreigners. The current pay-as-you-wish policy will stay in place for all New Yorkers and students from Connecticut and New Jersey, though they'll now need to provide some ID or proof of address before entering the exhibits. New Yorkers won't have to pay a fee because they already support the museum through taxes. Daniel Weiss, the museum's president and CEO, said in a statement that the Met is "determined that the Museum will remain accessible to as many visitors as possible while it also thrives as a financially stable institution." This means that in order for the Met to provide the best for the world, it must have a fee for non-area visitors.

Despite this seemingly harmless agenda, there has been a plentiful amount of justified controversy. One reason being that some feel this is a way of dividing people. Roberta Smith and Holland Cotter, art critics at the New York Times, disagree with the Met's decision, saying such museums should be free. "It divides people into categories — rich and poor, native and foreign," Another reason is the possibility of economic consequences. The reason is the Met admissions might decrease tourism rates. As is understood by many public institutions, foreign visitors have spent and sacrificed a significant amount of money to come to this country and experience another culture.

In the end, I believe that this small fee for the Metropolitan Museum of Art is needed and beneficial. The \$25 fee provides the Met with the resources to continue to thrive in the best way possible. The Metropolitan Museum of Art must be preserved. Art no matter what must be preserved. This is because the beauty of art is something so rare and so wonderful. Art has the ability to brighten life and one's own level of happiness. Art allows artists to express themselves as they see fit and the truth itself. Evil Exploits: Meltdown and Spectre

At the beginning of January, two exploits in computing were discovered by Jann Horn, a member of Google Project Zero, a group of researchers and analysts tasked with finding security vulnerabilities in computer hardware. The two exploits Jann Horn found, however, may be the most dangerous two yet. These software tools that are designed to take advantage of a flaw in a computer system affect nearly all devices, specifically almost every processor from 1995 or later, and can do a great deal of damage if used. The two exploits, although equally dangerous, work very differently.

Meltdown works by breaking the isolation between the system and the application. To put it simply, it "melts down" any walls between the user and the system, allowing the person using the exploit to remotely steal data.

In late December 2017, tech giant Apple, worth \$900 billion in 2017, according to Fortune, was faced with a major controversy. According to Mashable, the company confessed that they slowed down old iPhones with batteries that have lower capacity, when addressing concerns of the manufactured devices. The models that have been slowed down are iPhone 6, iPhone 6S, iPhone SE and iPhone 7 (according to Dezeen). Based on The Verge, the reason for the slowdown was to "prevent accidental shutdowns," and "improve battery life." Also, according to Mashable, the confession is, "confirming a long-running suspicion: that a tech giant has messed with an old device to encourage people to buy a new device."

The reactions to the controversy have been quick. According to Dezeen, "Apple has been hit with eight lawsuits, including one for almost \$1 trillion, after revealing it purposefully slowed down older iPhone models." The claim in the lawsuits, filed in several federal courts in the United States, is because Apple "defrauded iPhone users by not disclosing its actions sooner."

Apple released an apology. In the statement, it stated, "We've been hearing feedback from our customers about the way we handle performance for iPhones with older batteries and how we have communicated that process. We know that some of you feel Apple has let you down. We apologize. There's been a lot of misunderstanding about this issue, so we would like to clarify and let you know about some changes we're making. First and foremost, we have never and would never do anything to intentionally shorten the life of any Apple product, or degrade the user experience to drive customer upgrades." Also, Apple stated, that "the price of an out-of-warranty iPhone battery replacement by \$50 — from \$79 to \$29 for anyone with an iPhone 6 or later whose battery needs to be replaced, available worldwide through December 2018. Details will be provided soon on apple.com." A replacement can be beneficial, replacing an iPhone battery (\$79 with Apple) leads to "returned performance and CPU clock speeds back to normal," according to The Verge.

The controversy has hurt the reputation of Apple. People are upset knowing that Apple uses strategies like
