Dear Alumni, Parents and Friends of Delone Catholic High School,

I did not consider my position as principal as work but I did consider it a mission and the best part of my life and well worth doing. Totally I have spent 39 and a half years in education with 25 years at Delone Catholic. Since the opening of the doors in 1940-41, there have been seven principals. Almost one third of the educational time that the school has been in existence, I have had the honor and privilege to serve.

Yes, there have been high points and low points but oh, the precious memories, and always the students. One cannot forget the first of everything as now I will cherish the last of everything. As Andre Gide said, "One doesn't discover new lands without consenting to lose sight of the shore." My new lands will be more time with children and grandchildren. The new lands will also provide volunteer opportunities at my parish while teaching Algebra to the grade eight students at St. Joseph and substituting when and where needed. I look forward to these new rewarding roles.

I have been blest to serve with a dedicated, experienced, passionate faculty who commit to doing their best every day for the students in their classes. Conversations frequently revolve around how best to motivate all students to success. Planning for the future within the curriculum for courses that will provide knowledge for jobs that don't exist now but will be choices when these students graduate from college is an on-going challenge, but one which they tackle with consummate energy.

The parent groups with whom I have worked have displayed a dedication beyond the time that their child is in school. These parents continue to provide the backbone of organizations long after the last child has graduated. It is an awesome witness to their character and their commitment to the athletes, musicians, thespians and forensics participants. Delone Catholic could not exist without their volunteer hours.

I leave you with this Irish blessing that my Grandfather and Father would share with me, "May the road rise up to meet you, may the wind be always at your back. May the sun shine warm upon your face, the rain fall soft upon your fields. And until we meet again, may God hold you in the palm of his hand." Thank you for a quarter of a century of your support and prayers.

A Message From Our Principal

Dear Alumni, Parents, and Friends of Delone Catholic High School,

June 30, 2017 marked the close of a 30-year chapter of my life as I retired from Montgomery County (Md.) Public Schools, and on July 5, 2017, I crossed the threshold of Delone Catholic High School as its eighth principal. I have no regrets regarding my decision to leave my former employer, as I assert that every one of those years has played a crucial role in preparing me for my current challenge as a financial steward, an instructional leader, and a spiritual and moral guide for the students who have been entrusted to my care. When I graduated from the University of Navarre in Pamplona, Spain, in 1997 with a Licentiate in Theology, I prayed that God would place me in a new role in response to then Pope John Paul's II's call to participate in the "new evangelization." It took the Lord 20 years to respond, and I firmly believe that my prayer has been answered in the call to serve the DCHS community.

Delone Catholic High School has been truly blessed with passionate alumni and donors, with supportive families and volunteers, with integral business partners, with dedicated teachers and supporting staff, and with caring and scholarly students, all collaborating to make Delone Catholic an outstanding academic institution where skills are learned, talents are applied and faith is shared in response to St. James' exhortation to be "Doers of the Word" as faith-filled disciples of Jesus Christ.

This summer, many hands came together to complete Phase III of our renovation project. The 1955 wing now has state-of-the-art classrooms with projectors and air-conditioning. New ceiling tiles, flooring and lockers have been installed, the ovens and safety features in the kitchen have been updated, and a water-bottle filling station has been added next to the Sheppard Gym. No facility would be complete, however, without the hiring of exciting and exceptional staff members to breathe life into it. As such, Bethann Dolbow joined our Math Department as Donna Tompkins actively embraced her new role as Interim Vice-Principal; recent Mount St. Mary's graduate Brendan McCall added his theological training in support of our Religion Department; Derek Hakes, a Millersville University graduate, carved his niche in Technology Education, carrying on the dedicated work of Bill Grandia upon his retirement; Kim Cook transitioned from School Nurse to Instructional Support Specialist; Tim Bonitz with a Master's Degree in education and sport management, bolstered our team as full-time Athletic Director, taking over for Dave Lawrence '69 upon his retirement; Jennifer Hart returned to the Catholic school community, adding creativity and new ideas as our Director of Enrollment and Marketing; and Michelle Legacy is competently keeping us all connected 24-7 as Technology Coordinator.

Delone Catholic does not have a reputation for resting on its laurels, however, and we are actively looking ahead to meet the challenges of 21st century educational standards by preparing our students to be college and career ready. Plans are underway to update our school's strategic plan, and this effort dovetails nicely with our Middle States reaccreditation process of which we are in our self-evaluation year in preparation for our visitation, which will occur in the spring of 2019.

"So much to do, so little time" goes the adage, but each morning I step into our chapel to say a quick hello to Jesus, a prayer for Him to watch over our community and protect it from every moral, spiritual and physical harm, and a request to provide me with the strength and wisdom to guide Delone Catholic in these turbulent, uncertain times. Now more than ever, our Lord's voice needs to be heard and heeded, and Delone Catholic High School has no small part to play in turning His words into actions. Please continue to pray for all associated with DCHS.

AFTER 25 YEARS, DR. MAUREEN THIEC RETIRES AS PRINCIPAL

To be in one position, especially one as demanding as the principal of a high school, for 25 years is somewhat unusual. Even more so, it is unusual for someone who spent most of her life prior to that tenure moving around the country, but that is exactly what Dr. Maureen C. Thiec did at Delone Catholic High School.

Her family moved numerous times during her childhood, which prepared her for life as the wife of a member of the United States Navy. When she was hired as the seventh principal of Delone Catholic in 1992, she did not really have the future mapped out. She just knew what she did not want.

"I had no particular plan," Dr. Thiec said. "I knew that I did not want to move again having moved 15 times in my life in six different states. To maintain contact with extended family and to return to the state of our births, we chose to remain in Pennsylvania. Everything else evolved."

Delone Catholic was in a similar state of flux. Beginning with the departure of Rev. Michael J. Grab following the 1988-89 school year, Dr. Thiec became the school's fourth principal in five years. That was highly unusual for a school that had only known four principals in its first 49 years, including Rev. Msgr. William R. Lyons, who led the school from May 1949 until June 1977.

In a time before the internet made a nationwide job search a much easier task, the Thiec family began to plan for what would turn out to be their final major move. They were living in Jacksonville, Fla., where Dr. Thiec was the principal of the Resurrection Parish School. She had begun her career as a science teacher before taking on administrative roles.

"My husband (Randy, who passed away on Mar. 31, 2016) was offered a job in Maryland in 1991," Dr. Thiec said. "He moved here while I remained in Florida with our children and worked on my doctoral degree. I started to send resumes to the Diocese of Harrisburg and the Archdiocese of Baltimore. I had the "Catholic Directory of Parishes and Schools" and sent about 50 letters and resumes to schools. A school in Baltimore responded as did Sister Marilou MacDonald, IHM, Superintendent of Schools for the Diocese of Harrisburg."



Dr. Thiec began her tenure at the start of the 1992-93 school year. She has often said what a blur that first year was as she found her way in her new role, but she has very distinct memories.

She remembers "The first of everything – the first band competition, the first of all the athletic contests, the first Mass, the first honor roll honor card presentation, the first pep rally, the first play, the first musical (I was included in the role of Grandma Tzeitel in "Fiddler on the Roof"), the first Baccalaureate, the first graduation, the first day I called to close school on Dec. 10, 1992, the first blizzard in March 1993." The snow-related memories were especially new for someone who had spent most of her academic career in Florida.

As she settled in, Dr. Thiec began to prioritize different items and initiatives she wanted to accomplish. "The Catholic identity was first and foremost," she said, "starting each class period with prayer, establishing a reverence during Mass, requesting a Spiritual Life Director for the school. Then came academics, including the Algebra I program for eighth grade students to keep them enrolled in our Catholic elementary schools, adding AP (Advanced Placement) courses, adding additional math and science courses, and strengthening the elective offerings."

Over her tenure, the percentage of Delone Catholic graduates going on to higher education increased to the point at which 90-95 percent of each class enrolls in a post-secondary program. Those who enter military service or directly into the workforce, though fewer in number than in previous generations, continue to give glowing reports about their readiness for those endeavors as well.

Dr. Thiec inherited a rich tradition of just more than half a century when she arrived, and she was here long enough to help celebrate the school's 75th Anniversary in 2015. She has taken great pride in the fact that "Delone Catholic continues the proud tradition of an excellent academic school, enriched by the faith and nourished by the parishes in the deanery." She is also proud of the strides the school has taken in other areas, "continuing to build a challenging curriculum within the Catholic identity of the school, and adding the necessary technology for our students to be competitive in high school, in college and in their careers."

Additionally, there are specific accomplishments and highlights that quickly come to mind for her. "The amount of scholarship money stands out," Dr. Thiec said. "The number of state championships in sports and forensics, the students who have entered religious life, the number of Golden Apple recipients, and the dedicated faculty and staff committed to the students."

As with any job and the passage of time, the many years of 12-to-15-hour days, the responsibilities of guiding an institution made of up of hundreds of individuals and thousands of supporters eventually made her take stock of where she was in her career. For many reasons, she felt the time was right in early 2017 to announce her upcoming retirement.

"I have accomplished almost everything I planned as goals, for the curriculum, for the building (Delone's Diamond Decade Initiative), for the deanery (the recent study), and for the faculty," Dr. Thiec said. "I am much older and therefore the energy level is beginning to wane. Technology is moving faster than I can move!"

There are certainly some things mixed in that she wishes would have turned out differently as well. "I wish that every student had graduated walking across the stage," she said. "I wish that every student had made wise choices that hard decisions about disciplinary action could have been eliminated. I wish that every student and every family would gather at the table of the Lord on Sunday to be strengthened by the Eucharist, and I wish that every student could have been kept safe from harm."

Though she plans to slow down from the non-stop schedule of being a principal, her career as an educator will continue. With her retirement, the eighth-grade Algebra program will now be taught at each of the Adams Deanery elementary schools. She will continue to teach at St. Joseph School in Hanover in addition to spending more time visiting her children and grandchildren, gardening and volunteering at St. Joseph Parish.

"I will enjoy God's gift of life every day," she said. "I will miss the students the most – their laughter, tears, successes, competitions, talents and music. I will not miss the long days and the unending chain of meetings! The best times are wrapped up in the students, placing the gold medal around the necks of the athletes after district or state wins, enveloped in the musical or theatrical talents, celebrating liturgies, teaching Algebra and publications, being a part of a wonderful community."

As she reflected late this past winter on her time at Delone Catholic, while the school was in the midst of hiring her successor, she expressed her wishes for the school community.

"I hope that Delone Catholic continues to grow in numbers exemplifying our motto 'Be Doers of the Word.' I hope that the next principal values our mission so that Delone Catholic may ever be the touchstone of academic excellence."



RICHARD LA ROCCA Named Eighth Principal Of Delone Catholic High School

The Diocese of Harrisburg and the Delone Catholic High School Board of Directors announced the appointment of Richard V. La Rocca as the school's eighth Principal effective July 1. Mr. La Rocca has over 30 years of experience in education.

"Praised be Jesus Christ! What a blessing to learn this Easter season that I have been chosen as the next principal of Delone Catholic High School," Mr. La Rocca said when his hiring was announced in May. He continued, "I am looking forward to getting to know and work with the families, staff and extended DCHS community as we collaborate in educating the next generation of 'Doers of the Word.' I humbly request their prayers for God to provide me with the wisdom to be an effective leader on all levels. Go Squires!"

Mr. La Rocca was most recently the Assistant Principal at Poolesville High School with Montgomery County Public Schools in Maryland. He succeeds Dr. Maureen Thiec, who has served as Principal for the past 25 years before retiring on June 30.

Rev. Edward J. Quinlan, the Secretary for Education of the Diocese of Harrisburg and Fifth Principal of Delone Catholic, formally appointed Mr. La Rocca to the position. The Board of Directors of Delone Catholic High School recommended him for appointment following interviews conducted at the diocese and by the local search committee for the Board.

"I am excited that Mr. La Rocca will be joining the Delone Catholic family. Working with our parents, faculty, students and all our stakeholders, I feel confident he will lead our school to continued success in the future," Dr. Douglas A. Little '81, President of the Delone Catholic Board of Directors, said. He added, "With his extensive experience and ability to easily connect with others, he is well qualified to continue and expand on Delone Catholic's great traditions in ensuring the outstanding preparation of our students for their future endeavors."

Mr. La Rocca began his teaching career at Monroe Catholic High School in Fairbanks, Alaska, served as an instructor at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., the University of Maryland in College Park, Md., and Hood College in Frederick, Md., and since 1985 has been with Montgomery County Schools teaching languages and later in school administration.

Mr. La Rocca holds Bachelor of Arts degrees in history and Spanish from Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y., a Bachelor of Sacred Theology from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome, a Master of Arts degree in Spanish from The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., and an Licentiate of Sacred Theology from the University of Navarre in Pamplona, Spain. He also holds Teaching and Administrative Certification from the State of Maryland.


Mr. La Rocca and his wife of 31 years have five children and are the proud grandparents of four grandchildren.



DELONE CATHOLIC INDUCTS SECOND HALL OF HONOR CLASS





Mr. Flaherty and Brother René, both inducted posthumously, were represented by a large gathering of their families. Inductees and their presenters recalled many memorable stories about their time at Delone Catholic and their interactions with each other over more than 60 years. It was truly a celebration of Delone Catholic and some of the people who have done so much over the years.

Nominations for the Class of 2018 have been submitted, and the selection committee will again have an incredible challenge as it reviews the glistening resumes of some accomplished individuals. The Class will be announced by early January, and it will be inducted on Friday, Feb. 9, 2018. Further details of the induction ceremonies will be released with the announcement of the Class.









The nomination process for the Hall of Honor Class of 2019 will be open from Jan. 1-Sept. 1, 2018. 
CLASS OF 2017 COMPLETES FOUR YEARS OF FAITH, SERVICE, ACHIEVEMENT

The Class of 2017 closed its chapter as students in the storied history of Delone Catholic High School. Expanding the ranks of Delone Catholic graduates by 112, the class was offered nearly \$8.6 million in higher education scholarships and awards. In all, the last 17 classes have combined to earn more than \$84.9 million in scholarships and awards.

For many years, more than 90 percent of each graduating class at Delone Catholic has chosen to go on to higher education. Conscious of the rising costs of higher education and the adverse effects of students starting their lives tens of thousands of dollars in debt, many donors have founded new scholarships and many students have aggressively pursued these offers. Additionally, more students in recent years have applied to and been accepted by prestigious private colleges and universities along with many of the trade schools and state colleges and universities that have long been destinations for Delone Catholic alumni.

On Friday, May 19, 2017, Delone Catholic celebrated its 77th-Annual Commencement. Mrs. Livia Riley, Superintendent of Schools for the Diocese of Harrisburg, presided over the ceremony, which featured the valedictory address from Emily Lawrence and the salutatory address from Nicholas Evich.

The class's four years of faith development culminated in the Baccalaureate Mass on Thursday, May 18 at St. Joseph Church in Hanover. Most Rev. Ronald W. Gainer, Eleventh Bishop of Harrisburg, was the principal celebrant of the Mass. He was joined by his brother priests from the Adams Deanery.



The awards ceremony was held immediately after the Baccalaureate Mass. Numerous guests and the DCHS administration were on hand to present awards to the graduates. A partial list of awards and their 2017 recipients follows.



These activities are funded through fees paid by each participant, as well as fundraising done by many volunteers who contribute thousands of hours of their time each year.







Delone's Diamond Decade Initiative Phase III Update

Delone Catholic Hits Double Digits in Golden Apple Recipients

Now in his first season as the offensive line coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars, Flaherty continues to help young players throughout the region improve their on-field skills while bringing in instructors and guest speakers who relay the message of how lessons learned on the field have helped them in other areas of their lives. The funds raised by the event benefit the J.T. Flaherty Scholarship Fund and the John Gastley Scholarship Foundation. Both are awards that help young people continue their education.

John Urschel, a two-time First-Team All-Big Ten and two-time First-Team CoSIDA Academic All-American at Penn State, was on the camp coaching staff for the third time. He played three seasons with the Baltimore Ravens and retired prior to the 2017 season to focus full-time on studies in a doctorate program at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, Mass.

In addition, David A. Borden, Jr. '99, a major in the United States Marine Corps, returned to Delone Catholic as the featured speaker. Borden, who played football at Delone Catholic and Kutztown University in Kutztown, Pa., was severely wounded while deployed in Iraq. However, they encouraged the campers to place just as much emphasis, or more, on their education and their relationships outside the game because their football careers will end. For many of the campers, their last high school game will be the last time they play the game, and they will need to find ways to meet challenges and impact people off the field.

The fourth Mason Dixon Linemen Clinic is being planned for Summer 2018. Full details will be released when they are complete.

Sports Roundup

2016 Boys' Cross Country

The Squires (9-11, 6-0 YAIAA III) swept the YAIAA Division III field in 2016 to win their fifth division championship. The team also finished third in the PIAA District 3 Class A championships for the third year in a row. Adler Brininger '20 kicked off his career in fine style, leading the team with an eighth-place finish at the district meet. He was joined in the top half of the field by Gabe Hall '19 (19th) and Shamus Keefe '18 (21st). Brininger also qualified for the PIAA Class A championships where he finished 83rd out of 214 runners in a time of 18:10. He received honorable mention on the 2016 Game TimePA.com YAIAA Boys' Cross Country All-Star Team. All seven runners who competed in districts for the Squires have eligibility remaining in 2017, giving the team a bright outlook for the season ahead.

2016 Girls' Cross Country

The Squirettes (14-6, 6-0 YAIAA III) extended their run of consecutive YAIAA Division III wins to 30 by putting up a fifth consecutive perfect season. In fact, they have not lost head-to-head against a division foe since Oct. 4, 2011. The team again put together a solid performance at the PIAA District 3 Class A Championships. Leanne Sneeringer '18 paced Delone Catholic, coming in seventh place. The next four Squirettes – Natalie Wildasin '18 (30th), Michelle Cao '18 (36th), Abbey Sweeney '17 (37th) and Taylor Lescalleet '17 (39th) – all finished within 49 seconds of each other. The following week, Sneeringer made her third appearance in the PIAA Class A Championships, placing 73rd out of 217 participants. She again received honorable mention on the 2016 GameTimePA.com YAIAA Girls' Cross Country All-Star Team.

2016 Field Hockey

The Squirettes (3-11, 3-10 YAIAA III) improved by two wins within the division over the previous season, and overall saw the offense improve by half a goal per game. Delone Catholic was only shut out twice in 2016 after being blanked seven times in 2015. Mikayla McCleaf '17 led the offense with 10 goals on the season. Included in that number was four in a 4-1 win at York Suburban on Sept. 8. Brianna Milliken '17 added three goals and two assists.

2016 Football

The Squires (7-3, 4-3 YAIAA III) bookended the season with a pair of three-game winning streaks en route to a three-game improvement over the previous season. The 3-0 start was the program's best since opening the 2011 season 5-0. The Squires posted the best defensive season in recent memory, allowing only 111 points in 10 games, an improvement of more than 18 points per game from the previous season. The team posted its first shutout in six years on Sept. 16 at New Oxford. The Squires would go on to pitch three more shutouts, including back-to-back blankings of Fairfield and York Tech as part of a run of more than 12 consecutive scoreless quarters for their opponents. The team's four shutouts were the most in a season since the 2003 team had five.

Offensively, the brother tandem of Zach Hart '17 and Ryan Hart '18 combined to rush for 1,331 yards and 15 touchdowns. They gained another 206 yards and four touchdowns through the air. Ryan Hart also averaged 29.6 yards per punt return and 41.8 yards per kickoff return and returned one punt and one kickoff for a touchdown. Brandon Hall '17 was a weapon in the kicking game. He made 27-of-28 point-after attempts and 4-of-5 field goals, including a 37-yarder, which is the program's longest in at least the past eight seasons. Bryce Perkins '17 and Brian Shermeyer '17 were both named to the second team of the 2016 GameTimePA.com YAIAA Football All-Star Team. Hall, Ryan Hart, Wade Neiderer '17 and Zach Schussler '18 all received honorable mention.

2016 Golf

The Squires were a relatively young and inexperienced team in 2016. They finished fourth in every league meet, posting a season-best 390 in their home meet at Flatbush Golf Course. Josh Sherdel '20 and Maria Cushing-Daniels '19 competed in the YAIAA championships, which also served as the District 3 qualifying tournament. Neither qualified for districts, but they and their teammates gained valuable experience throughout the season, which will help them in 2017.

2016 Boys' Soccer

The Squires (5-8, 5-7 YAIAA III) continued working to establish themselves on the YAIAA soccer scene. They broke the program record for fewest losses in a season. Delone Catholic again posted wins against four of the six division opponents, including a season sweep of Littlestown. The Squires also split with Bermudian Springs and Hanover, with the losses to both coming indouble overtime. Brandon Hall '17 paced the team with 15 goals and two assists.

2016 Girls' Soccer

The Squirettes (10-6-1, 8-4 YAIAA III) posted their best season in five years of varsity competition. They reached double-digit wins for the first time in their first winning season. For the second straight season, they also qualified for the PIAA District 3 Class A playoffs, falling in the quarterfinals at Schuylkill Valley. The Squirettes again collected season sweeps against Bermudian Springs, Hanover and Littlestown and defeated every team in the division at least once except for state champion Fairfield. Cayla Aquino '18 excelled on offense, scoring 16 goals and handing out eight assists. Sophia Gilbart '19 tacked on seven goals and four assists, and Julia Whiteleather '18 added seven goals and two assists.

2016 Girls' Tennis

The Squirettes (12-3, 8-0 YAIAA II) again upped the ante for the program in 2016. They won their second straight YAIAA Division II championship, capturing all eight league matches as part of a 12-match winning streak. Among their wins were nine sweeps. As a team, Delone Catholic reached the PIAA District 3 Class AA playoffs for the second year in a row, defeating Kutztown, before bowing to Lancaster Catholic and Berks Catholic to place fourth.

Besides qualifying for the team tournament, several members of the squad also reached the YAIAA championships. Ellie Neudecker '19 captured the YAIAA singles championship as the number five seed, equaling a feat accomplished

by her sister, Alyssa Neudecker '17 the previous season. Second-seeded Alyssa Neudecker and Maria Waminal '18 both reached the quarterfinals. Bridget Kilkelly '17 and Julie Thackston '18 lost in the second round, and Emily Ritter '17 fell in the first round. For the second year in a row, the Neudecker sisters earned the top seed in the YAIAA doubles tournament and fended off the competition to capture the title. They defeated Kilkelly and Waminal in the quarterfinals, a round also reached by teammates Becca Dolce '19 and Peyton Golowski '19. Thackston and Megan Jones '17 also qualified for the tournament, losing in the first round. As an unseeded competitor, Ellie Neudecker placed third in the PIAA District 3 Class AA singles tournament. She and Alyssa Neudecker also placed third in the PIAA District 3 Class AA doubles tournament. Both sisters were named to the 2016 GameTimePA.com YAIAA Girls' Tennis All-Star First Team.

2016 Girls' Volleyball

The Squirettes (18-4, 12-0 YAIAA III) added another exciting chapter to the volleyball program's outstanding history in 2016. Delone Catholic went undefeated in league play for the sixth year in a row and won its seventh straight division title. A run of four consecutive YAIAA tournament championships ended with a 3-0 quarterfinal loss to York Suburban, but the Squirettes bounced back to run the table in the PIAA District 3 Class AA playoffs. They swept Lancaster Mennonite and York Catholic to capture the program's 11th district championship, which is the most by any Delone Catholic program.

Of the team's 18 victories, 16 came via the sweep, and none extended past a fourth set. The Squirettes reached the district championship match for the fifth consecutive season, capturing gold for the first time since 2013. Delone Catholic also matched the previous season's performance in the PIAA Class AA playoffs. The Squirettes yielded just 21 points in sweeping District 12's Bishop McDevitt in the first round of the playoffs before falling, 3-1, to North Star in the state quarterfinal match.

Claire Kaufmann '17 was named to the 2016 GameTimePA.com YAIAA Girls' Volleyball All-Star First Team and the 2016 Pennsylvania Volleyball Coaches' Association Class AA All-State Team. She was joined on the all-state squad by Chloe Kindig '18. Kindig and Kayla Ewart '17 also earned honorable mention recognition from GameTimePA.com.

2016-17 Boys' Basketball

The 2016-17 season followed a similar script as the previous one for the Squires (12-12, 11-3 YAIAA III). A non-league schedule loaded with larger schools provided its share of challenges, but prepared the team to stay in contention for the top spot in the division for much of the season. The Squires qualified for the YAIAA tournament for the first time in three years and reached the PIAA District 3 playoffs for the 20th straight season. Evan Brady '19 received honorable mention on the 2017 GameTimePA.com YAIAA Boys' Basketball All Team.


Following the season, head coach Lawrence Williams got the opportunity to take over the top spot at his alma mater, Gettysburg, following three seasons at Delone Catholic. He will be replaced by Darrell Wildasin, whose Squire teams won 140 games between 1995-96 and 2002-03 and reached the PIAA playoffs in each of his last six seasons.

2016-17 Girls' Basketball

Several young players logged extended minutes, allowing the Squirettes (20-8, 10-2 YAIAA III) to overcome some key injuries and post a season with numerous highlights. Delone Catholic opened the season on a six-game winning streak, including a season-opening 69-33 win at Camp Hill which gave head coach Gerry Eckenrode 400 victories in his 18 seasons at the school. He finished the year with an overall record of 419-129, giving him an average of more than 23 wins per season. Along with the victories, Coach Eckenrode's teams have reached the district playoffs every season, winning three titles. He has also guided the Squirettes to the state playoffs 15 times and captured three championships.





With the PIAA adding two classifications, Delone Catholic moved from AA to AAA. The Squirettes proved equal to the task. They earned the tournament's second seed and rolled through the semifinals to their first district title game in three seasons. Archrival York Catholic was waiting there and came away with the championship. The silver medal finish was good enough to qualify for the state playoffs, where Delone Catholic earned a 30-point win in the first round before bowing out in the second round.

Elise Knobloch '17 and Bradi Zumbrum '19 both earned honorable mention on the 2017 GameTimePA.com YAIAA Girls' Basketball All-Star Team.

2016-17 Swimming

Delone Catholic continued a recent tradition of sponsoring individual swimmers as a PIAA non-swimming school. At the 2016-17 PIAA District 3 Class AA championships, Caroline Dudenhoeffer '17 finished eighth in the 200-yard individual medley and 10th in the 500-yard freestyle. Addi Kesselring '20 also competed, finishing 22nd in both the 200-yard individual medley and the 100-yard butterfly. Dudenhoeffer received honorable mention on the 2017 GameTimePA.com YAIAA Girls' Swimming All-Star Team.

2016-17 Wrestling

A veteran Delone Catholic squad made a strong showing on the wrestling mat in 2016-17. The Squires (10-5, 5-1 YAIAA III) experienced success both as a team and individually. The team's only loss in the league came against perennial powerhouse Bermudian Springs, leading to a second-place finish. The Squires also placed 10th of 21 teams at the Solanco Mule Classic in December, 9th of 30 teams at the New Oxford Invitational in January, and 4th of 12 teams at the Gettysburg Classic in February. All of the team success earned them a spot in the PIAA District 3 Class AA team tournament, where they again fell to Bermudian Springs in the quarterfinals.

Delone Catholic hit double digits for the fourth year in a row with 10 wrestlers qualifying for the sectional tournament and more than doubled its point production from the prior season to 136.0 for a third-place finish. Eight wrestlers placed in the top six and advanced to the PIAA District 3 Class AA tournament, including Brian Shermeyer '17, who took the 160-pound championship. The team earned 63.0 points at the District meet to place 10th of 30 teams. Shermeyer (second – 160 pounds), Brady Repasky '17 (fourth - 195 pounds), Sean Sneeringer '17 (sixth -220 pounds) and Bryce Perkins '17 (third – 285 pounds) all placed at the District tournament. Shermeyer picked up a sixth-place finish, and Repasky was fifth in the regional tournament, giving them both back-toback bids to the PIAA Class AA championships. Perkins joined them at states after a sixth-place finish in the regional tournament. Shermeyer placed eighth at states, becoming the program's first state medalist in six years. He was a 2017 GameTimePA.com YAIAA Wrestling All-Star First Teamer, while Perkins and Repasky received honorable mention.

2017 Baseball

Long-time assistant coach Dave Neumayer took over the reigns of the baseball program in 2017. After getting off to a slow start, the Squires (9-10, 9-6 YAIAA IV) won six of their last eight games in the league to earn a second-place finish in the division, up one spot from the previous season. Among the highlights of the campaign were season sweeps of Hanover and Fairfield and wins against local rivals Bermudian Springs and Littlestown.

Ethan Slusser '17 went 4-2 on the mound to lead the Squires in wins. He also had a pair of doubles at the plate, which helped him to earn a first-team nod on the 2017 YAIAA Division IV Coaches Baseball All-Star Team. Neumayer was named the division's Co-Coach of the Year. Wes DePorter '17, Cody Pfaff '18, Shane Kecken '19 and A.J. Zeak '19 all received honorable mention.

2017 Softball

The Delone Catholic softball team continued to be a tough out for its YAIAA Division IV foes in 2017. The Squirettes (13-6, 13-2 YAIAA IV) won their sixth-consecutive YAIAA Division IV title and earned a trip to the District 3 playoffs for the seventh season in a row. Because the PIAA added two classes and redistributed schools among six classifications, instead of four, Delone Catholic appeared in the Class AAA playoffs for the first time. The Squirettes' season ended with an 8-2 loss to Tulpehocken in the quarterfinals on May 23.

Following another outstanding team performance, several individuals were honored for their contributions. Katie Ernst '20 and Marlee Lackey '18 were named Player and Pitcher of the Year, respectively, by the Division IV coaches. Lauren Little '20 and Maggie Rickrode '19 were named to the 2017 YAIAA Division IV Coaches Softball All-Star Team, while Sydney Keith '18, Lauryn King '17 and Callie Shearer '17, were all members of the second team. Additionally, Ernst was an honorable mention on the 2017 GameTimePA.com Softball All-Star Team.

2017 Boys' Tennis

The Squires (5-7, 4-4 YAIAA II) had an up-and-down season, never winning more than twice in a row or losing more than three straight. Matt Steinberg '20, Paul Tily '19 and Noah Russell '17 all qualified for the YAIAA Class AA Singles Championships. Steinberg, seeded sixth, won in straight sets in each of the first two rounds before falling to the top seed in the quarterfinals. The doubles teams of Steinberg and Rob McGough '17 qualified for the YAIAA Class AA Doubles Championships, advancing to the quarterfinals before being eliminated.

2017 Girls' Track and Field

The Squirettes (6-1, 5-1 YAIAA III) saw an incredible run come to an end almost exactly six years after it started. Fairfield defeated Delone Catholic by one point on April 13, 2011, and the Squirettes would not lose again in the league until April 11, 2017, this time by only eight points. In between, the Squirettes won 35 consecutive meets. After the loss, their new streak stands at four. Delone Catholic again put together some impressive performances in the postseason, including a second-place finish at the PIAA District 3 Class AA championships, falling just eight points shy of their third team title.

At the YAIAA championships, relays (second - 4x100, fifth - 4x400), Danielle Malesky '19 (second - pole vault), Leanne Sneeringer '18 (third - 1600, fourth - 800), Maddie Clabaugh '20 (fourth - 400), Julianna Malesky '19 (tie for fifth - high jump), Sophie Gilbart '19 (sixth - 400), Brooke Lawyer '20 (seventh - 100), Molly Raville '19 (eighth - javelin) and Becca Dolce '19 (ninth - shot put) all finished in the top 10 of their respective events. At the PIAA District 3 Class AA championships on May 19-20 at Seth Grove Stadium in Shippensburg, Pa., the Squirettes again experienced individual success. Lawyer placed third in the 200 and fifth in the 100. Clabaugh and Gilbart were second and ninth, respectively, in the 400. Sneeringer placed second in the 800, fourth in the 1600 and sixth in the 3200. Brianna Milliken '17 earned seventh in the 100 hurdles. The 4x100 relay team of Lawyer, Danielle Malesky, Amber Milliken '17 and Brianna Milliken came in fourth, as did the 4x400 relay team of Clabaugh, Gilbart, Sneeringer and Lauren Trummer '19. Gilbart, Emma Russell '20, Maggie Wells '19 and Natalie Wildasin '18 teamed to take seventh in the 4x800. In the field events, Julianna Malesky won the high jump and finished fifth in the triple jump. Trummer (seventh) and Lawyer (13th) also competed in the triple jump. Julianna Malesky (fourth) and Danielle Malesky (fifth) both made the top 10 in the pole vault. Dolce tooke seventh in the shot put and 12th in discus. Raville and Makenna Martin '18 rounded out the team's competitors with fourth- and 14th-place finishes, respectively, in the javelin. Clabaugh (400), Sneeringer (800) and Julianna Malesky (high jump) all qualified for the state meet. The three PIAA qualifiers all received honorable mention on the 2017 GameTimePA. com Girls' Track and Field All-Star Team.




2017 Boys' Track and Field

FRANCIS J. "GUINEA" RINEMAN, JR. '45

"Good evening, everyone, and welcome to Squire Country!" Anyone who has been to a Delone Catholic football game in the last 60 years or so has heard these words. The man who coined that signature welcome, Francis "Guinea" Rineman, has been a part of the Delone Catholic family since before the first shovel-full of dirt was turned to begin building the original wing on South Oxford Avenue. His sister, Patricia (Rineman) Frantz '41, was a member of the first graduating class, and he entered as a freshman in the school's second year.

Guinea was a manager for those early Squire athletic teams, a supporting role that foreshadowed the rest of his life. He was a key figure in the Athletic Association for decades, helping to raise the funds that allowed the Squires and later, the Squirettes, to compete for their school. His most public and celebrated role, though, was as the Voice of the Squires. For 51 years, he served as the public address announcer for Delone Catholic varsity football games. He also spent decades in the same role for the basketball program.

As a gift to Guinea in honor of his service to Delone Catholic, his family started the Guinea Rineman Voice of the Squires Fund in 2016. With his input, it was determined that this fund will be used on a rotating basis to assist Delone Catholic's athletic teams with the purchase of uniforms. Through this fund, the work of supporting Delone Catholic student-athletes which he accomplished so faithfully throughout his life, will continue long after his passing on Apr. 5, 2017. Though he handed on the microphone and the responsibility of welcoming crowds to Squire Country in recent years, Guinea will always be the Voice of the Squires.
