Registration: The Summer Academic Programs registration is completed at the student's home school

unless otherwise indicated on the Registration Form.

Attendance: Students are expected to attend the entire Summer Academy.

Student Services: Students with an identified disability enrolled in Summer Academic Programs will be

provided appropriate services and support by licensed special education staff.

Tuition: Some programs are offered free of charge; others require a tuition payment.

Books/Materials: Textbooks, instructional resources, and library services are available during the *Summer*

Academic Programs. All textbooks and library books must be returned. Students who

damage books will be required to pay the repair or replacement cost.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL ACADEMY

Elementary School Reading & Mathematics Grades Rising 1st-5th Grades



The *Elementary School Summer Academy* is designed for students enrolled in grades K – 4 who have been identified as needing academic support in the areas of reading & mathematics. Students are eligible for the *Elementary Summer Academy* based on the results of SOL testing and classroom performance and teacher recommendation. Students will be given the opportunity to demonstrate mastery of the objectives at the appropriate grade level. There is no fee for the academy for students who qualify through school recommendation.

Registration Information

- Registration forms must be returned to the home school by Friday, May 25, 2018.
- Parents of students who are recommended for this program will be contacted by their child's counselor.
- Transportation will be provided.
- Breakfast and lunch will be served.
- Students who are absent after three days for any reason including personal illness or emergencies may be withdrawn from the Academy.

MIDDLE SCHOOL SUMMER ACADEMY

Middle School English & Mathematics Grades – Rising 6th, Rising 7th, Rising 8th and Rising 9th

The *Middle School Summer Academy* is designed for students that are rising 6th, 7th, 8th or 9th graders (currently students who are in 5th, 6th, 7th or 8th grades) who have been identified as needing academic support in the areas of English & Mathematics. Students are eligible for the *Middle School Summer Academy* based on the results of SOL testing and classroom performance and teacher recommendation. Students will be given the opportunity to demonstrate mastery of the objectives at the appropriate grade level.

- Registration forms must be returned to the home school by Friday, May 25, 2018.
- Transportation will be provided.
- Students who are absent after three days for any reason including personal illness or emergencies may be withdrawn from the academy.

FRESHEN-UP SUMMER ACADEMY PRINCE GEORGE HIGH SCHOOL

English, Mathematics, Science, & Social Studies End of Course Subjects for Verified Credit

The *Freshen-Up Summer Academy* is designed for rising 9th-12th grade students, who have been identified as needing academic support in the areas of English 11: reading & writing, mathematics, science, and social studies to earn verified credit. Students are eligible for the *Freshen-Up Summer Academy* based on the results of SOL testing, classroom performance, and teacher/administrator recommendation. The academy will include direct teacher instruction, lab activities, data analysis, and projects. Students will be given the opportunity to demonstrate mastery of the objectives by course content. There is no fee for the *Freshen-Up Academy*.
