Early Drop Off & Breakfast: As a reminder the school day starts for students in grades K-3 at 8:20 am and 8:00 am for students in grades 4-8. Effective September 11, 2023, the morning arrival team will open the breakfast doors at 7:15 am for early drop-off. Students arriving for early drop off, must enter the cafeteria through the school yard via the Jarvis Avenue gate. Students in grades 4-8 arriving after 8:00 am and students in grades K-3 arriving after 8:20 am will be marked late. Students arriving late must then enter through the main lobby doors on Roberts Avenue to



receive a late pass before going up to class. All entrances will close at 8:00 am or 8:20 am!

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Dismissal Plans & Dismissal Procedures:

During dismissal time, it is imperative that our teachers' full attention be on the safe dismissal of their students. Therefore, teachers are unable to have conversations with parents at the rope. Your cooperation is essential and appreciated to ensure a safe and orderly dismissal of all students. Please note if you would like to speak to your child's teacher, they are available to meet and conference with parents during Parent Engagement Time.

NYC DOE Visitor Protocol: Please remember, that you must show Photo ID to the school safety agent when entering the building and you must sign the visitor's log. This is to ensure the safety and well-being of our entire school community. Your cooperation and Safety first! Show your ID! understanding are appreciated.

Attendance Matters: Students need to be present in school everyday to maximize learning, and to receive the quality instruction they are entitled to. When students are frequently absent, there is an impact on the continuity of instruction, making it difficult for students to master grade level standards and achieve academic success. Students who reach 18 absences during the school year are considered chronically absent. Our Attendance Team will conduct parent outreach via phone and email regarding excessive absences. Please ensure that your child comes to school on time every day and is present to learn.



PTA MEMBERSHIP: Parents are encouraged to attend monthly PTA meetings and to be actively involved in supporting our school. During these meetings, the PTA will share their goals for the school year and how they plan to support school wide initiatives and programs. Opportunities are also provided for you to voice your concerns regarding school related issues and to ask questions. PTA Meetings also provide a great forum for you to network with other parents, teachers, and staff. The PTA hosts many events throughout the year and would love to have parent volunteers!


Alexis Navatta
