Dear Alumni, Parents and Friends of Delone Catholic High School,

The 2013-14 school year opened to the luxury of air-conditioned classrooms, interactive projectors and golden opportunities for works of mercy hours to move two floors of classrooms and offices. It would take another two weeks before the lower floor would be finished. Then too, more golden opportunities to move furniture, arrange book shelves, unpack boxes of supplies and above all, teach the students. We survived those early weeks and now are basking in the coolness or warmth, depending on the weather, of our new surroundings. The sunlight filters through the blinds, stimulating the minds of the students and the leaves of the plants. We are all growing in the goodness of God and the generosity of all in reaching the near completion of Phase II.

Golden opportunities, we find these around us every day. That one small gesture, that one kind word, that one prayer uttered for the one most in need of our prayers, are the day-to-day golden moments. By God's grace, sometimes these golden moments are those that can be shared by a team, by a class, by a school. Delone Catholic High School was blest to celebrate many of these golden moments throughout the 2012-13 school year. The athletic teams earned five District gold medals making history for these accomplishments all in one year. Four individuals earned District gold in their performances. The volleyball team earned a State silver medal.

The golden moment for me happened at the Hersheypark Stadium. The football team had won the game and the gold medal. Before the celebration, before accepting their reward, and before greeting the cheering crowd, three seniors took the game ball, walked to a wheelchair in the far corner of the stadium and handed the ball to its occupant. Mrs. Neitz received the ball with tears in her eyes as her son, Jack, and two of his senior teammates took it upon themselves to award this honor to a woman who was fighting so hard to overcome cancer. She did it once before but the disease came back with a vengeance and took her life in July. Delone Catholic High School and St. Francis Xavier Parish and Youth Group lost more gold than we could ever have imagined when God called her home.

Personally, the golden outpouring of love and support as God called my Mother home in September has affected me. The cards, Mass cards, flowers, fruit baskets and baked goods touched my family and me deeply. The presence of members of the faculty and staff at the viewing and funeral reminded me that we are a family supporting one another. Traveling no small distance, their presence meant more than gold. The Memorial Mass offered at St. Joseph Parish added another golden moment when members of the community joined us in this celebration of life. These moments can be summed up in Matthew 11:28-30, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

Thanksgiving is upon us. We remember all the good gifts we have received as a school and as individuals. We have received riches much more than gold. Thank you to God for His many blessings. Thank you to all of you who receive this publication as you have shared golden moments with us and continue to share your prayers and golden treasures to make all things possible. As John F. Kennedy said, "As we express our gratitude, we must never forget that the highest appreciation is not to utter words, but to live by them." May we, the family of Delone Catholic, live by our words.

A GOLD RUSH IN MCSHERRYSTOWN

Squires and Squirettes Rule District 3 in 2012-13

During the 2012-13 academic year, Delone Catholic's student-athletes captured a medal haul usually reserved for the top countries in the Olympic games. Five teams and four individuals were crowned champions of PIAA District 3 in their respective sports. Included in the winnings were some program firsts and an unprecedented combination of success.

District championships are always among the goals for the Squires and Squirettes, but never before have they won with such frequency in the same year.

"Growing up here at Delone Catholic and coaching baseball for 20 years, I've seen the success," said DCHS Athletic Director Dave Lawrence '69. "It has almost become expected for our programs to be successful. It seems like different programs are always on top, but it has never happened all at one time like this."

The girls' cross country team got things started, winning its first PIAA District 3 Class A team championship. At that same event, Kate Mowrey '16 won the individual girls' title, and Nick Poole '13 took individual gold in the boys' race. Poole set the pace for a silver medal effort by the Squires.

Following quickly on the heels of the cross country teams, the girls' volleyball team won its first district championship since 1999 and ninth overall before continuing its march to the PIAA Class AA silver medal. The football program added another chapter to its storied history, winning its eighth District 3 championship and first since 2007.

As fall turned to winter, a new group of teams donned the black and gold, but the level of success was just as impressive. The boys' basketball team earned its second consecutive District 3 Class AA championship and third overall. The girls' basketball team came up just short of another gold medal, falling in the championship game. In the pool, Victoria Griffin '13 captured not one, but two gold medals, winning the 100- and 200- yard freestyle events. She would go on to place second and third, respectively, in the same events at the PIAA Class AA meet.

With the winter in the books, the stage was set for the Squires to do something that no other school in the history of District 3 had ever done. The baseball team's first-ever District 3 title gave Delone Catholic championships in football, boys' basketball and baseball in the same academic year.

"We have great kids who are very dedicated," Lawrence said, "and great coaches who give so much of their time to get the best from their kids. I am always amazed at the alumni who are so eager to return to Delone Catholic and help the next generation of students. You just can't say enough about all of these people who work so hard to be the best."

PAT MARROCCO JOINS GOLDEN ORCHARD AT DELONE CATHOLIC

When the Golden Apple Award program came to the Diocese of Harrisburg, it could have easily been assumed that it would be uncommon for a single school to have numerous winners in succession. With only seven awards given each year to teachers from among the hundreds at seven high schools and 33 elementary schools, what has happened at Delone Catholic is truly remarkable.

Pat Marrocco earned the award in May 2013, marking the fifth year in a row that a member of the Delone Catholic faculty has been honored. McSherrystown is quickly becoming the Golden Orchard of the Diocese of Harrisburg.

"I was actually astounded (to find out I would receive the award) because of all those who had preceded me," Mrs. Marrocco said. "I didn't think Delone Catholic would get five in a row, and I hadn't been here as long as they all had. I was just trying to do my best to help our students with the material each day."

Mrs. Marrocco, who is the chair of the Science Department, took a more roundabout path to teaching than many of her colleagues.

"My interest in science came from growing up on a farm and wondering about things. How does it work? Why does it work?" Mrs. Marrocco said. "It blossomed from there into health care. I have a degree in medical technology, and I worked in a hospital for a while. I stayed at home to raise my daughters, and it is very hard to get back into medical technology because the technology passes you by. I volunteered with the pre-school that my daughters attended, and eventually was hired as the director there. I got into teaching there. I liked the teaching aspect, and that planted the seed. When my girls graduated from Delone Catholic, I missed the interaction with teenagers, so I thought I would use my degree again. I took courses and got my teaching certification."

Mrs. Marrocco has a unique ability to reach a wide range of students wherever they are when they come into her classroom.

"In the classroom, she has motivated even the most challenging student to aspire to success in science," Delone Catholic principal Dr. Maureen Thiec said. "She has raised the bar for science education in Biology II, working with students individually who want to continue in science careers. She has also taught fundamental level courses and has generated a thirst for all things science that is not quenched until all answers are found."

As much as she is known for her outstanding work in the classroom, Mrs. Marrocco has an equally well-earned reputation as a club moderator, volunteer and supporter of her students in their extracurricular activities. She is the moderator of the Interact Club whose mission "is to extend to high school students opportunities to participate in service projects to enhance the lives of those in the community and thus their own lives." She also serves as a faculty representative to the Parent Teacher Organization and started a paper recycling program at Delone Catholic to help reduce waste in our landfills. Mrs. Marrocco's presence at sporting events, concerts and drama productions also helps the students to identify with her in the classroom.

"No matter what I was doing in life, I was always involved," Mrs. Marrocco said. "Giving back is a part of me. The students need to see you outside of the school day setting. They need to experience things outside the classroom, and if we (teachers) don't do it, there might not be anyone else who will. I just think it is part of the job to be honest with you."

Mrs. Marrocco and the six other recipients were presented with their Golden Apple Awards at a banquet at the Cardinal Keeler Center in Harrisburg on May 14. Delone Catholic's four previous Golden Apple Award recipients are Mr. Brian Yealy '79 in 2009, Mrs. Candy (Staub) Sneeringer '88 in 2010, Mrs. Julia Fuhrman in 2011 and Miss Beth Sneeringer '96 in 2012.

The Golden Apple Awards Program was first established through the generosity of the Donahue Family Foundation in the Diocese of Pittsburgh in 1992. The Diocese of Harrisburg was invited to participate in May of 2005. Since then, seven teachers have been chosen each year from schools throughout the Diocese to receive Golden Apple Awards, which includes a \$5,000 award check, a certificate of achievement, a gold apple and photos with the Bishop and the Secretary for Education.

So many teachers at Delone Catholic go well beyond their job descriptions to make a difference in the lives of their students. According to Dr. Thiec, Mrs. Marrocco is definitely one of those teachers.

"If we speak about the culture and climate of the school, Mrs. Marrocco has been an example of creating a school of community, of caring, of family," Dr. Thiec said. "This school has changed for the better since she has become a faculty member. Mrs. Marrocco is our Mary Poppins who has opened our eyes to what is truly important in our roles as teachers and 'Doers of the Word.'"

JAMES NUZZO ORDAINED TO PERMANENT DIACONATE

Delone Catholic High School's administrators and faculty members have always stressed life-long learning to their students. They also stress life-long growth in the students' relationship with God and openness to new callings, whether they be personal, professional or spiritual. James Nuzzo '86 recently took a significant step in answering a spiritual call when he was ordained to the permanent diaconate for the Archdiocese of Baltimore on May 11.

"I always felt that I had a vocation to the Church, but I didn't know what it was," Deacon Nuzzo said. "Discovering what it was was a process. Getting married obviously ruled out the priesthood, and I have a wonderful wife. We were involved in lay ministry in our parish. That kind of let me look into it. Part of the whole process is figuring out 'is this really something you want to do?' It started as a general desire to serve the Church, and as I went along, it got narrowed to the diaconate."

So many vocations are nurtured in the home, whether or not the individual who receives the calling realizes it. Deacon Nuzzo and his siblings, Joseph Nuzzo '84 and Lenore (Nuzzo) Kornreich '89, were born in New York and spent their early childhoods in a small-town setting where they had a lot of independence to play with their friends. When the family moved to Maryland, they settled in a more rural area, and the already-close siblings grew even closer. Through the changes, Deacon Nuzzo said that faith was the unchanging cornerstone of his childhood.

"Our faith was very important to both parents," Deacon Nuzzo said. "We could see them living their faith."

That faith played a big part in the family's choosing Delone Catholic for their high school education, and even 30 years ago, bus transportation in Maryland was a major factor in making Delone Catholic the ideal choice for many Maryland families.

"Delone Catholic was significantly cheaper and closer, or as close as the Baltimore schools," Deacon Nuzzo said. "They had buses that came to St. John's in Westminster, so we only had to go 10 miles there instead of 30 to Baltimore. It was kind of a no-brainer. It was cheaper, more convenient and as good or better of a school."

Once he got to McSherrystown, Deacon Nuzzo found where he fit in with his classmates, and shares similar memories of Delone Catholic to those of four generations of alumni.

"Overall I really enjoyed my time," Deacon Nuzzo said. "When you are coming of age, you have your ups and downs. You start out at 14, and you are completely different by the time you are 18. Your personality and maturity level can change dramatically. Academically, I was probably average. I learned a lot and I was prepared when I went to college, especially when I looked at myself in comparison to my peers. What I really remember is all of the laughs and jokes with my buddies. It was a great sense of community."

The preparation he received at Delone Catholic led to an associate's degree at Villa Julie College (now Stevenson University), in Stevenson, Md., a double major in history and economics at Towson State University in Towson, Md., and a Master of Business Administration from Mount St. Mary's University in Emmitsburg, Md. Deacon Nuzzo made several stops in his professional career, but did not find the right fit, particularly in the banking industry, which led to a major change.

"At that time, my brother was beginning to buy out our father's share of the family business, so I went in as a partner with my brother," Deacon Nuzzo said. "We now work together at Joseph Michael Septic Cleaning, Inc. We clean and maintain septic systems and drains."

In his personal life, Deacon Nuzzo has been married to his wife, Joy, for 13 years. Together they are raising two children, Joey, age seven, and Judy Marie, four. Many people would look at their life as a business owner, husband and father and think, "That's enough." For Deacon Nuzzo, he continued to feel the call to service of the Church. He described a process that is designed to make sure a candidate for the diaconate truly has a vocation and is committed to it.

"You have to be married for six years, if you are married, before you can be a deacon," he said. "While I was waiting out that period, Joy and I took the prerequisite classes together. It is a four-year program. The first part is called Aspirancy. It is the equivalent of a year-long retreat-slash-job interview

On Friday, May 31, 2013, Delone Catholic celebrated its 73rd-Annual Commencement. Rev. Msgr. James M. Lyons, V.F., pastor of St. Joseph Parish, Hanover, and Dean of the Adams Deanery, presided over the ceremony, which featured the valedictory address from **Samuel Edwards** and the salutatory address from **Therese La Fleur**. As the Class of 2013 leaves Delone Catholic, it swells the school's alumni ranks by 128 members. The class's four years of faith development culminated in the Baccalaureate Mass the previous evening at St. Joseph Church in Hanover. Rev. Lawrence J. when you are discerning. They are also evaluating you to see if this person is stable and here for the right reasons, to see if this person is someone they should commit the time and resources to forming. They also did a psychological assessment. During the summer, you find out if you will go forward with the program. We started with 24. Seventeen of us began the academic preparation the next fall. The semesters were the same length as college semesters – 16 weeks. We would meet on Saturdays, eight times per semester for eight hours.

“The second year was an institutional internship. Some served in hospitals and prisons. I worked in a nursing home. That was 8-10 hours a week as well. One stretch in June of that year, I worked 22 straight days between my job, classes and the internship. The next year is a parish internship, where you write homilies and serve in a parish. It could get a little hectic if being a deacon wasn't something you really wanted to do. After that, you spent the last four months before ordination serving in your home parish. The parish internship is not served in your home parish. They kind of divorce you from your home parish for that year to help you understand that you are now serving the Archdiocese of Baltimore and the Church at large, not just the local Church.”

As his discernment came to a close and ordination approached, Deacon Nuzzo said that there were a number of moments where the reality of his impending commitment set in.

“There is a point in the process where you have to hand write your commitments to the Church. As you get closer to ordination, your pledge is getting longer,” Deacon Nuzzo said. “At one point, there was a ceremony where you read your pledge to your classmates. As you are pledging your loyalty to the Archbishop of Baltimore and his successors, it starts to become much more real. There was a weeklong retreat right before ordination. That started to settle in that this was something very serious. You are going to have an impact on people's faith – either good or bad. I take that very seriously because I don't want something I say or do to leave people with a bad experience of Catholicism.”

Finally, on May 11, James Nuzzo and 15 classmates entered the Cathedral of Mary Our Queen in Baltimore, Md., and pledged their obedience to Most Rev. William E. Lori, Archbishop of Baltimore, and his successors. With that pledge and the laying on of hands, they became deacons for the Archdiocese and received the assignments in which they will serve God's people. Deacon Nuzzo has been assigned to his home parish, Sacred Heart in Glyndon, and to campus ministry at Stevenson University. Among the attendees at the ordination were two of Deacon Nuzzo's best friends from Delone Catholic, Jack Gullo '86 and Jeff Hobbs '86. Deacon Nuzzo said, “Seeing them there really hammered home how much Delone Catholic has meant in my life.”

Deacon Nuzzo said that he has experienced a calmness in his life stemming from a new focus on what is important and maximizing the quality of the time he spends with his family.

“It really is an honor to be a deacon and help people to understand how much Jesus loves them,” Deacon Nuzzo said. “Sometimes we can only reach them through our preaching. Sometimes you touch people at very week moments. Maybe they are in a nursing home for the first time. There is a vulnerability there because they have lost their independence. It is at that time that I try to help them remember that God loves them and they still have great value as a person. Baptisms are great. It is the beginning of life. There is so much ahead of this child, and the future is filled with great possibility. Funerals can be a moment of weakness. For others it can be a relief. Some people think ‘Mom lived a full life. She was 80, and she really lived a full life and didn't suffer until the end’. Other times, they are thinking, ‘she was only 50, and she was taken too soon.’ To be the Church to them is an honor. I feel a very heavy responsibility to represent the Church in a good way.”

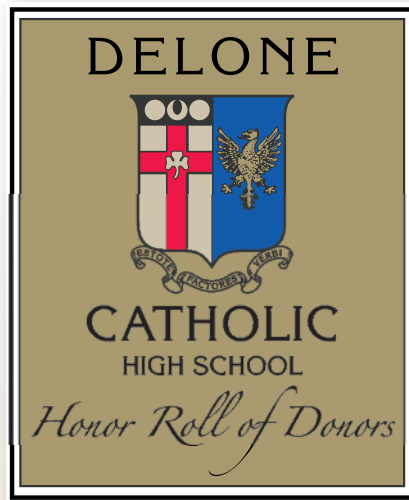

These activities are funded through fees paid by each participant, as well as fundraising done by many volunteers who contribute thousands of hours of their time each year.*

A heartfelt thank you from everyone at Delone Catholic to all who contributed to the school in any way during the 2012-13 year! Your selfless generosity and willingness to share the gifts with which God has blessed you is what allows Delone Catholic to thrive each year!

As you know, giving of any kind is greatly appreciated and needed by Delone Catholic High School. Unrestricted funds help with the day-to-day expenses, including but not limited to tuition assistance, community and alumni outreach and programs for students, such as Career Day. Restricted giving helps in ways which are meaningful to a particular benefactor. SMITH SHINES ON FIELD, COURT AND DIAMOND YEAR-ROUND

In an age when athletic specialization seems to occur at a younger and younger age, the three-sport athlete is becoming increasingly rarer. Witnessing a three-sport athlete who is an all-time performer in all three is just slightly more likely than spotting a unicorn on the practice field. Brett Smith '13 spoiled fans of Delone Catholic athletics by being just that over his four years.

Smith earned 11 varsity letters in football, basketball and baseball, and by his senior year, served as a captain for all three teams. He was the starting quarterback for the varsity football team by the middle of his sophomore season, the starting point guard for the varsity basketball team as a freshman and a starter wherever he was needed on the baseball diamond from the first game of his freshman year. At various points, he started at pitcher, catcher, second base, shortstop and centerfield. On the football field, he was also a standout safety and handled kicking and punting duties at one time or another. By all accounts, Smith is the kind of athlete whose favorite sport is the one he is currently playing, and he had an uncanny ability to roll right from the playoffs in one sport on one day to pre-season practice for another the next day.

At a school with a long and extensive history of athletic success, a strong argument can be made that Smith was a top-five all-time Squire in all three sports. Despite incomplete records in football and based on a high level of performance as a three-year starter, he is likely among the career leaders in passing yards, passing touchdowns and interceptions by a defensive player. He became the boys' basketball program's

12th 1,000-point scorer in January of his senior year and climbed to third place with 1,248 points. As one of just a handful of four-year varsity starters in baseball history and with a career batting average of well over .400, it can be safely assumed that he holds nearly every meaningful offensive record in the baseball program. He entered his senior season as the career hits leader and added 30 more in his final campaign. He was named all-state at least once in all three sports and garnered numerous league and all-area player of the year accolades.

For all of the individual achievements, Smith would be the first to tell you that he was prouder of what the three teams achieved during his career. In three seasons, the football team was 27-8 and reached the district playoffs all three years. The Squires won the 2012 District 3 Class A championship and were a double-overtime heartbreaker from the program's first victory in the PIAA playoffs. In four seasons, the basketball team went 68-39 and won a pair of YAIAA Division IV championships. At the district level, the Squires finished fourth once, as runners-up after a thrilling overtime loss in the championship and then won back-to-back championships in 2012 and 2013 after going 27 years since the program's first. The team also qualified for the PIAA playoffs in each of the past three seasons. Over four seasons, the basketball team was 63-21 with four YAIAA Division IV championships. The Squires finished as District 3 runners-up and reached the semifinals twice before capturing the program's first district championship in 2013. All told, Smith owns four district gold medals and two silver

medals. He also holds the distinction of being a team captain for all three teams for the first school in District 3 history to win the football, boys' basketball and baseball district championships in the same academic year.

Smith also excelled in the classroom. He received several scholarships and awards at the Class of 2013 Senior Awards Ceremony that were exclusively for or heavily weighted toward academic performance. He has chosen to continue his baseball career in college where he will compete at the Division I level for Bucknell University in Lewisburg, Pa. He also intends to pursue a degree in engineering. Though he has written the final chapter of his Delone Catholic career, Brett Smith's story is sure to be retold for many years to come.

2012-13 BOYS' BASKETBALL

When you win your first District 3 championship in 27 years, what do you do for an encore? Win another one, of course. The Squires (18-10, 12-3 YAIAA IV) followed up their 2012 PIAA District 3 Class AA championship with a steady season, but they only won more than two consecutive games twice. Proving that timing is everything, the second of those winning streaks coincided with the District 3 Class AA and PIAA Class AA playoffs. The District run started with a 12-point win over crosstown rival Hanover and continued with a 10-point victory against Camp Hill in the semifinal. Two nights later, Delone Catholic returned to the Giant Center and went toe-to-toe with a favored Trinity squad. Andrew Austin '14 was in the right place in the paint to corral a missed shot and put it back in at the buzzer to give the Squires a 58-56 victory over the Shamrocks. Delone Catholic picked up a win in the first round of the PIAA Class AA playoffs before bowing out in the second round.

The Camp Hill game marked a major milestone for long-time head coach Jim Dooley. In a career spanning parts of six decades and high school coaching stops at Shippensburg, Cumberland Valley, Gettysburg and Delone Catholic as well as a stint coaching the Icelandic National Team, Dooley reached the 700-win plateau in the district semifinal. His grandson, Jake Wiles '15, played a big role in the milestone win, scoring 20 points off the bench.

Brett Smith '13 became the 12th 1,000-point scorer in Squires history in early January and spent the rest of the season rising on the career scoring list. He graduates with 1,248 points, good for third place all-time. Smith earned a spot on the AP PIAA Class AA All-State Boys' Basketball Second Team. He and Devon Moore '15 were both named to the *Evening Sun* All-Area Boys' Basketball First Team and the *York Daily Record/Sunday News* Boys' Division III/IV Basketball All-Star First Team. Dooley was named Coach of the Year by the *Evening Sun*.

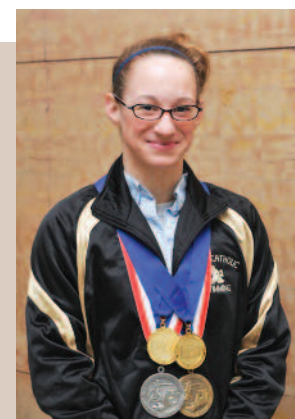

The season continued with a win over Prep Charter in the first round of the PIAA Class AA playoffs before Loyalsock Township scored five runs in the fifth and sixth innings to claim a 9-5 quarterfinal decision. Throughout the season, Delone Catholic relied on a high-powered offense, hitting .340 as a team and outscoring opponents 200-67, and a stingy pitching staff for well-rounded success. No pitcher with more than two appearances had an earned run average above 2.86.

Brett Smith '13 entered the season as the Squires' career hits leader and again led the team with 30 more while hitting .448. Buckley paced the team with 11 extra-base hits. On the mound, Haymaker was the team's workhorse, going 5-1 with a 1.36 ERA in 51.1 innings. All three players were named to the 2013 *Evening Sun* All-Area Baseball First Team and the 2013 GameTimePA.com Division IV Baseball All-Star First Team. With a strong returning core bolstered by an outstanding freshman class, the Squirettes (18-2, 15-0 YAIAA IV) have made the transformation from struggling program to budding powerhouse in just three seasons. For the second year in a row they started on a long winning streak, this time winning 18 in a row and clinching their second straight YAIAA Division IV championship before falling 2-0 to Central York in the YAIAA tournament championship game. Delone Catholic not only won, but it dominated in the regular season, winning by three or fewer runs only once. The Squirettes qualified for the District 3 playoffs for a third year in a row, where they lost, 2-1, to Pequea Valley in the quarterfinal.

The postseason accolades piled up for the Squirettes again in 2013. Two-time reigning Division IV Player of the Year Deanna Laughman '14 was supplanted for that honor by pitching ace Cassie Rickrode '16. 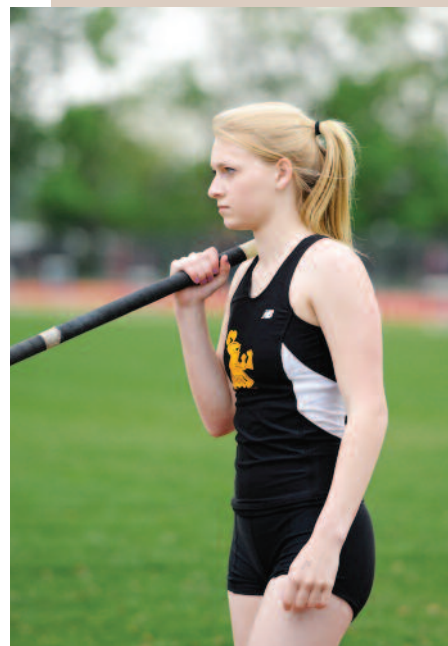
2013 GIRLS' TRACK AND FIELD

The Squirettes' 16 top-10 finishes at the PIAA District 3 Class AA championships were highlighted by Ugarte's bronze in the long jump, fourth-place finish in the triple jump and fifth-place finish in the 100-meter dash. J.T. FLAHERTY FIELD GETS NEW SCOREBOARD

Through the efforts of several volunteer electricians over the years, the J.T. Flaherty Field scoreboard outlived even the most optimistic expectations. The board, which was purchased in 1966, spent its last two seasons causing Delone Catholic athletics personnel to hold their breath about whether it would function from week-to-week or even quarter-to-quarter.

In the summer of 2012, through generous gifts from the McSherrystown Moose Family Center 720, the Flaherty Family and three anonymous donors, a new scoreboard was erected in time for the start of the 2012 fall season. The new scoreboard has worked well for the football program, and because the clock is capable of handling times over 19 minutes and 59 seconds, it has also worked very well for the senior night games for the field hockey and boys' and girls' soccer programs. It also has a message center which can display announcements and, eventually, advertisements.

On Sept. 14, 2012, with members of the McSherrystown Moose and the Flaherty Family on hand, the scoreboard was dedicated and blessed by Deacon Tim Shultis prior to the varsity football game against Littlestown. At that time, the field was also rededicated to the memory of long-time Delone Catholic coach, teacher and dean of students J.T. Flaherty. The field was originally named in his honor on Nov. 10, 1978 following his passing in June of that year.

The entire Delone Catholic community thanks the McSherrystown Moose, the Flaherty Family, our anonymous donors, the Athletic Association, the Building and Grounds Committee and all the administrators and staff members who worked to make this project a reality!



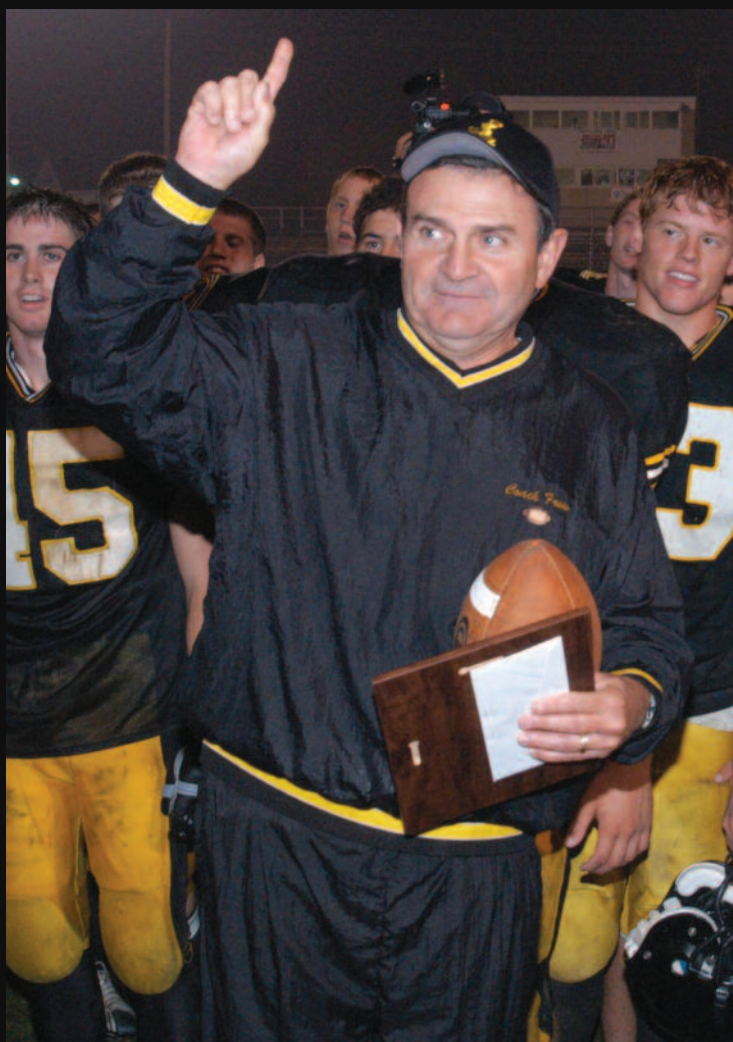

FREW INDUCTED INTO PSFCA HALL OF FAME

Former Delone Catholic High School football coach Denny Frew was inducted into the Pennsylvania Scholastic Football Coaches Association (PSFCA) Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 15, 2013. This is the third hall of fame induction since 2008 for the Hanover area's career victories leader.

Frew, who compiled a record of 220-101-3 in 28 seasons from 1979-2006, was enshrined as part of the PSFCA's 28th class. To date, fewer than 250 coaches in the history of Pennsylvania high school football have received this honor, and only three, Frew, Jack Connor of Hanover and George Shue of Littlestown, served as head coaches in the Hanover area. The inductees were also honored later in the day at the Big 33 Football Classic at Hersheypark Stadium.

Frew continued a long-standing tradition of football success at Delone Catholic and wrote a new chapter when the District 3 playoff era opened. In 20 seasons during district play, Frew's teams reached the playoffs 13 times, posting a 15-7 record, winning the program's first six District 3 championships and finishing as the runner-up three times. On five occasions, the Squires also qualified for the PIAA playoffs. Locally, Frew's teams won three Blue Mountain League championships, seven YAIAA Division II championships, seven City Cup championships for the local rivalry games with Hanover and South Western and five Division II Cups for games against Hanover and Littlestown.



A man who filled many roles at Delone Catholic, Frew served as an assistant football coach from 1975-78, a baseball coach, Athletics Director, Dean of Students and a member of the faculty. He was inducted into the South Central Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame in 2008 and the Adams County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame in 2010.

DELONE CATHOLIC REACCREDITED BY MIDDLE STATES

The Commission on Secondary Schools of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools voted at its Spring 2013 meeting to award accreditation to Delone Catholic High School for seven years, through May 1, 2020. Delone Catholic has been accredited since 1952.

According to the Middle States Association, an accredited institution: adheres to the Middle States Standards for Accreditation; uses its mission, beliefs and goals as the basis for daily decision making; operates in the public interest and in accordance with ethical practice; accepts responsibility for the level of performance of its students; remains committed to continuous improvement in student learning and its capacity to produce the levels of learning desired and expected by its community; operates in a collegial and collaborative way with all of its stakeholders; and sustains its focus on implementing recommendations, addressing monitoring issues and correcting stipulations that may be part of its notification of accreditation; and fulfills its maintenance requirements to the Commission.

In preparation for accreditation, Delone Catholic conducted a self-study in 2010-11, which included the most extensive survey of its stakeholders in the history of the school. In 2011-12, the faculty, Board of Directors and a planning committee that included parents, students, alumni and members of the business community, used the self-study data to identify student performance objectives for the next seven years. In November of 2012, a five-member Middle States evaluating team of educators visited the school for four days, interviewing stakeholders, reviewing documentation and observing school operations. At the conclusion of their visit, they wrote a report outlining their observations, recommendations and monitoring issues for the school.

In an oral report at the conclusion of the evaluating team visit, evaluating team chair Donna Bridickas stated, "Many schools talk about being a community, but Delone Catholic High School is an exemplar of such a community...Faculty and students use the word family to describe this unique relationship. The Team recognizes that your strong sense of family involves all of your stakeholders from your students to your Board members. This is what sets you apart from other schools in your area and is one of the reasons parents send their children to your school and why faculty and students stay....From the moment we entered the school, we saw and heard that this is a special place."

Throughout the next few years, Delone Catholic will implement strategies aimed at achieving the objectives identified during the accreditation process. In an effort to improve students' college/career readiness, self-reflection and writing skills, a comprehensive portfolio program will be put in place. The school will also focus on helping students improve their personal responsibility by encouraging regular school attendance, strengthening discipline procedures and establishing a mentoring program for students who need additional academic support. In conjunction with the accreditation protocol, the Delone Catholic Board of Directors will involve all stakeholders as they update strategic plans for the school's finances, facilities, technology needs and other facets of school management.

The Middle States Association, established by the academic profession in 1887, has set standards for American education and has provided ongoing support for public, private and faith-based schools for over 125 years.

The band then displayed its versatility in an entertaining medley of "Pixar Favorites," including a country line dance from *Toy Story*, a latin sax soli from the end credits of *Ratatouille*, and a brief swing trumpet solo by Matt Heilman from *Monsters Inc.* A stirring medley of "Harry Potter: The Music," brought the night at the movies to a powerful conclusion. DCHS GIVES STUDENTS ACCESS TO NEW TECH TOOLS



Delone Catholic is always looking for new, cost-effective means of improving communication between students, parents and teachers to support academic success. The school also wants to expose students to modern, 21st-century tools for productivity and collaboration. In 2012-13, Delone Catholic acquired E-Chalk, "a K-12 learning platform schools use to manage communication and instruction."

The first step in implementing E-Chalk was to design a new, more dynamic website. Teachers were trained to use the E-Chalk platform to share information and to create class and group pages. Freshman students were also given access to E-Chalk, as well as to Google Apps for Education, a free suite of cloud-based productivity and collaboration tools to complete school work from any internet-enabled device and to store it safely online for easy access at home and at school. Faculty members and administrators were just beginning to scratch the surface of how these tools can help students to stay organized, to communicate with their teachers and classmates and to be more successful learners. Freshman parents also had the opportunity to register for an E-Chalk account and to receive alerts when teachers added events and announcements to their class pages.

In 2013-14, E-Chalk and Google Apps accounts have been deployed for all students. Their parents have the opportunity to register for E-Chalk accounts as well.

STUDENTS SELECTED FOR EUROPEAN MUSIC TOUR

Brittney Eline '14 and Alison Heilman '16 were chosen for American Music Abroad's Burgundy Tour. Based in Central Pennsylvania, the 2013 summer tour of western Europe began with a three-day practice at Franklin & Marshall College in Lancaster, Pa., before continuing to Rome and other cities in Italy, Germany, Austria and Vatican City. They performed a farewell concert for family and friends on June 18 and seven concerts while in Europe before returning on July 5. Tour participants were high school musicians from Central Pennsylvania nominated by band and choir directors. Eline and Heilman performed with the symphonic band and choir.

KUMP ATTENDS MOOSE INTERNATIONAL YOUTH AWARENESS CONGRESS

April Kump '13 was selected by her peers to represent Pennsylvania at the 2013 Moose International Youth Awareness Congress held May 2-6 in Lisle, Ill. This event is the culmination of the annual Youth Awareness Program of the Loyal Order of Moose. Kump was awarded college scholarships on the local level, and was eligible for additional scholarships at the International Congress.

Each fall, Moose Lodges throughout North America are encouraged to invite two high school students to State and Provincial Association Student Congresses at which participants develop their own, unscripted talks on a variety of topics aimed at four- to nine-year-olds. Fifteen members of the Delone Catholic High School Class of 2013 have earned 2013 AP Scholar Awards in recognition of their exceptional achievement on Advanced Placement Exams taken in the spring.

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program® (AP®) provides willing and academically prepared students with the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses while still in high school, and to earn college credit, advanced placement or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. The College Board recognizes several levels of achievement based on students' performance on AP Exams.

At Delone Catholic, three students qualified for the AP Scholar with Distinction Award by earning an average score of 3.5 or higher on a five-point scale on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams. The AP Scholars with Distinction are: Samuel N. Edwards, Casara McCleaf and Keith T. Plummer.

Six students qualified for the AP Scholars with Honor Award by earning an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams. The AP Scholars with Honor are: Bethany H. Ball, Jessica S. Kopenhaver, Therese D. LaFleur, Kasey E. Myers, Matthew J. Noel and Jaci L. Wendel.

Six students qualified for the AP Scholar Award by completing three or more AP Exams with scores of 3 or higher. The AP Scholars are: Sarah M. Bischoff, Anjelica N. Cromartie, Melissa A. Golowski, Julie L. Mall, Evan Staub and Justin M. Tamminga.

Through 34 different college-level courses and exams, AP provides willing and academically prepared students with the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced placement and stand out in the college admission process. Each exam is developed by a committee of college and university faculty and AP teachers, ensuring that AP Exams are aligned with the same high standards expected by college faculty at some of the nation's leading liberal arts and research institutions. More than 3,800 colleges and universities annually receive AP scores. Most four-year colleges in the United States provide credit and/or advanced placement for qualifying exam scores. Research consistently shows that AP students who score a 3 or higher on AP Exams (based on a scale from 1 to 5, with 5 being the highest) typically experience greater academic success in college and have higher college graduation rates than students who do not participate in AP.

Most Rev. Joseph P. McFadden, Tenth Bishop of Harrisburg (1947-2013)

Most Rev. Joseph P. McFadden was installed as the Tenth Bishop of Harrisburg on Aug. 18, 2010. Just 15 days later, he made his first school visit as Bishop to Delone Catholic High School to celebrate the school's 70th Anniversary Mass. The Philadelphia native was embraced by the school, and just as quickly, he embraced Delone Catholic and the entire Diocese. Bishop passed away unexpectedly on May 2, 2013 of a heart attack while attending a bishop's conference in Philadelphia.

The loss of Bishop McFadden has been felt throughout the Diocese, but even more profoundly so by the administrators, faculty, staff and students of all of our schools. He was a tireless champion of Catholic education and an outspoken proponent of legislation to grow school choice in Pennsylvania. This love of Catholic education was recognized by his peers as well, who elected him as the chair of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Education in 2011, a post he held at the time of his death.

Though his tenure lasted less than three years, and he only returned to Delone Catholic twice more – to rededicate the 1963 Math and Science Wing and to celebrate the Baccalaureate Mass for the Class of 2012 – Bishop McFadden made himself a constant presence in the life of Delone Catholic and other Diocesan schools. He often spoke with and prayed with students via video conferencing.

In the months since his passing, the entire Delone Catholic family has answered Bishop's call to "pray for me, as I pray for you." We join everyone in the Diocese as well as Bishop's family and friends in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia in praying that he will be granted eternal rest and be rewarded for his faithful service to God.



**Joseph P. McCullough
(1931-2013)**

Delone Catholic High School has stood as a pillar of the Adams Deanery Catholic Community for 73 years, largely on the selfless service of administrators, faculty, staff, parents and alumni who have gone above and beyond the call of duty. Few people have exemplified that better and for longer than Joseph P. McCullough, a past parent and decades-long volunteer at the school.

Mr. McCullough was always willing to step in wherever he was needed in order to improve the school. Most notably, he was a member of the Board of Directors from the time lay members were added in the Fall of 1970 until the conclusion of the 2010-11 term. At 41 years, he served by far the longest tenure of any board member in school history. He served 15 years over several terms as the chair of the board, served on various board committees and the campaign cabinet for Delone's Diamond Decade Initiative Phase I, emceed the Athletic Association and Music Association \$100 Dinners, was a regular participant in the Henny Noel Memorial Tuition Assistance Golf Tournament and could be found at many of the school's extracurricular contests and performances.

It would be easy to assume that all of Mr. McCullough's volunteer efforts were directed toward Delone Catholic, but that was far from true. He was just as active in parish life at St. Joseph Parish in Hanover and served on several Diocesan committees. He was also a member of various fraternal organizations in the community. Mr. McCullough did all of this both before and after retiring from a professional career as an educator and vice president at D.C. Heath Book Company. He also held every rank from recruit to Master Sergeant and retired as a Brigadier General in the Pennsylvania Army National Guard.

Mr. McCullough passed away on June 9, 2013. He is survived by his wife, Carolyn, three children, all of whom are Delone Catholic alumni and eight grandchildren (four alumni and one current student). Because of his efforts and those of his peers, Delone Catholic has been forever changed for the better, and we pray that he is at rest from and enjoying the rewards of his extensive labors.



**James A. Dooley, Jr.
(1944-2013)**

To meet Jim Dooley was to be swept up in his passion for educating young people in social studies, basketball and life. Coach Dooley finished his long career as a full-time teacher in 2007 after six years at Delone Catholic. His coaching and substitute teaching career also came to an unexpected end in Squire Country. He was preparing for the Squires' defense of their 2012 and 2013 PIAA District 3 championships when he passed away on Oct. 31 after a battle with aplastic anemia.

After one season with the Squire freshmen, Coach Dooley resumed a storied varsity coaching career in 2003-04. In 10 seasons at Delone Catholic, he amassed a record of 187-85 and reached the 700-win plateau for his career. More impressive than his victory total is what his teams did in the post season.

All 10 of Coach Dooley's Delone Catholic teams reached the District 3 Class AA playoffs. Half of them advanced to the District title game, finishing as runners-up in 2006, 2008 and 2011 and champions in 2012 and 2013. Additionally, Coach Dooley's teams won six YAI AA Division IV championships and appeared in the PIAA Class AA playoffs six times.

Coach Dooley is survived by his wife, Mary, two children, three grandchildren and hundreds of students and players on whom he made an incredible impact. A brief ceremony in memory of Coach Dooley will take place prior to the Squires' varsity basketball game against Biglerville on Monday, Dec. 23. Following the game, light refreshments will be served in the DCHS cafeteria to allow Coach Dooley's family and friends to gather and celebrate his life. All are welcome.
