Call to Order

Mr. Dreves called the meeting to order at 7:08 p.m. and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. He asked the audience to remain standing for a moment of silence for Michael Sciavillo, a 2013 High School graduate.

President's Opening Remarks

Mr. Dreves mentioned that we were honoring youngsters in the music program and welcomed all of the parents, students and teachers in attendance. He then noted that several resolutions will be presented tonight. The two most important resolutions are one declaring the Board of Education as the Lead Agency towards the SEQRA for the Bond that is planned to be put up for a vote in the spring ,and the second for a public relations firm to be hired to explain details of the bond prior to the vote. He turned the program over to Dr. Kliszus who introduced Ken Kraut to speak about the music program and the honorees for:

- 2016 Band and Chorus
- 2016 Marching Band

There was a two minute break at 7:20 p.m. and meeting was resumed at 7:22 p.m.

Park Avenue School Report

Rosa Taylor, Principal of Park Avenue School gave the state of the school presentation.

Mrs. Taylor recognized parents for their participation in the parent program with certificates. Mr. Joseph Carvin commented briefly on the One World Program. Mrs. Taylor called up the students in the One World Program and presented them with certificates. Mr. Carvin introduced and thanked Jennifer Carriero-Dominguez and Maria Hernandez for being the teachers in the One World Program.

Mrs. Taylor then recognized the students of the month for October and November and also recognized Mrs. Gallo, Mr. Cafaldo and Mrs. Truini as the teachers for this program. Mrs. Taylor recognized Mrs. Jacobs for her 41 years of service as Special Education Teacher and Ms. Regina Gillis as Teaching Assistant for her 25 years of service to the Port Chester School District.

Mrs. Taylor also recognized all of the staff members present and thanked them for their support and she thanked the Board members and Dr. Kliszus for their support. Mr. Dreves asked the PTO members to stand and be recognized. Board members and Dr. Kliszus congratulated Mrs. Taylor on the presentation and on the good work going on at Park Avenue School.

There was a five minute break at 8:08 p.m. The meeting was called back to order at 8:15 p.m.

Public Comment

Mr. Dreves opened the floor for public comments:

Joan Miksner, 26 Brook Lane, had many great things to say about the school and the teachers at the school. Her one concern and the concern of other parents was the turnover of the teachers at Park Avenue. She respectfully asked that as part of the evaluation and criteria process leaders should focus on teacher turnover and to take care of the tenure of the teachers. She commended the board for K-5 Science Program and the band program.

Tom Ceruzzi, 84 Hobart Avenue, commented on the very nice turnout. He was lucky enough to be part of the bond committee. At one meeting we took a vote to have multiple plans to be sent to the board, but it was defeated. On hiring the public relations firm, it could divide the community more and could backfire. Whatever money you are going to spend could be better spent on things you need in the schools. Any proposals the firm puts forward, they probably won't have all of the information. He has concerns that people are upset already and feels there are people in the school system that could communicate with the community.

Steve Simmons, 255 North Regent Street commented on the alternate plans. He reiterated that the recommendation that the committee of 30 or so people presented was a recommendation that passed 20-2 at a 90% rate.

Heather Mateus, lives by the high school. I understand what Mr. Ceruzzi said about public relations but going through the budget, we make a lot of happen. To put together newsletters, you are taking about people volunteering and that is difficult with all of the responsibilities everyone has. She didn't believe that there was a full time communications coordinator in the district. We need to get accurate information out, but it does take people who are experts in the field. We should get as many people as possible out to vote and we need to get the information out to people. We need to get together and make the world a better place and do what we need to do for the children.

Coleen Moore, 11 Wesley Avenue, heard wonderful things about the dual language program. She thinks it is very valuable and hopes to see it continue at Park Avenue.

Keith Morlino, no address given, talked about the importance of the public relations firm as it would help alleviate all the misinformation that we had the last time. The bond is in the area of \$50 - \$70 million dollars and the cost of the public relations firm is a minimal amount compared to the cost of the bond. People didn't know what they were getting and what they were paying for the last time. It is very important to get the correct information out for the bond to be successful.

Public Comment was closed at 8:33 p.m.

* In order to be granted tenure, a classroom teacher must receive composite or overall annual professional performance review ratings pursuant to Education Law §3012-c and/or §3012-d of either effective or highly effective in at least 3 of the 4 preceding years. Further, if the classroom teacher receives an ineffective composite or overall rating in the final year of the probationary period he/she shall not be eligible for tenure at that time, in which case the Board of Education, in its discretion, may extend the teacher's probationary term for an additional year.

- 2. A Maternity Leave of Absence be granted to Rosann Guido, White Plains, New York as Science Teacher at the High School, beginning approximately November 21, 2016 through June 30, 2017. Action Items:

There was a discussion about Action Item A by the board members.

Upon motion by Mrs. Brakewood, seconded by Mr. Johnson and carried, the resolution was unanimously approved (5-0):

A. WHEREAS, the Port Chester-Rye Union Free School District ("the District") is considering the impact on the environment in accordance with the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act and its implementing regulations 6 N.Y.C.R.R. 617.1 et. seq ("SEQRA") of a proposed capital improvement project known as the High School Addition, JFK Elementary School Addition, and the King Street Elementary School Addition (hereinafter "the Project") which is set forth in more detail in the one Full Environmental Assessment Form and two Short Environmental Assessment Forms located at the District administrative offices ("the Project Plan"). The Project is to be undertaken at:

1. Port Chester High School Addition, 1 Tamarack Road, Port Chester, NY

Proposed are additions to two areas at the perimeter of the High School building, comprising a total of ±49,150 square feet.

- a. A new ±14,150 square foot gym structure addition to step into the grade providing a lower profile addition to the north of the school adjacent to the current gymnasium.
- b. A ±35,000 square foot academic addition to the west side of the existing building adjacent to Tamarack Road. The addition is elevated over the existing parking lot to remain (and be reconfigured, with some parking to be relocated to the south side), and contains classrooms, computer room, band and choral rooms. The addition will connect with all glass links to the existing building.

A synthetic turf field is also proposed to replace the existing natural grass turf athletic field within the track. In addition, bleacher refurbishment and a new small (±600 s.f.) concession stand are proposed.

- JFK Elementary School Addition, 40 Olivia Street, Port Chester, NY
 Proposed is a ±3,200 s.f. 2-classroom addition to the south side of the existing lower Elementary school; a ±7,300 gym
 addition to the north of the existing building adjacent to Olivia Street, to be connected by a bridge; and a ±7,300 s.f. bus
 storage/maintenance area below the gymnasium. Total size of the additions is 17,800 s.f.
- King Street Elementary School Addition, 697 King Street, Port Chester, NY Proposed is a ±13,850 s.f. addition to the north side of the existing building in the play area (which will be relocated), containing a ±7,300 s.f. gymnasium, classrooms, and office support space. The existing northerly parking lot off of Upland Street will be expanded and reconfigured.
- 4. <u>Edison Elementary School, 132 Rectory Street, Port Chester, NY</u> A synthetic playground and stage lighting are proposed.

5. Park Avenue Elementary School, 75 Park Avenue, Port Chester, NY

Proposed is a ±3,500 s.f 2-story addition to be situated atop the kindergartens, or 1,750 s.f. per floor, and align with all of the exterior walls below. The new punched windows would mimic the size of the existing kindergarten classrooms below, and the proposed exterior envelope of the addition would match the red brick and pre-cast masonry elements of the existing building.

WHEREAS, the District directs that the District consultants notify as appropriate involved and interested agencies under SEQRA of the District's intent to act as lead agency for the coordinated environmental review of the Project under SEQRA to such agencies (list attached) together with this Resolution of the District's intent to act as lead agency for the SEQRA review of same, and if no objection to the District acting as lead agency is upheld in accordance with applicable law, then the District wishes to be installed as lead agency in order to conduct a coordinated environmental review under SEQRA for the Project;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the District hereby directs District consultants to provide the involved agencies and interested parties for the Project (list attached) with a copy of the EAF Part 1 for the High School addition and two Short Environmental Forms, one for the JFK Elementary School Addition and one for the King Street Elementary School Addition, and a copy of this Resolution, and that the District intends to act as the lead agency in order to conduct a coordinated environmental review for the Project under the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that if no objection to the District acting as lead agency is received within thirty (30) calendar days, then the District will declare itself as lead agency for the SEQRA review of the Project and conduct a coordinated environmental review for same in accordance with 6 NYCRR. 617.1 et seq. of the implementing regulations under the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act as well as Article 8 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law, and

This resolution shall be effective immediately.

There was a discussion about Action Item B by the Board members. Mrs. Capeci asked that Action Item B be tabled to look at the costs further. There was not a second to this motion to table. Therefore, the original motion was voted on.
