The science faculty has increased the number of hands-on labs with the addition of the electrical outlets and gas availability for the Bunsen burners. The interactive smartboards enhance student learning with varied colors, graphs and speed in clearing the material and moving on. Faculty members save the examples and lessons and post the information to their class webpages so that students who are absent have access to the day's lesson. Then the air conditioning has provided an environment where learning can occur comfortably during September and May especially.

Now we are moving to Phase II and the renovation of the 1940 building. This year is the proclaimed Year of Faith. DELONE'S DIAMOND DECADE INITIATIVE: CHECKING OFF THE "TO DO" LIST

Every day since the beginning of the 2011-12 school year, Delone Catholic students and faculty have learned and taught the math and science curriculum in a completely renovated 1963 Math and Science Wing. While this was the first construction or renovation of an entire wing at Delone Catholic since the construction of the Lawrence B. "Sonny" Sheppard, Jr. Memorial Gymnasium in 1969, the wait for the next round of work will be considerably shorter. Phase II of Delone's Diamond Decade Initiative will be conducted during the summer of 2013. When students return to school in the fall, their social studies and religion classrooms and the administrative offices will all have a completely new shine for the first time since September 1940.

Delone's Diamond Decade Initiative, the first capital campaign in the history of the school, began with a feasibility study in the spring of 2009. The feasibility study tested a campaign to raise the \$6.8 million necessary to renovate the entire school. The support for the project was great due to the obvious need, but study participants had great concerns about the effects of a weak economy. Kirby-Smith Associates, Inc., the consultant hired to assist with the study and campaign, recommended a phased campaign that would allow the school to reach achievable goals and build momentum.

"Knowing that millions of dollars are involved in a project, there is always a chance that the goal may not be reached," Delone Catholic Principal Maureen C. Thiec, Ed.D. said. "What has impressed me over the many years here at Delone Catholic is the tremendous support we have received from parents, alumni and the business community to achieve our goals, no matter how big or small or what we deem possible or impossible. We have new bleachers outside. We have a new scoreboard. At one time these projects were thought to be impossible. One never knows the capacity of faith."

With the help of dedicated volunteers on the campaign cabinet and the generosity of hundreds of donors, Delone Catholic surpassed the original \$1.75 million goal as well as the extended \$2 million goal. Conewago Enterprises, Inc., which served as the general contractor for the project, worked diligently to limit costs, and completed the work for less than \$1.5 million. This allowed the administration, Board of Directors and campaign cabinet to accelerate the original schedule, which would not have seen Phase II completed until at least 2015. Many benefactors who made Phase I possible have extended their original commitments to help provide the funds necessary to complete Phase II.

"I was so pleased with the people that came forth right off the bat," Campaign Chair Robert B. Kenworthy '54 said. "The way people rallied behind the work that was being done was great. It really goes to show the dedication of the people in the area and in the Delone Catholic family. The percentage of participation and commitment from the faculty and staff was outstanding. People really came together as a family to make this happen. If there is a way to do it, the people in our area will find the way."

The Phase I work in the 1963 Math and Science Wing began in mid-May 2011 after the Class of 2011 completed its classes for the year. The remaining classes were relocated throughout the school, allowing Conewago Enterprises and its subcontractors to begin the demolition and rebuilding. In less than 100 days, the entire wing was gutted down to the cinderblock walls, concrete floors and steel roof and rebuilt with new electrical, plumbing and sprinkler systems, floors, drop ceilings, lighting and windows. The building was also rewired for internet connectivity within the infrastructure, rather than on the walls of the hallways. Each room received its own heating/air conditioning unit so that the 1963 Wing could be removed from the main boiler system, and numerous safety features were added to each room, including classroom doors that can be locked from the inside, and emergency shutoff systems for the gas and emergency showers and eyewash stations in the labs.

Any alumni that attended classes in the 1963 Wing will recognize most of the floor plan, with one notable exception. The wall between the old chemistry and physics labs, Rooms 119 and 121, was demolished, and two walls were installed creating Rooms 119, 121 and 123. By adding an additional lab on this floor, all of the rooms where science is taught are in the same area of the school for the first time in decades.

As part of the campaign, donors had the opportunity to take advantage of named gift opportunities. Several did, allowing for permanent recognition or a permanent memorial to friends and family members. Many of these individuals and families joined the Delone Catholic administration, faculty, staff, students, alumni, parents and friends on Sept. 21, 2011, as Most. Rev. Joseph P. McFadden, Bishop of Harrisburg, blessed and rededicated the 1963 Math and Science Wing.

"This is a building block," Bishop McFadden said in his remarks on that day. "As Dr. Thiec mentioned it takes a long time, but it's always good to have plans to go forward into the future. This is the first phase. There will be a second phase, and a third phase. I would suggest there will need to be a fourth phase and a fifth phase, a sixth phase because we can never get tired of adding more phases. Why? Because if we are adding more phases, it means that we are growing. If we are adding more phases, it means that there is something valuable that we want to hold onto and pass on to future generations."

Bishop McFadden blessed the 1963 Math and Science Wing knowing that it was the first step in a long-anticipated and long-term project to bring Delone Catholic's facilities in line with the talents of its faculty and staff. In spite of outdated facilities, generations of students had made do and cultivated their interests in math and science. They moved on to become widely-renowned doctors, biologists, chemists, mathematicians and engineers. Mrs. Patricia Marrocco, a member of the campaign cabinet and the chair of the science department recently spoke of how it is so much easier to encourage the interests of her students.

"I think students enjoy the curriculum more. We can use microscopes more. Before, it took days to do things with microscopes. We could only plug in four microscopes before we blew something. It makes lessons flow better. It takes less time, and we can cover more material with proper facilities."

The students and teachers also benefit from the new interactive projectors in each of the classrooms in the 1963 Wing. Teachers are able to use PowerPoint presentations to move more quickly through lessons and access and present relevant materials on the internet. Perhaps most exciting, the teachers can capture any notes written on the board in a given day and upload them to their class websites so that students who are absent have direct access to them.

"Since completing the Phase I project, observing teachers and classes has taken on a whole new meaning," Dr. Thiec said. "Math students are engaged via the interactive smart board. Lessons are saved to the website for easy review in class or for initial review if a student is absent. Science teachers have added labs with the new stations. Sharing of microscopes, stations, electrical outlets and Bunsen burners is now a thing of the past. Students are enjoying the high activity and hands-on learning."

Mrs. Marrocco's colleagues in the social studies department and in several religion classrooms will gain access to this same technology this summer. The 1940 Wing has served well as the academic home of every student to ever take a class at Delone Catholic, but it desperately needs to be restored after nearly 73 years on the job. The asbestos abatement in most of the 1940 Wing was completed in the summer of 2012. The bare concrete floors throughout the wing produced what has jokingly come to be known as the "Warehouse Chic" look, but it will allow demolition work to begin immediately this summer.

Following a similar schedule from Phase I, work will begin as soon as the Class of 2013 has finished its classes. The schedule for relocating the underclassmen has been made, and the necessary materials have been scheduled for delivery.

When the work is completed, 10 more classrooms will feature 21st century technology. Each room will have enough electrical outlets to appropriately run a classroom. All of the rooms, including those on the hottest floor in the building, will be climate controlled year-round. The kitchen for Family and Consumer Science classes will be brought up to date and gain new safety features. Additionally, all of the administrative functions will be consolidated onto the main floor of the 1940 Wing, and the offices will be reconfigured to better serve the needs of their occupants and visitors.

After many years of planning, another piece will be in place for the complete renewal of Delone Catholic High School. It would not have been possible to accomplish this without the financial support and prayer of the entire school family. Help is still needed to make the final push to reach the campaign total of more than \$2.8 million that will close out the 1963 and 1940 Wing renovations. As of March 1, approximately \$100,000.00 was needed to fully fund the project. There are numerous named gift opportunities (see sidebar for details) for donors who wish to make a permanent memorial. Gifts of any size will help make Delone Catholic the best school it can be for future generations of students, and any funds that remain will be used to renovate the 1955 Wing, the Old Gym and the Sheppard Gym and complete Delone's Diamond Decade Initiative.

"With the continued support of all of our constituencies and the new strategic plan being developed by the Board of Directors, we will continue to plan for the future," Dr. Thiec said, "not only in renovations beyond Phase II, but also in a plan of replacement when current equipment reaches its life expectancy."

BETH SNEERINGER CONTINUES GOLDEN TREND AT DELONE CATHOLIC

In May 2012, Miss Beth Sneeringer '96, became the fourth Delone Catholic High School teacher to receive the Diocese of Harrisburg's Golden Apple Award in as many years.

"It's been eye-opening to know that someone does appreciate the efforts and time we put into our work," Miss Sneeringer said. She becomes the second member of the Delone Catholic Mathematics Department to be honored in this way, joining Candy (Staub) Sneeringer '88, who won the Golden Apple Award in 2010.

Since joining the faculty at her alma mater in 2005, Miss Sneeringer has specialized in teaching Algebra, particularly to those students for whom mathematics can be most challenging. In addition to her teaching duties, Miss Sneeringer serves as the business manager of the *Delonian*, the school yearbook, the co-chair of the Accreditation for Growth (AFG) School Climate Committee, a member of the AFG Portfolio Objective committee and as a mentor teacher for new faculty members.

All of this hard work is not lost on her colleagues. Mrs. Jessica Reed, a foreign language teacher who nominated Miss Sneeringer for the Golden Apple Award, expressed her admiration in her nomination essay.

"Beth's sense of dedication to Delone Catholic is admirable. She spends time tutoring students both before and after school and is often one of the last people to leave the building. Beth is dedicated to Delone Catholic outside the classroom as well. She plays piano for school Liturgies and school musicals, is the chair of the Catholic Schools Week committee and a member of the Relay for Life committee. Beth can always be seen cheering on students at sporting events, applauding at fine arts productions and chaperoning dances. Indeed, her love for her alma mater is evident to any and all who know Beth."

Of course, the Diocese of Harrisburg's Golden Apple Award recognizes more than just outstanding work within the school's walls. It also recognizes those teachers who are dedicated to living and teaching the Catholic faith. In addition to her significant contributions to Delone Catholic High School, Miss Sneeringer is also a dedicated parishioner of Sacred Heart, Conewago. A Eucharistic minister, Miss Sneeringer is also active in music ministry, as a member of the choir and as an organist for several local parishes.

Her pastor, Rev. Lawrence J. McNeil says, "Beth goes the extra mile. She is involved as a volunteer in many parish and school activities. And all is done in the spirit of Christian joy."

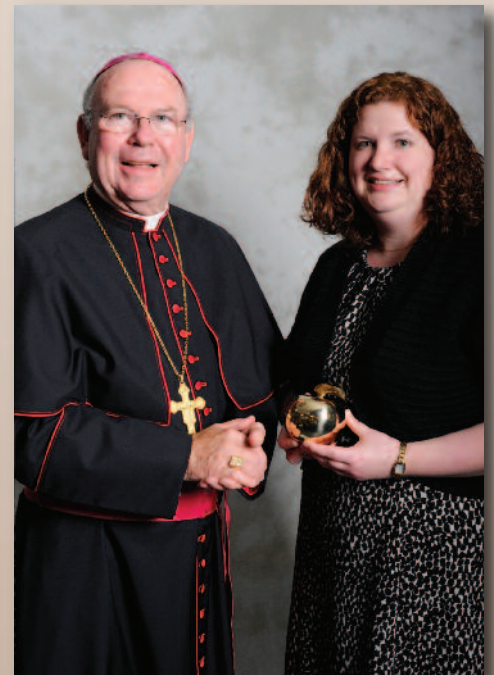
The Golden Apple Awards Program was first established through the generosity of the Donahue Family Foundation in the Diocese of Pittsburgh in 1992. The Diocese of Harrisburg was invited to participate in May of 2005. Since then, seven teachers have been chosen each year from schools throughout the Diocese to receive Golden Apple Awards, which includes a \$5,000 award check, a certificate of achievement, a gold apple and photos with the Bishop and the Secretary for Education.

Previously, three other Delone Catholic teachers have been awarded Golden Apple Awards – Mr. Brian Yealy '79 in 2009, Mrs. Sneeringer in 2010 and Miss Julia Tutino in 2011.

Of our most recent addition to that distinguished list, Principal Maureen C. Thiec, said, "Beth is truly deserving of this honor. She is a witness to our faith, a guiding light in our school and a gift to Delone Catholic."

The Delone Catholic Class of 2012 was offered a total of \$4,169,420 in scholarships and other monetary awards from colleges, universities and various other organizations. The per-student value of these awards is more than \$35,600. Congratulations to all!

On Friday, June 1, 2012, Delone Catholic celebrated its 72nd-Annual Commencement. Mrs. Livia Riley, Diocesan Superintendent for Education, presided over the ceremony, which featured the valedictory address from **Lynneah Smith** and the salutatory address from **Malorie Plank**. As the Class of 2012 leaves Delone Catholic, it swells the school's alumni ranks by 117 members. The class's four years of faith development culminated in the Baccalaureate Mass the previous evening at St. Joseph Church in Hanover. Most Rev. Joseph P. McFadden, Bishop of Harrisburg, was the principal celebrant of the Mass. He was joined by his brother priests from the Adams Deanery.

The awards ceremony was held immediately after the Baccalaureate Mass. Numerous guests and the DCHS administration were on hand to present awards to the graduates. BENEFACTORS FUND TUITION ASSISTANCE SCHOLARSHIPS AT DELONE CATHOLIC

The Delone Catholic High School administration and Board of Directors works very hard to keep tuition rates affordable for families who want a Catholic education for their children. In a time when it seems each paycheck needs to stretch farther, many families make tremendous sacrifices to choose Delone Catholic. Additionally, there are countless alumni and friends who believe strongly in the school and what it provides to its students. Several of them over the years have even taken the step of funding tuition assistance scholarships to help those who may not otherwise be able to send their children to Delone Catholic.

This year has been an exciting one on this front with three new scholarships being awarded for the first time. The endowed scholarships were established through two bequests and a gift from living donors.

Delone Catholic received a \$5,000 bequest from William F. Britcher '43, a retired carpenter and U.S. Postal Service worker who passed away on May 11, 2010. The scholarship bearing his name will be awarded each year to a Delone Catholic student with demonstrated financial need.

Donald H. Klunk '44 left Delone Catholic in December 1942 to serve his country in World War II. He returned to the Hanover area and worked as a plumber for many years. He and his wife, Lovie, have been generous benefactors to Delone Catholic for many years. They established the endowed Donald H. and Lovie F. Klunk Family Scholarship which provides tuition assistance to an incoming freshman at Delone Catholic. Each recipient is adjudged by the principal of his or her grade school to have adequate academic standing, and should have demonstrated financial need. Preference is given to a graduate of Annunciation B.V.M. School, McSherrystown.

The final new scholarship fund resulted from a bequest of more than \$225,000 from Louis B. Toler '49. Mr. Toler spent part of his youth living at the Paradise Rectory in Abbottstown, Pa. After high school, he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps and served for three years. Following

his return to civilian life, he missed the military. Mr. Toler joined the Air Force and served his country in the meteorology field for 20 years. He was a veteran of both the Korean and Vietnam Conflicts. He passed away on Aug. 12, 2009. His gift is one of the largest bequests ever received by Delone Catholic, and it has helped the school in numerous ways. The Louis B. Toler Scholarship will be awarded each year to a Delone Catholic student with demonstrated financial need. Preference will be given to a student who is a member of Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish, Abbottstown, St. Aloysius Parish, Littlestown, or St. Joseph the Worker Parish, Bonneauville. Additionally, The Louis B. Toler Science Scholarship, first awarded at the Class of 2012 Senior Awards Ceremony, will be given each year to a graduating senior who plans to pursue a post-secondary degree in science or a related field, with preference given to students majoring in meteorology. Mr. Toler's bequest was also instrumental in the completion of Delone's Diamond Decade Initiative Phase I. The Louis B. Toler '49 Chemistry Lab has been named in his memory.

Delone Catholic is tremendously grateful that these people have chosen to invest in the futures of our students. DCBN TAKES DELONE CATHOLIC TO VIEWERS AROUND THE WORLD

For generations, conversations among Delone Catholic alumni have turned to their nostalgia for Friday night football at J.T. Flaherty Field. They have said to each other, "Boy, I miss going to those basketball games in the Sheppard Gym!" Out-of-town family members and those who cannot get tickets have said, "I really wish I could have seen my nieces and nephews receive their diplomas."

These are no longer just unfulfilled wishes of homesick alumni and aunts and uncles who live in the Midwest. The Delone Catholic Broadcast Network (DCBN) has been bringing athletic events, graduation and other selected school events to those who cannot make it back to McSherrystown since August 2011. It has also allowed participants to relive all the action later after the excitement has died down.

Dan Colgan '87, owner of TownM Video and Computer in McSherrystown, approached the Delone Catholic administration in 2010 about using the available technology to take Delone Catholic to those who are not able to come to Delone Catholic. After hearing his proposal, the school decided to seize the opportunity.

"While Delone Catholic is a huge part of my past, I see the potential for the future," Colgan said. "It's one thing to say I believe in Delone, but people have to step up and do things. They have to put their money and their time where their mouth is. I wanted to be involved with Delone without having the education to be a teacher. This is the school that gave me the tools that, with the sacrifices and guidance of my parents, made me what I am today. For years I've been out living my life, and I saw an opportunity to give back to the place that gave me the confidence to do these things. I'm thrilled that this is growing and is something people enjoy."

The first trial run of athletics on DCBN took place with the 2010 Delone Catholic varsity football game against Hanover, a "for-internal-use-only" broadcast that was designed to see what it would take to make this endeavor a success.

With a growing corps of volunteers and determination to overcome some early technological glitches and scheduling conflicts caused by horrible weather during the 2011 football season, DCBN has gained a foothold as the go-to source for Squire and Squirette fans across the country and around the world.

Through the dedication of the volunteers and the generosity of sponsors, the original plan called for the entire regular season

home schedules for the varsity football and boys' and girls' basketball teams to be broadcast in 2011-12. Other sports and events were made available as schedules and facilities permitted.

"DCBN could not have become a reality without people like Mark Lookenbill '89, Eric Lawrence '98, Tom Reese '90 and Kathy (Hufnagle) Roat '83, who seized on the idea and gave so much of themselves to make it become a reality. You can imagine the hands it takes to pull off a live production, and we did it together step by step."

As word got out that the games were available online, DCBN gained in popularity to the point that alumni and fans were eager to see postseason games as well. Because broadcast outlets are charged a rights fee for playoff games, additional sponsors stepped up, and the DCBN crew hit the road to broadcast the football team's District 3 playoff game at Trinity and to follow the basketball teams all over Eastern Pennsylvania for District 3 and PIAA playoff games.

All the while, Colgan and Delone Catholic administrators were receiving feedback from viewers as far away as Hawaii and Ukraine, saying how grateful alumni and families of the student-athletes were to be able to see the games. Emails even came in from fans of opposing schools, saying they were watching while out of town on business and were pleasantly surprised by the professionalism and objectivity of the broadcasts.

The highlight of DCBN in year one, however, was the broadcast of the Class of 2012 graduation. Athletics is the most readily-available content for broadcast, but the long-term vision for DCBN calls for the broadcast of various academic programming and other special events.

"Athletics is a big part of Delone Catholic," Colgan said, "but people need to hear about all of the great things that happen in the classroom too. Because Delone Catholic is a partner in DCBN, we are able to get the message out in the way the school wants it to be heard without the time constraints and high costs of traditional television and radio advertising."

DCBN has continued to grow by leaps and bounds in 2012-13. The broadcast has added the ability to do remote interviews on the field during football season. However, the most exciting additions have come with added content. The logistics were far from simple, but DCBN was able to carry the first-ever varsity home games for the boys' and girls' soccer programs. The field hockey program's senior night game at J.T. Flaherty Field was broadcast live, and girls' volleyball and wrestling were added to the mix.

DCBN was able to capitalize on the success of two of Delone Catholic's teams this season as well. The Network broadcast live the PIAA Class AA Girls' Volleyball Championship match between Delone Catholic and Fort Le Boeuf in November, and followed that with the Squires' District 3 Class A Football Championship win over Steelton-Highspire at Hersheypark Stadium and the double-overtime thriller in the PIAA Class A Quarterfinal

loss to Bellwood-Antis at Mansion Park Stadium in Altoona, Pa

"Being able to carry those three events did more to raise the awareness of DCBN's existence than any amount of advertising we could have done on the Delone Catholic and TownM websites and Facebook," Colgan said. "We had always hoped to eventually broadcast a game at Hersheypark Stadium, but to do the volleyball state championship match and the state playoff football game in Altoona this early in the process was something that we were very excited about and extremely proud of."

Now that DCBN is established and there is a format for how to do this, Colgan hopes to continue to recruit volunteers, both from the ranks of the alumni and friends of Delone Catholic, as well as current students. It will also take more sponsors for DCBN to be all that it can be.

"DCBN hasn't even begun to reach its potential," Colgan said. "We have done this over the past two years with a core group of four or five people, but in order to reach its potential, we need other volunteers to contribute to their special area of the school, sport or activity so that we can bring even more programming to air. There are many on-air and on-camera roles, but we also need a lot of help behind the scenes. This is a great opportunity for our alumni to give back and help Delone Catholic connect with alumni who can't make it back to McSherrystown. As great as that is, I see DCBN as an unlimited educational opportunity for students who are interested in communications and broadcasting careers. We can accomplish our goals of reconnecting with alumni and showcasing the talents of our students while giving other students a head start in preparation for college and the real world."

KENWORTHY INDUCTED INTO MAC HALL OF FAME

Robert B. Kenworthy '54 was inducted into the Middle Atlantic Conference Hall of Fame on May 1, 2012. The Conference kicked off its celebration of 100 years of intercollegiate athletics in the conference by honoring student-athletes, coaches, administration and faculty or staff from conference schools who have demonstrated success in athletics, academics and in the community. Kenworthy, who served as the Sports Information Director at Gettysburg College from 1959-99, was one of 36 people chosen as members of the inaugural hall of fame class. Gettysburg was a member of the conference until it joined the Centennial Conference as a charter member in 1993-94.

Kenworthy served as the sports editor of the *Gettysburgian* and the sports director of the campus radio station at Gettysburg while working toward a degree in English, which he earned in 1959. Several months later, he became the College's first Sports Information Director. Over his 40 years in the field, he was known for his dedication to his institution and to its student-athletes and coaches as he blazed a trail in the Sports Information industry.

In addition to professional excellence, Kenworthy has long been noted for being a dedicated community servant and a genuinely good person. He and his colleagues from other schools around the country set the course for the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), an organization that honored him with its Warren Berg Award in 1989 and induction into its Hall of Fame in 1990. Kenworthy also received the Irving T. Marsh Service Bureau Award from ECAC-SIDA in 1991, and he was inducted into the South Central Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame in 1994. Perhaps most impressive, ECAC-SIDA presents the Bob Kenworthy Award to a person or organization for contributions to the mission of ECAC-SIDA, and CoSIDA annually presents the Bob Kenworthy Community Service Award for civic involvement outside the athletic communications profession.

St. Francis Xavier Parish in Gettysburg and Delone Catholic High School have been the benefactors of much of Kenworthy's effort outside of his professional life. He has been an active member of the parish for many years. He has also served Delone Catholic in numerous capacities, notably as a member of the Board of Directors from 1999-2002 and the campaign chair of Delone's Diamond Decade Initiative Phase I.

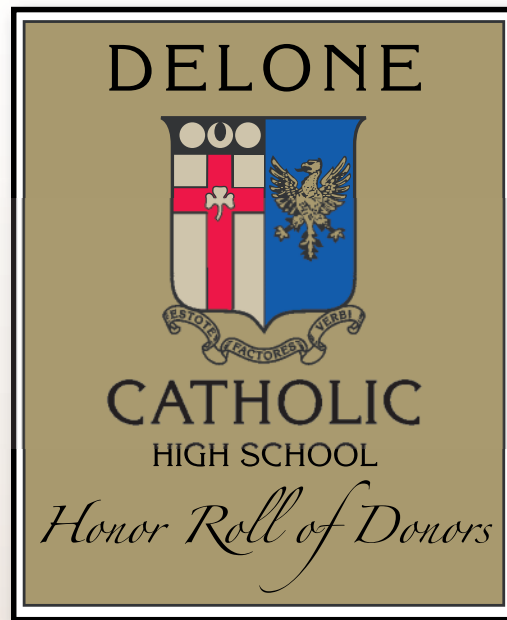

Donald B. Smith, Sr. '46 (1928-2012)

Donald B. Smith, Sr., began his freshman year at Delone Catholic in the fall of 1942. Like many teenagers of that era, he was forced to leave school and go to work in support of his family. In 1948, Mr. Smith founded Donald B. Smith Roofing, and in 1956, he founded Conewago Contractors. Over the next 40-plus years, he built both into well-respected businesses that continue to thrive under the leadership of his children and the children of his brother, Joseph P. "Pat" Smith '52.

While establishing highly successful businesses, Donald and Pat were both influential in many areas of the Delone Catholic community, within the Church and the McSherrystown-Hanover community as a whole. Through their generosity, leadership and expertise in the many aspects of construction, the school was maintained and improved in ways large and small.

One of the last major projects with which Donald B. Smith, Sr., was involved was Delone's Diamond Decade Initiative Phase I. He served as the campaign's Honorary Chair, assisting where he was able with soliciting gifts and helping to ensure the campaign's success. He and his wife, Alice (Smith) Smith '54 have been incredibly generous members of the community for decades, and their children and grandchildren have followed their example.

SPORTS ROUNDUP

Moore Sets Marks, Collects Honors

It was apparent very early in her career that Sierra Moore '12 was destined for lofty athletic accomplishments at Delone Catholic. She reached individual heights that no player in the history of Delone Catholic or YAIAA basketball ever has and earned numerous district and state medals in track and field.

In four years, she helped the Squirettes to a 95-25 record with two third-place finishes and two runner-up finishes in the PIAA District 3 Class AA tournament. The team also reached the PIAA Class AA quarterfinals in all four years and the semifinals twice.

During her senior season, Moore averaged 21.6 points per game, including a career-high 39 against Lancaster Catholic on Feb. 4. She became just the second Delone Catholic basketball player, male or female, to eclipse 2,000 career points. On Jan. 3, she became the Squirettes' all-time leading scorer, passing Meredith Cox '06 and her 2,097 points. With a career total of 2,595 points, Moore also became the YAIAA all-time leading scorer of either gender.

Following the season, Moore was locally named the Evening Sun All-Area Girls' Basketball Player of the Year, the *Gettysburg Times* All-Times Player of the Year and *York Daily Record/Sunday News* Girls' Division III/IV Basketball Player of the Year. She was also named to the Associated Press PIAA Class AA All-State Girls' Basketball Team for the fourth time, including the third time as a first-team selection, and she was the Class AA Player of the Year. Moore was named the 2012 Gatorade Girls Hoop Pennsylvania Player of the Year and finished her high school

career on Mar. 28, 2012, in the McDonald's High School All-America game at the United Center in Chicago, Ill.

Moore's career on the track was nearly as impressive. She helped the Squirettes to their first two District 3 Class AA championships in 2009 and 2010, earning five individual medals plus a gold in the 4x100 relay in 2009 and silver in the same event in 2010. She claimed the 100-meter dash gold in 2010 and medaled twice at the PIAA meet in those years. She took her junior year off to focus on basketball and returned as a senior to place second in the

100 and fourth in the 400 at the district meet. Moore was named the 2012 *York Daily Record/Sunday News* Division III Girls' Track and Field Athlete of the Year and to the 2012 *Evening Sun* All-Area Girls' Track and Field First Team.

An outstanding student as well, Moore was named 2012 Hanover Rotary Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year and 2012 Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year at the *Gettysburg Times* Sports Banquet. She received a scholarship to play basketball for ACC powerhouse Duke University in Durham, N.C.

2011-12 Boys' Basketball

The third-seeded Squires (18-9, 11-4 YAIAA IV) blew out their quarterfinal and semifinal opponents in the 2012 PIAA District 3 Class AA tournament. Their 19-point win over second-seeded Columbia was especially impressive, and it set up a third meeting with YAIAA Division IV rival and top seed York Catholic in the District 3 title game. The Fighting Irish had handled the Squires twice in the regular season by a combined 29 points. That did not deter a Delone Catholic squad searching for its first district championship since 1985 and second overall. The Squires won a 43-39 overtime thriller, giving long-time head coach Jim Dooley the first district championship of his career, which spans four schools and more than four decades. The season came to an end against Imhotep Charter in the first round of the PIAA Class AA tournament.

Brett Smith '13 earned a spot on the *Evening Sun* All-Area Boys' Basketball Team and the *York Daily Record/Sunday News* Boys' Division III/IV Basketball All-Star Team. Seth Bullers '12 was a second-team honoree by both papers. Smith also gained second-team notice on the 2012 Associated Press PIAA Class AA All-State Boys' Basketball Team.

2011-12 Girls' Basketball

The Squirettes (23-6, 11-2 YAIAA IV) reached the PIAA Class AA quarterfinals for the ninth time in 11 years, and won at least 20 games for the 10th time in 12 seasons. Their 2012

The Squires (3-11, 1-7 YAIAA II) again struggled as a team with depth issues. They picked up their lone division win of the season on Dec. 13 against York Tech. They defeated York Tech again and took down York Suburban to finish 2-3 at the York Suburban Duals.

In the District 3 Class AA Section I tournament, Joe Post '14 (170 lbs.) and Matt Lentz '13 (182 lbs.) placed fourth. Alex Little '15 (126 lbs.) and Josh Sneeringer '15 (145 lbs.) earned sixth-place finishes. Post moved onto the District 3 Class AA tournament, but did not place.

The Squires (18-6, 12-3 YAIAA IV) won the YAIAA Division IV championship outright, but early-season results did not indicate that outcome. Delone Catholic started out 3-4 with a pair of two-game losing streaks after not having consecutive

losses even once in 2011. However, a 14-game winning streak turned the season around. The last victory was a five-inning, 11-1 win against Littlestown in the YAIAA semifinals, allowing the Squires to host the league championship game for the first time. Riding an outstanding pitching performance, West York blanked the hosts, 4-0. The Squires then picked up a win against Boiling Springs in the PIAA District 3 quarterfinals before falling to Brandywine Heights in the semifinals to end the season.

Brett Smith '13 was named to 2012 *Evening Sun* All-Area Baseball First Team for the second year in a row and tacked on Player of the Year honors. With his senior year still to be played, he already owns the Delone Catholic record for career hits, surpassing Joe Kotula '02. Seth Bullers '12 gained second-team honors from the *Evening Sun*.

2012 Softball

Just two seasons after going 3-15 and being shut out six times, the Squirettes (12-5, 12-3 YAIAA IV) have completely turned around their fortunes. They opened the season with eight consecutive victories en route to a YAIAA Division IV title. Delone Catholic had not won a softball division title since winning Division II in 2001 and 2002. The Squirettes also finished the regular season on a three-game winning streak. They fell to Littlestown in the YAIAA semifinals and then to Annville-Cleona in PIAA District 3 Class AA quarterfinal. It was the second year in a row that the Squirettes reached the district playoffs.

Following the campaign, the team piled up numerous individual accolades. Deanna Laughman '14 was named the *York Daily Record/Sunday News* Division IV Softball Co-Player of the Year for the second straight year. She, Casara McCleaf '13 and Tayler Schussler '13 all received first-team honors. Ariel Price '13 and Shayna Rider '15 made the second team, and Rachel Heuisler '12 received honorable mention. Head coach Don Smith '64 was named Coach of the Year one year after sharing the honor. Laughman and Schussler were named to the 2012 *Evening Sun* All-Area Softball First Team, while McCleaf was a second-team honoree.

Ugarte and Wierman were on the second team, and the jumping duo was also named to the 2012 *York Daily Record/Sunday News* Division III Girls' Track and Field All-Star Team. 2012 Boys' and Girls' Cross Country

The cross country teams were both outstanding in 2012, sweeping the YAI AA Division III championships with 6-0 records in league meets. The season came to an end against Hamburg in the first round of the PIAA District 3 Class AA playoffs.

Five different players earned postseason recognition. Casara McCleaf '13 and Tayler Schussler '13 were named to the 2012 *York Daily Record/Sunday News* Division III Field Hockey All-Star Team. Becky Henn '13 was the Player of Year. Henn and Megan McGregor '13 were named to the 2012 *Evening Sun* All-Area Field Hockey First Team. Head coach John Henn earned Coach of the Year from both publications.

2012 Football

In early October, the Squires (9-4, 7-2 YAIAA III) found themselves 3-3 and at a crossroads concerning a possible postseason berth. They pounded the last four opponents in the regular season by an average score of 43-18 to claim the top seed in PIAA District 3 Class A playoffs. The Squires then continued their winning streak through the district title game, dropping Columbia, 28-16, and Steelton-Highspire, 28-13, at Hersheypark Stadium. The win was the eighth district championship in program history, and the first time the Squires had ever beaten Steelton-Highspire after going 0-4 against the Rollers from 1978-81 as members of the South Central League. By winning the district championship, Delone Catholic also qualified for the PIAA playoffs for the seventh time. The Squires put together the program's most impressive showing at the state level, pushing District 6 champion Bellwood-Antis to two overtimes before dropping a 33-26 heartbreaker.

The team played its best football of the year in the postseason, led by linebacker Austin Noel '13, who had 36 of his team-high 153 tackles during the postseason on his way to 2012 Pennsylvania Sports Writers' Class A All-State Team honors. Running back Lance Reneker '13 carried the ball 41 times for 237 yards and a touchdown while battling injuries that limited his playing time. Backfield mate Matt Giuffreda '14 added a breakout performance with 59 carries for 326 yards and four touchdowns. Quarterback/safety Brett Smith '13 turned in one of the most impressive individual efforts ever for the Squires. In the three playoff games, he was 14-for-26 for 231 yards and two passing touchdowns against just one interception and rushed for another 142 yards and four touchdowns, while intercepting six passes from his safety spot, including a 78-yard touchdown return in the fourth quarter to seal the district championship.

Members of the team collected a host of postseason honors. Highlights included first-team All-Area honors on defense from the *Evening Sun* for both Noel and Smith. Smith was named the publication's player of the year. Noel capped an amazing transition from defensive end to linebacker by playing in the Blue-Gray National All-Star Classic at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Fla., on Jan. 12, 2013.

The Squirettes took a 2-0 lead on Pope John Paul II, but needed to go to a fifth set to improve to 27-0 and advance to the state championship for the second time in school history. They joined the 2001 squad as the only Delone Catholic volleyball teams to achieve that feat. In the state final against Fort LeBoeuf, the Bison dominated the first set, and the Squirettes bounced back with a commanding set two performance. The third and fourth sets were tremendously competitive, with Fort LeBoeuf finding a way to take gold.

The individual honors followed closely on the heels of the team's success. Hannah Lawrence '14, Allie Mondorff '13 and Cambria Wierman '14 were all named to the Pennsylvania Volleyball Coaches' Association Class AA All-State Team. Mondorff and head coach Jason Leppo were named *Evening Sun* All-Area Girls' Volleyball and *York Daily Record/Sunday News* YAI AA Division III Girls' Volleyball All-Star Player of the Year and Coach of the Year, respectively.

DELONE CATHOLIC STUDENTS IMPROVE THE COMMUNITY

Students at Delone Catholic are challenged every day to “Be Doers of the Word.” Many of them take the challenge head on and use their time and energy to give back to the local, national and international communities. In the last 18 months, Delone Catholic students have chosen ways large and small to make a difference in the lives of their neighbors locally and globally.

Cappella’s Belly Buster Challenge

Participants of the Cappella’s Belly Buster Challenge representing Delone Catholic High School and the Conewago Valley School District, gathered at Cappella’s Pizzeria Ristorante on April 13, 2012 to present a check for more than \$1,000 to New Oxford High School Principal Kevin Thomas. Mr. Thomas accepted the check on behalf of the families of the five students from New Oxford High School who were killed in a car accident in December 2011.

Six two-person teams from both New Oxford and Delone Catholic participated in a preliminary round on Dec. 3, 2011. The teams had one hour to eat as much of a 24-slice Belly Buster pizza as they could. The winning team from each school advanced to the finals, which were originally scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 10. Derek Starner, an eighth grade teacher at New Oxford Middle School, and Brock Hartman, one of his students, bested the New Oxford competition, while Delone Catholic seniors Mike Franz ’12 and Kollin Ott ’12 advanced. The pledges collected by all competing teams were originally to be split 60-40, with the larger share going to the champion’s school, and to be used for each school’s purposes.

Tragically, five students from New Oxford High School died in a car accident on Dec. 5, 2011. Administrators from both schools agreed that postponing the Belly Buster championship was the right thing to do. The championship was rescheduled for Saturday, Feb. 11, 2012, and the New Oxford pairing of Starner and Hartman took the crown. In the interim, several of the Delone Catholic student participants had suggested that the proceeds should be given to the families affected by the car accident.

Sleepout for the Homeless

On May 9, 2012 students from the Delone Catholic Interact Club presented a check for \$2,700 to Mrs. Carol Hinkle from the Hanover Area Council of Churches. The funds were the proceeds from the annual Sleepout for the Homeless, which was held on April 27, 2012. A group of 26 students individually solicited donations and as a group solicited passing motorists on South Oxford Avenue that evening. They then spent the night outside in freezing temperatures to increase awareness of the plight of local homeless people.

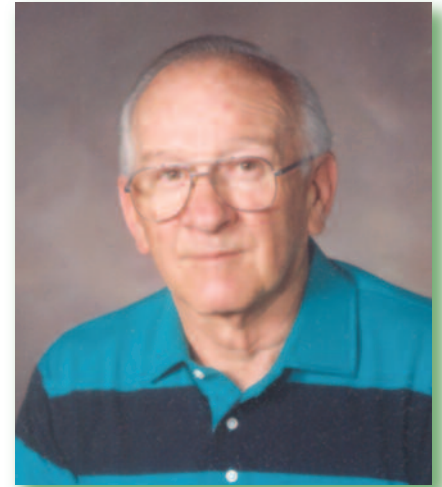

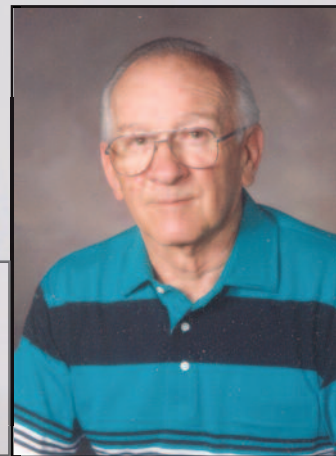
