Student Drop Off

- Students can be transported to school by school bus or by parent drop off.
 - Bus
 - Students traveling by bus will receive a tag and estimated time to be at the bus stop. Please have your child at the stop with their tag securely attached to their book bag. The bus tag should be completely filled out with updated information. On the back, please indicate adults authorized to pick up your child from the bus stop.
 - Parent Drop Off "Parked Vehicles"
 - Please make sure not to double or triple park and be aware of parking regulations because parking authorities will give you a ticket.
 - Upon arriving on campus your child will be received and escorted into the building.
 Parents are not permitted beyond the main gateway.
 - Parent Drop Off "By Car"
 - Upon arriving on campus please use the circular drive way. Be attentive to School staff who will facilitate traffic flow. Be mindful of your speed. Teachers/Assistants will receive your child from your vehicle, please do not get out of the car. Staff will escort your child into the building.

Dismissal

Students will begin the dismissal process at 2:15.

- Bus
 - Buses leave the school at approximately 2:30. Please be at the stop ready to receive your child. Children will not be allowed to get off if an authorized adult listed on the bus tag is not present.
 - *Please be flexible with bus times as traffic may vary throughout the year.

Pick up

• Parents may arrive at 2:15 pm. Security will then allow you to enter the B building. Pick up takes place in the Cafeteria, parents are asked to wait along the walls so students can easily enter and sit at assigned tabled. Once the student arrive students and their parents must sign out at the books at the front of the room. The child will then receive a Bee card, which they use to exit the room. Parents must bring identification and students will only be released to an authorized adult listed on the back of the bus pass.

Visiting Quarles School

- Any adult visiting the Quarles Campus must report directly to the security desk inside of the main building.
- In order to proceed past that point you must check in with security guards and provide a valid photo identification. These can include:

Recess


- 20 minutes total
